### TONNAGE OF AUSTRO-HUNGARIAN MERCHANT SHIPS.

THE accompanying Order of Her Majesty the Queen in Council, extending to Austro-Hungarian vessels the advantages held out by The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act 1862 to ships of foreign countries adopting the rules for the measurement of tonnage which obtain in the British possessions, is published for general information.

Whereas by The Merchant Shipping Act Amendment Act
1862, it is enacted that "whenever it is made to appear to Her
Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tomage
of merchant ships for the time being in force under the principal Act have been adopted by the Government of any foreign
country, and are in force in that country, it shall be lawful for
Her Majesty, by Order in Council, to direct that the ships of
such foreign country shall be deemed to be of the tonnage
denoted in their certificates of registry or other national papers,
and thereupon it shall no longer be necessary for such ships
to be re-measured in any port or place in Her Majesty's dominions, but such ships shall be deemed to be of the tonnage
denoted in their certificates of registry or other papers, in the
same manner, to the same extent, and for the same purposes
in, to, and for which the tonnage denoted in the certificates of
registry of British ships is to be deemed the tonnage of such
ships: And whereas it has been made to appear to Her Majesty that the rules concerning the measurement of tonnage

### SORRENTO CHANNEL.

PHOTS, masters of vessels, and others are hereby informed that the Sorrento Channel, which extends four (4) miles from Point King to the White Cliff, has been buoyed to afford facilities for vessels navigating in that locality.

The buoys are placed as follows:

1. A white buoy (300-gallon cask), a cable and a half to the eastward of Point King, in 9 feet at low water, and marking the edge of the bank off the point.

2. A black buoy (300-gallon cask), about half a mile to the S.E. of the preceding buoy, and midway between it and the end of the Sorrento Jetty. This buoy is in 11 feet at low water and marks the westernmost edge of a bank which fronts the coast from Point King to the White Cliff.

3. A white buoy, nearly a mile E. by S. of the end of the Sorrento Jetty, lying in 16 feet at low water and marking the northern edge of the bank off the Sisters.

4. A black buoy, a mile and a half S.E. by E.JE. from the preceding buoy, and nearly midway between the White Cliff and the easternmost of the Two Sisters, is laid in 16 feet at low water, and marks the southernmost edge of the bank extending from Point King to the White Cliff.

The channel from Point King to Sorrento is three-quarters (3) of a mile long, patchy and very narrow, and only navigable by vessels drawing not more than 9 feet of water. The soundings are very irregular, varying from 11 feet to 16 feet, and numerous knolls exist over which there is only 9 feet 6 inches of water. The channel from the White Cliff to Sorrento is a little over three (3) miles in length, and is from a cable's length and a half to half a mile in width, with from four to eight fathoms of water.

Vessels bound to Sorrento from Queenscliffe or Portsea and

half to half a mile in width, with from four to eight fathoms of water.

Vessels bound to Sorrento from Queenscliffe or Portsea, and using the western entrance, should not approach the shore between the Quarantine Station and Point King nearer than two (2) cables', lengths. The hospital buildings at the Quarantine Station kept open of Portsea Point lead clear of shallow water to Point King. After rounding the white buoy off Point King steer for the mooring buoy and anchor in thirteen (18) fect water off the end of the jetty. The mooring buoy is laid in 16 feet water about 2½ cables from the end of the jetty. Vessels drawing not more than 12 feet water can go alongside the end of the jetty.

In approaching Sorrento Channel from the eastward, vessels, after rounding No. 15 buoy in the South Channel should steer for the White Cliff until the easternmost black buoy in Sorrento Channel bears west, when steer to pass to the southward of it, giving the buoy a berth of half a cable's length. After passing this buoy steer N.W.b.W. for the white huoy off the Two Sisters; pass to the morthward of it, giving it also a berth of half a cable's length, when steer W.b.N. for Sorrento Jetty, and anchor two (2) cables to the eastward of it, in four futhoms of water.

### HARBOR LIGHT, ULLADULLA.

On and after the night of Tuesday the 10th of December 1872, a green fixed light will be exhibited from the Lighthouse on the Pier at Ulladulla; this light will be 45 feet above highwater mark and be visible between the bearings of S.W.4W. and W. by N.4N. at a distance of from 7 to 9 miles.

Vessels bound to Ulladulla from the northward will site the green light in clear weather on a south-westerly bearing before losing sight of the Cape St. George Light; vessels from the southward will have to keep an offing till the light is opened

out clear of the land. To enter the port, steer about W.S.W. for the green light, keeping a good look out to avoid the Sullivan Reef, which generally breaks, and should be passed two cables distant on the port hand.

No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or the said Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Mornington, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order divide the said Shire of Mornington into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:— WHEREAS by The Shires Statute (33 Vict.
