NOTICE TO SHIPPERS OF HORSES, ETC., TO INDIA.

THE attention of shippers of horses to India, and all other persons interested therein, is called to the fact that an Act (28 Vic. of 1871) has been passed by the Governor-General of India in Council, which provides that—"When any person of European extraction lands in India, being or having been in charge of, or in attendance upon, any animal, and becomes chargeable to the State as a vagrant within one year after his arrival in India, then the consignee of such animal, or the agents in India for the sale of such animal, or if such consignee or agent cannot be found, the agent to whom the ship in which such animal arrived in India was consigned, shall be liable to pay to the Government the cost of such person's removal and all other charges incurred by the State in consequence of his becoming a vagrant."

It further appears from a communication addressed to this Government from India, that two men named Charles Duncan and Charles Sherley have been lately charged as vagrants, when it transpired that they had been engaged by a Mr. John Learmonth as grooms in charge of horses from Australia, subsequently Mr. Learmonth was compelled to provide return passages for the men by the first opportunity, and also for their maintenance in the meantime.

PUBLIC ROADS AT WOODEND.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public road within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be public roads within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the roads, highways, or thoroughfares at Woodend, in the shire of Newham, the names, widths, and limits of which are hereinafter described, viz.:-

High street: 198 feet wide: from Urquhart street to Owen street
Collier street: 99 feet wide: from Anslow street to Forest street.

Nicholson street: 99 feet wide: from Anslow street to Forest street.

Urquhart street: 99 feet wide: from High street to Templeton street

Anslow street: 99 feet wide: from Collier street to Nicholson street.

PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria; and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the respective towns in the Shire of Marong which are hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF BRIDGEWATER,
THE TOWN OF KANGAROO FLAT,
THE TOWN OF LAANECORRIE,
THE TOWN OF LOCKWOOD,
THE TOWN OF MARONG,
THE TOWN OF NEWBRIDGE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a town the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, viz.:-

TOWN OF ELGIN, COUNTY OF DALHOUSIE.—Commencing on the right bank of Sunday Creek, at the point where the north boundary of the land near the Glenburnie pre-emptive section, licensed to William Wall, abuts thereon; thence by that land and a line bearing east sixty-three chains, more or less; thence by a line bearing north sixty-seven chains, more or less, to a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of allotment 22A, parish of Glenburnie; thence by that line bearing west eighty-five chains, more or less, to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

The bearings are from the true meridian.—(73.J.1122.)

THE SHIRE OF SPRINGFIELD DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of January 1873.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 558, § 18) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the third day of May 1869, the Springfield Road District was divided into two Electoral Subdivisions which are therein described: And whereas by another Order of the Governor in Council, made on the twenty-third day of January 1871, the said Road District was constituted the Shire of Springfield, and the Electoral Subdivisions thereof became the Ridings of the said shire: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Springfield, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council doth by this present Order rescind the Order in Council of the third day of May 1869 hereinbefore mentioned, and doth divide anew the said Shire of Springfield into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE NORTH RIDING: Commencing at the south-west angle of section 33, in the parish of Forbes; thence easterly by a road to the south-east angle of section 45; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of section 48, in the same parish; thence east by the southern boundary of sections 48 and 55 to the boundary of the parish of Bylands; thence north by the said boundary to the north-east angle of the parish of Forbes; thence west by the northern boundary of the said parish and a straight line to the Dividing Range; thence by the said range, being the county boundary between Bourke and Dalhousie, to a point north of the north-east angle of the parish of Lancefield; thence south to the north-east angle of the

parish of Lancefield; thence southerly and easterly by the boundary of the parish of Goldie to the north-west angle of section 33, in the parish of Forbes; thence south to the commencing point.

THE CENTRAL RIDING: Commencing at the junction of number three or Boyd's Creek with the Deep Creek; thence northerly by the number three or Boyd's Creek to the north-west angle of section 31, village reserve in the parish of Bylands; thence easterly by a road to the west boundary of section 118 of the said parish; thence north by part of the western boundary of section 118, the western boundaries of sections 117, 116, and 111, in the said parish, and the eastern boundary of the parish of Forbes to the south-east angle of section 55, parish of Forbes; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of sections 55 and 48 to the centre of a road due west of the south-west angle of section 48; thence northerly and westerly by that road to the south-west angle of section 33 in the said parish, being the boundary of the parish of Springfield; thence by the northern boundary of the said parish, being the Kilmore to Lancefield road, to the Deep Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the Deep Creek to the commencing point.

THE SOUTH RIDING: Commencing at the south-east angle of the parish of Havelock; thence by the eastern, northern, western, and southern boundaries of the said parish to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

AN Examination of Candidates for certificates of competency as Engineers and Surveyors of Land and Works will be held, at a place to be notified in the *Argus*, at Ten o'clock on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the 22nd, 23rd, and 24th days of April next.

Candidates are requested to be in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day.

All candidates must forward, before the 31st of March next, to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, at the Offices of Railways and Roads, Spencer street, notice in writing of intention to present themselves for examination, giving address and name in full, and at the same time enclosing the sum of (£2 2s.) two guineas with articles of indenture and certificates (if any) that they may possess from properly constituted bodies of examiners.

Candidates are requested to provide themselves with drawing instruments and scale.

No candidate will be admitted for examination unless the above conditions are complied with.

The fees will be paid by the secretary into the consolidated revenue.

The Board issues two classes of certificate, A and B, both of which qualify for an appointment; but a first-class certificate (A) is evidence that the grantee has passed with credit.

The following are the subjects in which candidates will be examined:-

1. Field-work and Topography.—Use and adjustment of instruments.
2. Construction and Maintenance of roads, including principles and practice.
3. Substructures.—General principles and practice in relation to various materials.
4. Collection and distribution of Water, including general principles and practice.

TORRES STRAITS.

MR. JARDINE, the Harbor Master at Somerset, reports the existence of the following dangers in Torres Straits, viz.:

A reef about 150 or 200 yards in diameter, lying in the fairway between the Brothers Hills Island and the pearl fisheries at Banks and Mulgrave Islands. This reef dries at low water springs, and from it—

Cap Island (highest point) bears ... E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

Brothers Hills Island (west point) ... N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ N.

A Sand-bank lying a short half-mile N.N.W. from Albany Rock, near the position of the 5 fathom sounding marked on the plan of Port Albany. The bank is about 200 yards long east and west, very narrow, steep to, and nearly awash at low water springs.

Also, that the shoal ground marked on the Admiralty charts as lying about one mile to the westward of the northern Mount Adolphus Island—but with no sounding less than 4 fathoms—has very little water on it at low water springs, the "ripples" being caused by rocky and foul ground. A deep channel, however, exists between this danger and the west point of the island.
