PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF DOOKIE.—Four hundred and forty-eight acres two rods eighteen perches, county of Moira, parish of Dookie: Commencing at the north angle of James Moylan's licensed land; bounded thence by that land bearing south fifty chains seventy-nine links; thence by allotment 164 bearing west eleven chains twenty links; thence by a line bearing south fifty chains; thence by a road bearing west thirty-two chains ten links; thence by a line bearing north fifty chains; thence by allotment 165 bearing west twenty-three chains; thence by allotment 159 bearing north forty chains nineteen links; thence by Peter Battersley's land bearing east eighteen chains, south ten chains, east twenty chains, and north twenty-one chains eighty-four links; thence by De Soyre street bearing N. 63° 26' E. fourteen chains fifty-four links; and thence by Coghill street bearing S. 63° 26' E. seventeen chains ten links to the commencing point.—(72.F.7391.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

YARCK COMMON.—The unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries shall be and constitute a Common, to be designated the Yarck Common: commencing at the west angle of allotment 8, parish of Yarck, being a point on the south-eastern side of the road from Yea to Merton; thence by that road bearing north-easterly to the north angle

of allotment 19*; thence by a road bearing south-easterly to Spring Creek; thence by that creek downwards to the road which forms the west boundary of allotment 93, parish of Alexandra; thence by that road and the road forming the south-western boundary of Yarck bearing north and north-westerly to allotment 5 of Yarck; thence by that allotment and a line bearing north-easterly to the east angle of allotment 8 aforesaid; and thence by the southern and south-western boundaries of that allotment westerly and north-westerly to the commencing point. 4000 acres, more or less, as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.H.17351.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, upon the application in writing of the Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale, do hereby proclaim the said

SHIRE OF BAIRNSDALE,
save and excepting the Townships of Bairnsdale and Mitchell, as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

ST. KILDA VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS.

RULES.

1. An annual meeting of the corps shall be held in the month of July in each year, of which one week's notice shall be given, at which the civil staff, consisting of the two senior commissioned officers, five members of the corps, a secretary and a treasurer shall be appointed (of whom three shall form a quorum), who shall audit the accounts, manage and dispose of the funds of the corps, and generally take into consideration any matters connected with the corps which may be referred to them by the officer commanding.

2. The officer commanding the corps may at any time convene a general meeting, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members, at which no rule or bye-law shall be passed unless ten (10) days' notice by posting in the orderly room shall have been given. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside. Twenty to form a quorum.

3. All members changing their permanent address must, within fourteen days, give notice of the same in writing to the officer commanding, under the penalty of Five shillings.

4. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days, must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and uniform in a place to be appointed by the officer commanding, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

5. Any member not on parade when the numbers are taken shall be deemed absent, unless a sufficient reason shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before the end of the month. Any member coming late (not exceeding a quarter of an hour) and assigning a reason for so doing, which is deemed sufficient by the officer commanding, shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

6. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

7. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularities on parade, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

8. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

9. Any member not producing his arms for inspection when called upon to do so, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

10. A list of all fines imposed in any month, and which have not been previously paid, shall be signed by the officer commanding, and posted in the Orderly Room or other place appointed, not later than the 5th of the following month.

11. All fines must be paid to the drill instructor, or other person appointed by the officer commanding, within one month of being posted; and the person so receiving such fines shall hand them over to the treasurer who shall keep an account, and submit the same for inspection half-yearly or whenever deemed advisable.

12. Members failing to make themselves effective, as per volunteer regulations, shall be liable to a fine of Forty shillings, but the commanding officer may remit the whole or any part of such fine.

13. If any member wishes to transfer to another corps, the officer commanding the corps to which transfer is desired must pay to the credit of this corps the value of his uniform at the time of transfer, or in default thereof the member so desiring to be transferred shall, previous to transfer, be made to pay a proportionate amount for the same according to the length of time such uniform shall have been worn.

14. Every member joining the corps to be supplied with a copy of these rules and regulations.

**NORTH OVENS SHIRE COUNCIL.
AMENDED BYE-LAW, No. 1.**

For providing for the management of the affairs and proceedings, and regulating the conduct of the officers of the North Ovens Shire Council, made under Part 12 of the Shires Statute.

IN pursuance of the 187th section of 33 Victoria, No. 358, the Council of the Shire of North Ovens ordains as follows, that is to say:—

1. That the regular meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, North Wangaratta, on the first Monday of each month, and that the business shall commence as soon as the legal quorum (five) is present; but should such quorum not be present at the expiration of one hour after the time appointed for such meeting, the same shall be entered with a note of the names of the members absent in the minute book, and such meeting shall be adjourned for not more than fourteen days, and the secretary shall give notice to members of such adjournment.

2. Special meetings may be called at any time by order of the president or of three members of the council, addressed to the secretary, in writing, giving four days' clear notice, and specifying the business to be considered.

3. That the first business at all the meetings of this council shall be the reading of the minutes of the preceding meeting for confirmation, and that no discussion shall be allowed thereon except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings. The reading and considering of all correspondence, presentation of petitions, and bringing up of reports, shall have precedence, in the order named, of the regular business, and finally notices of motion.

4. On the presentation of any petition the same shall be on the table until the next meeting of the council previous to the same being discussed; and no motion shall be discussed unless notice has been granted at a previous meeting, or when a special meeting has been called for the purpose.

5. Every notice of motion should be in writing and signed by the mover, and no such motion shall be proceeded with unless the mover or some person authorized by him be present when the business is called on, and any notice of motion not disposed of shall not be discussed for a period of six months, and then only on a fresh notice being given.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of the former meetings of the council, and any business which the president may think fit to bring under the notice of the members.

7. Every member (including the president) shall address the council standing, and no member while speaking shall be interrupted unless called to order, when he shall immediately sit down; the member raising the point of order shall then be heard in preference to any other; when such point of order shall be decided by the president previous to the subject under discussion or any other matter being resumed.

8. Any member moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken thereon; and no member shall be allowed to speak more than once on any question, except by way of explanation or in reply to any original motion or amendment of which he is the mover; and after such reply the amendment or original motion (as the case may be) shall be immediately put to the vote.

9. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original question is put to the vote; but upon any amendment being carried it shall be competent for any member to move one other amendment thereon, but not more.

10. All matters for the consideration of the council shall be decided by open voting, and all the members present shall vote on the matter under consideration. The president shall put every motion first in the affirmative, and afterwards in the negative; and all votes shall be taken by a show of hands.

11. No member shall at the council table be allowed to impute improper motives to any other member, and the ruling of the president shall be final on all points of order and practice, and he shall state the same without comment or argument.

12. Any member wilfully transgressing these rules, and not becoming amenable to the ruling of the chair, shall be liable to a fine not exceeding Ten pounds.

13. No election to any paid office at the disposal of the council shall take place until six days' public notice thereof has been given by advertisement in one or more of the local papers, inviting applications from properly qualified candidates.

14. All contracts shall be made by tender, and shall be duly advertised as the council may direct.

15. Tenders to be addressed to the president of the council, and shall only be opened at the council meeting appointed for the consideration of the same.

16. The officers of the council shall be required to give satisfactory security for the fulfilment of their respective duties; and should such officers at any period during their engagement neglect or fail to perform any or either of their various duties, whereby the council may sustain any damage or loss, they shall for every such neglect forfeit a sum not exceeding Five pounds (£5) sterling.

17. All officers who may receive any monies on account of the council shall, within three days of such receipt, pay the same to the treasurer of the council, and shall furnish at each ordinary meeting of the council a detailed statement of the same in writing. The treasurer shall present his account at every regular meeting of the council; or after if necessary.

18. In all cases it shall be considered sufficient for the collector to call once for payment of any amount due on the assessment roll, and in the event of any such amount not being paid to him, a notice shall be left stating that, unless the amount be paid before the expiration of one month from the date thereof, legal proceedings will be taken for its recovery.

19. In cases of emergency any one or more of these standing rules may be suspended *pro tem.* with the consent of a majority of the council.

Interpretation clause.—The word "president" shall in all cases signify the permanent president of the council, or in his absence any councillor appointed to preside at any meeting of the council. The term "council" shall in all cases signify a quorum of the council.
