## PART I. OF "THE POLICE OFFENCES STATUTE 1865" EXTENDED.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the town hereinafter mentioned, that is to say :-

THE TOWN OF NAGAMBIE.

## COMMON.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, and direct the more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive

Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

**CURRAWA AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON INCREASED.**—The Currawa Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, described in four several Proclamations, bearing date respectively the 31st day of December 1866, the 6th day of April 1868, the 29th day of December 1868, and the 18th day of July 1871, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the following boundaries, viz.:— Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment 222, parish of Dookie; thence by lines bearing respectively west three hundred and twenty-one chains, north one hundred and sixty-six chains, east nine chains, north twenty chains, west thirty-four chains, north three hundred and twenty-two chains, east one hundred and one chains five links, S. 8° 8' W. sixty-eight chains, S. 81° 52' E. one hundred and eight chains, S. 8° 8' W. twenty chains, S. 81° 52' E. thirty-three chains sixty-one links, N. 8° 8' E. twenty-five chains, N. 81° 52' W. one hundred and eleven chains sixty-one links, N. 8° 8' E. sixty-seven chains, east two hundred and fifty-four chains, south two hundred and thirty-six chains ten links, west seventy chains, south thirty chains, east seventy chains, south forty chains, S. 80° 49' E. eighty-three chains six links, and south thirty-one chains seventy-four links to a point on the north side of the road which forms the north boundary of the parish of Dookie bearing north from the north-west angle of allotment 214; thence by that road bearing west one hundred and twenty-one chains; thence by a line and the west boundary of allotment 219 bearing south thirty-three chains; thence by lines bearing respectively west fifty chains thirty-two links and south twenty-seven chains; thence by the north side of the road forming the north boundary of allotment 221 bearing east eleven chains seventy-four links; thence by a line bearing south forty-eight chains ninety-five links to the north boundary of allotment 222 aforesaid; and thence by the north and west boundaries of that allotment bearing respectively west twenty-two chains seventy-nine links and southerly forty-seven chains ninety-five links to the commencing point; comprising about 19,323 acres: excepting all portions of land exempted under the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869*.—(73.L.1732.)
