NOTICE TO PERSONS OCCUPYING RESERVED LANDS FOR MINING PURPOSES.

NOTICE is hereby given to all persons occupying, or claiming the right to occupy, under any authority heretofore granted by the Governor in Council and the Board of Land and Works, any portion of the lands reserved or set apart or used for public purposes in the several mining districts, that, if they still desire to occupy such lands, they should forthwith make applications for leases of the same, in conformity with the provisions of the regulations relating to gold mining leases on reserved lands, made by the Governor in Council on the 24th February 1873, and published in the *Government Gazette* of the 28th February; and it is further notified that, after the expiration of one month from the date of this notice, all authorities heretofore granted as first above mentioned will be liable to be revoked.

PUBLIC ROAD WITHIN THE SHIRE OF SAINT ARNAUD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public road within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force: provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as hereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public road within the meaning of the said Act the land reserved or used for the road, highway, or thoroughfare within the shire of Saint Arnaud, the limits of which are hereinafter described, viz.:-

From the Borough of Saint Arnaud to the Avoca River at Coonor Bridge: Commencing at a point on the northern boundary of Dundas street, St. Arnaud, where it is intersected by the prolongation of the centre line of Jones street north-easterly; thence north-westerly by the northern boundary of Dundas street seventy-eight links; thence N. 13° 5' E. distance one hundred and fifteen chains seventy-three links; thence north twenty-one chains; thence N. 49° 12' E. distance thirty-six chains thirty-five links; thence N. 48° 22' E. distance sixty-three chains sixty-three links; thence N. 21° 37' E. distance one hundred and six chains forty-six links; thence N. 09° 23' W. distance eighty-seven chains fifty links; thence N. 21° 52' E. distance twenty-four chains twenty links; thence N. 34° 37' E. distance thirty-four chains one link; thence N. 24° 52' E. distance twenty-seven chains thirty-two links; thence N. 4° 13' W. distance two hundred and nineteen chains eighty-three links;

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thence N. 3° 38' W. distance fifty-seven chains eighty-eight links; thence N. 23° 38' W. distance sixteen chains thirty-one links; thence N. 21° 42' E. distance sixteen chains sixty-one links; thence N. 52° 22' E. distance ten chains to the River Avoca; thence south-easterly by the River Avoca for a distance of one hundred and fifty links; thence S. 52° 22' W. distance nine chains fifty links; thence S. 21° 42' W. distance fifteen chains sixty-nine links; thence S. 23° 38' E. distance fifteen chains ninety-nine links; thence S. 3° 38' E. distance fifty-eight chains twelve links; thence S. 4° 13' E. distance two hundred and twenty chains seventeen links; thence S. 24° 52' W. distance twenty-seven chains seventy-eight links; thence S. 34° 37' W. distance thirty-three chains ninety-nine links; thence S. 21° 52' W. distance twenty-three chains; thence S. 0° 8' E. distance eighty-seven chains fifty links; thence S. 21° 37' W. distance one hundred and seven chains four links; thence S. 48° 22' distance sixty-three chains ninety-five links; thence S. 49° 12' W. distance thirty-five chains seventy-five links; thence south twenty chains fifty-seven links; thence S. 13° 5' W. distance one hundred and sixteen chains twenty-nine links to the northern boundary of Dundas street, St. Arnaud; thence by that boundary north-westerly to the commencing point.

TIMBER RESERVE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, that is to say:—

VICTORIA STATE FOREST.—One hundred and thirty-six thousand acres, more or less, counties of Anglesey, Evelyn, and Wonnangatta: Commencing on the southern side of the road from Melbourne to Wood's Point, at the point where the east boundary of the land in the parish of Gracedale, licensed to John Eccles abuts thereon; thence by that road to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section C at Fernshaw; thence by surveyed lands at Fernshaw bearing north-easterly, north-westerly, south-westerly, south, and south-easterly to the south angle of allotment 4 of section G, being a point on

the right bank of the Watts River; thence down that river to the foot of a spur running in a southerly direction from Mount Monda on the Great Dividing Range; thence by that spur northerly to a line running parallel with and one mile southerly from the summit of the said range; thence by that line bearing north-westerly to a point bearing south-west from Mount Saint Leonard; thence to the summit of that mount; thence by a line bearing magnetic east to a line formed by the prolongation of the west boundary of surveyed lands in the parish of Nar-be-thong; thence by that line and those lands bearing magnetic east about five miles and a half, to a point on a line running parallel with and one mile northerly from the summit of the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; thence by a line bearing northerly about two hundred and thirty chains to the south angle of suburban allotment 34 of section 4, Marysville; thence by the south-eastern boundaries of sections 4 and 5, bearing N. 36° 40' E. about seventy-eight chains to the Stevenson River; thence by a line bearing north about twenty-five chains to the Melbourne and Wood's Point road; thence by that road easterly to a line running parallel with and one mile north-westerly from the Great Dividing Range aforesaid; thence by that line bearing north-easterly, easterly, and south-easterly to a point bearing north from the source of Armstrong or Meola Creek; thence to the source of that creek; thence down that creek to the River Yarra-Yarra; thence down that river to the Cement Creek; thence by a line bearing north-westerly to the source of Grace burn; thence down that burn to the land licensed to John Eccles aforesaid; and thence by that land bearing north twenty-four chains sixty links to the point of commencement: as shown on the plans deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(78.L.1771.)

DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS, by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district to proclaim any part of such shire or road district to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim

THE WHOLE OF THE SHIRE OF OTEGO,
with the exception of the Township of Omeo, and ten miles from it, to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

IN pursuance of the provision in the 6th section of the Act to amend the Mining Statute 1865 (36 Victoria No. 446), relating to contracts for working leased lands on tribute or copies of such contracts, verified by affidavit, being filed in the office of the Mining Registrar of the district wherein the land demised is situate, the Officer administering the Government in Council has directed that the fees which shall and may be demanded and received by the mining registrars for or in respect of duties performed by them in conformity with the aforesaid section shall be such, and such fees shall be paid before or at the time of performing the duty in respect of which they shall be payable, and that the registrar to whom such fees shall be payable shall be responsible for the collection of such fees.

REGULATIONS RELATING TO GOLD MINING LEASES ON RESERVED LANDS.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the tenth day of March 1873.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Officer administering the Government.

WHEREAS by the 30th section of the Act No. 446, intituled *An Act to amend the Mining Statute 1865*, it is enacted that the Governor in Council, in the name or on behalf of Her Majesty, upon application made to him for that purpose, may grant leases to any person of mines on, under, or upon lands granted or reserved for railways, waterworks, public parks, places of recreation, or other public purposes, subject to such regulations as may be from time to time passed by the Governor in Council for that purpose, and with the consent of the Board of Lands and Works, in whom the said lands are vested: And whereas it is desirable to make regulations for the granting of such leases: Now therefore His Excellency the Officer administering the Government, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of every power enabling him in that behalf, doth by this present order make the regulations following, i.e.:

INTERPRETATION CLAUSE.

1. In construing these regulations the following words and expressions shall have the meanings hereafter assigned to them, except where inconsistent with the context:—

"The Minister" shall mean the responsible Minister of the Crown administering the Act aforesaid.

"The Warden" shall mean a Warden of the Gold-fields in and for the colony, or any district thereof, in which the mines or some portion thereof, are situated.

"The Clerk" shall mean a Warden's Clerk or a Clerk of Petty Sessions.

"The mines" shall mean the mines the lease of which is applied for.

The singular number shall include the plural and the plural the singular.

MANNER IN WHICH LEASES SHALL BE APPLIED FOR.

2. Any person desiring to obtain a lease of mines in, under, or upon any lands, vested in the Board of Land and Works, which have been granted or reserved for railways, waterworks, public parks, places of recreation, or other public purposes, shall address to the Governor, and leave with the warden, an application, in duplicate, in the form in the schedule hereto, marked A., having attached thereto a plan of the lands in which the mines are situate, showing the situation of the mines and the position and direction of the shafts, drives, and other works, proposed to be executed by the applicant for the purpose of mining, and shall, on the day of his leaving such application with the warden, deposit with the clerk the sum of £5, which shall be appropriated in such manner as the minister may direct, and shall, within three days after such day, or in the first issue of any such newspaper after the expiration of three days from such day, insert, as an advertisement, in a newspaper circulating in the neighborhood of the mines, a copy of such application.

3. On receipt of any such application, the warden shall cause to be entered in a book, kept for the purpose, a note of the application, numbered in order, and the day and hour when the same was left with him, and shall cause to be endorsed, a similar note on both such duplicate applications.

4. In cases where more than one application is made for the same land, the first in order of receipt shall be first dealt with.

OBJECTIONS.

5. Any person objecting to any application made under these Regulations shall, previous to the time appointed for the enquiry by the warden hereinafter provided for, lodge with the warden and leave for the applicant, or, if more than one, for each applicant, at his or their address, stated in the said application, a statement in writing of the grounds of his objections, and at the time of leaving his statement with the warden, deposit with the clerk of the warden, or with any other clerk in his office authorized to receive deposits, the sum of £5, which shall be dealt with and appropriated in such manner, as the minister may direct.

ENQUIRY INTO APPLICATIONS AND OBJECTIONS.

6. The warden shall proceed to hold an enquiry at a time and place to be notified by him to the applicant and all other persons who shall notify, in writing, to such warden that they are interested in the enquiry, and such time shall be not less than fourteen clear days after the publication of such advertisement, and every applicant shall receive not less than seven clear days' notice, and every such other person shall receive the same notice as an applicant, or such notice as the time of his notifying his interest to the warden will allow.

7. At such enquiry the warden shall take evidence in relation to the application and the objections thereto, if any; and shall within seven days after termination of the enquiry forward to the minister the application, together with the objections thereto, if any, and the evidence taken by him and his opinion thereon.

8. The warden shall have power to adjourn the hearing to any other time or place.

9. Any applicant or objector shall be permitted to take a copy of the application and the evidence, and any other documents produced at the enquiry, at any time before the same shall have been forwarded to the minister.

LEASES.

10. Upon receiving from the warden any such application the minister shall if he think fit cause the same and the documents accompanying it to be submitted to the Governor in Council and the Board of Land and Works, who shall determine—

Whether to grant such application subject to any and what covenants, clauses, stipulations, restrictions, and conditions, or whether to refuse such application, and to determine what sum of money (if any) ought to be paid by the applicant as compensation for damage to the lands on which the mines are situate, and what security (if any) shall be given by the applicant to make good any damage that may result from his mining beyond that for which such sum to be paid as aforesaid shall be a sufficient compensation.

11. Whenever the Governor in Council shall order a lease to issue under these regulations, the Minister shall cause such lease to be prepared and submitted to the Board of Land and Works for their approval, and the rent reserved by every such lease shall be such as the Governor in Council shall determine.

MISCELLANEOUS RULES.

12. If any applicant shall make default in proceeding in accordance with these regulations, or if he neglect to execute and take delivery of the lease within sixty days after a notice properly addressed has been sent to him through the post office that the lease is ready for execution, the minister may, by an order under his hand, declare the application abandoned, and cause to be published in the *Government Gazette* a notice to that effect, and after the publication of any such notice such applicant shall not be entitled to proceed with his application or to execute or accept delivery of any such lease: Provided that, in any case where an applicant appears at an enquiry by an agent, or gives sufficient reasons in writing on or before the day on which the enquiry is to be holden why he cannot appear, his application shall be proceeded with at such times and places as the warden may think fit.

13. Before executing any lease the applicant shall pay to the Receiver and Paymaster of the district within which the mines lie the cost of the preparation of the lease; and also the first half-year's rent reserved in the lease, and any sum to be paid by him by way of compensation, and shall give any security that may be required of him, as hereinbefore provided, and he shall produce receipts for such payments and such other payments as under the provisions of the Act he may have been required to make before executing the lease; and he shall not be permitted to execute the lease and the same shall not be delivered to him until such receipts have been produced and such security has been given.

14. If the lease shall be refused a notice to that effect shall be published in the *Government Gazette*, and all proceedings in relation to the application shall be stopped; but the applicant, or any other person, may make a fresh application for the same mine, and such application shall in all respects be dealt with as the Act and these regulations prescribe.

15. Any applicant may at any time withdraw his application by giving notice in writing to the minister; and in like manner any objector may, before or during the enquiry held by the warden, withdraw his objections.

16. Any applicant, or objector, may proceed under these regulations by his attorney, provided that such attorney be constituted by the execution of a power-of-attorney for that purpose in such form as shall be approved of by the minister.

17. Any person or persons being the holder of a lease granted under these regulations, except any person who by operation of law shall be entitled to sell or dispose of such lease for the benefit of creditors, in which case no license shall be necessary, may apply to the minister for a license under the hand and seal of the Governor, to transfer, underlet, mortgage, or otherwise

dispose of or encumber such lease, or the mines or premises comprised therein, or any part thereof, and it shall be lawful for the Governor to grant or refuse such license. Every such application must be accompanied with a remittance of £1, which will be returned if the license be not granted. The minister shall determine the form of the license to be granted.


