**ADDITIONAL PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.**

**PROCLAMATION**

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and St. George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time, in like manner, may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an additional Port and Harbor Regulation and to be observed accordingly:—

No person shall take, lead, drive, or conduct any horse or other animal, or any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or any vehicle whatever, drawn by any one or more horses or other animal upon or along any public pier, jetty, or wharf without the consent of the Harbor Master or Pier Master in charge of such public pier, jetty, or wharf; and the person in charge of such carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or any vehicle, shall not, without the consent of the said Harbor Master or Pier Master, leave the same, or allow or permit or suffer the same to be left on any such pier, jetty, or wharf.

#### BALLARAT DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor herewith to forward the quarterly report on the state of the Ballarat district.

I have inspected 247,296 sheep during the quarter, all of which were free from disease. I have had four prosecutions, two under section 49 of the Act, one under section 67, and one under section 22; and in each case obtained a conviction.

The Board of Advice for this district met once during the quarter. I believe the Ballarat district is still perfectly free from disease.

No stations have been released from quarantine during the quarter, but several applications for release from quarantine have been sent in during last month, and will be considered at the next meeting of my Board of Advice.

#### SEYMOUR DISTRICT.

I HAVE the honor to report as to the state of scab in the Seymour district for the quarter ending 31st March.

At the present time I have no sheep under license in this district, and know of no scab existing on any of the stations, but do not expect the winter to pass over without its showing.

Last month I had a very satisfactory inspection of the sheep on Mr. Lloyd-Jones' stations, Avenel, Upton, and Mangalore, and found no scab or any straggling unshorn sheep. All the sheep were dipped at shearing, as some stragglers from Mr. Youngusband's station, Killeen, were found among them, and there were at that time sheep under license at Killeen. In consequence of this dipping I shall not be able to pronounce positively as to the state of Mr. Jones' flock until another shearing has passed.

A portion of the sheep on Avenel were licensed in March 1872, since which I have not found scab on any of these stations.

I intend to have an inspection of the sheep on Mr. Youngusband's stations this month. All the sheep, 70,000, were licensed at last shearing. The last license lapsed in February. At present I am not in a position to speak as to their state.

I had a prosecution against Mr. Jones on the 13th ultimo. He was fined £100 by the Avenel Bench for dipping his sheep without an authority from me. He gave notice of appeal.

Fluke has hardly shown itself up to the present in the district, owing, I consider, to the abundance of green pasture, the season having been an exceptionally favorable one for grass.

There is very little "Pleuro" in the district. Mr. Tidbould, a farmer at Dargalong, lost several valuable cows from it, but as no deaths have occurred for some time past it is to be hoped the disease has worn itself out.
