PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor if he shall think fit by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Ten thousand pounds by such name as in and by such order shall be assigned thereto to be a town, and by such notice to proclaim any borough whose gross revenue for the year preceding was not less than Twenty thousand pounds to be a city, and such borough shall thereupon be called such town or city accordingly; provided that no borough after the proclamation thereof as such city, save as herein provided with regard to the adjustment of boundaries to those of wards, shall be united with any other city or with any shire; and it is also enacted that every town or city shall after the proclamation thereof as such be and be deemed to be and to have been such and the same borough (to all intents and purposes) as such town or city was at the time of such proclamation; and save as aforesaid, and save where herein otherwise expressly provided, all the provisions of this Act relating to boroughs shall continue and be of full force and effect with regard to such town or city and be read accordingly: And whereas the gross revenue of the Borough of East Collingwood for the year ending the thirtieth day of September 1872 was not less than Ten thousand pounds: And whereas the boundaries of the said borough are amongst others described in the first schedule of the Act hereinbefore recited, and it is deemed expedient to proclaim the said borough to be a town: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do, in pursuance of the provisions of the said Act, by this notice proclaim the Borough of East Collingwood to be a Town, by the name in and by the Order in Council made in this behalf assigned thereto, that is to say—

TOWN OF ARAPILES.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby subdivide a portion of the county of Lowan

into a town, and do define the boundaries of such town and distinguish it by the name prefixed to the description, that is to say :—

TOWN OF ARAPILES.—County of Lowan, parish of Tocon, comprising allotments 4 and 5 and parts of allotments 8 and 9: Commencing at the north angle of allotment 4, being a point on the south-western side of the road from Lawloit to Balmoral; bounded thence by that road bearing S. 42° 8' E. one hundred and two chains fifty-three links and S. 66° 23' E. seventeen chains thirty-three links; thence by a road bearing south twenty-two chains forty-six links; thence by a line bearing west one hundred and eighteen chains fifty links; thence by a road bearing north forty-two chains fifty-six links; thence by a road bearing east thirty-four chains; and thence by a line and a road bearing north sixty-two chains forty links to the commencing point.—(73.K.986.)

PUBLIC STREET IN THE BOROUGH OF SANDRIDGE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the Council of the Borough of Sandridge, do by this notice proclaim to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the street, highway, or thoroughfare hereinafter described, that is to say—

Street in the Borough of Sandridge.

Name, Bridge street; width, 99 feet; limits, from Evans street, bearing N. 45° W. thirty-five chains seventy-five links, to the sand ground.—(72.F.9453.)

TIMBER RESERVE.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight, Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and be set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim as a Reserve made for the preservation and growth of timber, in accordance with and subject to the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described (excepting the

portions thereof which may have been applied for under the 19th or 49th section of the said Act, prior to the date of this Proclamation, and for occupation of which portions licenses may hereafter be granted), viz. :—

CAPE OTWAY STATE FOREST.—Commencing at the point on the left bank of the Gellibrand River, where the west boundary of allotment 27 of block A, parish of Yagher, abuts thereon; thence by a line bearing south eleven miles and three-quarters, more or less, to the left bank of the River Aire; thence by that river downwards to the River Calder; thence by a line crossing the last-mentioned river, and by that river downwards to the sea-coast; thence by the coast south-easterly and north-easterly to the mouth of the Wild-dog Creek; thence by a line bearing northerly to Burst-my-gall Hill in the range which forms the eastern watershed of the Wild-dog Creek aforesaid; thence by that range bearing northerly to the source of the Gellibrand River near Mount Sabine; and thence by the Gellibrand River downwards to the commencing point: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 145,000 acres.—(72.E.8238.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the town hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE TOWNSHIP OF CORON.

PILOTS' SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND, ETC.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for the establishment of a Sick and Superannuation Fund for the benefit of pilots, pilots' widows, and children of pilots, in lieu of the Regulations of the 5th June 1871, published in the *Gazette* of 23rd June 1871.

RULES FOR THE ESTABLISHMENT OF A SICK AND SUPERANNUATION FUND FOR THE BENEFIT OF PILOTS, PILOTS' WIDOWS, AND CHILDREN OF PILOTS, MADE UNDER "THE PASSENGERS, HARBORS, AND NAVIGATION STATUTE 1865." AMENDED 6TH SEPTEMBER 1867, No. CCCXII.

1. *Superannuation.*—No pilots unless they shall have completed a term of ten (10) years' service shall be entitled to be placed upon the superannuation list, and in the event of their decease before the completion of such service their widows and children shall not be entitled to participate in the benefit of the fund.

2. *Superannuation.*—Pilots who having attained the age of sixty (60) years shall have become in the opinion of the board incapacitated from following their calling, or pilots after serving ten (10) years and upwards who from infirmity or other grounds of incapacity shall have become in the opinion of the board unfit for duty, shall be entitled to an annual pension from the superannuation fund according to the annexed scale:—

3. *Provision for widows of pilots.*—Widows of pilots whose husbands have served ten years and upwards shall receive remuneration from the fund in proportion to the annexed scale.

On the decease of a pilot, either in the exercise of his calling or subsequent to his being placed on the superannuation list, leaving a widow him surviving, such widow will become entitled to a pension, having reference to the term of service of her deceased husband, according to the annexed scale:—

The above scale is subject to the proviso that the pension to the pilot's widow shall in no case exceed £40 per annum, unless she shall have been married to him 10 years or upwards at the time of his death or superannuation, whichever shall first happen; and shall in no case exceed £50 per annum unless she shall have been married to him at least 15 years at the time of such decease or superannuation.

4. *Provision for children of pilots.*—If a pilot shall die, leaving a widow and children, a capitation allowance shall be made in favor of the children at the rate of £6 5s. per annum to each child, until he or she shall have attained the age of 15 years, as long as the widow shall continue in existence. On her decease, should there be any children under the age of 15 years her surviving, the pension payable to the widow is to be divided into as many equal portions as there are children, and each such portion is to be continued as a yearly allowance in addition to the capitation allowance payable as aforesaid to each such child to be continued until the age of 15 is attained, but without benefit of survivorship between the children, and subject to the further proviso that no child shall in any case receive a larger allowance (capitation money included) than £15 per annum.

In the event of a pilot dying leaving children under 15 years of age, but no widow him surviving, the allowance to each child is to be calculated as if the pilot had died leaving a widow surviving him for a period of twenty-four hours.

5. *Scale for the future relief of those persons who have from time to time been receiving bounty from the fund.*—The following is the scale of payments adopted by the board for the persons hereinafter named, who have for a period of time received bounty from the fund:—

Mary Steele, widow of John Steele (pilot) deceased, £20 per annum.
 Louisa Jones, widow of William Jones (pilot) deceased, £31 5s. per annum.
 Mary Hansen, widow, and 6 children of William Hansen, (pilot) deceased, £65 12s. 6d. per annum.
 Mary Cowley, widow of Colin G. Cowley (pilot) deceased, £31 5s. per annum.
 John Neill Nicholson, child of William Nicholson (pilot) deceased, £14 1s. 3d. per annum.
 Margaret Nicholson, child of William Nicholson (pilot) deceased, £14 1s. 3d. per annum.
 Alexina Eliza Nicholson, child of William Nicholson (pilot) deceased, £14 1s. 3d. per annum.
 Margaret Lang Nicholson, child of William Nicholson (pilot) deceased, £14 1s. 3d. per annum.

N.B.—These children being orphans, the calculation is based as £6 5s. for each child, and £31 5s. the widow's allowance additional, Mr. Nicholson having, at the time of his decease, been 12 years in the service.

6. *Sick allowance.*—A sick allowance of Twenty-five shillings per week shall be paid to each pilot so long as he shall give satisfactory evidence to the board that he is incapacitated by reason of illness from performing his duty.

7. *Retiring allowance.*—A retiring allowance of Twenty-eight pounds ten shillings and sixpence is fixed as the retiring allowance to any pilot leaving the service for each year that he shall have served, provided such term of service shall have been not less than ten (10) years, and also that he grants a release to the board from all future claims against the fund on behalf of himself, his wife, and children.

8. *Suspension of widow's allowance on her re-marriage.*—In all cases of a widow of a pilot re-marrying, her pension shall be suspended from the date of her re-marrying; but in the event of her again becoming a widow, her pension may be restored to her upon proof being adduced to the satisfaction of the board that she is in circumstances needing assistance and is otherwise deserving of bounty, but it will be again liable to suspension during future re-marriages.

9. *Increase of fund by contribution from pilots' earnings.*—With a view of increasing the fund, all pilots shall pay towards its maintenance a sum of one and a quarter per cent. on their gross earnings, to be deducted by the secretary with the administrative expenses.

10. *Gratuity inalienable.*—The provision hereby made for pilots, their widows and children, are intended to be personal and inalienable by charge, mortgage, executions under judgment, insolvency, or other voluntary or involuntary disposition, and notwithstanding any assignment which may purport to have been made thereof, the board shall pay the person entitled irrespective of any such assignment; or, if necessary for the protection of such persons under this clause, the board may apply the same at their discretion for the benefit of such persons, or of other members of their families.

11. *Reservation of board to rescind, alter, or amend preceeding rules.*—The board reserves to itself the power of rescinding, modifying, or altering the preceeding provisions in any particular (if the condition of the fund, or other circumstances should in their opinion make it desirable so to do) both as to the then existing or inchoate claims upon the fund, and as to future claims.
