REGULATIONS UNDER THE EDUCATION ACT 1872.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the sixteenth day of January 1873.

WHEREAS by the 18th section of the *Education Act 1872* it is enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make and rescind regulations for, amongst other purposes, regulating the secular instruction to be given in all schools under the said Act, the salaries to be paid to teachers, the payments by way of results, the scale of fees to be paid by parents, the distribution of such fees amongst the teachers, and the deduction and appropriation of a percentage thereof for payments by way of results : Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this Order make the Regulations following :—

I.—COURSE OF FREE INSTRUCTION.

Class I.

- Reading and Spelling.*—Tablets ; First Reading Book Irish National Board, or its equivalent.
Writing.—Capital and small letters on slate, from copies on black-board, and from dictation.
Arithmetic.—Notation—learning to write and read numbers up to 20 ; oral addition and subtraction of numbers, each less than 11.
Rhymes.—To learn them daily.
Needlework.—Those who are able to learn, to commence.
Disciplinary Exercises.

Class II.

- Reading, Spelling, and Explanation.*—Irish National Board's Second Book, or equivalent.
Writing.—Single and double turns on paper, copying on slates in manuscript sentences from tablets or books 1 or 2, and writing on slates from copies set on black-board.
Arithmetic.—Simple addition and subtraction, and multiplication tables.
Grammar.—Learn to distinguish articles, nouns, and adjectives.
Geography.—The continents, oceans, and larger seas, with their relative positions.
Needlework.—To be learning to hem.

Class III.

- Reading, Spelling, and Explanation.*—Irish National Board's Third Book, or equivalent.
Dictation.—From Second Book or equivalent.
Writing.—In copy-books, text-hand.
Arithmetic.—Notation and numeration, four simple rules, and money tables.
Grammar.—The parts of speech.
Geography.—Minor seas, chief gulfs, capes, bays, peninsulas, and islands in the world.
Needlework.—Hemming and seaming.

Class IV.

Reading and Explanation.—In Irish National Board's Fourth Book, or equivalent.

Dictation.—From Third Book, or equivalent.

Writing.—Small-hand.

Arithmetic.—To compound rules and reduction.

Grammar.—Inflections of nouns, pronouns, adjectives, and adverbs, and the principal parts of verbs.

Geography.—The countries, with their relative positions and capitals; the principal mountains, rivers, and lakes of the world.

Needlework.—Hemming, seaming, stitching, and darning.

Class V.

Reading and Explanation.—Prose and poetry, in an advanced reading book.

Dictation.—From an advanced reading book.

Writing.—Running-hand.

Arithmetic.—To simple proportion and practice, with the four simple rules in decimals.

Grammar.—Parsing, and the inflections of the parts of speech.

Geography.—Maps of Europe and Australia.

Needlework, for Girls.—To hem, seam, stitch, darn, work buttonholes, gather, and knit.

Class VI.

Reading and Explanation.—Any book or newspaper.

Dictation.—From any book or newspaper.

Writing.—Mercantile writing.

Arithmetic.—Vulgar and decimal fractions.

Grammar.—Syntax, and prefixes and affixes, and analysis from Morell.

Geography.—Generally of the world.

Needlework.—Put work together, cut out, and all plain needlework.

II.—SALARIES OF TEACHERS.

1. Teachers employed on the 31st of December 1872, whilst holding the same positions in the same schools, will receive, for the remainder of the present financial year, that is, to the 30th of June 1873, the same fixed salaries and also the same allowances for results as they would have been entitled to under the Regulations of the Board of Education if such regulations had continued in force, and they will receive as an equivalent for fees an amount at the rate of nine-tenths of their actual receipts on account of fees during the six months preceding the 1st of January last. If at any time it is found that the number of scholars in actual attendance in any school has diminished below the average in such school for the year 1872, the amount paid as the equivalent for fees will thenceforth be diminished in proportion. After the 30th of June 1873, all teachers will be paid according to the next Regulation.

2. All teachers, except those under the last Regulation, will be paid as follows:—

Certificated teachers will receive annual salaries according to the following scale:—

Head Teachers.

- In schools where the average attendance is below 20, £80.
- In schools where the average attendance is not less than 20 but under 30, £100.
- In schools where the average attendance is not less than 30 but under 50, £110.
- In schools where the average attendance is not less than 50 but under 75, £120.
- In schools where the average attendance is not less than 75 but under 100, £130.
- And so on, the salaries increasing £10 for each increase of 25 in the average attendance of scholars up to 350, after which the increase will be £10 for each increase of 50 in the average attendance.

Assistant Teachers.

- 1st assistants will receive £80, with £20 for every 100 scholars in attendance above the first 50.
- 2nd assistants will receive £80, with £10 for every 100 scholars in attendance above the first 150.
- 3rd assistants will receive £80, with £10 for every 200 scholars in attendance above the first 250.
- 4th assistants will receive £80, with £10 for every 300 scholars in attendance above the first 350.
- 5th assistants will receive £80, with £10 for every 400 scholars in attendance above the first 450.

Other assistants, £80 only.

Uncertificated teachers and assistants will receive annual salaries not exceeding £80.

Pupil teachers will receive annual salaries varying from £20 to £50 according to their class.

Workmistresses will be paid at the uniform rate of £30 per annum.

Head teachers; assistant teachers, and pupil teachers, being females, will receive one-fifth less than the above scale.

Note.

Teachers will generally be employed in schools according to the following scale:—

To schools where the average attendance is below 30, 1 teacher.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 30 but below 50, 1 teacher; 1 work-mistress.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 50 but below 75, 1 teacher; 1 work-mistress; 1 pupil teacher.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 75 but below 100, 1 teacher; 1 assistant.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 100 but below 125, 1 teacher; 1 assistant; 1 pupil teacher.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 125 but below 150, 1 teacher; 1 assistant; 2 pupil teachers.

To schools where the average attendance is not less than 150 but below 175, 1 teacher; 2 assistants; 2 pupil teachers.

After which a pupil teacher and an assistant will be allowed alternately for each successive increase of 50 in the average attendance.

It is not intended at once to reduce the allotment in schools already in existence, but as vacancies occur they will only be filled up in accordance with the above scale.

III.—PAYMENTS BY WAY OF RESULTS.

1. In addition to their fixed salaries, payments will be made to head teachers and assistant teachers by way of results, upon examination of their schools by an inspector, in the subjects specified in Schedule I. of the Act.

The maximum payment which any teacher can obtain by way of results will be an amount equal to one-half of his fixed salary.

In order to entitle the teachers of any school to this maximum:—

1. Every scholar who has attended such school during any part of the five weeks preceding the inspector's visit must be presented for examination.
2. The inspector must be satisfied that all the scholars below seven years of age in class I. are under proper instruction and discipline.
3. That every other scholar has been satisfactorily instructed up to the standard of the class with which he is presented by the teacher.
4. That the scholars are classified and instructed in accordance with Regulation I.
5. That the average age of the scholars does not exceed in class II., nine years; in class III., ten years and three months; in class IV., eleven years and six months; in class V., thirteen years; and in class VI., fourteen years. But the ages of any scholars whom the teacher may present for examination as proficient to the full extent of the course of free instruction will be omitted in calculating the average age of class VI.

Any school complying with the above conditions will have the maximum number of marks awarded to it, viz.:—

3 marks for each scholar under 7 years of age in class I.

5 marks for each scholar over 7 years of age in class I, and for each in class II.

7 marks for each other scholar.

1 mark for each girl above 7 years of age where needlework is taught.

Marks will be withdrawn for individual scholars and for classes failing to comply with any of the above conditions, and the result payment made to the teachers will be in the same ratio to the maximum as the number of marks actually awarded is to that which might have been obtained.

IV.—FEES FOR EXTRA SUBJECTS.

1. Fees payable by parents for subjects not included in the First Schedule to the Act, herein called extra subjects, will be at a uniform rate for each subject, and not exceeding one shilling per week.

NOTE.—The amount of the fee for each subject will be determined by the Minister as occasion may arise.

2. One-fourth of the fees will be deducted, the teacher who gives the instruction retaining the other three-fourths; the amount deducted will be distributed amongst the teachers in the extra subjects on the principle of payments by results.

3. Instruction in extra subjects must not be given so as to interrupt the course of instruction in accordance with Rule I.

And the Honorable JAMES WILBERFORCE STEPHEN, Her Majesty's Minister of Public Instruction for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

REGULATIONS UNDER THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of January 1873.

WHEREAS by The Diseases in Stock Act 1872, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may from time to time make such regulations as may be deemed expedient for all or any of the purposes mentioned in the 4th section of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order, in exercise of the power conferred by the above recited Act, and every other power enabling him in that behalf make the regulations following, that is to say:—

1. The diseases mentioned in the first schedule hereto are hereby declared to be contagious or infectious diseases, and all stock affected with such diseases are hereby declared to be diseased stock for the purposes of The Diseases in Stock Act 1872.

2. All the sections of the said Act shall extend to all stock of the kinds mentioned in the second schedule hereto.

3. The introduction of any stock mentioned in the second schedule hereto into the colony either by sea or land known to be suffering from any of the diseases mentioned in the first schedule hereto is prohibited.

INTRODUCTION OF STOCK FROM THE AUSTRALASIAN COLONIES AND NEW ZEALAND.

Stock not to be introduced into the colony without a written authority.

4. No one shall introduce into the colony, either by sea or land, any stock of any kind mentioned in the second schedule hereto, coming from any of the Australasian colonies or New Zealand, without the authority in writing of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority.

Stock to be landed and introduced at certain places only.

5. Such authority may be granted to introduce such stock at any of the places mentioned in the fourth schedule hereto, but shall not, unless under special circumstances, be granted to introduce stock at any other place.

Steps to be taken by inspectors before authorizing stock to be introduced or to travel.

6. No inspector shall authorize any of the said stock to be introduced or to travel until he has inspected such stock, and is satisfied that it is free from any of the diseases mentioned in the first schedule hereto, and has received a statutory declaration made by the owner or person in charge, stating the number and description of stock which he is desirous to import, and that the same have been free from disease and from contact with any diseased stock for the space of not less than thirty days, and has counted the same, or been otherwise satisfied in regard to the number of stock to be so imported, and received the charge imposed by the 7th section of the said Act in respect thereof, for which charge a receipt shall be given in the form of the third schedule hereto.

Authority to introduce saddle and draught horses, working bullocks, &c.

7. In the case of the introduction of saddle horses, draught horses, pack horses, and working bullocks, used *bona fide* for the purpose of riding, draught, or carrying burdens, having been once inspected and paid the charges specified in the said section, special authority may be granted by an inspector and continue in force until revoked by a notice from such inspector, to enable such horses or bullocks to pass and repass, without further inspection or payment of the said charges, between any portions of either of the adjoining colonies and this colony.

INTRODUCTION INTO THE COLONY OF STOCK FROM PLACES OTHER THAN THE AUSTRALASIAN COLONIES AND NEW ZEALAND.

Stock from outside the Australasian Colonies to be landed at Sandridge.

8. No stock of any kind mentioned in the second schedule brought by sea to the colony from any place other than one of the Australasian Colonies or New Zealand shall be introduced at any other place than Sandridge, or without the authority, in writing, of an inspector of stock, and except in accordance with the conditions of such authority.

Stock to be certified by a veterinarian before introduction.

9. Before authorizing the introduction of any such stock the inspector shall be furnished with a certificate in the form or to the effect of the fifth schedule hereto from some veterinary surgeon in whom he has confidence that such stock are in his opinion free from any of the said diseases, and a statutory declaration from the master of the vessel in which such stock have been brought to this colony that they have not suffered from any such disease during the voyage, and be satisfied that the said stock are free from any of the said diseases.

Inspector may authorize removal from quarantine.

10. No inspector shall authorize the removal from any quarantine ground of any stock ordered to have been placed in quarantine until they have been twice disinfected to his satisfaction, and have been detained until he is satisfied that they appear to be free from any of the said diseases.

Introduction of fodder and fittings.

11. No inspector shall authorize the introduction into the colony of any fittings until they have been properly disinfected to the satisfaction of the inspector, nor of any fodder, other than oilcake, bran, barley, beans, or pease, except for the purpose of burning such other fodder on the beach.

Fodder, &c., not to be thrown overboard in port.

12. No fodder or fittings, shall be thrown overboard from any ship in any port of the colony.

The Governor in Council to appoint quarantine places for stock.

13. The places or buildings at which stock may be kept in quarantine may be from time to time determined and varied by the Governor in Council, and on the publication in the *Government Gazette* of an order of the Governor in Council declaring any place or building a place at which stock may be kept in quarantine, and defining the boundaries of such place or building, such place or building together with any adjoining land, the boundaries whereof are defined by such order and declared to form part of the district hereinafter mentioned, shall become, and until the variation or revocation of such order, continue a quarantine district.

TO PREVENT THE SPREAD OF DISEASE IN THE COLONY.

The inspector may direct that premises on which he has discovered disease shall be a quarantine district.

14. Where an inspector finds any of the said diseases to exist in stock, he shall forthwith make a statutory declaration thereof under his hand and deliver a notice under his hand of such declaration to the occupier of the premises where the diseased stock is found, and thereupon such premises and all lands and buildings contiguous thereto in the same occupation, and all other lands and buildings the inspector may think fit to include, and on the occupiers of which, if any, he shall serve notice, shall become a quarantine district until the determination and declaration of the Governor in Council relative thereto.

Steps to be taken by an inspector after discovery of diseased stock.

15. When an inspector makes a statutory declaration of the existence of disease, he shall forthwith forward a copy thereof and a notification of the boundaries of the quarantine district as fixed by him, to the chief inspector of stock, and the Governor in Council may either declare such district a quarantine district and prescribe the boundaries thereof, or that such district be released from quarantine, and, on the publication of such declaration in the *Government Gazette*, such district shall either continue a quarantine district with the boundaries prescribed by the Governor in Council, or shall cease to be a quarantine district, as the case may be.

Owners of diseased stock may be required to keep notices affixed.

16. The inspector may from time to time direct persons in the occupation of any premises included in a quarantine district to affix and keep affixed notices to such effect, on such portions of such premises and in such manner as the inspector may order, and such persons shall affix and keep affixed the same accordingly.

Inspector may seize diseased stock, &c.

17. Where an inspector finds diseased stock, he may seize the same and take such steps as he may deem expedient to ensure the isolation and safe custody of such stock, and he shall at once report the circumstances to the Chief Inspector.

Quarantine districts may be altered.

18. The Governor in Council may by Order alter from time to time the boundaries of or abolish any quarantine district.

Stock not to be removed from quarantine without authority.

19. No stock shall be moved out of any quarantine district without the written authority of an inspector.

Inspector may order premises, fittings, &c., to be disinfected.

20. The inspector may direct any quarantine district or any portion thereof, or anything thereon, or that has been in contact with any diseased stock, or any clothes of anyone who has been in contact with any diseased stock to be disinfected in such manner as he may think fit, and all persons shall permit the same to be disinfected accordingly.

Owners to disinfect and treat stock for diseases.

21. The inspector may direct the owners of any stock of any of the kinds mentioned in the second schedule to subject them to any treatment for the cure of any of the said diseases or for the purpose of disinfecting them, and the owners of such stock shall with all diligence carry out such directions.

Stock illegally moved out of quarantine to be taken back.

22. Any constable may require that any animal mentioned in the second schedule hereto or thing moved out of a quarantine district in contravention of these regulations or of the said Act be forthwith taken back at the cost of the owner within the limits of such district, and may enforce and execute such requisition.

Diseased stock not to be exposed for sale at markets or travelled, &c.

23. If any person exposes in a market or other public place where stock are commonly exposed for sale, or exposes in any sale yard, whether public or private, or places in any lair or place adjacent to or connected with any market, or where stock are commonly placed before exposure for sale, or sends or causes to be carried on a railway or on a canal or river, or by any other inland navigation, or on a coasting vessel, or carries leads or drives or causes to be carried led or driven on a highway or thoroughfare, or keeps on any common or on the side of a highway, or unless such stock be constantly followed and kept in sight on any unenclosed land, or in any field or other place insufficiently fenced, any stock of any of the

said kinds affected with any of the said diseases, he shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations unless he show to the satisfaction of the justices before whom he is charged that he did not know of the said stock being so affected, and that he could not with reasonable diligence have obtained such knowledge.

Owner of diseased stock required to give notice thereof.

24. The owner or the person having the charge or custody of any stock affected with any of the said diseases shall forthwith give notice to the chief inspector, and if any inspector shall find any stock to be diseased, before such notice has been given, every such owner and person shall be deemed guilty of an offence against these regulations, unless he show to the satisfaction of the justices before whom he is charged that he did not know of such stock being diseased, and that he could not, with reasonable diligence, have obtained such knowledge.

Persons not to transgress these regulations.

25. No person shall do, or cause to be done, or assist in doing any act forbidden by these regulations; or obtain, or endeavor to obtain, or assist anyone in obtaining or endeavoring to obtain by fraud any authority under these regulations, or forge any authority purporting to be issued under these regulations, or make use of any such forged authority or fraudulently grant or issue any such authority, or obstruct, or refuse to carry out the directions of any inspector or other person acting under the authority of these regulations.

WHEREAS by The Local Government Act 1863 it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council from time to time, if it shall seem fit, to add to any district not divided into subdivisions, or to any subdivision, or separately to two or more subdivisions of a district so divided, any portion of the colony actually adjoining to such district or subdivision, as the case may be, and not lying within the limits of the city of Melbourne or town of Geelong, or of any municipal or road district; and every such portion so added shall thereupon become and be part of such first-mentioned district to all intents and purposes, and of the subdivision, if any, to which the same shall have been added: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fifth day of February 1857, a road district was proclaimed under the designation of "The Dandenong Road District:" And whereas by an Order of the Governor in Council made on the seventh day of December 1868, the said road district was divided into three separate electoral subdivisions: And whereas it has seemed fit for the Governor in Council to add to the South subdivision a portion of the colony not lying within the limits of the above-mentioned city and town, or any municipal or road district: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order add to the South subdivision of the said Dandenong Road District a portion of the colony adjoining to such subdivision (such portion not lying within the city or town above mentioned, or any municipal or road district), in accordance with the above-recited provisions of the said Act; and doth re-define the said subdivision added to as aforesaid, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SOUTH SUBDIVISION—Starting at the north-west corner of section 22, parish of Mordialloc; thence eastward to and along the north boundary of section 52, parish of Dandenong and to the Dandenong Creek, down this creek to the north-west corner of allotment 95, parish of Eumemmering; southward by the west boundary of this allotment and of Nos. 60 and 59, and to the south-east corner of allotment 95, Lyndhurst; westward by the south boundary of this allotment and of Nos. 97, 92, 91, and in continuation of last bearing of latter line to the shore of Port Phillip Bay; northward along the shore to the Mordiallock Creek, up this creek and along the south boundary of allotments 20 and 22, parish of Mordialloc, and to the south-east corner of the latter allotment, and northward to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

WHEREAS by The Shires Statute (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas by an Order in Council, bearing date the nineteenth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the Cranbourne Road District was divided into subdivisions: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-fourth day of February, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-eight, the said Road District was constituted the Shire of Cranbourne, and the subdivisions of the Road District thereupon became the Ridings of the Shire: And whereas by another Order in Council, bearing date the seventh day of December, One thousand

eight hundred and sixty-eight, the Dandenong Road District was divided into subdivisions. Owing to the splendid season for grass the sheep in this district are in excellent condition, and very little fluke showing.

BYE-LAW, No. 47, TO REGULATE THE CARRIAGE OF PERSONS AND GOODS THROUGH THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

Bye-Law of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, made under part 12 of the Boroughs Statute.

IN pursuance of part 12 of the Boroughs Statute the Council of the City of Sandhurst ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1. The driver of every cart, carriage, or other vehicle which is halduring the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day, be in any street or public place within the City of Sandhurst, shall keep lights attached on each side to such cart, carriage, or other vehicle under his control, so as to be plainly visible to the driver or person in charge of any vehicle proceeding along or through such street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first-mentioned cart, carriage, or other vehicle shall be directed; and in the case of a night-cart, such lights shall be so disposed as to appear white in front and red at the outer side.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle, or ride any horse or other animal at other than a walking pace across the intersection of any of the streets of the said city.

3. No person shall fasten a horse or other animal to the fences of the public reserves abutting upon a street or streets of the said city, or to the trees, or guards of trees, planted in the said city.

Any person committing a breach of any of the clauses of this Bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.
