IMPORTANCE OF VACCINATION.

THE recent introduction of Small-pox to the colony has again shown our liability to such an attack at any moment; and, although the disease has happily been again prevented from gaining a footing here, the Central Board of Health deem it of great importance to the safety of the public that every advantage should be taken of the present very favorable season for vaccination, so that the protection which vaccination is known to afford against the horrors of Small-pox may be extended as widely as possible throughout the colony.

The Central Board therefore trust that the local sanitary authorities will use all means in their power for securing the extension of vaccination in their respective districts; and as the Board believe that the ministers of the various religious bodies might very beneficially use the influence and opportunities they possess in directing attention at the present time to the proved benefits of vaccination, they desire to appeal to the latter also to use their influence in promoting a hearty compliance with the provisions of the Vaccination Act.

DATE FOR HOLDING THE NEXT GENERAL SESSIONS
AT GEELONG CHANGED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the next Court of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned place for the district of Geelong to be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the day appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said court, that is to say:—

At Geelong, on Tuesday the twelfth day of August in the present year, in lieu of the twenty-ninth day of the said month.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this sixteenth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and in the thirty-sixth year of Her Majesty's reign.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (38 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Lillydale therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the part of the Shire

of Lillydale described in such petition from such shire, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Templestowe Road District: And with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the said Road District and of the South-Western Riding of the said Shire of Lillydale in manner following, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (38 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Seymour therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the part of the Shire of Seymour described in such petition from such shire, and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Pyalong; and, with the advice aforesaid doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the Seymour and Tallarook Ridings of the Shire of Seymour as hereby diminished, and of the South and East Ridings of the Shire of Pyalong as hereby added to, in manner following, that is to say:—

THE SEYMOUR RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF SEYMOUR.—Commencing at the junction of the Glenaroua and Sunday Creek runs with the electoral boundary of Rodney and Dalhousie; thence north-easterly about seven and a half miles to the junction of Hughes' Creek with the Goulburn River; thence southerly by the Goulburn River to the north-east angle of Banks and Boyd's pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line east to a point due south of the south-east angle of Jones' pre-emptive section; thence north to and by the eastern boundary of the said pre-emptive section to the southern boundary of the township of Avenel reserve; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said township reserve to Hughes' Creek; thence up that creek to its junction with a tributary north of the northern boundary of Abdallah pre-emptive section; thence southerly by that tributary to its intersection with the said northern boundary; thence westerly by the northern boundary, southerly by the western boundary, and easterly by the southern boundary, to the intersection of the said southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence by that tributary southerly to the northern boundary of Kobyboyn pre-emptive section; thence

easterly by the northern boundary, southerly by the eastern boundary, and westerly by the southern boundary of Koboy-boyn pre-emptive section to the intersection of its southern boundary by the aforesaid tributary of Hughes' Creek; thence up that tributary southerly to a point due north of the north-west angle of Grant's pre-emptive section; thence by a direct line south to the said north-west angle, and further south by the western boundary of Grant's pre-emptive section to the Goulburn River; thence north-westerly by the Goulburn River to a point about one and a half miles below the junction of the Narrangearnong Creek, and north of a point on the road from Yea to Tallarook, one mile twenty-eight chains west of its intersection with the Narrangearnong Creek; thence due south to that road, and north-westerly by the said road to a point due south of the eastern boundary of Woorough pre-emptive section; thence due north to the Goulburn River, and by the Goulburn River north-westerly to the Sugarloaf Creek; thence by the Sugarloaf Creek south-westerly to the centre of a road between Ryan's selections; thence by that road westerly about thirty-nine chains, south-westerly about nine chains, and north-westerly about one and a half miles to a point due south of the junction of the Glenaroua and Sunday Creek runs with the electoral boundary of Dalhousie and Rodney; thence due north about eight and a half miles to the commencing point.

THE TALLAROOK RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF SKYMOUR—Commencing in the centre of the road forming the northern boundary of the parish of Broadford at its intersection by the Sunday Creek; thence eastward by that road to the Dabyngs Creek, and further east by a straight line to a point due south of the south-east angle of Woorough pre-emptive section; thence northward to the Goulburn River; thence by the Goulburn River north-westerly to the Sugarloaf Creek; thence south-westerly by the Sugarloaf Creek to a road north of allotments 107, 108, and 104, in the parish of Lowry; thence by that road south-easterly to the Sunday Creek, and by the Sunday Creek southerly to the point of commencement.

THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF PYALONG—Commencing in the centre of the road from Lancefield to Pyalong at the county boundary of Bourke and Dalhousie on the Dividing Range; thence north-easterly by that road to a road north of allotments 80, 81, 84, and Mollison's pre-emptive section; thence by the centre of that road easterly to the centre of the road from Kilmore to Heathcote; thence southerly and south-easterly by the Heathcote and Kilmore road to a point due west of a road north of allotments 139, 138, and 137, in the parish of Moranding; thence by a straight line due east to the centre of the said road, and by that road further east to the centre of the road west of the north-west angle of Mount Piper reserve; thence by the last-named road south-westerly to its junction with a road north of the Willowmavin Special Survey; thence westerly by the road north of Willowmavin Special Survey to the creek that forms its western boundary; thence by that creek southerly to the northern boundary of allotment 29, parish of Forbes; thence by the northern boundary of allotments 29 and 30, parish of Forbes, and a straight line due west to the Dividing Range forming the boundary of Bourke and Dalhousie counties; thence northerly and westerly by the Dividing Range to the commencing point.

THE EAST RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF PYALONG—Commencing in the centre of the road west of the north-west angle of Mount Piper Reserve; thence due west by the road north of allotments 137, 138, and 139, in the parish of Moranding, and by a straight line further west to the centre of the road from Kilmore to Heathcote; thence by that road north-westerly and northerly to the Mount William Creek; thence north-easterly by that creek to its junction with Mollison's Creek; thence by a line due north to the boundary of the Rodney and Dalhousie Electoral Districts; thence by the said electoral boundary north-easterly to its intersection with the boundaries of the Glenaroua and Sunday Creek runs, about seven miles and a half from the junction of Hughes' Creek with the Goulburn River; thence due south about eight miles and a half to the centre of a road north of John Mooney and Anne Patterson's selections; thence by that road to the Sunday Creek, and by the Sunday Creek southerly to the centre of a road forming the boundary of the parishes of Lowry and Broadford; thence by that road westerly to Cameron's Creek, and by Cameron's Creek southerly to the point of commencement.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

No. 357, § 6)*.

RULES OF THE GENERAL BODY OF TRUSTEES.

All former rules and regulations are hereby repealed, and in lieu thereof the following are enacted:—

1.—ORDINARY MEETINGS.

The trustees shall meet monthly.

2.—SPECIAL MEETINGS.

A special meeting shall be convened by the secretary on the requisition of two trustees.

3.—QUORUMS AND ADJOURNED MEETINGS.

Three trustees shall form a quorum. If a quorum be not formed within half an hour of the time named, the meeting, whether ordinary or special, shall be called for a day to be named by the trustee or trustees then present; and the business which should have been transacted shall have precedence at the meeting on the day so fixed.

4.—NOTICE OF MEETINGS.

The trustees shall be duly supplied by the secretary with a notice of the day, hour, and place of every meeting, and of all motions to be made or special matters to be considered thereat; and any trustee may hand to the secretary a notice of motion in writing, which it shall be the secretary's duty to insert in such notice paper, and also in a book to be called the notice of motion book.

5.—SECTIONS.

For the more convenient and effectual performance of the duties imposed upon the trustees, they shall be divided into five sections.

1. The Library.
2. The National Gallery.
3. The Industrial and Technological Museum.
4. The National Museum.
5. The Building.

For each of the sections a committee shall be appointed from the trustees, which committee shall have the control and management of the business of the section, subject to the approval of the trustees; and it shall be competent for the trustees to dissolve such committee and appoint another in its place. Each sectional committee shall once at least in twelve months report its proceedings to the trustees, and the trustees may at any time require a special report.

6.—PRESIDENT.

There shall be a president, a vice-president, and a treasurer elected annually in April, and each shall remain in office until a successor to each be appointed. The president shall preside at the meetings of the trustees; in his absence, the vice-president; in the absence of both, the meeting shall elect its chairman. The chairman shall have a deliberative vote, and in case of an equality of votes shall give a casting vote.

7.—TREASURER.

1. One of the trustees shall act as treasurer, and shall sign all vouchers and financial documents.
2. The treasurer shall be an *ex officio* member of each sectional committee, but shall not be chairman.

8.—COMMITTEES.

Each committee shall meet monthly. Two members shall form a quorum. A special meeting for the consideration of business shall be convened on the requisition of any member.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CONDUCT AND INFORMATION OF VISITORS TO THE PUBLIC LIBRARY, MUSEUMS, AND NATIONAL GALLERY.

GENERAL.

1. The library shall be open every day, except on Sunday, Christmas Day, Good Friday, and such days as the trustees may by special order direct.
2. The museums and galleries shall be open daily during such hours as may be appointed, except on such days as the trustees may by special order direct.
3. Any visitor behaving in an unbecoming manner shall be excluded from the institution.

SPECIAL.

THE LIBRARY.

1. No book is to be taken out of the library.
2. Every book taken from a shelf is to be returned to the place from which it was taken.
3. Writing in or upon, marking, folding down a leaf, defacing, mutilating, or otherwise injuring any book, is strictly prohibited. Ink is not to be used, except by special permission.
4. Children under fourteen years of age are not admitted.

Conditions upon which Duplicate Books will be lent by the Trustees to Free Libraries.

1. Books will be lent to the trustees or committees of mechanics' or literary institutions, or to the councils of municipalities.

2. The borrowers shall place the books lent in a suitable apartment, to be approved of by the committee; and admit the public to the use of the books therein for such hours as may be appointed by the local committee, but in other respects subject to the rules of the library.

3. The borrowers shall insure, at their expense, the books lent to them in a sum equal to the value thereof, and shall deliver to the committee the policy, and receipts for the annual premium: all insurances to be made payable at Christmas in each year.

4. The borrowers shall bear all the expenses of taking the books from and returning them to the library, and of having them collated on their return (the cost of collating not to exceed 10s. for 100 volumes); and no final receipt will be given for the books until after they have been collated and an adjustment made for the imperfections or loss (if any).

5. The borrowers shall give security to the satisfaction of the committee, in an amount equal to the value of the books lent to them, that the works will be returned at the expiration of the period of the loan in good condition, regard being had to reasonable wear.

6. The borrowers and sureties are to be liable for—

- i. The value of any book not returned.
- ii. If a volume of a work consisting of several volumes, or if a set, or if a series, then the value of the work, set, or series.
- iii. When any work, set, or series rendered imperfect is replaced by the borrower, the imperfect work, set, or series will be handed over to such borrower.
- iv. The estimated value of the injury done to any volume, work, set or series, or book-case, of which the committee shall be the sole judges.

THE INDUSTRIAL AND TECHNOLOGICAL MUSEUM.

Lectures.

Admission to the lectures will be by ticket, to be obtained either gratuitously or at such prices as the trustees fix.

Laboratories.

With a view of promoting the development of the industrial resources of the country, analyses will be made, on application, of minerals, soils, and other substances, at rates to be fixed by the trustees.

Rules for Students.

1. Persons desirous of joining the class lectures can do so on application to the superintendent of the museum, on such terms as the committee direct.
2. Students receiving instruction shall pay a term fee in advance to the master.
3. Students may enter the class at any time during the term, on payment of the fractional part of the term fees, but the least fraction shall be one month.
4. An approved guarantee must be given to the committee, or a sum paid as a deposit, to cover the expense of chemicals and apparatus used by the student; the amount to be fixed by the superintendent.
5. All laboratory students will be admitted free to all lectures connected with the institution, except class lectures.
6. All students shall, when leaving, remove or carefully put away all chemicals and apparatus used by them.
7. The committee will not be responsible for any loss of or injury to any property of any such person left on the premises.
8. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct upon the part of any student, when proved to the satisfaction of the committee, shall subject such student to be excluded for such period as the committee may think fit.

THE NATIONAL GALLERY.

Rules for Students in the Schools of Painting and Design.

1. Applicants for admission as students shall submit specimens of their skill to the masters and the committee. If such specimens are considered satisfactory, the applicants shall be admitted on probation, and shall prepare drawings within the school of design; and on the same being approved by the master, the applicants shall, on payment of fees, be registered as students.
2. If applicants for admission shall be found endeavouring to impose upon the committee, by presenting as specimens of their ability drawings not of their own performance, they shall be declared incapable of being admitted as students.
3. Students receiving instruction shall pay a term fee in advance to the master.
4. Students may enter the schools at any time during the term, on payment of the fractional part of the term fee; but the least fraction shall be one month.
5. No person will be allowed to copy any picture, drawing, or work of art in the galleries of painting and sculpture without having first obtained permission in writing from the committee; and such permission shall specify the part or parts of any such picture, drawing, or work of art not to be included in the copy.
6. The master shall have the right to determine the order in which students shall be permitted to copy any picture, and the period for which such students shall have priority.
7. All students shall sign the students' book on every day they attend, when they enter the gallery.
8. All students shall, when leaving the gallery, remove or carefully put away all materials used by them in drawing or painting.
9. The committee will not be responsible for any loss of or injury to any property of any such person left in the gallery.

10. Any irregularity or unbecoming conduct upon the part of any student, when proved to the satisfaction of the committee, shall subject such student to be excluded for such period as the committee may think fit.

BEACONS AND BUOY, AUCKLAND HARBOR.

NOTICE is hereby given that two iron perch beacons (painted black) have been erected on the south side of the Waitemata Channel, near Kauri Point.

The upper beacon is erected on the northern extreme of the Boat Rock Reef, and is surmounted by a diamond-shaped cage 22 feet above the surface of the reef, and 13 feet above high-water spring tides.

The lower beacon is erected on the outer end of the reef, immediately opposite Kauri Point, and is surmounted by a circular-shaped cage 24 feet above the surface of the reef, and 15 feet above high-water spring tide.

Also that a cask-buoy (painted black) has been placed on the south-western edge of the Sunken Rock, off the north of Hillyard's Creek, and lies in two and a-half fathoms at low water.

Masters of vessels are cautioned not to pass to the southward of the line of beacons, or within a cable's length northward of them, as rocky patches and uneven ground extend some distance out from the beacons.

SEYMOUR QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing on the Goulburn River at a point where the eastern boundary of the Woorrough run abuts thereon; thence up that river to the south-west corner of the Nainabulla run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Droppmore run; thence by the southern, western, and northern boundaries of that run to Gobur run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to Borodomannin South run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run to Borodomannin North and Junction runs to the Barjarg run; thence northerly by the eastern boundary of that run to the Lima run; thence westerly and northerly by the southern and western boundaries of that run to the Warrenbayne run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Honeysuckle North run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western portion of the northern boundaries of that run to Stony Creek run; thence by the western boundary of that run to the Gowangardie run; thence by that run north-westerly to the eastern boundary of the Caniambo run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the south-eastern boundary of Arcadia run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries of the Molka run to the south-eastern boundary of Noorilim run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; thence up that river to the Merringo run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to Woorrough run; and thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to the point of commencement: Provided that all runs intersected by the boundaries above described shall be held to be within the Seymour Quarantine District: Provided, further, that such part of the Sydney road and all public roads, as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads, as are included in the boundaries above described shall form no part of the Seymour Quarantine District. Provided further that the Mogolemby run shall form no part of the Seymour Quarantine District.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyooora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Moleside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the south-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. The boundaries above described comprise the runs of Greenwald, Glenaulin, and Kentbruck.

HAPPY VALLEY QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the head of the Muddy Creek; thence westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the east boundary of the Glenvale run; thence northerly by the east boundary of that run to the Clonbinane run; thence northerly and north-easterly by the east and south-east boundaries thereof to the southern boundary of the Flowerdale run; thence by the said boundary easterly to the Glenburn run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Muddy Creek aforesaid; and thence to the commencing point.

KILLAWARRA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the north corner of the Owens Crossing-place Station; thence in a south-westerly direction by the Owens Crossing-place, Tameric, Springs, and Mokoan runs; on the west and north by the Goornbat and Peecheiba runs to the Owens River; and on the east by that river to the point of commencement.

BECHWORTH CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray River; thence up the Ovens River to the King River; thence up that river to the Dueran run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that run and by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Howitt, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by the Victoria River to the source of the Victoria River; thence by the Victoria River to the Cobungra run; thence by the western boundaries of the Cobungra, Darbitary, and Bundaramungee runs to the Mitta-mitta River; thence up that river to Wombat Creek, being also a point in the boundary of Gibbo run; thence by the boundary of that run to the north-east corner thereof; thence by a direct line to the south-east angle of Nariel run; thence by the eastern boundary of Nariel to Thongla run; thence by the southern boundaries of Thongla and Beggaria runs to the Indi River; thence by that river to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement.

Any person making, or erecting, or placing a monument in the cemetery, by and with the permission of the trustees, and upon payment of the proper charges, is entitled to have, maintain, and keep a vault, monument, or tombstone, according to the tenor of such permission, to and for the sole use of such person and his or her representatives for ever.

3. Application for such permission is to be made to the trustees through the person in charge. A certificate of permission will be granted to the party applying for the same, upon the payment of the proper charges.

4. Orders for interment will be received from sunrise to sunset. Six hours' notice to be given to the sexton or other person appointed by the trustees previous to the hour appointed for the funeral.

5. The trustees will cause all ordinary graves to be dug, but should a brick grave or vault be required, it must be constructed under the directions of the trustees. No graves to be less than six feet deep.

6. The charges will be remitted for the burial of any person on evidence being produced to the trustees that the relations or friends of such person are unable to pay the charges.

7. The hours for interments are from Ten a.m. to sunset.

8. The trustees reserve the right to alter these regulations and charges from time to time, subject to the approval of the Governor in Council.
