NOTICE TO INTENDING CANDIDATES FOR CERTIFICATES OF COMPETENCY UNDER "THE SHIRES STATUTE" AND "BOROUGHES STATUTE" 1869.

AN Examination of Candidates for certificates of competency as Engineers and Surveyors of Land and Works will be held, at a place to be notified in the *Argus*, at Ten o'clock on Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday, the 5th, 6th, and 7th days of August next.

Candidates are requested to be in the examination room punctually at the hour named each day.

All candidates must forward, before the 25th July next, to the Secretary to the Board of Examiners, at the Offices of Railways and Roads, Spencer street, notice in writing of intention to present themselves for examination, giving address and name in full, and at the same time enclosing the sum of (£2 2s.) two guineas with articles of indenture and certificates (if any) that they may possess from *properly constituted bodies of examiners*.

If a candidate presents himself more than twice and is successful at the third or any subsequent examination, the last fee will be returned.

Candidates are requested to provide themselves with drawing instruments and scale.

No candidate will be admitted for examination unless the above conditions are complied with.

The fees will be paid by the secretary into the consolidated revenue.

The Board issues two classes of certificate, A and B, both of which qualify for an appointment; but a first-class certificate (A) is evidence that the grantee has passed with credit.

The following are the subjects in which candidates will be examined:—

1. Field-work and Topography.—Use and adjustment of instruments.
2. Construction and Maintenance of roads, including principles and practice.
3. Substructures.—General principles and practice in relation to various materials.
4. Collection and distribution of Water, including general principles and practice.

PART II. OF "THE PUBLIC HEALTH AMENDING STATUTE 1867" EXTENDED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act passed in the thirty-first year of Her present Majesty's reign, intituled *An Act to amend the Laws relating to or affecting Public Health* (31 Vict. No. 310), it is amongst other things enacted, that this Part (that is to say, Part II.) of this Act shall apply to all places where the Part of the Act thereby repealed, or any portion thereof, has been in force, and all or some of the provisions of this Part shall also apply to every such city, town, borough, shire, district, or place in Victoria as the Governor in Council shall by Proclamation direct; and the Governor in Council may at any time, and from time to time, alter, repeal, or revoke any such Proclamation theretofore or thereafter made: And whereas Part II. of the above-recited Act was extended to the Shire of Beechworth by a Proclamation bearing date the thirtieth day of October 1869, and to the Borough of Beechworth by a Proclamation dated the twenty-fifth day of January 1870: And whereas by an Order in Council made on the eleventh day of December 1871 the said borough and shire were united and constituted the United Shire of Beechworth: And whereas it is expedient to extend Part II. of the recited Act to the collective areas comprised within the said united shire: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby alter the Proclamations hereinbefore mentioned whereby Part II. of the recited Act was extended to the Shire of Beechworth and the Borough of Beechworth, and do revoke so much of such Proclamations as extends Part II. aforesaid to the said shire and borough; and I do, with the advice aforesaid, by this my Proclamation direct that all the provisions of Part II. of the above-recited Act, 31 Vict. No. 310, shall apply to the united shire hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE UNITED SHIRE OF BEECHWORTH.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereinafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby unite or increase (as the case may be) the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

LEXINGTON AND CHAPMAN UNITED TEMPORARY COMMONS.—The Lexington Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 14th day of May 1866, and the Chapman Temporary Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 18th day of February 1867, and diminished by a Proclamation bearing date the 15th day of April 1867, are hereby united.—(73.L.489.)

MAFFRA COMMON.—The Maffra Common, described in a Proclamation bearing date the 26th day of August 1872, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of the land in the parish of Wa-de-lock licensed to J. A. Du Moulin, being a point on the

south-eastern boundary of the existing common; thence by that land and other licensed lands to the south-east angle of the land licensed to James Boland; thence by allotments 7, 8, and 9 of section 3 in the said parish, and by a line crossing a road bearing south fifty-three chains ninety-five links to the north boundary of the land licensed to W. B. Read; thence by that land and by the land licensed to James Read to the south boundary of the parish; thence by that boundary bearing west about two miles to the land licensed to J. M. Coulson; thence by that land and other licensed lands to the north-west angle of the land licensed to W. S. Williams, being a point on the eastern boundary of the existing common; and thence by that common northerly and north-easterly to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area, about 8000 acres.—(72.F.23897.)

PYALONG UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The Pyalong United Town and Farmers' Common, described in three several Proclamations bearing date respectively the 16th day of April 1866, the 14th day of September 1868, and the 20th day of December 1870, is hereby increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the north angle of the land in the parish of Pyalong licensed to Angus Campbell; thence by lines bearing respectively N. 60° E. two miles and a half, S. 57° E. three miles and a half, and south about three miles to Mollison's Creek; thence up that creek to the eastern boundary of the existing common; thence by the eastern and north-western boundaries of that common to the eastern boundary of the land licensed to Patrick Ryan; thence by that land, by the land licensed to Peter Chalmers, and by the land licensed to Angus Campbell aforesaid, to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian. Area, about 4500 acres.—(73.K.3465.)

TOWN PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter mentioned, and do distinguish such Town by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

TOWN OF KINYSPANIAL.—County of Gladstone: Commencing at the south-east angle of allotment 101, parish of Kinyspanial, being a point on the western side of the Lower Loddon road; bounded thence by the said side of that road, by Henry Thackthwaite's licensed land, and by a line bearing S. 10° E. twenty-two chains three links, and south about twenty-three chains to Henry Wright Brett's licensed land; thence by that land by a line crossing the aforesaid road, and again by that land and a line bearing N. 89° 38' E. about eighty chains to allotment 1, parish of Powlet; thence by that allotment bearing N. 0° 22' W. about forty-five chains to allotment 100, parish of Kinyspanial; and thence by that allotment and a line bearing west eighty-three chains five links to the commencing point.—(73.L.11923.)

The deaths in May were fewer by 52 than those in April. They were above the average of May in the previous ten years by 60; but, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of May by 2.

During the month the highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory was 70°6' on the 8th, and the lowest was 37°6' on the 29th. The mean temperature of the month (55°) was two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (27°6') took place on the 29th, viz. from a maximum of 65°2' to a minimum of 37°6', and the least (8°3') on the 22nd, viz. from a maximum of 58°9' to a minimum of 50°6'. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.980 inches) was slightly below the average.

Males contributed 54 per cent. and females 46 per cent. to the total mortality of the month. Children who had not attained their fifth year of age contributed 40 per cent. to that mortality, against 46 per cent. in May 1872, 39 per cent. in May 1871, 38 per cent. in May 1870, 43 per cent. in May 1869, 45 per cent. in May 1868, 43 per cent. in May 1867, 47 per cent. in May 1866, 56 per cent. in May 1865, 58 per cent. in May 1864, and 52 per cent. in May 1863.

The number of deaths of persons of the age of 75 years and upwards was twelve, viz. those of a gentleman aged 75 of rheumatic fever, of a banker aged 75 of ossification of the arteries, of a laborer aged 75 and a butcher aged 77 of old age, of a laborer aged 75 of congestion of the liver, of a registrar of births and deaths aged 76 of cerebral hemorrhage, of a bricklayer aged 77 of dementia, of a miner aged 82 of septic gangrene, of a female aged 76 of chronic brouchitis, of a female aged 76 of debility, of a female aged 83 of paralysis, and of a female aged 87 of old age.

The violent deaths which occurred during the month numbered seventeen, of which twelve were set down as accidental, two as homicidal, and three as suicidal. The accidental deaths were those of a male infant aged 8 days, who died of injury to the skull at birth; of a lad aged 7 years, who died of pyæmia following a fracture of the leg from a fall; of a lad aged 13, who died of fracture of the skull, the limb of a tree having fallen on him; of a farmer aged 44, who died of paralysis and injury to kidneys from a fall; of a female aged 72, who died of concussion of the brain from a fall; of a quarryman and of a farmer, each aged 60, of tetanus; of a female infant aged 2 years, who died of a burn, its clothes having caught fire; of a female aged 50, who was scalded with boiling water; of a cabman aged 43, who was found drowned; of a male infant aged 8 days, who was suffocated in its mother's arms; and of a female infant aged 11 days, who was suffocated in bed. The homicidal deaths were those of a newly-born female infant, who was intentionally suffocated; and of a seaman aged 34, who was stabbed. The suicidal deaths were those of a sodawater-maker aged 36, and of a carpenter aged 41, who cut their throats; also that of a clerk aged 33, who poisoned himself with strychnine.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 23 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.—38 in the Melbourne Hospital; 9 in the Benevolent Asylum; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 13 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Kew Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 8 in the Lying-in Hospital; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 3 in the Industrial Nursery School; 1 in the Victoria Barracks, and 1 in Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 152, of which 71, or 47 per cent., were of males, and 81, or 53 per cent., were females. Of those who died, 88 were under one year of age, 33 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three years, 8 were between three and four years, and 9 were between four and five years of age.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 230, of whom 134, or 58 per cent., were males, and 96, or 42 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 7 were between twenty and twenty-five, 28 were between twenty-five and thirty, 13 were between thirty and thirty-five, 28 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 9 were between fifty-five and sixty, 17 were between sixty and sixty-five, 11 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 3 were above eighty years of age.

Deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 112 in April to 82 in May. Under this head, deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery declined from 44 in the former month to 23 in the latter; whilst those from scarlatina declined from 11 to 8, and those from diphtheria declined from 18 to 13. Under the head constitutional diseases phthisis caused 38 deaths in the month under review, as against 33 deaths in the former month.
