## TOWN PROCLAIMED UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power vested in me by the said Act, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter mentioned, and do distinguish such Town by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:-

TOWN OF TINTYNDYER.—One hundred acres, county of Tatchera: Commencing at a point on the left bank of the Murray River, near Gnyer; bounded thence by lines bearing respectively south seven chains fifty-one links, west forty-six chains fifty-three links, north twenty-six chains forty-nine links, and east thirty-four chains forty-six links to the river aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the commencing point; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.E.27312.)

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this fourteenth day of July, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

## PUBLIC ROAD IN THE SHIRE OF CRESWICK.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Administrator of the Government of the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public road within the meaning of the said Act, and such land reserved or used for a road, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public road within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public road within the meaning of the said Act the land reserved or used for the road, highway, or thoroughfare which is hereinafter described, that is to say:-

Road in the Town of Smeaton, ninety-nine feet wide, extending from Birch street to Hepburn street.—(73.M.8672.)

## ELECTRIC TELEGRAPH.

AMENDED REGULATIONS AND CONDITIONS UNDER WHICH TELEGRAPHIC MESSAGES ARE AUTHORIZED TO BE TRANSMITTED IN VICTORIA.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following amended Regulations under which Telegraphic Messages may be transmitted in Victoria:—

1. A full and correct address must be given to every message, which must also bear the signature of the sender. Messages must be written with ink. All amounts must be written in words at length, with figures in parentheses.
2. Messages must be transmitted in the order of their reception, and no precedence will be allowed, except for special despatches on the service of the Government, the arrest of criminals, and in cases of pressing emergency, sickness, or death.
3. Payment of charges in advance is required, except for replies to interrogatory messages on which the sender may have written the words "Reply will be paid for;" but special arrangements may be made for the receipt of messages payable by the receiver, either by depositing security at the receiving office, or by furnishing written guarantee to the satisfaction of the manager, covering the cost of transmission.
4. Messages will be delivered free of charge within one mile of the office at which they are received by telegraph; over that distance cab or omnibus fare will be charged, when incurred; and for messages to be delivered on shipboard an extra charge to cover the disbursement for boat hire will be made.
5. Messages may be transmitted in cypher in Roman letters or figures, on payment of an additional charge of fifty per cent. A group of five cypher letters or five cypher figures will count as one word.
6. On special occasions, when the communication may be kept open during the night, the minimum charge will be 5s. for 58 words or under upon all messages received for transmission later than 8 p.m.
7. No pecuniary responsibility is assumed for any errors or delays in the transmission or non-transmission, delivery or non-delivery of any message, from whatever cause the same may arise. In order, however, to afford the fullest security for the correctness of a transmitted message, the sender may obtain a copy of the message as repeated back from the receiving office, upon payment of one-half the original charge upon such message.
8. In the event of serious delay occurring to prevent the transmission of a message within a reasonable time, or sufficient to destroy the value of the despatch, notice will be conveyed to the sender, should his address be known, and the message, together with the amount paid thereon, be returned, if desired.
9. All messages, whether written upon the usual printed forms or upon plain paper, will be considered as tendered for transmission to their destination under the several conditions and stipulations above detailed.
10. The offices will be kept open for the transmission of messages by the public generally between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 8 p.m. (Sundays excepted).
11. In case of any dispute arising as to the number of words chargeable on any message, the same shall be decided in accordance with the rules adopted at the latest European Telegraph Convention.

## TRANSMISSION OF TELEGRAPHIC MESSAGES BY POST.

HIS Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council has approved of the following Regulations for the transmission of Telegraphic Messages free by post:—

Telegraphic messages forwarded by wire from any telegraph station in Victoria, upon which the full telegraph rates payable in this colony have been paid, may be sent by post as letters, for delivery in Victoria or in any of the Australian colonies or New Zealand, without any payment for postage, if enclosed in the usual telegraph envelope.

Letters containing messages for transmission by telegraph from any place within Victoria posted at any post office not a telegraph office, with the words "Telegraphic Message only" written thereon, above the address, and directed to the nearest telegraph office, may be forwarded free of postage; and the officer in charge of the telegraph office to which such letter may be addressed shall transmit the message contained therein to destination, if within the colony of Victoria, provided that at least the minimum telegraph fee of One shilling in postage-stamps be paid thereon, any deficiency being collected on delivery.

Any telegraphic message received by post for transmission by wire, and upon which less than full rate (if for a place beyond Victoria), or less than One shilling (if for a place within the colony); has been paid, shall be returned at once by the officer receiving the same to the sender, together with a note of explanation, enclosing the money received with the message as above.

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has ordered that the portion of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be a Quarantine District within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

**BALLARAT CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the intersection of the main road from Skipton to Smythesdale and the eastern boundary of the Benjamin run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to the Emu Creek; thence up that creek northerly to Baillie's Creek; thence up that creek northerly to Carngnam run; thence by the western, southern, and eastern boundaries of that run to Baillie's Creek; thence by that creek northerly to Lake Burrumbeet; thence westerly and northerly along the margin of that lake to a one chain road, at Paynter's Point, between section 22 and 23, parish of Brewster; thence westerly by that road to the eastern boundary of Trawalla run; thence northerly by the eastern boundaries of that run and Mount Ross run to the south-west corner of the Ercildoum property; thence by the southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that property to the main dividing range; thence bearing westerly by that range to the Alluvale run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Lexington run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to Barton run; thence by the eastern, southern, and western boundaries thereof to La Rose, Mokepile, and Lexington run; thence by the western boundary of that run to Woortook run; thence by the southern boundaries of that run, Rosebrook, and Brim Spring runs to Glenisla run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and Markanger run to the Plains run; thence by the north-eastern boundaries of that run, Mount Sturgeon Plains north, and Mount Sturgeon Plains run to Liallithgow Plains run; thence by the northern boundaries of that run, Burriel-burriel, and Glenronald runs to Greenvale run; thence by the southern and eastern boundaries of that run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to View Lake run; thence by the western and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Fiery Creek and St. Enoch's run to the Benjamin run; thence by the south-western and south-eastern boundaries thereof to the starting point at the intersection of the main road from Skipton to Smythesdale: Provided that the main roads from Dunkeld to Skipton, and from Streatham to Ballarat, *via* Mount Emu and Carngnam, and the road from Carngnam by Trawalla bridge leading north-westerly by the land of Frederick Williams, held under the 42nd section of *The Land Act 1865*, to the northern boundary of the district, together with all reserves on such roads, shall be excluded from and shall form no part of the Ballarat Clean District.

**BEECHWORTH CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the junction of the Ovens River with the Murray River; thence up the Ovens River to the King River; thence up that river to the Duerau run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that run and by a line bearing south-easterly to Mount Howitt, in the Main Dividing Range; thence by that range to the western source of the Victoria River; thence by the Victoria River to the Cobungu run; thence by the western boundaries of the Cobungu, Darbitary, and Bundaramungee runs to the Mitta-mitta River; thence up that river to Wombat Creek, being also a point in the boundary of Gibbo run; thence by the boundary of that run to the north-east corner thereof; thence by a direct line to the south-east angle of Nariel run; thence by the eastern boundary of Nariel to Thongla run; thence by the southern boundaries of Thongla and Begatie runs to the Indi River; thence by that river to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the point of commencement.

**BENALLA CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at the junction of the Goulburn River with the Murray River; thence up the Goulburn River to the Broken River; thence up that river to the Samaria run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of Samaria run to Fern Hill run; thence by the northern, eastern, and southern boundaries of Fern Hill run to Duerau run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of Duerau run to the King River; thence down that river to the Ovens River; thence down that river to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the commencing point. Provided that the Killawarra Quarantine District, published in the *Government Gazette* of 12th April 1872, pursuant to Order in Council of 8th April 1872, shall form no portion of this the Benalla Clean District.

**GREYLONG CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20A, parish of Bambara;

thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

**GIPPSLAND CLEAN DISTRICT.**—Commencing at Cape Patterson; thence by the eastern boundary of the county of Mornington northerly to the south boundary of the county of Evelyn; by part of the southern, the eastern, and part of the northern boundaries of the county last named, easterly, northerly, and westerly to the Main Dividing Range; by that range northerly and easterly to a point due south of the easternmost source of the Livingstone Creek; by a line north to said source; by the Livingstone Creek northerly to its junction with the Mitta-mitta River; thence by a line north-easterly to the south point of the range at Gibbo Station; by that range northerly and a line east to the source of the Cowrang Creek; by that creek northerly to its junction with the Murray; by that river southerly to its source at Forest Hill; thence by the boundary-line between Victoria and New South Wales south-easterly to Cape Howe; and by the sea-coast westerly to the point of commencement including likewise Sunday Island and Snake Island.

Provided that the Main Road from Penola in South Australia to Hamilton *via* Casterton and Coleraine shall form no part of the Hamilton Clean District.

**SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 1.**—Commencing at the point on the Murray River where the eastern boundary of the Murrabit run abuts thereon; thence by the said boundary of that run and the eastern and southern boundaries of the Reedy Lake run to Quambatook East run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and by the northern, western, and southern boundaries of the Quambatook West run to the Avoca River; thence up that river to the Spring Bank West run; thence by the northern boundary of that run and the western boundaries of that run and of the Coonover A and Yawong Springs runs; also by the southern boundary of the last-named run to the Spring Hill run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Brenanah run; thence by the western and north-western boundaries of that run to Powlett Plains run; thence by the southern boundaries of that and Salisbury Plains runs to the Bullock Creek Plains run; thence by the western, southern, eastern, and northern boundaries of that run to Bullock Creek; thence northerly by the western boundaries of the Yarraberb and Tandarra runs; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaninny Creek run thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; and thence down that river to the commencing point: Provided that allotment 96 in the parish of Kinypanial, known as Mackin's farm, and allotments 10 and 12, parish of Powlett, known as Clancy's farm, shall form no part of this Clean District.

**SANDHURST CLEAN DISTRICT No. 2.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of the Yarraberb run; thence by the southern and western boundaries of that run and the western boundary of the Tandarra run; thence easterly by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Piccaninny Creek run; thence by the western and northern boundaries of that run to the western boundary of the Restdown Plains West run; thence by the said boundary of that run bearing northerly to the south angle of the Wharparilla run; thence by the south-western and western boundaries of that run to the Murray River; thence up that river to the north-eastern angle of that run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the northern boundary of Campaspe River run; thence by a part of the northern boundary of that run westerly to the Yarraberb run; and thence by the eastern boundary of that run southerly to the point of commencement.

Rules relating to quarantine for the ports mentioned in schedule A hereto annexed.

The following rules, made by the Chief Commissioner of British Burmah, with the sanction of the Governor-General in Council, in pursuance of the provisions contained in Act I. of 1870, are hereby promulgated for general information:—

I.—The master or other person in charge of any vessel about to enter any of the ports mentioned in schedule A annexed hereto, in which any case or cases of cholera, yellow fever, Asiatic plague, small-pox, or other disease dangerous to the general health, may have occurred within a period of ten days previous to the date of the arrival of such ship or vessel at any of the ports aforesaid, shall notify this fact by hoisting a signal—which signal shall be, in the day time a yellow flag at the fore, and in the night time two lighted lanterns, one over the other, at the same mast-head; and such master or other person as aforesaid shall not take up anchoring ground within the said port without having obtained the previous sanction of the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port, nor without such leave shall he hold any communication with the shore or with any shipping within the said port.

II.—Whenever the master or other person in charge of any vessel about to enter any of the ports aforesaid is unable to produce a clean bill of health, obtained from the proper authority at the port last visited, he shall notify this fact to the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port by hoisting a signal as aforesaid, and thereupon the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port may, on the report of the Health Officer or other officer appointed by the Local Government in that behalf, suggesting or warranting the adoption of such a measure, refuse to permit the master or other person as aforesaid to anchor his vessel within the ordinary limits of the said port, and may forbid all communication between the vessel and the shore until a quarantine of observation, not exceeding twenty-four hours from the receipt of the report of the Health

Officer or other officer appointed by the Local Government in that behalf, shall have been enforced.

III.—It shall be the duty of the Health Officer or other officer appointed by the Government in that behalf, to proceed without delay on board any vessel about to enter any of the ports aforesaid in which any case or cases of cholera, yellow fever, Asiatic plague, small-pox, or other disease dangerous to the general health, shall have occurred within ten days previous to the date of the arrival of such vessel as aforesaid; or whenever the master or other person in charge of any vessel is unable to produce a clean bill of health from the port last visited; and such Health Officer or other officer as aforesaid shall inspect the crew and passengers of every vessel as aforesaid, and make careful enquiry as to the nature of the disease then existing on board every such vessel, and make a report thereon to the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the said port.

IV.—Upon the receipt of the report of the Health Officer or other officer appointed by the Local Government in that behalf, the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port shall determine whether any passengers or merchandize may be landed, or whether the master or other person in charge of such vessel shall be required to proceed to a quarantine anchorage, or to put out to sea, or to anchor beyond the limits of the port in such place as may be appointed for that purpose by the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port, or to undergo a quarantine of observation.

V.—Whenever cholera, yellow fever, Asiatic plague, small-pox, or other disease dangerous to the general health, shall be actually prevailing amongst any of the crew or passengers of any vessel as aforesaid, and none of those diseases shall exist at the time in the neighborhood of the port which the said vessel is about to enter or has entered, it shall be the duty of the Health Officer, or other officer appointed by Government in that behalf, to report this state of the facts to the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port. Thereupon the Master Attendant or other officer in charge of the port shall require the master or other person in charge of such vessel as aforesaid to take the said vessel out to sea for a period of ten days, or to anchor at any place to be appointed for that purpose for a period of ten days.

VI.—All persons on board vessels in quarantine are hereby prohibited from communication with the shore beyond the limits of any place which may be set apart for performing quarantine on shore, or with any vessel in the roadstead or vicinity of the roadstead, unless the permission of an officer duly authorized by the Local Government in that behalf shall have been previously obtained; and all persons are hereby prohibited from going on board any vessel in quarantine, unless the permission of an officer duly authorized by the said Government in that behalf shall have been previously obtained.

VII.—It shall be lawful for every officer, duly authorized by the Local Government in that behalf, to appoint a sufficient number of subordinates for the purpose of enforcing these rules at the expense of the owners of such vessels, and the master or other person in charge of such vessel shall pay the subordinates so appointed, and defray all expenses incurred in pursuance of this rule. It shall be the duty of the officer in charge of the Custom House to refuse port clearance to such vessels until all such demands be discharged.

VIII.—It shall be lawful for every officer, duly appointed as aforesaid, with the sanction of the Local Government, to appoint as many places for performing quarantine on shore as may be required, and to provide accommodation at such places for passengers on board any vessel to which these rules are applicable, at certain fixed fees, to be determined from time to time by the Government—which fees shall be payable by the master or other person in charge of such vessel. No person shall be permitted to leave the place so appointed within ten days from the date of last case of the disease for which quarantine was enforced, unless with the previous sanction of the said officer duly authorized as aforesaid.

IX.—Disobedience to any of the above rules Nos. I., II., III., IV., V., VI., and VIII., will subject the offender and all persons aiding or abetting him to a prosecution under section 271 of the Indian Penal Code.
