AMENDED RULES OF PILOT BOARD OF VICTORIA. Duty of Sea Pilot to ascertain Final Destination of Vessel before mooring.

mooring.

26. The sea pilot, before anchoring any vessel in Hobson's Bay, shall ascertain from the master whether the vessel is to be taken alongside any of the wharfs or piers, or moored in the inner harbor; if so, he is to be guided by the master's instructions. He is not to give up pilotage charge of the vessel until she has been finally moored in the berth determined on by the master, unless his services are required on the outer station, in which case another pilot belonging to the same company shall moor her as required without any additional No. 56.—July 25. 1873.—1 No. 56.—July 25, 1873.—1.

charge being made. Pilots shall anchor vessels having gun-powder on board in accordance with the rules of the port.

The foregoing rule relative to no additional charge being made for taking ships to final destination is not to apply to vessels that require to discharge cargo to enable them to go alongside any wharf or pier.

Duty of Sea Pilot where Vessel is bound outwards.

27. The sea pilot shall also pilot all vessels bound to sea from the berths they occupy, and may move any vessel from any wharf or pier to the inner anchorage at the option of the master: Provided such vessel proceeds to sea within twenty-four (24) hours, Sundays excepted, or unless detained through stress of weather or other unavoidable causes, which shall be determined by the board.

Harbor Pilots.

28. The harbor pilots may take charge of such vessels in the outer anchorage as are not prepared to go to their final destination, and shall berth and moor them in such situation in the inner harbor as the master or officer may direct, subject to the regulations of the port. They shall also remove all vessels in the inner harbor not included in the sea pilot's duty.

I have inspected 185,487 sheep during the quarter, all of which were free from disease. I have granted 56 permits under section 67 of the Act, and have had four prosecutions, two under section 22 and two under section 67, gaining a conviction in the two former; the latter were dismissed.
