FURTHER PROROGUING THE PARLIAMENT OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Constitution Act* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor to fix such places within Victoria and, subject to the limitation therein contained, such times for holding the first and every other Session of the Council and Assembly, and to vary and alter the same respectively in such manner as he may think fit; and also from time to time to prorogue the said Council and Assembly, and to dissolve the said Assembly, by Proclamation or otherwise, whenever he shall deem it expedient: And whereas the said Council and Assembly, called "The Parliament of Victoria," now stand prorogued until Thursday the Thirtieth day of January instant, and it is expedient to prorogue the same further: Now therefore, I, the Governor of Victoria, in exercise of the power conferred by the said Act, do by this my Proclamation further prorogue the said Parliament of Victoria from Thursday the Thirtieth day of January instant until Tuesday the Eleventh day of March in the present year.

CUTTING OR REMOVING CERTAIN LIVE TIMBER OR BARK PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do hereby declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut or remove any live trees which, at the height of three feet from the surface of the ground, are of less diameter than twelve inches, or remove bark from such trees on or from any Crown Lands within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:

SANDHURST AND EAGLEHAWK, DISTRICT AROUND.—Commencing at the junction of Wattle Creek with Sheepwash No. 6.—JANUARY 24, 1873.—1.

Creek; thence up the last-named creek to the eastern boundary of the Bendigo Water Works reserve; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that reserve to the north-west angle thereof; thence north-westerly about one mile to a point on the northern side of the road from Kangaroo Flat to Lockwood bearing north from the north-east angle of allotment 6 of section 10, parish of Lockwood; thence by that road south-westerly about twenty-seven chains fifty links; thence by a road bearing west about fifteen chains to a creek; thence down that creek to the east boundary of allotment 33 of section 5; thence by the east and north boundaries of that section to the road from Castlemaine to the Lower Loddon; thence by that road and the road which forms the eastern boundary of section 8, parish of Marong, bearing north-westerly to the south boundary of the town of Marong; thence by the south and east boundaries of that town; thence by the south boundary of the parish of Nerring bearing east to the south-east angle of allotment 4 of section 4 of that parish; thence by the east boundary of that allotment and by a line bearing north about two miles and a quarter to a point on a line formed by the prolongation of the south-east boundary of section 1; thence by that line and boundary bearing north-easterly about three miles to the east angle of allotment 53; thence north-westerly eighty-one chains to the road which forms the south-east boundary of allotment 12 of section 2; thence by that road and a line bearing north-easterly about thirteen chains to the southern boundary of allotment 16; thence by that boundary easterly about fifty-five chains to the east side of the road which forms the east boundary of the land licensed to James Alfred Nicol; thence by that road and its continuation bearing northerly eighty-four chains fifty-one links and north-easterly about one hundred and ten chains to the south-west angle of allotment 5 of section 5; thence by the south and east boundaries of that allotment; thence by a road north-easterly nineteen chains five links to the road from Raywood to Sand-

hurst; thence by that road south-easterly about one mile and a half to the road towards Ellesmere; thence by that road south-easterly and easterly about five miles and a half to the north-west angle of the parish of Wellsford; thence by the west boundary of that parish bearing south about one hundred and forty chains; thence by a line bearing south-easterly about one mile and a half to the north-west angle of allotment 60; thence by the east boundary of that allotment and by the east and south boundaries of allotment 59; thence by a line bearing south-easterly about eighty-one chains twenty-five links to the north-west angle of the land licensed to Thomas Lambus; thence by the west boundary of that land and of the land licensed to James Middleton; thence by a line southerly eighteen chains eighty-four links to the north-west angle of the land licensed to Thomas Murray; thence by the west and south boundaries of that land; thence by a line bearing south easterly about one mile and a half to the north-east angle of the land licensed to Ralph Thackway; thence by a road bearing south-easterly and south-westerly to the road which forms the north boundary of section 13, parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence by that road westerly to the north-east angle of the town of Strathfieldsaye; thence by the east, south, and west boundaries of that town; thence by the north boundary of section 19 parish of Strathfieldsaye; thence by the west boundary of that parish bearing south about four miles to the south-west angle thereof; and thence by a line bearing south-westerly two miles and a half to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.F.25371.)

COMMON.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the one hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the said Act, that is to say:—

HANSON AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.—The Hanson Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, proclaimed on the 26th day of July 1869, and increased on the 21st day of April 1870, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the south angle of J. Miller's pre-emptive section in the parish of Glenrowan, being a point on Fifteen-mile Creek; thence up that creek to the northern boundary of allotment 108; thence by the road which forms the north boundary of allotment 8 of section 29 in the parish of Laceby bearing east ninety-four chains, more or less, to the land licensed to John Nolan; thence by that land and the lands licensed to Thomas and Henry McUliffe; thence by a line crossing a road to the north boundary of the land licensed to James Scholes; thence by the north, west, and south boundaries of that land to the north-west angle of allotment 5; thence by the western and south boundaries of that allotment to a point bearing north from the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1 in the parish of Greta; thence to the said angle of that allotment by a line crossing a road; thence by the western boundaries of sections 1 and 10 to the west angle of allotment 4 of the last-named section, being a point on the road from Oxley to Greta; thence by that road westerly nine chains ninety-five links to the aforesaid creek; thence again up that creek to the northern boundary of the Fifteen-mile Creek run; thence by that boundary westerly to the Kelfera run; thence by that run northerly to the road from Greta to Winton; thence by that boundary westerly to the western watershed of the aforesaid creek northerly to J. Miller's pre-emptive section aforesaid; and thence by that section south-easterly to the

point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. Area available for commutation, about 11,600 acres.—(72.H.23,697.)

PUBLIC STREETS AT HOTHAM AND SANDHURST.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Right Honorable JOHN HENRY THOMAS VISCOUNT CANTERBURY, of the City of Canterbury in the County of Kent, and BARON BOTTESFORD, of Bottesford in the County of Leicester, in the Peerage of the United Kingdom of Great Britain and Ireland, Knight Commander of the Most Honorable Order of the Bath, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

Streets in the Borough of Hotham, with the names, total widths, and limits thereof.

Buncle street; 66 feet; from Canning street to Sutton street
Buncle street; 33 feet; from Sutton street to the Flemington road.

Mark street; 66 feet; from Melrose street to Boundary road.
—(72.F.24217.)

Streets in the City of Sandhurst.

Mundy street extension; 99 feet wide; from the eastern side of the Railway, at a point on the prolongation of the line of the existing street bearing south-easterly to the Sheepwash road, at Morrish street.

McIvor road and Sheepwash road widened at their junction by adding to them the land comprised within the following boundaries: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 5 of section 35 c, being a point on the present western side of Sheepwash road; thence by the said side of that road bearing northerly to the present southern side of McIvor road; thence by the said side of that road bearing westerly and south-westerly to a point thereon bearing north-easterly about one chain sixty links from the north angle of allotment 8; and thence to the commencing point by a line bearing south-easterly in an arc of a circle whose centre lies southerly of that arc, and from the extremities of the arc, is at right angles to the said roads; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(72.F.24493.)

THE subjoined Rules of the Supreme Court of Victoria, having been duly laid before Parliament, are now published in compliance with the requirements of the 32nd section of the Act 15 Vict. No. 10.

REGULÆ GENERALES.

WHEREAS it is expedient to repeal the Rules of the said Court passed on the twenty-third day of December, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, in lieu of Chapter II., and to substitute others instead thereof, it is therefore ordered as follows:—

1. *Repeal of Rules of 23rd December 1865.*—The said rules of the said Court, and all rules for the admission of Barristers and Attorneys heretofore existing, shall be and the same are hereby repealed.

PART I.

ADMISSION OF BARRISTERS TO PRACTISE IN THE SAID COURT.

2. *Board of Examiners for Barristers.*—There shall be a Board of Examiners in the said Court, which shall be called the Board of Examiners for Barristers, and shall consist of Her Majesty's Attorney and Solicitor-General, and Her Majesty's Counsel in the said colony, and five practising Barristers of the said Court, who shall be elected in the manner hereinafter provided.

3. *Election of practising Barristers.*—Every practising Barrister of the said Court desirous to vote shall, on or before the 10th day of December in each year, signify in writing, signed by him and addressed to the existing Board, the names of the practising Barristers whom he proposes shall act for the ensuing year as members of the Board; and those for whom the highest number of votes shall be given shall be members of the Board, but in case of an equality of votes the existing Board shall determine the matter by lot: Provided that, in default of such election, it shall be competent for the Judges of the said Court to appoint such practising Barrister or Barristers; and if any vacancy shall at any time occur, the same may be filled up, by the election or appointment (as the case may be) of any other practising Barrister.

4. *Meetings and quorum of the Board.*—The Board shall meet as occasion may require, and may adjourn its meetings if deemed necessary; and three Barristers shall form a quorum for the transaction of business; and the majority of members present shall decide all questions which may arise, and in case of an equality of votes at any such meeting or adjournment, the chairman shall have a casting as well as a deliberative vote.

STUDENTS-AT-LAW.

5. *Qualification.*—Every person applying to become a Student-at-Law—

- (1.) Shall be a natural-born or naturalized British subject of good fame and character, and
- (2.) A matriculated student of the University of Melbourne, or an undergraduate of some University admitted *ad eundem statum* in the University of Melbourne, or a Bachelor of Arts of some University recognized by the University of Melbourne.
- (3.) Shall, before the Term next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted, give to the Secretary of the said Board, in the form "A" to these rules annexed, written notice of his intention to apply to be admitted as a Student-at-Law, together with a certificate in the form "B" to these rules also annexed, and
- (4.) Shall in person make his application to the said Board for admission as a Student-at-Law.

6. *Board to meet every Term.*—The Board shall meet once in every Term for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of becoming a Student-at-Law, and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted, and has complied with the regulations in that behalf hereinbefore contained, they shall give to him under their hands a certificate of admission, and every such certificate shall be dated on the day of the Term in which it is given.

7. *Students to sign the Roll Book.*—The Secretary of the Board of Examiners shall keep a book to be called "The Students' Roll Book," and every person to whom any certificate of admission shall have been given shall make and sign in such book a declaration in the form "C" to these rules annexed, and from the time of signing the same shall be deemed to have become a Student-at-Law.

8. *Studentship.*—Every person admitted as a Student-at-Law—

- (1.) Shall not, during any part of his Studentship, be an Attorney, Solicitor, Proctor, or Notary Public in any part of the British dominions, Writer to the Signet, or Writer in any Scotch Court, Parliamentary Agent, or Clerk to any such person, or to any Barrister;
- (2.) Or cease, during any part of his Studentship, to reside in Victoria. But if any such Student be compelled or desire to leave Victoria in consequence of ill health, or for any other urgent cause, he shall give notice in writing to the Secretary of the Board of Examiners, which notice shall specify—
 - (a.) The time of his projected departure,
 - (b.) The country to which he intends to proceed,
 - (c.) The true cause of his intended absence,
 - (d.) The probable duration thereof.

And the time of his absence from Victoria shall not be included in the period of his Studentship, unless the Board shall think proper to allow the same or some part thereof.

BARRISTERS-AT-LAW.

9. *Qualification.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court shall—

- (1.) Be of good fame, and have attained the full age of twenty-one years, and
- (2.) Have been admitted to the degree of Bachelor of Laws in the University of Melbourne, or, after examination, in some University recognized by the University of Melbourne, and shall have been a Student-at-Law for at least one year; or,
- (3.) Have been duly called to the Bar in England, Scotland, or Ireland; or
- (4.) Have been admitted as a Barrister in any British colony or possession, subject to the conditions that the admission in such colony or possession is as a Barrister solely, and after examination in law, and that the standard of admission in such colony or possession is not inferior to the standard in Victoria.

10. *Applicants for admission to give notice.*—Every person desirous of being admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court shall, *in person*, before the Term next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted, give to the Secretary of the said Board, in such form as the Board shall require, written notice of his intention to apply to be so admitted. But the Court may, in the exercise of its discretion, dispense with this rule in the case of any Barrister who has been duly called to the Bar in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and has been admitted in any other Australasian colony; and may, on reading the certificate mentioned in Rule 11, admit such Barrister on any day on which the Court may be sitting, notwithstanding the 13th Rule. And any Barrister who has been duly called to the Bar in England, Scotland, or Ireland, and who has not complied with this Rule, may, if the Court shall think fit, upon reading the certificate mentioned in Rule 11, be admitted for a limited period.

11. *Board to meet every Term.*—The Board shall meet at least once in every Term for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of being admitted to practise as a Barrister, and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted, and has complied with the regulations in that behalf hereinbefore contained, they shall give to him under their hands a certificate testifying such fitness, and compliance, and such certificate shall continue in force until the end of the Term next following the date thereof, and no longer.

12. *Appeal to Court.*—In case any person shall be dissatisfied with the refusal of the Board to grant him a certificate, he shall be at liberty to appeal against such refusal to the said Court; and such appeal shall be heard by the said Court at such time as it shall appoint, and the said Court may, upon hearing thereof, dismiss or allow such appeal, or make such other order as to the said Court may seem fit.

13. *Admission to the Bar.*—No person shall be admitted to practise as a Barrister in the said Court except upon his appearing in person in the said Court, and upon reading the proper certificate or the order of the Court, and no motion shall be made for any such admission on any other but the last day of Term, or on any special adjournment thereof.

14. *Fees.*—The following fees shall be paid:—

15. *All notices to be posted.*—The Secretary of the Board of Examiners shall reduce all notices into an alphabetical list, under convenient heads, and shall, on the first day of the next Term, affix such list in some conspicuous place in the Library of the Supreme Court, and such list shall remain so affixed until the commencement of the next following Term.

16. *Not to apply to previous Applicants, &c.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained shall affect any person who has already delivered the first certificate, or given the first notice required by any rules heretofore existing, and every such person may be admitted as if the said rules had not been repealed; and the Board of Examiners for Barristers and the Secretary shall have the like powers and perform the like duties in regard to every such person as would have been had and performed by the Board and Secretary under the said rules if the same had not been repealed: Provided that a certificate of matriculation in the University of Melbourne or, after examination, in any University recognized by the University of Melbourne shall, at the option of the candidate for admission, be taken by the said Board instead of and as a substitute for an examination in the first five subjects set out in section 12 of Chapter II. of the Rules of Court bearing date the first day of February, One thousand eight hundred and fifty-four.

PART II.

ADMISSION OF ATTORNEYS, SOLICITORS, AND PROCTORS TO PRACTISE IN THE SAID COURT.

17. *Board of Examiners for Attorneys.*—The Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys shall consist of, three practising Attorneys of the said Court, to be named by the Judges thereof in the month of December in each year, to act during the ensuing year.

18. *Candidates not previously admitted.*—Every person, except as hereinafter provided, must, before he enter into articles in the colony of Victoria, produce to the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at a matriculation examination in the University of Melbourne in six at least of the subjects fixed for the time being by statutes and regulations of the said University for the matriculation examination, of which subject Latin must be one, and must lodge with the said Board a copy of such certificate; and must also, after he enter into his articles of clerkship, pass two other examinations, with an interval of at least one year between each, in the subjects of Law and History as required by the statutes for the time being of the said University for the second and third examinations for the degree of Bachelor of Laws: Provided that if any such person shall produce to the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys a certificate of his having passed at a matriculation examination in any University recognized by the University of Melbourne, or of his having passed the preliminary or any intermediate examination which clerks articulated in England, Scotland, or Ireland may be required to pass, and lodge with the Board a copy thereof, it shall not be necessary for him to submit to such examination as aforesaid.

19. *Attorneys not previously admitted.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court, not previously admitted as an Attorney or Solicitor in England or Ireland, or Writer to the Signet in Scotland, must be a natural-born or naturalized British subject, of the full age of twenty-one years, of good fame and character, and—

- (1.) Shall have served the full term of five years under articles in some part of the British dominions, or shall have served the full term of five years as Associate to any one of the Judges of the said Court: Provided that if any applicant shall, after examination, have taken the degree of Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Arts in the University of Melbourne, or in any University recognized by the University of Melbourne, and shall, within three years after taking such degree, have become an Articled Clerk, three years' service under articles as aforesaid shall be sufficient.

(2.) Shall have passed the examination hereinbefore mentioned, or shall, after examination, have taken the degree of Bachelor of Laws or Bachelor of Arts in the University of Melbourne, or in some University recognized by the University of Melbourne.

(3.) Shall have been examined in the manner hereinafter provided.

20. *Residence and certificate required.*—Every such person shall reside for one year at the least in Victoria before he shall be entitled to be examined as a candidate for admission to practise in the said Supreme Court; and one year before he gives notice of his desire to be examined he shall cause to be delivered to the Board of Examiners for Attorneys a certificate in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule to these rules annexed marked "D"; and one month before he proposes to be examined he shall cause to be delivered to the said Board a certificate in the form or to the effect of that in the said schedule marked "E."

21. *Subjects of examination.*—Every such person must, after the expiration of his articles of clerkship, and before he apply for admission to practise in the Supreme Court, also submit to be examined by the said Board of Examiners of the Supreme Court for Attorneys, and must pass in six at least of the following branches of the law:—

- (1.) Real Property and Conveyancing.
- (2.) Common and Statute Law.
- (3.) Equity, Divorce and Matrimonial, and Ecclesiastical Law.
- (4.) Insolvency and Admiralty.
- (5.) Criminal Law.
- (6.) Practice of the Supreme Court in its various branches.
- (7.) Practice of the Courts of Inferior Jurisdiction.
- (8.) Constitutional Law and Constitutional History.

22. *Attorneys previously admitted.*—Every person applying to be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court, previously admitted as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in any of the Queen's Superior Courts of Record in England or Ireland, or Writer to the Signet in Scotland, shall, before the Term next preceding that in which he proposes to be admitted, in person give to the Board of Examiners, in such form as the Board shall require, written notice of his intention to apply to be so admitted, and shall, before the first day of the Term in which he shall so apply, file with the Prothonotary the affidavit on which he seeks admission, together with a copy of his original or annual certificate, which affidavit shall be in the form or to the effect of that in the schedule to these rules annexed marked "F."

23. *Board to meet every Term.*—The Board shall meet once in every Term for the purpose of considering the application of every person desirous of being admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court; and if it shall appear to the Board that such person is a fit and proper person to be admitted, and has complied with the regulations in that behalf hereinbefore contained, they shall send a report in the form "G" to the Judges of the Supreme Court, who shall determine as to the admission or rejection of such candidate.

24. *Appeal to Court.*—And in case any person shall be dissatisfied with the decision of such Board, he shall be at liberty to appeal against such decision to the said Court, and such appeal shall be heard by the said Court at such time as it shall appoint; and the said Judges may upon the hearing thereof dismiss or allow such appeal, or make such other order as to the said Court may seem fit. 26. *Admission to practise as an Attorney, &c.*—No person shall be admitted to practise as an Attorney, Solicitor, and Proctor in the said Court except upon reading the proper certificate, or the order of the Court, and no motion shall be made for any such admission on any other but the last day of Term, or on any special adjournment thereof.

27. *Fees.*—The following fees shall be paid by persons desirous of being admitted to practise in the said Court as Attorneys, Solicitors, and Proctors:—

28. *Rules not to apply to Clerks previously articulated.*—Nothing hereinbefore contained, except so much of Rule 19 as applies to the service under articles of any person having taken a degree, shall affect any person who has already entered into articles of clerkship in Victoria, but every such person may be admitted as if these rules had not been promulgated; and the Board of Examiners for Attorneys established by these rules, and the Secretary, shall have the like powers and perform the like duties in regard to any such person as would have been had and performed by the Board and Secretary under the said rules if the same had not been repealed. Provided that it shall not be necessary for any person who shall, after examination, have taken the degree of Bachelor of Arts or Bachelor of Laws in the University of Melbourne, or in any University recognized by the University of Melbourne, to pass the examinations prescribed by the 36th section of the Rules of Court bearing date the twenty-third day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five.

PART III.

29. *Payment of fees.*—All fees received by virtue of the foregoing rules shall be paid to the Secretary of the said Boards; and in any case in which any applicant be not admitted to practise in the said Supreme Court, the fee required to be paid by him, on his admission to practise, shall be returned to him at his request, on his giving up any certificates he may have received under these rules.

30. *Fees received to be lodged in bank to the credit of the Chief Justice.*—All such fees received by the said Secretary shall be by him lodged in the bank to the credit of the Chief Justice of the said Court on account of the "Supreme Court Library Fund," and entries of such receipts, lodgments, and of all disbursements, shall be duly made in a book to be called the "Supreme Court Library Fee Book" to be kept by such Secretary.

33. *Library Committee.*—The Library Committee shall consist of the Judges of the said Court, the Board of Examiners for Barristers and the Board of Examiners for Attorneys, who shall have power to make rules and regulations for the management and good government of the Library; and all branches of the profession shall have free access to such Library, subject nevertheless to the rules to be made in that behalf.

34. *Secretary to the Board.*—Such person as the Judges may from time to time appoint shall be and act as Secretary to the said respective Boards, and shall perform such duties as these rules and the said Boards respectively may require.

35. *Boards, etc., to continue in office.*—Notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, the Board of Examiners for Barristers, the Board of Examiners for Attorneys, and the Secretary to the said Boards in existence at the coming into force of these rules shall respectively be and act as the Boards and Secretary under these rules, until the first day of January, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy three.

36. These Rules, with the exception of Rules 14 and 27, shall come into force on the Fifth day of December, A.D. 1872, and until the said Rules 14 and 27 come into force by operation of law, the Rules of Court bearing date the 23rd of December 1865 shall, notwithstanding anything hereinbefore contained, continue in force so far as regards the fees required by the said Rules to be paid.

VOLCANIC ISLAND, LAT. 20° 33' N., Lon. 144° 49' E.

Captain Almond, F.R.A.S., of the British barque *Decapolis* reports the existence of a Volcanic Island in latitude 20° 33' north, lon. 140° 49' east.

The island (? Guy Rock) is estimated to be from three to four miles in circumference and 900 feet high. It is of a conical shape, and was in active eruption on the 11th of July 1872; a quantity of ashes was blown on board the *Decapolis* as she passed about three miles to leeward of it.

SUPPOSED ERROR IN POSITION OF THE OCEAN ISLANDS.

The *Decapolis*, on her passage from Yokohama to Sydney, on the 20th of September 1872, passed to the eastward of a dangerous group of islands, the southernmost of which, from reliable observations, was found to be in lat. 9° 0' north, lon. 165° 47' east. This group extends N.N.W. and S.S.E. about thirty miles, and appears to be somewhat similar to the description of the Ocean Islands, although found to be situated considerably to the westward of the position given to those islands on the chart.

NEREUS SHOAL.

Captain Almond also reports sighting the doubtful Nereus Shoal, and considers it to be near the position assigned to it on the chart.

CITY OF SANDHURST.

BYE-LAW No. 47, TO REGULATE THE CARRIAGE OF PERSONS AND GOODS THROUGH THE CITY OF SANDHURST.

Bye-law of the Council of the City of Sandhurst, made under part 12 of the Boroughs Statute.

IN pursuance of part 12 of the Boroughs Statute the Council of the City of Sandhurst ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1. The driver of every cart, carriage, or other vehicle which shall during the hours after sunset of any day and before sunrise of the following day, be in any street or public place within the City of Sandhurst, shall keep lights attached on each side to such cart, carriage, or other vehicle under his control, so as to be plainly visible to the driver or person in charge of any vehicle proceeding along or through such street or place in a contrary direction to that in which such first-mentioned cart, carriage, or other vehicle shall be directed; and in the case of a night-cart, such lights shall be so disposed as to appear white in front and red at the outer side.

2. No person shall drive any vehicle, or ride any horse or other animal at other than a walking pace across the intersection of any of the streets of the said city.

3. No person shall fasten a horse or other animal to the fences of the public reserves abutting upon a street or streets of the said city, or to the trees, or guards of trees, planted in the streets of the said city.

Any person committing a breach of any of the clauses of this Bye-law shall, on conviction thereof before two or more justices of the peace, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Forty shillings.

Passed first by the said Council on the seventeenth day of May, and confirmed as a special order on the fifth day of July in the year 1872.

WARRNAMBOOL HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT
ASYLUM.

BYE-LAWS made by "The Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum," incorporated under the Act 27 Vict. No. 220.

1. That the building be used both for the purposes of an hospital and benevolent asylum.

2. That the objects of the hospital be to afford medical and surgical aid to poor persons requiring it, for a limited number of paying patients and for casualties, but that no person who shall meet with casualties, and shall be found able to pay for surgical aid, shall receive further than temporary gratuitous assistance. That the object of the benevolent asylum be the reception and relief of the aged, infirm, disabled, and destitute, of all creeds and nations, with a view to afford them consolation and assistance, and also to give temporary out-door relief in cases of emergency, as required.

3. Every donor of £20 and upwards not being a paid collector shall be a life governor, and every person who shall subscribe £10 10s. or upwards, and raise, by one or more collections in the same year, a further sum of £10 10s. or upwards, from persons not entitled to vote at the general meetings of contributors, and the executors first named in any will proving the same, and paying to the institution a bequest of fifty pounds or upwards, under the said will, shall be a life governor, or any other person for special services rendered may be so elected by the committee.

4. Every subscriber of £1 annually shall be an annual contributor, with liberty of having patients admitted as follows:—Annual contributor of £1 to have one in-patient's and three out-patient's tickets; of £2, two in-patient's and four out-patient's; of £3, three in-patient's and six out-patient's; of £5, and so on up to £20, one in-patient's and two out-patient's tickets for every additional £1. Recommendations for admission to be subject to the approval of the visiting committee, and to be made by tickets only, to be issued by the secretary to contributors at the time of their becoming, such, and provided that whenever any recommendation cannot be acceded to, from want of room or other cause appearing to the committee, the ticket used in such recommendation shall be reclaimable by the contributors issuing the same; contributors shall also have the privilege at any time, on application to the secretary, of exchanging out-patient's tickets for in-patient's, and *vice versa*—one in-patient's ticket being equivalent to three out-patient's. These tickets shall only be used for the recommendation of persons unable to pay for medical attendance, and shall only be available till 31st January in the year after that in which they are issued.

5. That the annual subscriptions must be paid in advance for the current year, such year to be computed from the first day of January in each year, and no contributor entitled to any privilege until the subscription be paid.

POWERS AND DUTIES OF CONTRIBUTORS.

6. There shall be on the second Thursday in the month of January in every year a general meeting of the life governors and contributors of the institution, of which ten shall form a quorum, to be held at such place as the general committee shall appoint, of which meeting fourteen days previous notice shall be given in one or more of the local papers, to receive the report and balance-sheet of the committee of management, to elect by ballot a president, vice-president, treasurer, two honorary medical officers, two auditors, and one-third members of the committee for ensuing year. No member shall be eligible unless his name and consent has been sent to the secretary three clear days previously.

COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

7. The committee of management shall consist of twenty-four annual contributors, twelve of whom shall reside in the outlying district, but are not required to attend meetings of committee, but to enquire into any cases requiring relief, and send with applicant a report to the president and visitors, who will see that the case receives consideration. The president, vice-president, treasurer of Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum, mayor of borough, mayor of Corioit, chairman of shires of Warrnambool, Mortlake, and Camperdown, shall be members of committee in virtue of their respective offices.

8. The general committee shall have power to fix the salaries of all paid officers, and shall have power to discharge them.

9. Should any vacancies occur in the committee of management or honorary medical officers, the committee shall, at the next monthly meeting, supply such vacancies for the remainder of the year.

SPECIAL MEETINGS OF SUBSCRIBERS.

10. It shall be competent at any time for the committee of management, at which at least four members shall be present, or for nine or more contributors, by a writing under their hands, to require the president to summon, at the expiration of fourteen days, a special meeting of life governors and contributors, the occasion of calling such meeting being stated in such requisition; and no business shall be transacted at such special meeting, except that for which it shall have been summoned. Every such meeting to be called by the secretary, by advertisement in one of the public newspapers published in Warrnambool, within one week after such requisition being received. Ten contributors shall be necessary to form a general or special meeting.

11. That all meetings of contributors be called by the secretary, by advertisement, in one of the newspapers published in Warrnambool, at least one week before the day of meeting.

12. In the event of any vacancy in the office of president, vice-president, treasurer, or auditors, the election of a successor shall take place at a special meeting of subscribers, to be convened by the committee of management.

PLURALITY OF VOTES.

13. All contributors of the sum of one pound shall be entitled to one vote, of three pound to two votes, of five

pounds and upwards to three votes, at all general meetings of subscribers held in the year for which their subscription is paid.

DUTIES OF VISITING COMMITTEE.

14. The general committee shall appoint two visitors from their number every month, whose duties shall be to visit the Asylum at least once a week; to investigate any case of distress, and to afford temporary relief—to admit into the institution fitting subjects, to see that the various duties of the officers and servants are duly performed; to ascertain if any of the inmates are in a fit state for employment or to leave the asylum, and if so, in conjunction with the paid medical officer, to discharge them. Also to offer any suggestions as to necessary repairs, and authorize the purchase of any article immediately required. The president shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees.

HONORARY AND PAID MEDICAL STAFF.

15. There shall be two honorary and one paid medical officers. No one shall be eligible for the office of honorary or paid medical officer who does not possess the certificate of registration of the medical board of Victoria.

16. It shall be the duty of the paid medical officer to call by circular a consultation with one or more of the honorary medical officers in all cases of protracted illness in the hospital, and when either of the medical officers deem it necessary they may call a full consultation of all the medical officers connected with the establishment; and that no case having been admitted for medical treatment shall be discharged not cured, without a consultation having been held upon the case by the paid medical officer with one or more of the honorary medical officers.

17. The surgeon shall perform all the surgical operations necessary, but no capital operations shall be performed on any patient without a previous consultation with one or both of the honorary officers, except in cases of emergency.

ADMISSION OF PATIENTS.

18. That accidents and such cases of decided emergency as cannot be delayed, be received into the hospital at any time, without ticket, and that the admission of patients in ordinary cases, recommended by contributors, and considered fit subjects for admission by paid medical officer, or, in his absence, by honorary medical officers further agreed to and ticket signed by visitors for month, be admitted by master, except those requiring admission as benevolent patients, who do not require the doctor's certificate.

19. Cases of disease combined with destitution, when certificates from contributors cannot be obtained, may be admitted on written reports of the circumstances from the officer in charge of police countersigned by the visiting committee; but these cases shall be admitted only when there are no nominees of contributors waiting for admission.

20. That paying patients be admitted on the order of the visiting committee.

21. That the amount chargeable to each patient shall be at the discretion of the visiting committee; and shall be paid in advance, or at the discretion of the visiting committee.

22. That the general rules and regulations of the institution shall be applicable to and observed by all paying patients received into the institution.

23. That persons unable to pay for medicines and medical attendance (or for either), but not requiring admission to the house, may be treated as out-patients of hospital on regulated days, on producing the recommendation of a contributor, countersigned by a member of the visiting committee.

PERSONS NOT ADMISSIBLE.

24. No pregnant female for the purpose of confinement, no person insane, no one subject to epilepsy, no one having a contagious or infectious disease, no one suffering from venereal disease, nor any one who in the opinion of the visiting committee might receive equal benefit as an out-patient, shall be admitted; and no child under three years of age shall be admitted, except from an accident or for a surgical operation, or any one who in the opinion of the paid surgeon, or visiting committee, is unsuitable to be admitted.

25. Ministers of religion, or persons duly accredited by them for that purpose, shall have free access to persons of their respective denominations, at such times as shall be appointed by the committee of management; and when a patient requests that a minister may be sent for, his wish shall be immediately complied with.

SECRETARY.

26. The secretary shall convene and be present at all meetings, and keep the minutes and all records and books required by the institution, conduct the correspondence, and bring all business before the same according to standing order.

TREASURER.

27. The treasurer shall receive all moneys, and acknowledge all subscriptions in local papers, on behalf of the institution, and deposit the same in such bank as the committee shall direct to the credit of the Warrnambool Hospital and Benevolent Asylum. He shall pay all accounts passed by the committee by drafts on the bank, which shall be signed by the treasurer and secretary. He shall keep an account of all money received and paid, and report the same to each monthly meeting of the committee, if required, and shall cause a balance-sheet and financial report to be presented at the annual general meeting of life governors and contributors, the same being previously examined and signed by the auditors.

AUDITORS.

28. The auditors shall, at the end of each year, examine the treasurer's annual financial report, with all accounts, vouchers, and documents relating thereto, and shall report thereon to the annual general meeting.

29. The collector, on appointment, shall give such security as the committee deem sufficient for the due performance of his duty. He shall pay to the treasurer fortnightly all sums that he may have collected, and furnish a report of the same to the committee at each monthly meeting.

30. He shall give printed receipts, for all subscriptions or donations paid to him, stating the term for which they are paid, and shall keep a counterpart or butt for the inspection of the treasurer and finance committee.
