5. Whether the land is the property of the institution, and whether granted by the Crown or purchased.
6. The number of books.
7. The number of visitors during 1873 to 31st July.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT OF A RESERVE AT EAGLE POINT, IN THE PARISH OF BAIRNSDALE, FOR PUBLIC RECREATION.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, has made the following Regulation relative to the control of the land temporarily reserved, by order of 11th February 1873, as a site for Public Recreation at Eagle Point, in the parish of Bairnsdale.

## REGULATION.

The Council of the Shire of Bairnsdale shall be a Committee of Management to exercise control over the said reserve, under regulations to be promulgated by the Board of Land and Works.

## RIDINGS OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE AND NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARRNAMBOOL.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirtieth day of June 1873.

## PRESENT:

His Excellency the Administrator of the Government

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 25) it is amongst other things enacted, that where any portion of Victoria shall have been annexed to any shire divided into ridings, or any part of any such shire has been severed from such shire, it shall be lawful for the Governor either to abolish all previous ridings of such shire or to divide anew such shire into such separate ridings as may seem fit, by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to the same and at any time to vary or annul such order; and the number of such ridings shall be the same as that of the ridings theretofore subsisting, or in the case of annexation may be one more, or in the case of severance may be one less, than such number, if the Governor shall see fit, and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the last mentioned ridings, and upon any such abolition as aforesaid the

shire shall be deemed to be a single shire to all intents and purposes: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the eighteenth day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the shire of Mortlake was constituted: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twenty-third day of January, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the said shire was divided into three ridings: and by another Order bearing date the twenty-third day of January, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, two of such ridings were altered: And whereas by an Order in Council bearing date the fifth day of May in the present year a portion of the shire of Warrnambool was severed therefrom and attached to the shire of Mortlake: And whereas it has seemed fit to abolish all previous ridings of the said shire of Mortlake and to divide it anew: Now therefore His Excellency the Administrator of the Government, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous ridings of the said shire of Mortlake, and doth divide such shire anew into four several ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively; and doth also re-define the boundaries of the North Riding of the said shire of Warrnambool, as it has been diminished by the transfer of a portion thereof to the said shire of Mortlake, that is to say:-

## THE MORTLAKE RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.-

Commencing at a point in the centre of the road bounding the parish of Keilambete on the south opposite the south-west angle of said parish; thence east by said road to a point opposite the south-east angle of said parish of Keilambete; thence northerly and north by the east boundaries of said parish and the parishes of Kolora, Mortlake, Toorak, Ligar, and Elyar, and due north through the parish of Nerrin-nerrin to the northern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to the north-east angle of the parish of Woorndoo; thence southerly by the Salt Creek to the south-west angle of the parish of Ligar; thence east to the north-west angle of the parish of Toorak; thence south by the western boundaries of the parishes of Toorak, Mortlake, Kolora, and Keilambete to the point of commencement.

## THE WOORNDOO RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.-

Commencing at a point in the centre of the road bounding the parish of East Framlingham on the south opposite the south-east angle of said parish; thence north by the eastern boundaries of the parishes of East Framlingham, Ellerslie, Connewarwan, and East Hexham to the northern boundary of the parish of East Hexham; thence west by said parish boundary to the Salt Creek; thence northerly by the Salt Creek to the northern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence west by the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to a point in the centre of the Hopkins River opposite the north-west angle of the parish of Towanway; thence southerly by the Hopkins River to a point in the centre of said river opposite the centre line of the road bounding the parish of East Framlingham on the south; thence east by said road to the commencing point.

## THE BALLANCEIGH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.-

Commencing at the point where the Ararat, to the south-western seaboard road is cut by the county boundary of Hampden in the township of Chatsworth; thence south-westerly by the centre line of said road to the intersection of the road bounding the parish of Caramut on the north; thence easterly by that road to its junction with the road bounding the parish of West Hexham on the west; thence southerly by the last said road to the intersection of Muston's Creek; thence south-westerly by the course of Muston's Creek to the north-west angle of allotment 1 of section 1, parish of Yeth-Youang; thence southerly by the western boundary of said allotment to the road bounding the said parish on the west; thence southerly by that road to the north-west angle of allotment 2 of section 12 of the said parish; thence southerly by the western boundaries of said allotment 2 and of allotment 6 of said section 12 to the north-west angle of allotment 7 of said section 12 of the said parish; thence southerly by the road bounding the last said allotment and section 25 of said parish on the west to the north-west angle of the parish of Ballanceigh; thence south-westerly by the parish boundary of Ballanceigh to the road bounding a portion of allotment 1 of said parish on the north-west; thence south-westerly by that road bounding the said parish on the north-west to the north-east angle of the parish of Bullanbull; thence southerly by the road bounding the parish of Ballanceigh on the west to the south-west angle of last said parish; thence easterly by the southern boundary of the said parish of Ballanceigh to the Drysdale Creek and the road bounding allotment 73 of the said parish on the south; thence easterly by that road bounding said allotment 73, and allotments 74, 95, and part of 96 of said parish on the south to the north-east angle of allotment 18 of section 2 of the parish of West Framlingham; thence easterly by the northern boundary of allotment 19 of said section 2 to the Hopkins River; thence northerly by that river to the commencing point.

## THE DARLINGTON RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF MORTLAKE.-

Commencing at a point in the centre of the Emu Creek opposite the south-east angle of the parish of Wooriwyrite; thence northerly by the Emu Creek until it intersects the northern boundary of the county of Hampden; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the county of Hampden to a point due north of the western boundary of the parish of Terrinallum; thence south through the parish of Nerrin-nerrin and by the western boundaries of the parishes of Terrinallum, Jellalabad, Darlington West, and Wooriwyrite to the south-west angle of the last-named parish; thence east by the southern boundary of the parish of Wooriwyrite to the point of commencement.

**THE NORTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF WARRENAMBOOL.**  
Commencing at the north-west angle of the parish of South Caramut; thence south by a road, the western side of which coincides with the western boundaries of the parishes of South Caramut, Minjah North, Minjah, and Woolsthorpe, to the intersection of the road from Woolsthorpe to Green Hills at the south-west angle of allotment 1 of section 20, in the parish of Woolsthorpe; thence south-easterly by the said road intersecting sections 20, 19, 22, and 23 in the said parish to its junction with the road bounding the township of Woolsthorpe on the west; thence southerly by the last-named road to the south-west angle of the township of Woolsthorpe; thence easterly by the road on the south of said township to the centre of the main Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence northerly by said road to the intersection of the Spring Creek; thence southerly and easterly by the course of the said creek to its junction with the Drysdale Creek; thence by the course of the Drysdale Creek northerly and easterly to the southern boundary of the parish of Ballangeich; thence westerly by the said southern boundary of the said parish to the road bounding the said parish on the west; thence northerly by the said road to the north-east angle of the parish of Bullanbull; thence north-easterly by the road bounding the said parish of Ballangeich on the north-west to the intersection of a swamp; thence crossing the swamp by the said parish boundary to the north-west angle of said parish; thence northerly by the road bounding section 23 and allotment 7 of section 12 of the parish of Yeth-Young on the west to the north-west angle of said allotment 7; thence northerly by the western boundaries of allotments 6 and 2 of the said section to the north-west angle of said allotment 2; thence northerly by the road bounding section 11 and part of section 1 of the said parish on the west to the south-west angle of allotment 1 of said section 1; thence northerly by the western boundary of the said allotment to Muston's Creek; thence north-easterly by the course of that creek to the intersection of the road bounding the parish of West Hexham on the west; thence northerly by that road to the intersection of the road bounding the parish of Caramut on the north; thence westerly by the last said road to its intersection with the main Ararat and south-western sea-board road; thence south-westerly by the centre line of said road to the northern boundary of the township of Caramut; thence by the northern and western boundaries of said township to the intersection of Muston's Creek; thence by the centre line of said creek north-westerly to the south-east angle of the parish of Purdeet East; thence by the road on the southern boundary of said parish to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

*Street in the Borough of Hotham.*

Extension of Munster terrace, being the land bounded by the prolongation of the western side of the said terrace, the south-western side of Macaulay road, and the north side of Arden street; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.J.13269.)

## SHIRE OF OMOO.

## BYE-LAW No. 1.

*Bye-law of the Council of the Shire of Omoo, made in pursuance of section 187 of the Shires Statute, for the purpose of providing for the management of the affairs and proceedings of the Council, and for regulating the conduct of officers.*

THE Council of the Shire of Omoo ordain as follows (that is to say):—

1. In all cases not herein provided for resort shall be had to the rules, forms, and usages of the Parliament of Victoria, if applicable.
2. The ordinary meetings of the council shall be held at least monthly, in the first Monday of every month, at the Shire Office, at Two o'clock in the afternoon.
3. At every ordinary meeting of the council the first business thereof shall be the reading and putting for confirmation the minutes of the preceding meeting, and no discussion shall be permitted thereon, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.
4. The order of business at meetings shall be as follows, or as nearly thereto as practicable, but for the convenience of the council such order may be temporarily varied, namely:—
  - (1.) Reading copies of letters sent.
  - (2.) Reading letters received, and considering and ordering thereon.
  - (3.) Reception and reading of petitions and memorials.
  - (4.) Presentation of reports.
  - (5.) Reception of accounts.
  - (6.) Orders of the day.
  - (7.) Opening of tenders.
  - (8.) Motions of which previous notice has been given.
  - (9.) Reading notices of motion for consideration at future meetings.
5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council shall be in proper form, and must be presented by a councillor, who shall be responsible for its being respectfully worded, and no debate shall take place thereon except as to its being received and taken into consideration.
6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council and any business which the president may think fit to bring under consideration.
7. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud at the meeting previous to that in which the same is to be taken into consideration, and every such motion shall be considered in the order in which notice has been given.
8. The mover of any motion which may be referred to a committee shall for the occasion be a member of such committee.
9. Every councillor, including the president, shall stand up while addressing the council.
10. The president when called upon to decide upon points of order or practice shall, if requested, state the provisions, rule,

or practice which he deems applicable to the case, without discussing or commenting on the same, and his decision as to order or explanation in each case shall be final.

11. Every motion or amendment shall be entered in the minutes, with the names of the movers and seconders, and on a division the votes shall be recorded if so required by any councillor.

12. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but if lost another may be moved before the original motion is put to the vote, but upon any amendment being carried the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of the original motion, and on it only one amendment can be moved.

13. No discussion shall be allowed upon any motion for adjournment of the council, but if on the question being put the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next on the notice-paper, or any other that may be allowed precedence, shall be discussed before any further motion for adjournment shall be entertained.

14. The mover of any original proposition, but not of any amendment, shall have a right to reply, immediately after which the question shall be put from the chair, but no councillor shall be allowed to speak more than once on the same question, unless permission be given to explain, or the attention of the chair be called to a point of order.

15. No motion entered on the notice-paper shall be considered unless the councillor who has given such notice, or some other councillor authorized by him in writing, be present when the business is called on, and notices not so proceeded with shall be struck off the notice-paper.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, nor impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be deemed highly disorderly; and any councillor making use of any such expression capable of being applied offensively to any other councillor, shall at once, if required to do so by the president, or any other councillor acting as chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to the council.

17. The president shall call to order any councillor out of order, and if the councillor deemed out of order shall not obey he shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding five pounds.

18. No appointment to any permanent office at the disposal of the council shall take place until at least seven clear days' notice shall have been given in some newspaper usually circulating in the shire inviting applications for the same.

19. All contracts shall be let by tender unless the council should otherwise direct. All tenders shall be addressed to the president, and be opened only at the time of their consideration. The respective amounts of tender together with the names of the tenderers shall be entered in every case on the minutes of the council.

20. The shire office shall be open on Tuesdays and Saturdays in each week, public holidays excepted, between the hours of Twelve noon and Five p.m., during which time the secretary shall be in attendance for the purpose of transacting the ordinary business of the council. The surveyor shall be in attendance during the hours of business at every ordinary meeting of the council, if so requested by letter.

21. The valuer appointed by the council shall visit and examine every rateable property within the shire, and shall, after having valued each such property, thereupon deliver or cause to be delivered to the owner or occupier thereof a notice setting forth the amount at which such property is valued, and every such notice shall be signed by the valuer.

22. All officers of the council shall deliver or cause to be delivered to the council official reports at every ordinary meeting or at such other times as the council may require.

23. The common seal of the council shall be kept in a box having two locks of different patterns; the key of one lock the president shall keep, the key of the other lock shall be kept by the secretary; and the seal shall not be affixed to any document unless the president, or in his absence two councillors, be present.

24. On the appointment of any committee a time shall be named for bringing up the report.

25. The president shall, by virtue of his office, be a member of all committees, and when present shall preside thereat, unless disqualified by law.

26. In all cases where security is required from officers for the faithful discharge of their duties such security shall be obtained from an approved guarantee society, and the expense thereof shall be borne by the officer.

27. Any clause of this bye-law may be suspended *pro tem.* for a special purpose, with the consent of not less than four councillors present, the same being entered in the minutes at such meeting.

The above bye-law was passed and confirmed on the twenty-second day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, by special order of the Council of the Shire of Omoo, and the corporate seal of the said shire council was affixed hereto this fourth day of June, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three.
