DISTRIBUTION OF PLANTS FROM STATE NURSERIES.

IN future the distribution of plants from State Nurseries will be restricted to the donation of young useful timber-producing trees to such public bodies, committees of management of reserves, or private individuals who would be willing to conform to a code of instructions for the culture of such trees, and to report periodically the results of such culture.

On and after 1st September next any further distribution of plants, cuttings, seeds, or flowers from the Botanical Gardens, Melbourne, will be discontinued; and after May next young trees only will be distributed from the State Nursery at Macedon, subject to the following conditions:—

Each application for young trees to be planted in reserves under the local control of public bodies or committees of management shall be accompanied by a statement of the area of the portion of the reserve proposed to be planted, the nature of the soil in such portion, the number and description of trees previously supplied by the State for the reserve, and the present condition of such trees.

Each application by a private individual for young trees shall be accompanied by a statement of the particulars of his claim for a donation of such young trees from the State Nursery, the area of the land proposed to be planted, the nature of the soil of such land, the number and description of any trees, plants, cuttings, or seeds previously supplied to him from any State Nursery, and the use made thereof.

The applicants will have to pay the cost of packing the young trees for transport from Macedon, and the cost of transport.

He describes Edward Rock, lying to the southwards of Restoration Island, as being 100 yards wide, and extending nearly half a mile east and west, and also as being awash at low water.

Also, a detached coral patch with five feet of water over it at low water, lying from $\frac{1}{2}$ to $\frac{3}{4}$ mile from g. Reef; the small westernmost rock of Forbes Islets bearing N. by E.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act the land reserved or used for the street, highway, or thoroughfare hereinafter described, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (83 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of this Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely, dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinbefore provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke a notice dated the sixteenth day of November 1871 proclaiming certain streets in the borough of Stawell, so far as it affects the portion of Lamont street shown by blue color on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.1.18220.)

THE COUNTIES OF HEYTESBURY AND POLWARTH
ALTERED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county; and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* they define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Provided that it shall be lawful for the Governor by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* to diminish or extend the area of any county or to alter the boundaries or name of any county, and to add the territory taken away from one county to any other adjacent county, and to divide any county into two or more counties and to give to each a distinguishing name: And whereas by a proclamation under the hand and seal of the Governor of New South Wales and its Dependencies, bearing date the twentieth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and forty-eight, certain parts or portions of land in the said territory of New South Wales (including the Port Phillip or Southern District) were declared to have been admeasured and laid out as separate and distinct counties to be known or called by the names therein mentioned, with the boundaries and limits therein described; subject, nevertheless, to such more exact determination thereof, with reference to the natural features of the county, as might hereafter be deemed expedient: And whereas the counties of Heytesbury and Polwarth, in the colony of Victoria (formerly called the Port Phillip or Southern District of New South Wales), are two of the counties named and described in such proclamation: And whereas it is expedient to alter the boundaries of the said counties of Heytesbury and Polwarth: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in exercise of the power conferred by the Act hereinbefore recited, do, by this my Proclamation, alter the boundaries of the said counties of Heytesbury and Polwarth, and do hereby

define and proclaim the boundaries of the said counties so altered as aforesaid in manner following, that is to say:—

THE COUNTY OF HEYTESBURY.—Commencing at the mouth of the Hopkins River; thence up that river to the south boundary of the county of Hampden; thence by the south boundaries of that county and the county of Grenville to the Pirron Yaloak Creek; thence up that creek to the north-east boundary of the parish of Carpendit; thence by that boundary; thence by the east boundary of that parish and by a line bearing south to the Gellibrand River; thence down that river to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point.

THE COUNTY OF POLWARTH.—Commencing at the mouth of Salt Creek, which forms part of the south-western boundary of the county of Grant; thence by the said boundary of that county and the south boundary of the county of Grenville to the Pirron Yaloak Creek; thence up that creek to the north-eastern boundary of the parish of Carpendit; thence by that boundary; thence by the east boundary of that parish and by a line bearing south to the Gellibrand River; thence down that river to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point.—(73.L.16479.)

The deaths in July were exactly equal to those in June. They exceeded the average of July in the previous ten years by 76; and, if allowance be made for the increase of population, they will also be found to have exceeded the average of July by 23.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 63.9° on the 31st, and the lowest was 30.2° on the 18th. The mean temperature of the month (46.4°) was 1.6° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (30.5°) took place on the 31st, viz. from a maximum of 63.9° to a minimum of 33.4°. The least range (9.1°) was on the 15th, viz. from a maximum of 55.1° to a minimum of 46°. The mean daily range was 16.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.108 inches) was a little above the average.

Fifty-three per cent. of the deaths were of males and 47 per cent. were of females. Thirty-six per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year of age, as against 36 per cent. in July 1872, 34 per cent. in July 1871, 39 per cent. in July 1870, 37 per cent. in July 1869, 44 per cent. in July 1868, 44 per cent. in July 1867, 40 per cent. in July 1866, 44 per cent. in July 1865, 44 per cent. in July 1864, and 45 per cent. in July 1863.

The deaths of thirteen persons of 75 years of age and upwards occurred during the month, viz.:—A male aged 75 of dropsy, a female aged 75 of diarrhoea, a female aged 75 of bronchitis, a female aged 81 of heart disease, a female aged 81 and a male aged 83 of asthma, a male aged 86 of bronchitis, and five males aged respectively 75, 77, 80, 83, and 88, and one female aged 80, of old age.

The number of violent deaths which occurred during the month was 20, of these 13 were set down to accident or negligence, viz.:—That of a boilermaker aged 32, who was crushed by a boiler; of a laborer aged 38, who died from internal injuries caused by bags of sugar falling on him; of a male aged 52, who died of fracture of the skull; of a farmer aged 66, who died of fracture of the leg; of a female aged 65, who died of extravasation of blood on brain resulting from a fall down stairs; of a female aged 3, a carpenter aged 60, and a female aged 63, who died of scalds; of a coachman aged 35, who was found drowned; of a seaman aged 40, who was drowned in Hobson's Bay; of a female infant aged 20 days, who was suffocated by bed clothes; of a boy aged 2 years, who died of suffocation in night soil; and of a female infant, who died of neglect at birth. Two were set down as cases of murder or manslaughter, viz. those of a newly born male infant, who died of loss of blood and exposure, and of a girl aged 1 year, who was poisoned with opium. The suicides numbered 5, viz. those of a female aged 49, who died of the poisonous effects of hydrochloric acid taken whilst laboring under temporary insanity; of two males aged respectively 30 and 52, and of a female aged 35, who drowned themselves; and of a male aged 60, who threw himself into the River Yarra whilst of unsound mind, causing death by fracture of the skull.

Eighty-four deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital; 4 in the Alfred Hospital; 5 in the Lying-in Hospital; 8 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 3 in the Immigrants' Home; 6 in the Industrial Schools; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 126, of whom 63, or 50 per cent., were of males, and 63, or 50 per cent., were of females. Of those who died, 67 were under one year of age, 21 were between one and two years, 14 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 225, of whom 124, or 55 per cent., were males, and 101, or 45 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 3 were between ten and fifteen, 8 were between fifteen and twenty, 9 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 18 were between thirty and thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 18 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 19 were between fifty and fifty-five, 12 were between fifty-five and sixty, 22 were between sixty and sixty-five, 14 were between sixty-five and seventy, 9 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 8 were eighty years and upwards.
