PRESENT :

The Queen's Most Excellent Majesty in Council.

WHEREAS in many appeals now pending before Her Majesty in Council no effectual steps have been taken by the parties or their agents to set down their cases for hearing, although more than twelve months have elapsed since the arrival and registration of the transcript of appeal in this country, and it is expedient to make further provision in that behalf, Her Majesty, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, and upon a recommendation of the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council, is pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that the solicitors or agents for the party appellant in all such appeals now pending before Her Majesty in Council are hereby required to take effectual steps, to set down their cases for hearing within six months from the date of this Order, and in all other appeals to Her Majesty in Council within a period not exceeding twelve months from the date of the arrival and registration of the transcript in this country.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to order, and it is hereby ordered, that it shall be the duty of the Registrar of the Privy Council to report to the Lords of the Judicial Committee the names of the parties and dates of the decrees in appeals in which no effectual steps have been taken within the aforesaid periods of time to set down the case for hearing; and the Lords of the Judicial Committee of the Privy Council shall be at liberty to call upon the appellant or his agent in such cases to show cause why the said appeal or appeals should not be dismissed for non-prosecution, and (if they shall so think fit) to recommend to Her Majesty the dismissal of any such appeal, or to give such directions therein as the justice of the case may require.

And Her Majesty is further pleased to order that nothing in the present Order shall prevent the dismissal of an appeal under the 5th of the Rules approved by Her Majesty on the 18th of June 1853, in cases to which that rule is applicable.

Whereof the Governors of Her Majesty's Plantations and Dominions abroad and the Judges or Officers of Her Majesty's Courts of Justice from which an appeal lies to Her Majesty in Council and all other persons whom it may concern, are to take notice and govern themselves accordingly.

CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF STATE FORESTS
IN THE SHIRES OF BALLAARAT, CRESWICK, BUN-
GAREE, BUNINYONG, BALLAN, AND MEREDITH.

BALLAARAT LOCAL FOREST BOARD.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, has made the following Regulation relative to the control of all State Forests in the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick, Bungaree, Buninyong, Ballan, and Meredith:

REGULATION.

The undermentioned representatives of local public bodies in the Shires of Ballarat, Creswick, Bungaree, Buninyong, Ballan, and Meredith, shall constitute a Board of Management, to be called the "Ballarat Local Forest Board," to exercise control over all State forests in the said shires.

They may propose rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of such State forests, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein, and, after approval and confirmation of such rules and regulations by the Board of Land and Works, shall give effect to and carry out the same as such board of management.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions of *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 338, § 334), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the complaint of the Council of the Shire of Moorabbin, and pursuant to an Order in Council bearing even date herewith, do hereby proclaim the portion of the Point Nepean road extending from the Mor-dialloc Creek bridge to the Half-way House, a distance of six miles, more or less, to be a Common-toll road of the said Shire of Moorabbin and the Shire of Dandenong.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of this Act; and nothing herein contained shall prevent the sale by auction or the leasing or licensing under this Act of any land comprised in any common heretofore or hereinafter to be proclaimed; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Commons hereinafter mentioned, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, such Commons to be designated by the names prefixed to the respective descriptions thereof, that is to say:—

GOORAM-GOORAM-GONG COMMON.—Three thousand six hundred acres, more or less, comprising allotments 34 and 35, in the parish of Euroa, and the unappropriated Crown lands within the boundaries described as follow, viz.: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 6, in the parish of Gooram-gooram-Gong; thence by the road which forms the north boundary of that parish bearing easterly ninety-seven chains to the north-west angle of allotment 24; thence by that allotment bearing south ten chains; thence by a line bearing east about ninety-eight chains to the Seven Creeks; thence down the Seven Creeks to the aforesaid road; thence again by that road bearing east about twenty-one chains to the north-west angle of the land licensed to William Douglas; thence by that land and by the lands licensed to John Hoysted, James Hogg, Adam Hogg, and John McPhee, respectively, to the south-east angle of allotment 21, being a point on the northern side of the road from Merton to Longwood; thence by that road westerly to the south-east angle of allotment 8; thence by that allotment and a line bearing north forty-six chains thirty-eight links; thence by a road bearing west twenty-four chains twenty-four links to the south-east angle of the land licensed to Thomas D. Kearney; thence by the east and north boundaries of that land to the aforesaid road from Merton to Longwood; thence by a line crossing that road and bearing westerly to north angle of allotment 5; thence by that allotment bearing south about ten chains seventy links to a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of the land licensed to John Thomas Vidler; thence by that line bearing west about thirty chains fifty links to the south-east angle of that land; thence by the east and north boundaries of that land to the north-west angle thereof; thence by a line bearing north about eighty-five chains to the road last mentioned; thence by a line bearing westerly about thirty-eight chains to the south-east angle of the land licensed to Michael Burns; thence by the east boundary of that land and a line crossing the last-

mentioned road bearing north about twenty-seven chains thirty-two links to the southern boundary of the land licensed to Patrick Burns; thence by the southern and east boundaries of that land to the south boundary of the land licensed to Jeremiah Coonen; thence by the south and east boundaries of that land to the Castle Creek; and thence up that creek to the point of commencement.

Also, commencing on the right bank of the Seven Creeks, at the point where it is crossed by the southern side of the road which forms the southern boundary of the land in the parish of Gooram-gooram-Gong licensed to John Cusack; thence up the Seven Creeks aforesaid to a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of the land licensed to William Bond; thence by that line bearing easterly about twenty chains to the south-west angle of that land; thence by that land and the land licensed to William Wakenshaw to the north-east angle of the last-mentioned land; thence by a line bearing north about eleven chains eighty-five links to the aforesaid road; and thence by that road bearing westerly to the point of commencement.

Also, commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 16, in the parish of Gooram-gooram-Gong; thence by a road bearing west forty-three chains seventy-four links; thence by the east and south boundaries of the land licensed to Alexander Andrews to the road from Euroa to Gobur; thence by that road bearing southerly four chains forty-four links to the land licensed to Duncan McLean; thence by that land and by the lands licensed to Thomas Moylan and John McLeod respectively to the north-east angle of the land licensed to the said John McLeod; thence by a line bearing north about one hundred and forty chains to the south boundary of allotment 16 aforesaid; and thence by the south and east boundaries of that allotment to the point of commencement.

Also, commencing on the western side of the road from Gobur to Euroa at a point on a line formed by the prolongation of the south boundary of the land in the parish of Gooram-gooram-Gong licensed to Thomas Killen; thence by the said road bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the land applied for under the 19th section of *The Land Act 1869* by Enlay McRae; thence by the south boundary of that land bearing west twenty-nine chains seventy-two links; thence by a line bearing south about one hundred and eighteen chains to a point bearing west from the point of commencement; and thence to that point by a line bearing east about eighty-six chains.—(73.L.8587.)

Mount Emu and Carngham, and the road from Carngham by Trawalla bridge leading north-westerly by the land of Frederick Williams, held under the 42nd section of *The Land Act 1865*, to the northern boundary of the district, together with all reserves on such roads, shall be excluded from and shall form no part of the Ballarat Clean District.

BRECHWORTH CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at the junction of the Owens River with the Murray River; thence up the Owens River to the King River; thence up that river to the Dueran run; thence by the north-eastern boundary of that

the Buckle-Kupple run; thence by the eastern, northern, and western boundaries of Buckle-Kupple run to the Dergholm run, being the southern extremity of Bogalara run; thence by the northern and north-western boundaries of that run to the Elderslie run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the western boundary of the colony aforesaid; and thence by that boundary bearing north to the commencing point.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF BOTANICAL AND DOMAIN GARDEN.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1859* it is among other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the rules and regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of the Botanical and Domain Garden:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds therein, or throw stones or commit any nuisance therein, or leave any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter therein, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths.
 2. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences therein, or to stick bills on such fences, or on the gates, or to cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts or fences, or to write thereon.
 3. No person shall be allowed to bring any dog into the Botanical and Domain Garden unless led by a chain or cord, or to run any goats or poultry therein.
 4. No children under ten years of age shall be admitted therein unless accompanied by friends or nurses.
 5. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale any article therein.
 6. Unless the Minister of Lands and Agriculture shall otherwise direct, the gates of the Botanical Garden shall be closed from 6 o'clock p.m. until 8 o'clock a.m.; and, after dusk, the traffic in the Domain shall be restricted to the road through the Domain to South Yarra.
 7. Entrance into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes is prohibited.
 8. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the garden not decorously dressed; and no person shall be allowed to commit any act of indecency either by word or action in this garden.
 9. If any person persists in offending against any of these rules after having been warned by a Crown lands bailiff or a constable to desist, such person may be forthwith removed from the garden by any such bailiff or constable.
- Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1859*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person, who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulation, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

REGULATIONS FOR THE CARE, PROTECTION, AND MANAGEMENT OF CARLTON GARDEN.

WHEREAS by section 108 of *The Land Act 1859* it is among other things enacted, that the Board of Land and Works shall have power from time to time to make and alter or rescind rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and preserves: Now, therefore, the said Board of Land and Works, in exercise of the power conferred as aforesaid, doth hereby make the rules and regulations following, to be observed and enforced in respect of Carlton Garden:—

1. No person shall interfere with the trees, shrubs, flowers, statuary, fountains, fish, or birds therein, or throw stones or commit any nuisance therein, or leave therein any bottles, orange-peel, paper, cast-off clothing, or other litter, or light fires therein, or smoke when walking off the paths.
 2. No person shall be allowed to climb or jump over the fences therein, or to stick bills on such fences, or on the gates, or to cut names, letters, or marks on the trees, seats, gates, posts, or fences, or to write thereon.
 3. No person shall be allowed to bring any dog into Carlton Garden unless led by a chain or cord, or to run any goats or poultry therein.
 4. No children under ten years of age shall be admitted therein unless accompanied by friends or nurses.
 5. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale any article therein.
 6. No person shall be allowed after dusk to walk off the garden paths.
 7. Entrance into plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and for other purposes is prohibited.
 8. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the gardens not decorously dressed, and no person shall be allowed to commit any act of indecency either by word or action in these gardens.
 9. If any person persists in offending against any of these rules after having been warned by a Crown lands bailiff or a constable to desist, such person may be forthwith removed from the gardens by any such bailiff or constable.
- Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1859*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £5 for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully

offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable, and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding £10.

Special Bye-law of the Council of the United Shire of Newham, made under the 6th section of the Shires Statute Amendment Act 387, for the Borough of Woodend, united to the said Shire, and framed in accordance with the Act 33 Vict. No. 359, for the purpose of adopting the parts, subdivisions, and sections of the 12th Schedule of the said recited Act No. 359, hereunder enumerated.

IN pursuance of the 6th section of the Shires Statute Amendment Act No. 387, and the 168th section and 12th schedule of the Boroughs Statute No. 359, the Council of the United Shire of Newham ordain as follows, that is to say:—

That subdivision 4, part 1, of the said 12th schedule of the Boroughs Statute, which is copied hereunder, be adopted in and for the Borough of Woodend united to the said shire.

Crossing, &c., footway, &c., save by made crossing.—Every person who wilfully and without lawful excuse rides or drives any horse or other animal, or drives or wheels any carriage, cart, or other vehicle upon, along, or across any footway or any water channel or gutter, herein called channel, by the side of any street, save in each such case upon and by or at some crossing to be made as hereinafter mentioned, shall forfeit a sum not exceeding five pounds, and shall also pay to the council such sum, not exceeding ten pounds, by way of compensation for any damage done by him to the footway or channel as the justice adjudicating upon the information shall on the hearing thereof order.

Notice of making crossing.—If any land shall front to, adjoin, or abut upon the footway of any street, and if access with horses and vehicles from such street to such land or to some sufficient way appurtenant thereto, cannot be had without riding, driving, or wheeling the same respectively upon or across the said footway, or the channel (if any) lying along the outer edge thereof, and if the owner of such land shall desire that a crossing for horses and other animals and for vehicles be made as herein provided over such footway and channel, and shall give a notice in writing of such his desire to the council, and in such notice describe the land in question and the proposed work by reference to the specification deposited as hereinafter mentioned, such specification being in accordance with the provisions hereof and with such regulation as may be in force in that behalf, it shall be lawful for such owner, after seven clear days from the giving such notice and not before (with no unnecessary delay or obstruction), at his own cost and under the inspection of such officer as the council shall have appointed for the purpose, to make such crossing according to the tenor of such notice and specification, and not otherwise, and the owner of such land shall afterwards in like manner maintain the same.

Specification.—Every such owner who desires as aforesaid that any such crossing shall be made, shall, before giving notice to the council as herein provided, deposit with the clerk of the council a specification describing the proposed work with respect to each of the several matters hereby or by any such regulation in force in that behalf required or provided.

Immunity of person giving irregular notice in certain cases.—Unless within the period of seven days after the receipt of any such notice as aforesaid the council shall give notice to the person giving the same that (if the fact be so) such notice, or the specification referred to therein and deposited, is not in accordance with the provisions of such regulations as aforesaid, such notice and specification shall thereafter, so far only as affects the liability of such person to any penalty, be deemed to be in accordance therewith.

Nature of crossing where there is a street curb.—In streets in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is a curb of stone or wood along the outer edge of the footway, the crossing, so far as the footway extends, shall have on both sides a curb not higher in any part than the surface of the footway at that part, and similar in all respects to such first-mentioned curb, and such curb shall approach to and join the street curbing in gentle curves outwards, and such crossing shall be of such width and the surface thereof as far as the footway extends shall have such inclination outwards, and be depressed so far below the footway, as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf, and shall, with respect to the channel be so laid or constructed as not to raise or obstruct the same or any part thereof.

Nature of crossing where there is no street curb.—In streets in which, at the site of any such proposed crossing, there is no such curbing as in the last preceding section mentioned, the crossing over the channel shall be such suitable bridge as shall leave a free passage for the water underneath the same, and shall be of such materials, form, length, size, strength, and fall as shall have been respectively appointed by some regulation in that behalf; and the surface of such crossing so far as the footway extends shall be so made good by paving, macadamising, gravelling, or otherwise, that the necessary traffic by animals or vehicles over the same shall not cause any damage thereto, but that such crossing shall be as sound and commodious for the passage of persons using the footway as the other portions of such footway adjoining such crossing.

Departures from notice, &c., not punishable in certain cases.—No person making any crossing shall be deemed guilty of an offence by reason only of some departure in making such crossing from the notice or specification relating thereto, unless the officer of the council appointed as hereinbefore provided to inspect the making of the crossing shall have reported in writing such departure to the council within three days after the same shall have occurred, and unless such person, being served by the council within three days after such report with a notice so to do, shall for the space of seven clear days after such notice have failed to correct or supply such departure.

Council may alter improper crossings.—Expenses.—If any crossing shall have been made in any respect contrary to this subdivision or any regulation in force hereunder, it shall be lawful for the council, if they shall see fit, to cause the same to be altered so as to conform to this subdivision and to such regulation respectively, and to recover, in manner in this Act elsewhere provided, the expenses of such alteration from the owner of the land to which such crossing shall lead; but they shall not so recover in those cases of departure from the notice or specification which the council or their officer might respectively have given notice of or reported, but failed to give notice of or report respectively in manner and within the time provided in the preceding sections hereof.

Crossings for private streets.—Expenses.—If any private street shall meet at an angle the footway of any public street, and there shall be no crossing upon and across such footway and the channel adjacent thereto from such private street to such public street, it shall be lawful for the council, if they shall see fit, to make in accordance with any regulation in force in that behalf a crossing upon and over such footway and channel of the description hereinbefore provided with respect to other crossings, and to recover from the owner of each of the tenements abutting on such private street such portion of the expenses of such making as shall bear to the whole of such expenses the same proportion as the rateable value of such tenement bears to the whole rateable value of all the tenements so abutting.

Council may alter crossings made before subdivision in force.—If any crossing across or over any footway or channel to any land or way appurtenant thereto, or to any private street, shall have been made before the coming into operation of this subdivision in the borough, but shall in any respect not be in accordance with any regulation made hereunder, the council may, if they shall see fit, cause the same to be altered so as to conform to such regulation; and if such crossing shall have been made contrary to any bye-law in force at the time of making the same, the council may recover the expenses of such alteration in manner in the last two preceding sections mentioned, according as one or the other may be applicable to the case.

Repair of crossings.—If any crossing shall be out of repair, and the person liable hereunder to, maintain or repair the same shall, for seven days after notice from the council to that effect, neglect properly and completely to repair the same, he shall forfeit for every day that such crossing shall remain so unrepaired a sum of forty shillings, and the council may, if they shall see fit, effect such repair and recover the same from such person before any justice.

Regulations.—It shall be lawful for the council from time to time to make regulations for all or any of the purposes following, that is to say:—

For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels; and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall, either absolutely or with relation to the levels, inclination, or fall of the footway or channel, or otherwise in like manner.
