SUNKEN ROCK OFF NUSA HEAD.

MR. WILLIAM JEW, master of the barque *Crishna*, reports that while lying in Laguna Bay, off the mouth of the Nusa River, on the 22nd and 23rd instant—a heavy sea running outside—he observed a break about 1½ miles northwards of Nusa Head. This probably shows the existence of a sunken rock lying off that head, similarly situated to the rocks off Point Lookout, Cape Moreton, Point Raper, and Double Island Point.

LIGHT ON LADY ELLIOT'S ISLAND.

ON and after this date the temporary light on Lady Elliot's Island will be replaced by a Fourth Order Dioptric Holophotal Revolving Light, the flashes being at intervals of thirty seconds.

The tower is painted white, and the light, which is visible all round the horizon, is elevated 60 feet above high water, being, in clear weather, visible from a distance of 12 miles.

TEMPORARY LIGHT, BURNETT RIVER.

ON and after this date a temporary light will be exhibited from the Pilot Station, at the mouth of the Burnett River. The light will be a fixed white light, showing from seaward between the bearings of S.E. and N.W., and visible in clear weather from a distance of 9 miles.

CONTROL AND MANAGEMENT OF THE STATE FOREST EASTWARD OF SMYTHESDALE, IN THE SHIRE OF GRENVILLE, AND OF THE CARNGHAM TIMBER RESERVE, IN THE SHIRE OF RIPON.

LOCAL FOREST BOARD FOR GRENVILLE AND RIPON.

WHEREAS by the 108th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Board of Land and Works to make rules and regulations for the care, protection, and management of all public parks and reserves, and for the preservation of good order and decency therein: The Board of Land and Works, in pursuance of the powers conferred as aforesaid, has made the following Regulation relative to the control of the State Forest eastward of Smythesdale, in the Shire of Grenville, and of the Carngham Timber Reserve, in the Shire of Ripon:—

REGULATION.

The undermentioned representatives of local public bodies in the Shires of Grenville, Leigh, Ripon (East Riding), and in the Boroughs of Smythesdale and Browns and Scarsdale, shall constitute a Board of Management, to be called the "Local Forest Board for Grenville and Ripon," to exercise control over the State forest eastward of Smythesdale, in the Shire of Grenville, and the Carngham timber reserve, in the Shire of Ripon.

"THE DISCIPLINE ACT 1870."

THE following regulations defining the uniform to be worn by the Naval Forces in the service of H.M. Government in Victoria have been approved by His Excellency the Governor in Council, viz.:—

1. Officers and men belonging to the regular Naval Forces of H.M. Government in Victoria shall wear the uniform prescribed in the Queen's regulations for the officers and men of the Imperial Service, with the following modifications, viz.:—

In the Executive branch, instead of the loop worn on the upper stripe, a diamond is to be substituted of one inch and a half inside diameter; warrant officers to wear $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch lace with same device; and in the Civil branches the uniform is to be as follows, viz.:—

For Surgeons.—Three $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch stripes half an inch apart on scarlet velvet.

Assistant Surgeons.—Two $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch stripes half an inch apart on scarlet velvet.

Paymaster and Assistant Paymaster.—Same as surgeon and assistant surgeon on white velvet.

Clerk.—One $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch stripe on white velvet.

Chief Engineer, Engineer, Assistant Engineer.—Same as paymaster, assistant paymaster, and clerk, on purple velvet.

2. The officers of the Naval Reserve will wear the same uniform as the officers of the Naval Forces, with the exception that, in the Executive branch, instead of a diamond, a loop is to be worn between the centre stripes, and where only one stripe is worn the loop is to be worn downwards.

3. The men of the Naval Reserve will wear the same uniform as the men of the regular Naval Force, with the following exceptions:—

Cap.—In place of ship's name on the ribbon, the words "Naval Reserve" are to be substituted.

Trousers.—A white stripe $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch broad is to be worn down the outside seams.

In each of the foregoing cases, where lace is to be worn, the lace known as the Victorian gold lace is to be used.

A Bye-law made under the provisions of Part 12 of the Shires Statute No. 358, for regulating the formation of crossings over footways in the Shire of Colac.

IN pursuance of the provisions of Part 12 of the Shires Statute No. 358, the Council of the Shire of Colac ordain as follows:—That from and after the date of this Bye-law coming into operation, all crossing places for the transit of wheeled carriages, horses, and other beasts across the footways within the said shire shall be made and maintained in the form, manner, and of the materials described in the several schedules marked A and B respectively to this Bye-law annexed.

SCHEDULE A.

Crossings of footways in roads and streets where a wood kerb is now laid or hereafter shall be laid.—The crossing shall be metalled and gravelled the whole width of the footpath, commencing from the exterior of the side channel with a slope to run out at four feet or less in the wide streets and two feet six inches or less in the narrow streets from the outer edge of the kerb, from which line the metalling shall follow the slope of the footpath, and be level therewith, until it meets the outer edge of the footpath; and the length of the crossing measured longitudinally with respect to the street shall not be less than seven feet nor more than twenty feet; the metal shall be two and a half inches ring gauge, not less than nine inches deep, and covered with gravel two inches thick; the metal shall be enclosed on each side for the whole width of the footpath and returned for its entire length by a hardwood kerb nine inches by four inches secured to a post four inches by nine inches, two feet in the ground, corresponding with the kerb of the street, which kerb at its junction with the kerb of the street shall terminate continuously with it on each side in the form shown on plan; the metal shall consist of bluestone or ironstone or such other durable stone as the shire surveyor for the time being shall approve.

SCHEDULE B.

Crossings of footways in roads and streets where a wood kerb has not been laid down.—The crossing to be in every respect the

same as the crossings in the foregoing Schedule A, with the exception that no kerb need be laid down; provided, however, that so soon as a wood kerb is laid down in the usual line of the street by the Council the said crossing places shall forthwith be constructed in strict accordance with the foregoing Schedule A; and provided further that the metal shall be continued from the edge of the footpath toward the centre of the street in the proper form of the side channel thereof for the space of four feet.
