## NOTICE TO INTENDING SELECTORS UNDER THE 19TH AND 49TH SECTIONS OF THE LAND ACT 1869, AND TO APPLICANTS FOR SALE OF LAND BY AUCTION.

## POST OFFICE SAVINGS BANK.

### NOTICE TO DEPOSITORS.

IT is hereby notified that the following Amended Regulations have been approved by the Governor in Council:—

2. Deposits of One shilling, or of any number of shillings, or of pounds and shillings, will be received from any depositor at the Post Office Savings Banks, provided the deposits made by such depositor do not exceed One hundred pounds within any period of fourteen days without special permission in writing having first been obtained by such depositor from the Postmaster-General; but no interest will be allowed on any sum in excess of Two hundred and fifty pounds.

All deposits must be made in cash, or in notes issued by Victorian banks, or in coupons on Victorian Government debentures.

6. Interest calculated yearly at the rate of Four pounds per cent. per annum shall be allowed on every complete sum of One pound, or some multiple thereof (not exceeding Two hundred and fifty pounds), deposited, and shall be computed from the 1st day of the calendar month next following the day on which the sum of One pound shall have been deposited, or on which deposits of a less amount shall have made up the sum of One pound, up to the first day of the calendar month in which moneys are withdrawn.

The interest will be calculated to the 31st December in every year, and will then be added to and become part of the principal money.

These regulations to take effect on and after the 1st day of November 1873.

## MIDDLE ISLAND (WEST COAST).

*These lights are not to be used for crossing the outer bar.*

AFTER the 4th September 1873, two lights, colored red, will be shown for the guidance of vessels over the inner bar, from two skeleton beacons, erected in the western portion of the town of Greymouth. The south-eastern or high light is twenty feet, and the north-western or lower light fifteen feet above high water during ordinary spring tides. The lights in one lead through the deepest water, over the shallow at the lower part of the Cross Channel, after passing the flagstaff inwards.

Mariners are cautioned that those lights are in no way to interfere with the lights at the flagstaff, and are only to be used for the navigation of that portion of the river extending from the flagstaff to the foot of Arney street.

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

*Pursuant to Order of 23 April 1873.*

**BRENNAN QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Brennanah and Coyoola Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

## SANDRIDGE R. V. V. ARTILLERY CORPS.

RULES PREPARED BY THE COMMITTEE FOR THE FUTURE  
GOVERNMENT OF THE CORPS.

*Constitution of Committee.—Members, how elected.—Vacancies in Committee, how filled.—Secretary, his duties.—Officers Members of Committee ex officio.*

1. The civil business of the corps shall be managed by a general committee consisting of six members, to be elected annually in the month of February, five to form a quorum. Should the number of candidates proposed exceed the number required, a ballot shall be taken, and the six having the greatest number of votes shall be declared elected. All vacancies occurring in committee to be filled by the corps at a meeting specially convened for that purpose. Secretary to be elected by the committee. His duties shall be to keep clear and intelligible minutes of all proceedings at committee and corps meetings, to keep the accounts of the corps, to prepare yearly statements of receipts and expenditure, to post copy of same in the orderly room, and to conduct all correspondence relating to the civil business of the corps under direction of the commanding officer. All commissioned officers of the corps shall be *ex officio* members of the committee.

*Duties of Committee.—Money Votes.—When to meet.*

2. The business of the committee shall be to consider and decide as to the eligibility of all candidates for admission to the corps; to consider, pass, and recommend to be paid all expenditure of the corps funds, and to take into consideration any matters submitted to them by the officer commanding the corps. The committee to meet on the first Thursday in each month, and as often as occasion may require. Absence from three consecutive meetings (without sufficient excuse) will disqualify any elected member of the committee.

*Special General Meetings, how convened.—Rules for conducting all Meetings.*

3. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special general meeting of the corps, or on receiving a requisition stating the object of the meeting, signed by not less than twenty members of the corps (provided always that the subject to be dealt with be of a military nature), giving not less than seven days' notice. Such notice shall consist of an advertisement in two daily papers, and also one insertion in the local paper (if any), and an intimation on parade when practicable. At every meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman. No discussion shall take place except on a motion moved and seconded and delivered, in writing, signed by the mover, to the chairman, who shall add the name of the seconder. No motion can be withdrawn without leave of the mover and seconder. No member shall propose more than one amendment upon any motion, and no member shall speak more than once upon any motion or amendment except the original mover of the motion first proposed, who shall be entitled to one reply and no more during the debate on the subject. The seconder of a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon if he has only seconded the same without remark. Any member, by leave of the chairman, may offer an explanation of any particular words which he has used, and which has been misunderstood, but shall not add any new matter. Any amendment to proceed with the next business shall, if carried, supersede the original motion and every amendment thereon. No meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion to that effect having been carried.

*General Meeting to be held in February of each year.*

4. A general meeting of the corps shall be held in the month of February of each year, at which a statement of the financial position of the corps, duly audited, shall be submitted to the members. Two auditors may be elected at any special general meeting of the corps.

*Construction of Corps and enrolment of New Members.*

5. The corps shall consist of those members whose names shall appear on the muster-roll on the date on which these rules shall be approved by the Governor in Council, and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted members in the manner hereinafter mentioned. From and after that date every person desirous of being enrolled shall forward to the commanding officer an application in writing supported by two members of the corps, and the following particulars in writing also:—(1) name in full, (2) age, (3) height, (4) occupation, (5) private and business address; which particulars shall be posted in the orderly room for a period of fourteen days, or two successive parade nights, and thereafter submitted to the general committee, which shall have the power to admit or refuse the candidate, subject always to the decision of the commanding officer for the time being and to the existing regulations of the Volunteer Force. Should the candidate for admission be under the age of twenty-one years, or in service as an apprentice, he must also produce the written consent of his parent, guardian, or employer to his entering the corps, and, in addition thereto,

such parent, guardian, or employer must sign the following undertaking to become responsible for all fines and penalties incurred by such candidate after his admission and under these rules:—

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"I, the undersigned of being of a candidate for admission to the Sandridge Volunteer Artillery Corps, he being under full age, do hereby give my consent to his candidature, and, in consideration of his being admitted a member, do hereby undertake to pay to the officer commanding the said corps, or to such other person as he may appoint, the amount of all fines which may be incurred by the said under the rules of the said corps, a copy of which I have seen, and have made myself acquainted with the contents thereof.

"Witness—

*Minimum Age and Height required of Candidates.*

6. No person shall be eligible for admission to the corps unless he be at least five feet seven inches in height and not under eighteen years of age.

*Members responsible for Damage to Arms, Accoutrements, and Clothing.*

7. Every member will be responsible for the good and servicable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing (fair wear and tear excepted), and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

*Members intending to be Absent for thirty days or more.*

8. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of such intention, in writing, to the commanding officer, who shall, at his discretion, direct the deposit of his arms, accoutrements, and uniform in a place to be appointed by the said commanding officer; penalty for non-compliance with this rule, Ten shillings.

*Members Changing Residence.*

9. All members changing their address must, within thirty days, give notice of the same, in writing, to the commanding officer, under a penalty of Two shillings and sixpence.

*Members must be properly Clothed for Parade.*

10. No member when in possession of arms and clothing shall be allowed on parade unless in uniform and accoutred.

*Appearing on Parade with Arms, Clothing, &c., Dirty or Unservicable.*

11. Any member appearing at parade or company drill with uniform, arms, or accoutrements dirty or unservicable from neglect may be fined by the officer in command or the captain commanding any sum not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

*Non-attendance at Parade for Inspection.*

12. The arms, accoutrements, and great-coats, or either of them, belonging to the corps to be called in twice in each year for general inspection, and shall be lodged in the store room for the space of seven days; penalty for non-compliance with order, Ten shillings.

*Resignation of Members.*

13. Any member of the corps resigning before he has earned his effective allowance according to the Volunteer Statute for the time being, or failing to make himself effective in any year, shall be fined the sum of Two pounds ten shillings, or such less sum as the committee may determine.

*Non-payment of Fines, how enforced.*

14. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to those appointed by the commanding officer to receive the same within fourteen days of the fine having been posted in the orderly room, and in default of such payment he shall be proceeded against according to law.

*Members owing Fines must Pay them before Competing in Company's Matches.*

15. No member shall compete in any of the matches of the corps, or for any prize offered by or to the corps, unless he has qualified himself as an effective and duly liquidated all claims against him.

*Members guilty of Disorderly Conduct.*

16. Any member, when in uniform, guilty of disorderly or riotous conduct, will render himself liable to immediate expulsion on information to the captain commanding, who shall at once forward his name to the Volunteer Office and recommend that his further services be dispensed with.

*Wearing Uniform, or any portion, prohibited when off duty.*

17. Any member, when off duty, wearing the uniform issued to him by the Government, or any portion thereof, without permission of the commanding officer, shall be fined for the first offence Two shillings and sixpence, and for every subsequent offence Five shillings.

*Rules to be supplied to each Member.*

18. Every member joining the corps will be supplied with a copy of these regulations.

*Subscription.*

19. Each member of the corps shall subscribe the sum of Sixpence per month to the funds of the corps.

## Alteration of Rules.

20. No alteration or addition whatever shall be made to these rules unless at a meeting of the corps especially convened for that purpose by a requisition to the commanding officer.

## RULES OF THE BENDIGO VOLUNTEER RIFLE CORPS.

## CONSTRUCTION OF THE CORPS AND ENROLMENT OF MEMBERS.

1. The corps shall consist of those members whose names shall appear on the muster-roll on the date on which these rules shall be approved by the Governor in Council, and of such other persons as may from time to time be admitted members in the manner hereinafter mentioned.

From and after that date every person desirous of being enrolled shall forward to the commanding officer an application, in writing, supported by two members of the corps, and the following particulars, in writing, also, viz.:

Name in full,  
Age,  
Height,  
Occupation,  
Private address and business address,

which particulars shall be posted in the orderly room for a period of one week, and thereafter submitted to the general committee, which shall have the power to admit or refuse the candidate, subject always to the decision of the commanding officer for the time being and to the existing regulations of the force.

## ADDRESS.

2. Any member changing his address must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding within fourteen days of such change, under a penalty of Two shillings.

Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his usual address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of the same, in writing, to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms and accoutrements in the store at the orderly room, under a penalty of Five shillings.

## PARADES, DRILLS, ETC.

3. The names of all members attending parades and drills shall be noted down in a book to be kept for that purpose, and any member whose name shall not appear marked on such attendance-book as present shall be deemed to have been absent, unless reasonable excuse shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before commencement of parade or drill.

Any member coming late may report himself to the senior officer present, assigning a reason for his late arrival, and if such reason shall be deemed sufficient and accepted by the commanding officer, such member shall be considered as having been present at parade or drill.

Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations (unless such parade shall have been ordered in plain clothes), or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine not exceeding Two shillings and sixpence.

## MANAGEMENT.

4. The civil business connected with the corps shall be managed by a general committee, a match committee, a band committee, a secretary, and treasurer.

The general committee shall consist of two sergeants, two corporals, seven privates, and the secretary, besides the officers, who shall be *ex officio* members of all committees.

The general committee shall be elected at a general meeting of the corps, to be held annually, at the expiration of which time all elected members shall retire from office, but will be eligible for re-election. Absence from three consecutive meetings (without sufficient excuse) will disqualify any elected member, and any vacancy caused by such disqualification or by resignation may be filled up by the committee at a special meeting to be called for that purpose.

The duties of the general committee shall be as follows:—To consider and recommend as to the eligibility or otherwise of all candidates for admission to the corps; to consider and deal with such correspondence as may be submitted to them; to take charge of and be accountable to the officer commanding for all property belonging to the corps which the commanding officer may entrust to them; to consider, pass, and recommend for payment all just and proper liabilities which may from time to time be incurred in the management or for the benefit of the same; to report to the corps (under the direction of the officer commanding) on the expenditure and condition of its funds and property, and all other necessary matters; and generally to transact such business as may be submitted by the commanding officer.

The general committee shall meet at least once a fortnight, on such day as they may agree upon; shall be at liberty to make rules for the conduct of its business; and seven members of such committee shall at all times be sufficient to form a quorum.

The match committee shall consist of five members of the corps, who shall be elected at the same time, in the same manner, for the same period, retire from office, and be eligible for re-election in a similar manner in all respects as is herein provided in the case of the general committee, with like powers to fill up vacancies occurring in their number.

The duties of the match committee shall be as follows:—To challenge and accept or decline challenges for matches with the rifle or other weapons under the direction of the officer commanding; to make and carry out all necessary arrangements for such matches; to select members to compete therein; to take charge of and arrange as to the competition for prizes; and generally to manage all matters connected with matches; subject in all cases to the consent of the commanding officer.

The match committee shall meet at such times as may be agreed on, and three members shall form a quorum.

The band committee shall consist of nine members, who shall be elected at the same time, in the same manner, for the same period, retire from office, and be eligible for re-election in a similar manner in all respects as is herein provided in the case of the general committee, with the like powers for filling up vacancies occurring in their number.

The duties of the band committee shall be as follows:—The general management of all matters connected with the band under the direction of the officer commanding.

The band committee shall meet at such times as may be agreed on, and five members shall form a quorum.

The secretary shall be elected annually at a general meeting of the corps, and shall hold office for twelve months.

The secretary shall attend the meetings of the corps and general committee, keep clear and intelligible minutes or records of all proceedings at such meetings, have custody of all letters and other papers connected with the corps entrusted to his care by the commanding officer, and conduct the correspondence relating thereto under direction of the officer commanding.

The secretary may at any time be removed from office by the vote of the majority present at any general or special meeting of the corps. In the event of such removal, or of the resignation of the secretary, the corps may at any general or special meeting elect a person to perform the duties for the remainder of the time for which such removed or resigned officer shall have been elected.

That at each annual meeting of the corps a treasurer shall be elected, who shall receive and disburse all moneys (other than Government moneys) according to directions of the general committee, and subject to the decision of the commanding officer.

## PROPERTY, UNIFORM, ETC.

5. Every member shall be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing; and any damage done thereto, except on duty, shall be made good by the person holding the same, or in default may be fined to the amount of such damage.

Every member must produce his arms for inspection by the officer commanding or other officer appointed for that purpose, whenever and so often as may be required, and must also return such arms to the officer commanding whenever directed by him so to do, or deposit the same in the orderly room under a penalty of Ten shillings.

Any person ceasing to be a member of the corps must forward his uniform and other property of the corps in his possession to the officer commanding, or in default he may be fined to the amount of the value of the property retained by him.

Any member expelled the corps within twelve months from receipt of new uniform shall pay to the officer commanding the full contract price of the same, or in default shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding such contract price.

Any member who may damage, lose, destroy, or retain any weapon, book, plate, or other property whatever belonging to the corps, shall make good the same to the satisfaction of the officer commanding, or in default he will be liable to a fine not exceeding the value of the property so damaged, lost, destroyed, or retained.

All property whatsoever belonging to the corps shall for all purposes be considered as vested in the commanding officer and his successors, whose decisions on all questions as to

value or amount, with reference to the fines and penalties aforesaid, shall be conclusive.

6. Any member who may be fined must pay the amount of such fine to the non-commissioned officer or other person authorized by the commanding officer to receive the same within seven days of its notification to him, and in default of such payment may be proceeded against according to law. In the event of such fine not being paid within seven days of the notification, the same shall be publicly intimated to the corps at their next parade, and the name of the defaulter posted in the orderly room until payment.

At every annual general meeting of the corps a balance-sheet showing its actual financial position, together with a plan of the proposed distribution and expenditure of funds for the ensuing twelve months, may be submitted by the general committee (after approval by the commanding officer) for the information of the meeting. The accounts of the corps shall be audited by two auditors to be elected at the annual general meeting.

#### MEETINGS.

7. The officer commanding may at any time convene a special meeting of the corps, or, on receiving a requisition signed by not less than twenty members (provided the subject be not of a military nature), giving not less than three days' notice.

Such notice shall consist of an advertisement in two of the local daily newspapers, and an intimation on parade when practicable, or by circular forwarded by post to each member. At every meeting the senior officer present shall be chairman.

No discussion shall take place except on a motion moved and seconded and delivered, in writing, signed by the mover, to the chairman, who shall add the name of the seconder.

Immediately on a motion or amendment being so delivered, it shall be read by the chairman for discussion, and shall not then be withdrawn without leave of the meeting.

Every amendment on a motion shall be dealt with in like manner, but only one amendment shall be entertained and decided on at a time; and if any amendment is carried it shall be held to have negatived the original motion and stand in its place, and it shall be competent, whether any amendment is carried or not, to receive other amendments, one at a time, in like manner to be discussed and decided on until the subject is finally disposed of: Provided that no member shall propose more than one amendment upon any motion, and no member shall speak more than once upon any motion or amendment except the original mover of the motion first proposed, who shall be entitled to one reply and no more during the debate on the subject.

The seconder of a motion or amendment shall not be held to have spoken thereon if he have only seconded the same without remark; and any member may, with leave of the chairman, offer an explanation of any particular words he has used and which have been misunderstood, but shall not add new matter.

No question which is substantially the same as one which has been negatived at the same meeting shall be entertained at such meeting or adjournment thereof.

Any amendment to proceed with the next business shall, if carried, supersede the original motion and every amendment thereon.

The chairman of any meeting or committee shall have no vote except in case of equality.

No person shall be allowed to vote or take any part in the proceedings at any meeting who is not at the time an effective member of the corps, or who shall have an unpaid fine, penalty, or subscription recorded against him; but a newly joined member will not be so disqualified on the ground of non-effectiveness, if he shall have been a duly enrolled member of the corps for three months.

All motions shall be decided by the holding up of hands unless a ballot be previously decided upon by the meeting.

Minutes of committee meetings shall be read prior to the adjournment or close of same, but shall not be confirmed until the next meeting.

Minutes of "general" or "special" meetings of the corps shall be read and confirmed prior to the close of such meetings.

To constitute a "general" or "special" meeting of the corps there shall be present before commencing business thirty of the members then upon the roll.

No meeting shall be adjourned or dissolved without a motion to that effect.

#### LIABILITIES INCURRED BY THE CORPS FOR MEMBERS.

8. If on the 1st of July in any year a member's debit exceeds his credit by One pound or upwards, he may be fined the amount of such difference; provided always that the amount of such fine shall not in any case exceed Two pounds.

9. If a member desire at any time to quit the corps under the provisions of the Act, he shall be fined the amount, if more than Ten shillings, whereby his debit exceeds his credit, provided that no such fine shall exceed Two pounds, and that the half may, at the discretion of the commanding officer, be remitted.

10. Any member desirous of altering or rescinding any of the foregoing rules, or of adding any new rule, must give fourteen days' notice, in writing, to the officer commanding, who shall cause a copy of such proposed alteration, rescission, or addition to be posted in the orderly room, or on the volunteer notice board, or published in one of the local papers, such notice to be given at least one week before the meeting.

These rules were adopted by a meeting of the corps on Monday, 25th August 1873.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Avon therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the part of the Shire of Avon described in such petition from such shire; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the South Riding of the said Shire of Avon as hereby diminished, in manner following, that is to say:—

#### SOUTH RIDING OF THE AVON SHIRE DIMINISHED.

Starting at the intersection of the north boundary of the parish of Bundalagwah with the Avon River; thence along said boundary to the Macalister River; down this and the Thomson rivers to the west boundary of the parish of Sale; north along this boundary to the Flooding Creek; down said creek to the south-east angle of allotment 100, parish of Sale; thence direct to the south-west angle of the Sale cemetery, and around cemetery to the same point; south to and down Flooding Creek to a point west of the north boundary of allotment 74, parish of Sale; east to the north-east angle of allotment 86, same parish; south to Flooding Creek; down this creek and the La Trobe River to Lake Wellington; and by the shore of this lake and the Avon River to the starting point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

#### DIVERTING AND WIDENING ROADS IN THE PARISH OF NANAPUNDAH.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Mount Rouse, by an Order made the seventh day of February A.D. 1872, directed the taking of certain lands for the diverting and widening of

roads in the parish of Nanapundah, in accordance with a plan deposited at the office of the said council: And whereas such Order was confirmed by the Minister of the Crown administering the Shires Statute, and the confirmation published in the *Government Gazette* of the eleventh day of July A.D. 1873, with the variation, namely, "The two chain road running between allotments 135 and 134 of the parish of Nanapundah and the Glen Ronald pre-emptive section in the same parish, and colored yellow on the said plan, not to be closed, the land included therein being reserved for public use and occupation as a road." And whereas it is expedient to deal further with the said lands under the powers conferred by the two hundred and eighty-second section of the Shires Statute, the council of the said shire do hereby, on this the eighteenth day of August A.D. 1873, order and direct that the land so taken shall be roads within the meaning of the Shires Statute, from and after the approval of this Order by the Governor, and that such roads shall be in lieu of the former road colored yellow on the said plan, and bounded as follows:—Commencing at the south-west angle of allotment number 133 in the parish of Nanapundah; bounded on the north by that allotment bearing east twenty-three chains ninety-two links; on the north-east by a line bearing south forty-two degrees twenty-five minutes east two chains three links; on the south by allotment number 119 bearing west twenty-five chains fifty-four links; and on the west by a line bearing north nine degrees thirty minutes east one chain fifty-one links to the commencing point. ## BALLAARAT DISTRICT ORPHAN ASYLUM.

**BYE-LAWS** of the Ballarat District Orphan Asylum, incorporated under 27 Vict. No. 220.

1. *Objects of the institution, and how supported.*—The object of the institution shall be the reception, maintenance, and education of children deprived of one or both parents by death, subject to such conditions as may be hereinafter mentioned; and the asylum to be supported by donations and subscriptions, together with such aid as may be obtained from Her Majesty's Government.

2. *Religion of inmates afterwards.*—Orphan children are admissible without reference to the creed or country of their parents; and all children now in the asylum and henceforward received shall be entered as members of the denominations to which they belonged during the joint lives of their parents; that no change be afterwards made or permitted during their continuance in the asylum.

3. *Children under guardianship may be admitted.*—Orphan children who are placed under guardianship or otherwise may be admitted on such terms of payment as the committee may decide.

4. *Powers of committee to recover payment for inmates.*—Whenever the committee are of opinion that an inmate has a parent or guardian in a position to contribute to its support, they shall be empowered to demand such sum as they think proper; and in default of payment the inmate may be removed.

5. *Constitution.*—The asylum shall be governed by a president, two vice-presidents, treasurer, and a committee of management consisting of fifteen members; but no minister of religion, recognised as such by the civil law, or by the respective denominations, shall be eligible for the office of president or vice-president.

## QUALIFICATIONS AND PRIVILEGES OF LIFE GOVERNORS.

6. *Qualifications of life governors.*—The following shall be the qualifications and privileges of life governors:—Every donor of £10 and upwards; every person who shall raise, by one or more collections in one year, the sum of £20 or upwards from persons not claiming membership on account of their contribution towards such sum; any person, appointed by any society, paying the sum of £20; the executor, or if more than one, the first-named in any will by which a bequest of £20 or upwards shall be paid to the institution; or any person recommended by the committee of management for special services rendered; shall be a life governor, and entitled to vote.

7. *Privileges of contributors.*—Every contributor of £1 or upwards annually, dating from the time of payment; every contributor of £10 and upwards from his own funds in one donation; shall be entitled to vote at all general and special meetings of governors and contributors, and be eligible to hold office.

8. *Privileges of life governors.*—Every life governor or annual contributor of £1, shall be entitled to recommend for admission to the asylum one child and no more during the current year; of £5 5s., two children; of £10 10s. and upwards, three children; and the minister of any congregation making an annual collection in aid of the funds of the asylum of not less than £10 shall be entitled to recommend two children for admission within twelve months from the date of the adoption of these rules, or from that of the last annual election, and three children for a collection of £20 and upwards. The privilege of recommendation in all the above cases shall be exhausted only upon the admission of the child recommended.

9. *Limitation of voting.*—No person shall in any case be entitled to more than one vote on any question.

10. *Annual meeting and election of officers.*—An annual meeting of governors and contributors shall be held on the second Thursday in the month of January in each year, due notice of which shall be given at least one week previously in one or more of the local papers, at which meeting the report and balance-sheet shall be presented, and the nomination and election of president, vice-presidents, treasurer, five members of committee of management, two auditors, and honorary medical officers, shall take place; and the consideration of such other business as may arise.

11. *Vacancies.*—In the event of any vacancy occurring during the year in the offices of president, vice-president, treasurer, or medical officer, the same shall be filled up at a special meeting of governors and contributors in accordance with rule 15.

## GENERAL MEETINGS.

12. *Chairman of meetings.*—At all meetings of governors and contributors the president, or, in his absence, one of the vice-presidents, shall take the chair; but should neither be present, the meeting shall choose its own chairman, who shall have a vote only in the event of there being an equality of votes; and every question submitted to such meeting shall be decided by the majority of votes of the governors and contributors then present.

13. *Quorum.*—At all meetings of governors and contributors twelve shall constitute a quorum, but if the required number be not present at the expiration of half an hour of the time named, such meeting shall stand adjourned to the following week at the same day and hour.

14. *Special meetings.*—At the request of twenty governors and contributors, or of the committee of management, a special meeting may be called, the secretary giving notice forthwith of such meeting in one or more of the local papers at least seven clear days before the meeting is to be held; and no other business than that specified in such requisition shall be entertained.

15. *Ballot.*—All elections, when contested, shall be by ballot.

16. *Persons entitled to vote.*—At all general and special meetings of governors and contributors two scrutineers shall be

appointed; and the secretary shall provide a list containing the names of all persons entitled to vote at such meetings, and no person shall be allowed to vote at any such meetings whose name does not appear in such list.

## COMMON SEAL.

17. The common seal of the corporation shall be kept at the asylum, in a box with two different locks and keys, one of which shall be kept by the president, and the other by the secretary.

18. *Affixing common seal.*—The common seal shall not be affixed to any deed or other instrument except by a resolution of the committee of management, and then only in the presence of and witnessed by two members of the committee specially appointed for that purpose.

## EXTRACTS FROM ACT, ETC.

19. *Retirement of committeemen.*—On the second Thursday in the month of January in every year one third part of the elected members of the committee shall go out of office (but may nevertheless be re-elected), and the persons who shall go out of office shall be those who have been the longest in office without re-election, or where two or more shall have been in office for the same length of time, then those who shall go out of office shall be determined by lot.—27 Vict. No. 220, sec. 11.

20. *Vacancies, how filled.*—If any member of committee shall die, or resign by letter under his hand addressed to the chairman of the committee, or become insolvent, or compound with his creditors, or be convicted of any treason, felony, misdemeanour, or be absent for four consecutive meetings from the committee, his office shall become vacant, and the remaining members of committee may declare his office vacant, and temporarily appoint thereto some contributor to such institution until the next annual meeting for the election of the committee, when the person thus temporarily appointed shall retire as one of those who, by the provisions of the said Act, are required to go out of office.—27 Vict. No. 220, sec. 12.

## COMMITTEE OF MANAGEMENT.

21. *Duties and powers.*—The committee of management shall conduct the general business of the asylum; admit and discharge children; appoint, suspend, and discharge salaried officers; accept contracts; make payments; and frame rules for the internal management of the institution.

22. *Day of meeting.*—They shall meet once in each month, or oftener if necessary, at such time and place as they may decide upon.

23. *Chairman's vote.*—The chairman shall have a casting but not a deliberative vote.

24. *Quorum.*—At all meetings of the committee, a quorum of four shall be competent to proceed with the business.

25. *Apprentices.*—The committee shall have power to enter into agreements for the apprenticing or otherwise arranging for the employment of any of the inmates, under such conditions and rules as may from time to time be adopted.

26. *House committee.*—The committee of management shall appoint a house committee, consisting of the two vice-presidents *ex officio*, and five others chosen from their number, three to form a quorum, who shall meet fortnightly to superintend the internal arrangements of the asylum, examine accounts, engage and discharge the domestic servants of the asylum, purchase food, clothing, and other necessaries, and attend to all matters relating to the health and comfort of the children, subject to the approval, and by the authority of, the committee of management.

27. *No member to become security for a contractor.*—No member of committee shall be a contractor, or become security for a contractor directly or indirectly; nor shall any member of the committee be present at the discussion of, nor record his vote upon, any matter in which he is pecuniarily interested.

28. The president shall be an *ex officio* member of all committees.

## AUDITORS.

29. *Duties of auditors.*—The auditors shall examine, certify, and report on the correctness or otherwise of the half-yearly accounts terminating on the 30th June and the 31st December in each year.

## SECRETARY.

30. *Duties of secretary.*—The secretary shall attend all meetings, keep all accounts, and perform the whole of the clerical work of the corporation, under the direction of the committee of management.

## TREASURER.

31. *Treasurer to receive all moneys.*—All moneys received by the secretary or collector on account of the asylum shall be paid to the treasurer within seven days, and the treasurer shall deposit the same within three days afterwards to the credit of the corporation in such bank as the committee of management may from time to time appoint.

32. *Sign collector's book.*—On receiving any moneys from the collector, he shall sign the collector's acquittance book for the amount so paid to him, after first satisfying himself that the addition of the items is correct.

33. *Payments by cheque.*—All payments shall be made by cheques, which shall be signed by the president (or, in his absence, a vice-president), and the treasurer, and countersigned by the secretary.

34. *Authority for payments.*—Previously to signing a cheque for the payment of any account, the treasurer shall require a warrant signed by the chairman of the meeting at which the account was passed.

## HONORARY MEDICAL OFFICERS.

35. *Duties of medical officers.*—The honorary medical officers of the institution shall be duly qualified medical practitioners, who shall have access to the institution at all times; perform all surgical operations, and report the same in a book kept for that purpose at the institution. Any honorary medical officer neglecting his duty, without reasonable excuse, shall cease to hold office, and another be appointed in his stead.

## SUPERINTENDENT.

*As. Duties of superintendent.*—The superintendent shall be responsible for the internal management of the institution, and shall have control of the inmates, all employees in and about the asylum, and hired servants thereof, subject to the regulations and orders of the committee of management.
