WHEREAS by The Importation and Custody of Cumpowder
Statute 1864 it is amongst other things enacted, that

5. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale any article therein.

6. No person shall be allowed after dusk to walk off the Garden paths.

7. No person, with the exception of the persons employed in the Garden, shall be allowed to enter the plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and flower-bods.

8. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the Garden not decorously dressed, and no person shall be allowed to commit any act of indecency either by word or action in this Garden.

9. The Fitzroy Garden shall be open to the public from Six a.m. to Fight p.m. on ordinary days, and from Six a.m. until Nine p.m. on Sundays.

10. Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of the Lund Act 1889, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Pive pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailtiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
