IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the fifth section of *The Bank Holidays Act 1873*, I, the Governor of Victoria, do by this my Proclamation appoint

MONDAY the 27th day of October instant a special day to be observed as a Bank Holiday in the Borough of Wangaratta.

## DISTRICT BROUGHT UNDER THE GUNPOWDER ACT.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the town hereinafter mentioned as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine, that is to say:—

THE TOWN OF ALEXANDRIA.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinbefore mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

*Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.*

**BRENAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Brenahan and Coyora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

3. No person shall be allowed to bring any dog into Fitzroy Garden unless led by a chain or cord, or to run any goats or poultry therein, or to ride on horseback therein.
4. No children under ten (10) years of age shall be admitted therein unless accompanied by friends or nurses.
5. No person shall be allowed to offer for sale any article therein.
6. No person shall be allowed after dusk to walk off the Garden paths.
7. No person, with the exception of the persons employed in the Garden, shall be allowed to enter the plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and flower-beds.
8. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the Garden not decorously dressed, and no person shall be allowed to commit any act of indecency either by word or action in this Garden.
9. The Fitzroy Garden shall be open to the public from Six a.m. to Eight p.m. on ordinary days, and from Six a.m. until Nine p.m. on Sundays.
10. Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence, and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

  6. No person shall be allowed to walk off the Garden paths.
  7. No person, with the exception of the persons employed in the Garden, shall be allowed to enter the plots of ground specially enclosed for plantations and flower-beds.
  8. No person shall be permitted to enter or remain in the Garden not decorously dressed, and no person shall be allowed to commit any act of indecency either by word or action in this Garden.
  9. The Treasury Garden shall be open to the public from Six a.m. to Eight p.m. on ordinary days, and from Six a.m. until Nine p.m. on Sundays.
- Offenders against these regulations shall, in accordance with section 108 of *The Land Act 1869*, on conviction before any justice, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Five pounds for each offence; and every person who shall knowingly and wilfully offend against any such regulations, and who shall not, after he shall have been warned by a bailiff of Crown lands or any constable, desist from so offending, may be forthwith apprehended by such bailiff or constable and be taken before some justice of the peace, and shall, on conviction, forfeit and pay a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.
