SIR,—Her Majesty's Government has been informed by the Prussian Government, that in view of the inclination to emigrate spreading largely in some provinces, excited and nourished principally by foreign agents, it proposes to expel from the country all emigration agents, sub-agents, and other recruiters who are not of German nationality, and that from this measure it would not be possible to except emigration agents sent from the British colonies.

## ST. KILDA VOLUNTEER ARTILLERY CORPS. RULES.

1. An annual meeting of the corps shall be held in the month of July in each year, of which one week's notice shall be given, at which the civil staff, consisting of the two senior commissioned officers, five members of the corps, a secretary, and a treasurer, shall be appointed (of whom three shall form a quorum), who shall audit the accounts, manage and dispose of the funds of the corps, and generally take into consideration any matters connected with the corps which may be referred to them by the officer commanding.
2. The officer commanding the corps may at any time convene a general meeting, and must do so on the written requisition of twelve (12) members, at which no rule or bye-law

shall be passed unless ten (10) days' notice by posting in the orderly room shall have been given. At every meeting the senior officer present shall preside; twenty to form a quorum.

3. All members changing their permanent address must, within fourteen days, give notice of the same in writing to the officer commanding, under the penalty of Five shillings.

4. Any member of the corps intending to be absent from his permanent address for a period of more than thirty days must give notice of such intention in writing to the officer commanding, and deposit his arms, accoutrements, and uniform in a place to be appointed by the officer commanding, under a penalty of Ten shillings.

5. Any member not on parade when the numbers are taken shall be deemed absent, unless a sufficient reason shall be forwarded to the officer commanding before the end of the month. Any member coming late and assigning a reason for so doing which is deemed sufficient by the officer commanding shall be considered as having been present at that parade.

6. Any member who, after having been supplied with uniform, shall attend parade not dressed in accordance with the established regulations, or whose arms, accoutrements, or clothing shall be dirty, or in any way unserviceable from neglect, will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence for each offence.

7. Any member guilty of talking or other irregularities on parade will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

8. Every member will be responsible for the good and serviceable order of his arms, accoutrements, and clothing, and any damage done thereto shall be made good by him.

9. Any member not producing his arms for inspection when called upon to do so will be liable to a fine of Two shillings and sixpence.

10. A list of all fines imposed in any month, and which have not been previously paid, shall be signed by the officer commanding, and posted in the orderly room or other place appointed, not later than the 5th of the following month.

11. All fines must be paid to the drill instructor, or other person appointed by the officer commanding, within one month of being posted; and the person so receiving such fines shall hand them over to the treasurer, who shall keep an account, and submit the same for inspection half-yearly or whenever deemed advisable.

12. Members failing to make themselves effective, as per volunteer regulations, shall be liable to a fine of Forty shillings, but the commanding officer may remit the whole or any part of such fine.

13. That in the event of any member leaving the battery without sufficient reason before the termination of the year in which he shall have joined, or failing to make himself effective during the said year, such member shall be subjected to a fine of Thirty shillings (30s.) for wear and tear of the uniform issued to him.

14. That the civil staff shall have the power of appointing from time to time such match committee as may be needed for the carrying out of the business of the battery, such committee to be selected either wholly from the said staff, or partly from the said staff and partly from the other members of the battery.

# BYE-LAW No. XI. OF THE MINING BOARD, OF THE MINING DISTRICT OF BALLARAT.

**A**T a meeting of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, begun and holden at Ballarat, in the said district, on the twenty-first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-three, it is ordained by the said board as follows (that is to say):—

1. *Definition of claims.*—A claim shall be such a parcel of land as may, in accordance with the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be taken possession of by or for any holder of a miner's right, or by or for any number of persons, each being the holder of a miner's right; acting in conjunction, or any number of such parcels as shall be lawfully amalgamated, or any divided portion or subdivision of a claim which shall have been transferred from the claimholders to other persons; and for the purposes of fixing and defining the dimensions thereof, and fixing the position of the boundaries with respect to any reef or lead, claims shall be divided into two classes, namely, alluvial claims and quartz claims, and shall be subdivided into registered claims and unregistered claims.

2. *Mode of determining extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The extent of a registered alluvial claim shall depend upon and be determined by the depth of the lead below the surface of such claim and the number of persons by or for whom the claim is taken possession of and held; and for the purpose of determining the dimensions of a claim, the depth of the lead shall be ascertained or computed from the most reliable data obtainable; provided always that the extent of a claim shall not, after the boundaries thereof have been adjusted and registered, be varied by reason of the depth of the lead being subsequently found to be greater or less than was computed at the time of fixing the extent and boundaries of such claim.

3. *Extent of registered alluvial claims.*—The size of a registered alluvial claim shall be in accordance with the schedule hereto numbered 1, having regard to the depth of the lead within such claim and the number of persons holders of miners' rights by or for whom such claim shall have been taken possession of: Provided always that, for the purpose of taking possession, the claim shall be marked off as that, the length thereof shall not exceed three times the width thereof.

4. *Extent of registered quartz claims.*—The width of a registered quartz claim shall not exceed seven hundred and fifty (750) feet by such length along the course or supposed course of a quartz reef or lode as shall be equal to, or shall not exceed, one hundred (100) feet per man; that is to say, a quartz claim for one person, being the holder of a miner's right, shall not exceed 100 feet in length by 750 in width; a quartz claim for two persons, being each the holder of a miner's right, shall not exceed 200 feet in length by 750 in width, and so on in the proportion of 100 feet or less in length along the course or supposed course of any quartz reef or lode for each and every of the persons who shall conjointly take possession thereof, by a width of 750 feet or less, shall be a quartz claim.

5. *Mode of taking possession of claims.*—Any person, being the holder of a miner's right, or any number of persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, and acting in conjunction, may take possession of a claim by fixing in the ground firmly at each corner, or at a point as nearly as practicable to each corner of the claim, a post projecting above the surface not less than three feet; and in all cases where any portion of the areas included within such posts shall, previous to the fixing thereof, have been exempted or excepted from occupation for mining purposes within the meaning of *The Mining Statute 1865*, or in case any such area shall be intersected by any land so exempted or excepted, the fixing of the posts as aforesaid shall, as far as respects the ground within (or intended to be included within) such area which shall not have been so exempted or excepted as aforesaid, be deemed as valid and sufficient for all purposes of possession under this bye-law, as if the land so exempted or excepted had not been included within such area; and provided the person or persons taking possession of a claim as aforesaid shall, within forty-eight hours (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after taking possession, make application therefor, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 2, to the mining registrar, and produce to the registrar a miner's right in the name of the applicant, or in the names of each of the applicants, and thereafter proceed in the manner prescribed by the mining board bye-laws in force in this district to obtain survey and registration of such claim, such possession as aforesaid shall be deemed a good, sufficient, and valid title to such claim within the meaning of *The Mining Statute 1865*, except as against any person or persons previously and at the time in occupation of the whole or any portion of the land comprised in the claim so taken possession of, until such claim shall have been surveyed and registered, or until the mining registrar shall have refused, in accordance with any mining board bye-law in force in this district, to make registration thereof.

6. *Application for claims.*—The mining registrar may and shall receive application for any claim or claims which shall have been taken possession of in accordance with the clause hereof numbered 5, and every such application shall be registered by the mining registrar in a proper book to be by him kept for the purpose, under the date and hour upon which such application shall be made, and the registrar shall thereupon deliver to the applicant or applicants a certificate in the form of the schedule hereto numbered 3, and upon receipt of such certificate the applicant or applicants shall, within forty-eight hours (Sundays and public holidays excepted), proceed in the manner prescribed in the clause hereof numbered 7, to obtain survey and registration of such claim or claims.

7. *Survey and registration of claims.*—Upon receipt of the certificate of application referred to in the clause hereof num-

bered 6, the applicant or applicants shall forthwith apply to the mining surveyor who shall by the Governor in Council have been appointed to the division in which the claim or claims shall be situated for survey of the claim or claims referred to in such certificate, which shall be produced to the surveyor; and the applicant or applicants shall, within twenty-one days from the date of such certificate, obtain from such surveyor, and deliver to the mining registrar, a plan and description of the claim or claims aforesaid, showing accurately the nature, extent, and locality of such claim or claims; and in the case of alluvial claims, the approximate depth of the lead, the lengths and bearings of the several boundary lines thereof, and the distance and bearing of some one of the angles of such claim or claims from some fixed point in the survey of some other claim or in some Government survey; and in the event of the claim or claims so applied for, or any portion thereof, infringing or encroaching, or appearing to infringe or encroach, upon any other mining tenement, or in any way interfering with, or appearing to interfere with, the rights of the owners of any other mining tenement, such encroachment or interference shall be shown upon the plan, or stated clearly in the description aforesaid; and upon receipt by the registrar within the time appointed of the plan and description aforesaid (provided the applicant or applicants be the holder or holders of, and produce to the registrar, sufficient miners' rights, and there appear upon the face of such plan and description no objection to the registration of such claim or claims), such registrar shall post upon a proper notice-board, to be kept outside and in front of his office, a notice, in the form of the schedule hereto numbered 4, stating that he intends, on a certain day to be named in such notice, not less than seven clear days from the date thereof, to make registration of such claim or claims; and unless he shall, before the day so fixed as aforesaid, receive from some competent court, or from some judge of such court, or from a warden, an injunction restraining him from making such registration, the registrar shall, after the full expiration of the time named in such notice, proceed forthwith to make registration of such claim or claims in a proper book or books, to be by him kept for that purpose, by entering therein full particulars of the nature, extent, position, and locality of the said claim or claims, the names in full of the applicants, and the numbers and dates of the several miners' rights under which such claim or claims shall be held, and by drawing or delineating upon the face of such register a sketch-copy of the plan which shall be delivered to him as aforesaid; but in case by the plan to be delivered to the registrar as aforesaid it shall appear that the claim or claims delineated thereon encroach upon or interfere with the rights of any person other than the applicants, he shall refuse to post the notice aforesaid; or in case an injunction from a competent court, or from a judge of such court, or from a warden, shall be served upon him, directing him to refrain from making registration of such claim or claims, he shall refuse to make such registration until he shall receive a duly certified copy of an order directing or permitting him to make such registration, or legally discharging such injunction as aforesaid: Provided always that notwithstanding the claim applied for shall appear by the plan and report of the mining surveyor to interfere with or encroach upon any other claims, if such last-mentioned claim shall not be held in reserve under protection registration, and if the applicant or one of the applicants, or his or their agent, shall make a statutory declaration that the claim or other mining tenement with which the claim applied for interferes or appears to interfere is apparently unoccupied and has been unworked for a period of more than two calendar months, and that there is no plant or machinery thereon, the registrar shall post the notice as aforesaid, and proceed, unless restrained as aforesaid, to make registration of the claim applied for, subject to the rights (if any still subsisting) of any previous occupant of such ground.

8. *Plurality of claims.*—Any one person, being the holder of a miner's right, may take possession of any number of separate claims (for one person) not exceeding fifty, or any two persons, each being the holder of a miner's right, may take possession of any number of separate claims (for two persons) not exceeding fifty, and so on in like manner in proportion to the number of persons who shall join together.

9. *Time for and mode of fixing boundaries of registered claims.*—It shall not be necessary at the time of taking possession of a registered claim to mark or define the boundaries thereof accurately and completely, but at the time of making survey the boundaries shall be adjusted so as to include the land taken possession of, or intended to be taken possession of, and which shall have been applied for; and the boundaries of every claim shall, at the time of making survey thereof, be completely and accurately defined, by cutting at each angle of such claim a V trench not less than nine (9) inches deep and not less than six (6) feet along each line, and erecting at each such angle a post not less than three (3) feet high; and such boundaries shall be correctly delineated upon a plan.

10. *Claims may be amalgamated.*—Any number of adjacent claims may be amalgamated, and for the purposes of working the claims which are amalgamated shall be deemed to be one claim, and work done upon or in connection with any one of the claims so amalgamated shall be deemed to be done upon or in connection with each and every of the claims so amalgamated.

11. *Mode of amalgamating claims.*—Upon the application of the holders of any number of adjoining claims, made in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 5, and signed by the persons interested therein, the mining registrar shall forthwith amalgamate such claims, and shall record such amalgamation upon the register relating to such claims, under the proper date, and shall issue to the holders of such amalgamated claim a certificate in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 6.

12. *Amalgamated claims may be re-registered as one claim.*—At the time of, or at any time subsequent to, the amalgamation of any two or more claims, the holders of such claims may, on payment of the fees prescribed for the registration of a mining tenement and of the holders of a mining tenement, require the mining registrar to re-register such claim as one claim, and to re-register the holders of the several claims as the holders of the one amalgamated claim.

13. *Time when work shall be commenced.*—Within fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted) from and after the date upon which the registration of any claim shall have been completed, the owners of such claim shall *bona fide* proceed to work, and shall, unless such claim be held under protection registration, as provided in the clause hereof numbered 14, continue to work upon such claim by themselves, or their agents, tributors, or servants, according to the usual practice of efficient mining; and efficient mining shall be the employment of such appliances and such a number of men as shall, taking into account all the circumstances of the mine, be necessary at the various stages of the work to explore and develop the mine with reasonable expedition: Provided always that working a claim or claims on a tribute system or percentage shall be deemed efficient mining: Provided also that in every and any case the minimum number of men employed shall be one man for and in respect of every claim for eight or less persons: Provided always that within and in respect of every forty men's ground comprised in any claim a separate shaft or such other works as shall be necessary to thoroughly and expeditiously develop the mine shall be constructed; that within and in respect of every claim comprising more than forty men's ground and less than eighty men's ground two separate shafts, or two sets of such other works as shall be necessary to thoroughly and expeditiously develop the mine, shall be constructed; and so on in like manner in respect of claims comprising more than eighty men's ground, so that within and in respect of every forty men's ground, or fractional part of forty men's ground in excess of forty men's ground comprised in any claim, there shall be constructed a separate shaft, tunnel, or other works, from which each such forty men's ground, or fractional part of forty men's ground in excess of forty men's ground, may be efficiently and expeditiously worked.

14. *Claims may be held in reserve.*—When by reason of any influx of water, or scarcity of water, or by reason of any other sufficient cause, the works upon a claim cannot be prosecuted, or when the holder or holders of a claim require to suspend mining operations upon such claim for the purpose of procuring and erecting machinery thereon, or for the purpose of repairing the machinery upon such claim, the holder or holders of such claim, or some person duly authorized on his or their behalf, shall make a statutory declaration in the form of the schedule hereto numbered 7, setting forth fully the reason or reasons for desiring to suspend, or the cause of having suspended, the works upon such claim, and stating the period (not exceeding three months) during which it will be requisite to suspend mining operations upon such claim, and shall deliver such declaration to the mining registrar, and the said registrar shall upon the receipt of such declaration register such claim to be held in reserve and unworked for any period named in the declaration not exceeding three months, and shall deliver to the person or holder or holders aforesaid a notice in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 8, stating that the owners of such claim are protected from forfeiture of their title to such claim for a certain period named therein, and it shall be the duty of such person or holder or holders to cause such notice to be posted on some conspicuous part of the claim to which it relates during the term of protection; and provided the causes or reasons assigned in such declaration be sufficient and the declaration be true, any claim or claims which shall have been registered as aforesaid shall during the time of such protection be exempt from fine or forfeiture for non-performance of work.

15. *Forfeiture for not proceeding to work.*—Any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area) upon or in connection with which work shall not *bona fide* be commenced within fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after the completion of the registration thereof shall be forfeitable; and unless at least forty-eight hours before the commencement of any proceedings taken in a competent court or before a warden to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture, the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work and continue to work thereon, such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid may, by a competent court or by a warden, be declared forfeited: Provided always that such court or warden may for the first offence inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

16. *Forfeiture for suspension of work.*—Any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area) upon which work having been commenced shall (except as provided in the clauses hereof numbered respectively 14 and 78) be suspended for a space of fourteen days (Sundays and public holidays excepted), or any claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid which shall be held in reserve and unworked under protection registration (as provided in the clauses hereof numbered respectively 14 and 78), if it shall appear to a court of competent jurisdiction or to a warden that the reasons assigned in the declaration under which such protection registration was obtained were insufficient, or that the declaration under which such protection registration was obtained was untrue, shall in any or either of the cases aforesaid be forfeitable; and unless (at least forty-eight hours before the commencement of any proceedings taken in a competent court or before a warden to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture) the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work and continue to

work thereon, such claim or other mining tenement as aforesaid may, by a competent court or by a warden, be declared forfeited: Provided always that such court or warden may for the first offence inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding fifty pounds.

17. *Exemption from forfeiture.*—In the event of the forfeiture of any claim or other mining tenement upon which there is any plant or machinery having accreted by reason of the owner or owners of such claim or other mining tenement not having commenced to work thereon, or in connection therewith, in accordance with the provisions of this bye-law, or by reason of the owner or owners as aforesaid having suspended work contrary to the provisions aforesaid, if (at least forty-eight hours before any proceedings shall have been taken in a competent court or before a warden to obtain an adjudication of such forfeiture) the owner or owners as aforesaid shall *bona fide* proceed to work, and continue work upon such claim; such last-mentioned work shall be and constitute an exemption from such forfeiture.

18. *Possession of a forfeited or abandoned mining tenement.*—When under the clauses hereof numbered respectively 15, 16, 22, 61, and 79, any claim or other mining tenement (except a residence or business area) shall be forfeitable, or be deemed to be abandoned, any person or persons, being the holder or holders of sufficient miners' rights, may take proceedings to obtain an adjudication of forfeiture or abandonment, and to obtain possession of such forfeited or abandoned claim or other mining tenement; and the person or persons who shall first take proceedings in that behalf shall (subject to any right of priority in any other person or persons in certain cases provided) be first entitled to enforce such forfeiture, penalty, or abandonment.

19. *Registration of claims adjudged forfeited or abandoned.*—In the event of any registered mining tenement having been adjudged or decreed forfeited or abandoned (unless notice of intention to appeal shall have been lodged, or in case the intention to appeal or the appeal shall have been abandoned) the person or persons upon whose complaint such adjudication or decree shall have been made, may proceed, in the manner prescribed in the clauses hereof numbered respectively 5 and 6, or 70 and 71, to take possession of, and make application for, and obtain survey and registration of the land comprised in such forfeited or abandoned mining tenement; or may, after having taken possession in accordance with the clause hereof numbered 5 or the clause hereof numbered 70, on production to the mining registrar of an authenticated copy of the order or decree and a copy or tracing of the plan of the mining tenement referred to in the order or decree, demand registration in his or their favor of such mining tenement without being required to proceed in the manner prescribed in the clauses hereof numbered respectively 5 and 6, or 70 and 71; to make application for and obtain survey of such mining tenement; but the application as aforesaid must be made, or the registration (without application and survey) must be demanded, within seven days after the date of the order or decree: Provided always that, in the event of an appeal from the adjudication or decree being proceeded with, the person or persons upon whose complaint the adjudication or decree shall have been made shall not be entitled to make application or demand registration until such appeal shall have been heard and finally determined in his or their favor; but within seven days after the appeal shall have been so finally determined, he or they shall make application as aforesaid, and proceed to obtain survey and registration, or (as the case may be) shall demand registration, without making application and obtaining survey.

20. *Registration may be cancelled on production of warden's order.*—At the expiration of fourteen days from and after the date on which any competent court or any warden shall have adjudged the title to any mining tenement forfeited or abandoned (unless an appeal or notice of intention to appeal shall have been lodged), on receipt by the mining registrar of a copy of the decree or order of such court or warden, he shall, note such decree or order on the face of the register of such tenement, and such note shall have the effect of cancelling the registration of title to such tenement.

21. *Claims or portions of claims may be abandoned.*—The holder or all the holders of any claim may at any time, provided such claim be not the subject of a lien duly registered, in the books of the mining registrar, abandon such claim or any portion of such claim by lodging with the mining registrar a notice signed by all the registered holders of the claim, stating that they have abandoned such claim or such portion of the claim as shall be described and delineated upon a plan attached to such notice; and thenceforth the claim or the land comprised in the portion of the claim delineated upon such plan shall be deemed absolutely abandoned, and may at any time thereafter be taken possession of by the holder of a miner's right; or by the holders of miners' rights, in the same manner as land which had not been previously held and occupied for mining purposes; and the abandonment of a portion of a claim shall not in any way prejudicially affect the title to the remaining portion of such claim.

22. *Deserted and abandoned ground.*—Ground which, having been occupied or held under miners' rights, shall have been unworked and unoccupied (except as provided in clause 14 hereof) for a period of two months, shall be deemed to be and shall be treated as ground absolutely relinquished, deserted, and abandoned.

23. *Taking possession of abandoned claims.*—Any claim which shall be apparently unoccupied, and which shall have been unworked for a period of more than two calendar months, and upon which there is no plant or machinery, shall be deemed to be actually abandoned ground, and may without any adjudication of forfeiture or abandonment be taken up and registered as a claim in accordance with the provisions of



this bye-law by any holder of a miner's right, but subject nevertheless to the rights (if any still subsisting) of any previous occupant of such ground.

24. *Mining tenements previously held may be re-registered.*—Any person or persons who shall previous to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation be in possession of a mining tenement may require the mining registrar to register such tenement under the provisions of this bye-law. The mode of effecting such re-registration shall be in every respect the same as prescribed in the clauses hereof numbered 7 and 71, except that on production by the applicant or applicants to the registrar of a plan, description, and report made by the mining surveyor to the effect that the mining tenement shown on the plan has been and is still held by the applicant or applicants, the registrar shall make registration of such tenement without posting the notice, as provided in the clauses hereof numbered 7 and 71, of his intention to register: Provided always that previous to making such registration the registrar shall require the applicant or applicants to produce such a consolidated miner's right in force, or such a number of miners' rights in force, as shall, under the provisions hereof, be sufficient to entitle the applicant or applicants to hold such tenement.

25. *Rights of holders under previous bye-laws.*—Any person or company occupying any claim or claims under any mining regulations or bye-law in force previous to the passing of this bye-law shall be at liberty, without relinquishing any rights or privileges which they may hold under such mining regulations, in so far as such rights or privileges relate to the area or tenure of such claims, to take advantage of all and every of the privileges conferred by this bye-law, provided that the rights of other persons shall not be thereby interfered with; and any person or company occupying or holding as aforesaid any claim or claims under separate miners' rights may, if they desire so to do, hold the same under such a consolidated miner's right as shall be sufficient under the provisions of this bye-law to entitle the owners to hold the area of ground comprised in such claim or claims, and at the request of such person or company the mining registrar shall register such consolidated miner's right in lieu of the separate miners' rights under which such claim or claims had been held.

26. *Mining, &c., on reserves.*—The lands which under *The Mining Statute 1865*, section 13, are exempted from occupation for mining purposes, or for residence and business under a miner's right or business license, that is to say, all Crown lands which shall be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, cultivated field, or orchard, or upon which any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, provided the same shall be in actual use and occupation, or any artificial dam or reservoir, shall be lawfully standing, may, notwithstanding such exemption, be occupied and held for mining purposes or for residence or business under a miner's right or business license, subject to the provisions generally of this bye-law, and also to the special conditions following, that is to say:—The condition upon which any lands which shall be lawfully and *bona fide* used as a yard, garden, cultivated field, or orchard, or upon which any house, outhouse, shed, or other building, or any artificial dam or reservoir, shall be lawfully standing shall be mined upon or under, or be occupied for residence or business, shall be that compensation shall be paid to the owner for all damage done or caused by such mining or occupation; and should such owner and the person or persons doing or causing such damage disagree as to the amount of such compensation, the matter shall be referred to the arbitration of two indifferent persons, one of whom shall be appointed by the owner and one by the person or persons doing or causing such damage, and should such arbitrators fail to agree upon an award, they shall select a third person, and the decision of any two of such arbitrators shall be binding upon the parties.

27. *Claimholders entitled to gold.*—The person or persons being lawfully the registered holder or holders of any claim shall, during the continuance in force of any miner's right in the name of such person, or of each such person connected in the register with such claim, and subject to the provisions of any mining bye-law in force in this district, be deemed in law to be possessed (except as against Her Majesty only) of the parcel or parcels of land comprised in such claim; and the property therein, and every share or interest which may be created therein, shall be deemed a chattel interest, and during such continuance, and subject as aforesaid, all gold then being in and upon any such parcel or parcels of land shall (except as against Her Majesty) be the absolute property of the person or persons for the time being in lawful occupation of such parcel or parcels of land.

28. *Creation of shares.*—The person or persons who shall have taken possession of and shall have applied for any claim shall, when registration is made of such claim, be registered as the holders thereof, and such person or persons may at any time thereafter create any number of shares or interests in such claim, and may appropriate such shares or any portion thereof, and for the purpose of registering the shares so created the registered holder or holders of any claim may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 9, notify the mining registrar of the creation and appropriation of shares therein, and the persons to whom the shares so created have been appropriated may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 10, require the mining registrar to make registration of such shares in accordance with the terms of the notice of the creation and appropriation thereof, and the person or persons in whose favor such shares have been registered may demand from the mining registrar a certificate in respect of each share, or of two or more shares, and every such certificate shall be in the form of the schedule hereto numbered 11, and shall describe fully the tenement and the share or shares therein to which it relates.

29. *Allotment, transfer, &c., of furnishing shares.*—At the time of, or at any time subsequent to, the creation of shares in any claim any share or shares may by the shareholders be allotted to any person or persons in consideration of such person or persons furnishing goods, materials, or machinery for the claim; and the number of shares to be so allotted, the consideration for which such shares shall be allotted, and the terms and conditions upon which such shares shall be held, transferred, encumbered, or otherwise dealt with by the allottee or allottees, shall be the subject of a written agreement between the shareholders and the allottee or allottees (as the case may be), and a copy of such agreement shall at the time of allotting such share or shares be lodged with the mining registrar in whose office the claim is registered, and thereafter such share or shares shall be transferred, encumbered, or otherwise dealt with subject to and only in accordance with the terms, conditions, and stipulations contained in such agreement.

30. *Shares in claims may be increased.*—Any company may, after the creation of shares as provided for in the clause hereof numbered 28, by a vote of the majority of the shareholders, increase the number of their shares, and the registrar on receipt of an application in the form contained in the schedule hereto numbered 12, signed by a majority of the shareholders of any company, and on the production of the miners' rights, certificates, or transfer tickets under which the company requiring registration under this clause hold their claim or other mining tenement, shall register such company for such increased number of shares, and shall furnish new certificates in the form contained in the schedule hereto numbered 11 to the company in lieu of the previous certificates, and shall retain and file the original certificates; and no registration under this clause shall interfere with, set aside, or curtail any right, title, or interest held by the company at the date of such registration, nor shall it affect the date of the first registration: Provided always that, unless the increased number of shares be allotted *pro rata* amongst all the shareholders, the consent of every shareholder in the company shall be obtained, and the mining registrar shall, before making registration of such increased number of shares, require the signature of every shareholder to the application.

31. *Transfers of claims or shares created in claims.*—The registered holder or holders of any claim or other mining tenement, or the registered holder of any lien upon any claim or other mining tenement, may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 13, and the holders of any share created in any claim or other mining tenement, or any interest therein, may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 14, assign or transfer such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien, or any portion thereof or interest therein, to any other person or persons, being the holder of a miner's right or holders of miners' rights. Provided that every such transfer shall be signed by the parties thereto, in the presence of some person or persons who shall attest the signatures to such transfer, and upon the completion of such transfer and delivery to the registrar of the certificate, transfer, or lien ticket, and miner's right or miners' rights under which such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien shall have been held, the registrar shall record upon the register relating to the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien so transferred the date on which such transfer has been made, and the name of the transferee, together with such other particulars relating to such transfer as to such registrar shall appear necessary, and shall issue to the transferee a duplicate of the transfer. The registrar shall retain and file the certificate, transfer, or lien ticket delivered to him as aforesaid, and in the event of the transferor having transferred only an undivided interest in the share held by him under such certificate, transfer, or lien ticket, the registrar shall issue to the transferor a certificate in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 15, describing accurately the interest retained by the said transferor: Provided always that if a sufficient number of miners' rights in force or a sufficient consolidated miner's right in force shall be held by or on behalf of the holders in respect of any claim or other mining tenement, the transferor or transferee of any lien upon or any share or interest created in such claim or other mining tenement shall not for the purposes of transfer be required to produce any miners' rights; and further provided that the miners' rights or consolidated miner's right under which the claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien had been held, may, with the consent of all the parties interested, be transferred with such claim or other mining tenement, share, interest, or lien to the transferee, and if required so to do, the registrar shall endorse such transfer upon such miner's right or consolidated miner's right.

32. *Transfer or subdivision of claims.*—In the event of a claim or other mining tenement being subdivided, and a divided portion or subdivision being transferred from the registered holders of such claim or other tenement to another or other persons, plans shall be produced to the registrar, showing respectively the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or mining tenement to be transferred, and the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement to be retained, and the plan of such first-mentioned portion or subdivision shall be referred to in the tickets upon which such transfers are made; and when the transfers shall have been completed, the registrar shall make registration (under the date of the original registration) of the divided portion or subdivision of the claim or other mining tenement retained by the persons who were at the date of the subdivision the registered holders of the entire claim or other mining tenement, and shall make a separate registration of the divided portion or subdivision of such claim or other mining tenement which shall have been transferred; and upon the face of the register of the entire claim or other mining tenement the registrar shall make a minute of such subdivision or transfer.



33. *Number of shares may be transferred on one ticket.*—Any person holding two or more undivided shares in any one claim or other mining tenement may transfer the whole of such shares upon one transfer ticket.

34. *Lien.*—The holder or holders of any registered claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 16, and the holder of any share or interest created in any claim or other mining tenement may, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 17, grant a lien upon the same to any other person or persons as security for the due payment of any debt or liability; and upon production to the registrar of the transfer ticket or certificate under which the intending lienor holds the claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest intended to be made the subject of a lien, and of the miner's right of the intending lienor, and upon the execution of a lien ticket by the lienor and lienor in the form aforesaid, duly attested, the registrar shall register a lien upon the aforesaid claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, and after having made such registration the registrar shall issue to the lienor a duplicate of the lien ticket as aforesaid, and shall retain and file the transfer ticket or certificate of the lienor until such lien shall have been satisfied and the subject thereof released; and in the event of the sum of money named in the lien ticket not being paid within the time named in the lien ticket for the payment thereof, the lienor may, after making a demand in writing for payment of the sum of money aforesaid, and after advertising in three consecutive issues of some newspaper published at or circulating in the locality in which the subject of the lien is situated, sell by public auction the claim, share, or interest the subject of the lien, and may, as agent for the lienor, transfer and assign such claim, share, or interest, and may, for the purpose of effecting such transfer or assignment, sign the name of the lienor to any form or document required by the mining registrar; and every such lien granted and duly registered as aforesaid shall be a specific charge upon the claim or other mining tenement or interest which shall have been so made the subject of such lien until the debt or liability shall have been discharged in full, and registered liens shall take precedence according to the dates of their respective registration by the registrar; and every transfer of any claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest held under lien shall be made subject to every registered lien thereon. Whenever the sum secured under any lien shall have been paid, and all lawful demands in respect thereof satisfied, the lienor shall fill up and sign, in the presence of a witness, who shall attest his signature thereto, the form of release at the back of the lien ticket, and upon receipt by the registrar of the lien ticket, with the form of release duly filled up and signed, he shall record such release in the register and return to the lienor the transfer ticket or certificate retained and filed as aforesaid.

35. *Executors, &c., may be registered.*—The executors or administrators, or the assignee or assignees in insolvency, or the guardians in infancy, or the committee or guardians in lunacy, of any person or persons possessed of any claim or other mining tenement, share or interest, or the purchaser or purchasers under an execution of any claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, may be registered for or in respect of such claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest; and the mining registrar shall, on production of the order or authority under which such executors, administrators, assignee or assignees, guardians, committee, or purchaser or purchasers, as aforesaid, claim to be registered, and on the production of a miner's right or miner's rights sufficient to hold such claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest, register them or any of them named in such order or authority for and in respect of such claim or other mining tenement, share, or interest so possessed or purchased as aforesaid.

36. *Events in which shares shall be forfeitable.*—The events upon which a share in a claim shall be forfeitable shall be as follows:—The non-performance by any shareholder of his proper share of work according to the rules or practice of the company holding, or of his copartners in the claim; or in the absence of such rules or practice the non-performance by any shareholder for a period of six consecutive days of his proper share of work; the non-payment by any shareholder of all lawful calls made upon his share or shares; and in respect of shares which shall be forfeitable by reason of non-performance of work or non-payment of calls, the company or copartners, or some person duly authorized by a majority in number and value of the shareholders in the company, or by a majority of the copartners, or by the directors of the company, may enforce forfeiture; and such company, copartners, or person shall, as aforesaid, respectively have priority of right to be put into possession of such share or shares: Provided always that a competent court or a warden may for the first offence inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

37. *Registration for forfeited share.*—When, under the provisions of *The Mining Statute 1865*, an order shall be made directing that any certain person or persons shall be put into possession of a forfeited share or interest, such person or persons shall deliver to the mining registrar a certified copy of such order, which shall be by such registrar filed, and upon production of the miner's right or miners' rights of such person or persons, the registrar shall forthwith register him or them for the share or interest referred to in such order in lieu of the person or persons who shall have forfeited the said share or interest.

38. *Liability of holders of shares worked by contract, &c.*—Persons holding shares or portions of shares in claims which are being worked by contract or hired labor, or by a smaller number of men than are registered for the same, shall be deemed to be working shareholders, and non-payment of calls made for the purpose of defraying the expense of working the claim, and payable by such person, shall be deemed to be neglect of work

within the meaning of this bye-law, and the share or shares, or portions thereof, belonging to the person or persons neglecting to pay any calls payable in respect of the same, within twenty-one days after such call shall become due, shall, in the absence of some rules made by the company or party holding such claim providing otherwise, be deemed to be forfeitable, and may by a competent court or a warden be declared forfeited; and any other person may, subject to any right of priority in certain cases provided, and subject to payment of the calls due thereon, be by a competent court or a warden put into possession of such share or shares, or portions thereof: Provided nevertheless that no forfeiture shall be incurred under this section for non-payment of any call unless notice in writing of such call shall have been served on the person whose interest is intended to be forfeited seven days at least before such forfeiture: Provided also that in case the person liable to pay such call cannot, after reasonable enquiry, be found, it shall be sufficient to post such notice on the claim in which such share or interest is held, and also at the office of the registrar of the division in which such claim is situate, and such posting shall be deemed a service of such notice on the defaulting shareholder.

39. *Portions of shares liable to forfeiture.*—In case the share or interest held by any person or persons shall be forfeited, such forfeiture shall only affect the interest then held by the person or persons incurring such forfeiture, and shall not extend to any portion of interest previously disposed of by transfer or by way of lien; and any person being put into possession of a forfeited share, or part thereof, shall be so put into possession subject to all liabilities and encumbrances affecting the same respectively, and also subject to the conditions registered by the registrar, and to the rules of the company under which such share or interest may respectively have been held.

40. *Liabilities of holders of sleeping portions of shares.*—In the event of the working portion of a share being forfeited, and no person taking possession of and working the same, the liability to work it shall fall upon the holder for the time being of the last-created sleeping portion of such share; and in default of the holder of such last-created sleeping interest working such share and paying all liabilities due in respect thereof, he shall forfeit his interest therein; and in every such case the holder of the next last-created sleeping portion of said share shall work, or pay the expenses of working, the forfeited portion of such share, and shall pay the liabilities due in respect thereof, and so on in the like manner until the whole of the said share shall have been forfeited, or until the forfeited portion or portions shall be taken up and worked: Provided always that the person who shall perform the work or pay the liabilities of a forfeited portion of a share shall be first entitled to enforce the forfeiture and to be put into possession of such forfeited portion of a share.

41. *Liabilities of holders of working portions of shares.*—The working partner in a share shall be primarily responsible to the company for all calls and expenses in respect of or incidental to the working of such share, and for all fines which may be imposed by the company in respect of such share for neglect of work; and when a working partner in a share has incurred expenses by fines, wages, or otherwise, and refuses or neglects to pay the same, and such company neglect to give notice thereof to the holder or holders of a sleeping portion or sleeping portions of such share, all liabilities incurred by said working partner over and above the sum of Ten pounds (£10), in addition to the amount due for calls, shall be at the company's own risk, and shall not be chargeable against the sleeping partner or partners in said share.

42. *Sleeping shareholders liable for calls.*—Should any person holding a sleeping interest and being a sleeping partner in any share, claim, or company, neglect to pay the portion of calls or other liabilities to which he is legally subject, either by special agreement or in any other way, and should the working shareholder or the company sustain any loss by such neglect, the sleeping shareholder shall, in addition to paying such calls, be liable to make good such loss within eight days after a notice has been served upon him, requiring him to pay to his copartner or copartners, or to the secretary or other officer of the company named in such notice, the amount of the liabilities so incurred by him, and in case of his non-compliance with the terms of such notice, or in case he cannot after reasonable enquiry be found so that such notice can be served upon him, if a copy thereof shall be left at his last-known place of abode, and a copy thereof also posted and kept posted for eight days consecutively upon the claim in which the sleeping interest aforesaid shall be held, and a copy thereof be inserted in one at least of the local newspapers for eight days consecutively, and payment of such liabilities shall not have been made within said eight days, then in either of said cases the interest of said sleeping shareholder shall be forfeitable, and the working partner, or some person authorized in writing by a majority in number and value of the shareholders in the company, as the case may be, shall be entitled to be by a competent court or by a warden put into possession of such sleeping interest; and the registrar of the division in which such forfeited interest shall be situated shall register the person so put into possession in respect of the sleeping partner's interest in such claim on production of a certified copy of the order of the court, or of the warden in that behalf.

43. *Abandonment of shares.*—Any person or persons holding a share or shares in a registered claim or other mining tenement may abandon the same, provided that previous to such abandonment the said shareholder shall pay all liabilities due in respect of such share or shares, give to his partner or partners, and also to the registrar, a notice in writing of his intention, and shall publish four days consecutively a copy of said notice in a daily newspaper circulating in the district in which such claim or other mining tenement is situated; and the registrar, after having been satisfied that notice has been given in each of

the ways aforesaid, shall forthwith cancel the registration by which such share has been held, and the said shareholder shall thereupon be released from all future liability in respect of such share: Provided always that such abandonment shall not be deemed or taken to interfere with, set aside, or cancel any debt, agreement, engagement, or contract, which may at the date of such abandonment exist between the said shareholder and his copartner or copartners, or any debt or liability the subject of a lien upon such share or shares.

44. *Rights of shareholders to discoveries.*—All persons holding interests, whether sleeping or working, in claims shall be entitled to benefit by all auriferous deposits discovered by the working shareholders or workmen during the working of such claims, whether such auriferous deposits be within the boundaries of such claims or not: Provided always that nothing shall be considered a discovery within the meaning of this clause unless actual access can be had thereto by means of the drives or workings of the claims aforesaid.

45. *Machinery, or dam sites.*—The owner or owners of any claim or water-right may take possession of, and occupy as a site upon which to erect machinery or construct a dam, any extent of Crown land not exceeding five acres, and the mode of taking possession of and making application for and registration of such site shall be in every respect similar to the mode of taking possession of and making application for and registration of claims, as provided in the clauses hereof numbered respectively 5, 6, and 7: and the boundaries of a machinery site shall be defined as is provided in the clause hereof numbered 9 in respect of claims.

46. *Machinery sites not to be undermined.*—No person shall undermine any area upon which any steam-engine or quartz-crushing or other machinery is erected, without the consent of the person to whom such machinery belongs.

47. *Auriferous earth or quartz may be stacked, &c.*—Any person or persons shall be at liberty to hold possession of any quartz, stone, or other substance containing gold, that may have been raised, stacked, or stored by him or them, or of which he or they may be the owner or owners, provided that the same shall not have been stored on any ground occupied by any other person; and unless such quartz, stone, or other substance as aforesaid shall be stacked or stored upon a claim in the occupation of such person or persons, owner or owners, he or they shall give notice to the registrar of the division in which the same shall be stacked or stored of his or their having stacked or stored such quartz, stone, or other substance, and the registrar shall thereupon register the title of the person or persons to such quartz, stone, or other substance; and such registration shall be made for any period not exceeding twelve calendar months, and the owner or owners shall cause a notice of such registration to be legibly written or painted on a board or metal plate which shall be posted and kept posted upon the stack or store; and no person or persons shall remove any quartz, stone, or other substance stacked or stored, and registered in accordance with this section of this bye-law, without the consent of the registered owner or owners of the same; but should such owner neglect or fail to give notice and obtain registration as aforesaid, or otherwise fail to comply with the provisions of this section, or neglect or fail to remove the same within the period of twelve months as aforesaid, such quartz, stone, or other substance, unless stacked or stored upon a claim or claims in the possession of the owner or owners thereof, shall be deemed to be forfeited and abandoned, and may be taken possession of by any other person or persons who shall have lawfully taken possession of the ground upon which such quartz, stone, or other substance may have been stacked or stored.

48. *Width of ground for protection of roads, channels, &c.*—Persons taking possession of areas of ground for the purpose of making or using tunnels, roads, or tramways, shall be entitled to occupy, subject to the provisions of this bye-law, for the protection of such tunnels, roads, or tramways, respectively, a width of ground not exceeding ten feet on each side of the centre of such tunnels, roads, or tramways; and no person shall mine upon or under, or otherwise interfere with, such areas without the consent of the owner or owners thereof.

49. *Races, &c., may be constructed through claims, &c.*—Any person or persons, being the holder or holders under a miner's right or miners' rights, or consolidated miner's right, of any mining tenement, may use, by way of an easement, any unoccupied Crown lands, and may, through or upon such Crown lands, make or construct such races, roads, tramways, tunnels, or drains, as shall be necessary for carrying on, or as shall aid in carrying on, the operations of such person or persons in the effectual working of such mining tenements. Any person or persons shall be entitled to cut and construct private ways and passages for mining purposes through any claim or claims held by any other person or persons, or under, over, or across any race, tail-race, or drain: Provided always that such private ways or passages be cut, constructed, timbered, framed, and formed in such a manner as not to injure the claim, race, or drain through or across which it may be cut or constructed.

50. *Construction of crossings, &c.*—Any person or persons cutting a race across roads or thoroughfares shall construct and keep in repair good substantial and suitable crossings over the said race not less than twelve (12) feet in width, and shall also construct suitable approaches, not less than ten (10) feet in length, to and on each side of said crossings; and any person or persons opening up new roads or thoroughfares across any race shall construct and keep in repair suitable crossings as aforesaid over said race, and suitable approaches as aforesaid thereto: Provided that such last-mentioned roads, thoroughfares, and crossings shall not interfere with the security of the race.

51. *Accumulation of sludge, &c., not allowed.*—No person or persons shall cause or permit sludge to flow from his or their

claims, and to accumulate so as to cause injury to any public road, or to any claim, drive, water-race, dam, puddling-machine, or other machinery belonging to any other person, or displace, deface, injure, or destroy, or in any way interfere with any notice, notice-board, post, peg, trench, or reference-mark, made or used by any person or persons making any survey, or doing any act proper to be done, or holding any privilege under this bye-law.

52. *Removal of timber from abandoned shafts and drives.*—No person shall remove slabs out of any abandoned shaft without filling up such shaft as the slabs are removed, nor remove from any drive or other underground works any props or supports, the removal of which may endanger any adjacent mine or mine works.

53. *Ventilation of mines.*—Where the underground works of two or more claims communicate with each other so as to afford the means of ventilation, such ventilation shall not be obstructed by the owners of any one of such claims without the written consent of the owners of all the claims affected.

54. *Loss of miner's right, &c.*—When any person loses the miner's right, consolidated miner's right, certificate, or transfer or lien ticket, by virtue of which he holds any mining tenement, share or portion of a share, or lien, he may make a statutory declaration of such loss before a justice of the peace; and the registrar shall, on production to him of such declaration, issue to the person a duplicate of the certificate or transfer or lien ticket, and shall, for all purposes connected with the transfer of such share or interest, receive such duplicate in lieu of the said certificate or transfer or lien ticket, and for the purposes aforesaid shall receive the declaration in lieu of the miner's right or consolidated miner's right.

55. *Registration of new miner's right.*—At any time during the currency of the miner's right or when the term of the miner's right under which a person holds any mining tenement is about to expire or shall have expired, and such person shall have obtained a new miner's right, he may, upon production of the new miner's right, require the registrar of the division in which such mining tenement is situated to substitute in the register of the mining tenement aforesaid the number and date of the new miner's right for the number and date of the old one.

56. *Size of unregistered claims.*—The size of an unregistered claim shall depend solely upon the number of persons by or for whom possession thereof is taken.

57. *Size of unregistered alluvial claims.*—The maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of, and be held by one person as an unregistered alluvial claim, shall be 10,000 superficial feet; the maximum extent of ground which may be taken possession of, and be held as an unregistered claim by two persons, shall be 20,000 superficial feet; and so on in like proportion (that is to say, in the proportion of 10,000 superficial feet for each person) for any number of persons who shall take possession of and hold conjointly: Provided always that, for the purpose of taking possession, the claim shall be marked off so that the length thereof shall not exceed four times the width thereof.

58. *Size of unregistered quartz claims.*—The size of an unregistered quartz claim for one person shall be any length not exceeding fifty feet by a width of two hundred and fifty feet; for two persons any length not exceeding one hundred feet by a width of two hundred and fifty feet, and so on in like proportion for any greater number of persons.

59. *Boundaries of unregistered claim, when to be defined.*—The boundaries of an unregistered claim shall be completely and accurately defined at the time of taking possession thereof; and for the purpose of taking possession, a post not less than three inches in diameter and not less than three feet in height shall be fixed, and a V trench not less than nine inches deep and six feet long shall be cut at each corner or at each angle of the claim; and such posts and trenches shall be maintained by the holders of the claim during their occupancy. The person or persons who shall have so taken possession of an unregistered claim shall, during the continuance in force of his miner's right or their respective miners' rights, subject to the provisions of any mining board bye-law in force in this district, be entitled (except as against Her Majesty, and except as against any person or persons who shall have previously taken possession of the ground comprised in such claim) to all gold in and upon such claim.

60. *Amalgamation of unregistered claims.*—Adjacent unregistered claims may, by consent of their respective owners, be amalgamated.

61. *Unregistered claims, forfeiture of.*—The title to any unregistered claim, or to any share therein, shall be deemed to be forfeited within the meaning of *The Mining Statute 1865* and of this bye-law, if the owner or owners of such claim or share shall, during eight consecutive days (Sundays and public holidays excepted), neglect to work such claim or share.

#### RESIDENCE AREAS AND BUSINESS AREAS.

62. *Residence areas.*—Areas of ground occupied under and by virtue of a miner's right for the purposes of residence shall be called residence areas, and such areas may be registered.

63. *Business area.*—An area of ground occupied for the purpose of business under a business license shall be called a business area, and such area may be registered; but, as provided in *The Mining Statute 1865*, no business area shall be taken possession of or registered upon land situated within one quarter of a mile of any town, village, or hamlet, or of land in any township previously sold or advertised, or specified as about to be offered for sale.

64. *Mode of taking possession of residence or business area.*—Possession may be taken of a residence or business area by fixing

firmly in the ground at each corner or angle of the area a post projecting above the surface not less than three feet.

65. *Application for and registration of residence or business area, and objections thereto.*—Upon receipt by the mining registrar of a notice of possession of and application for a residence or business area, in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto numbered 18, he shall deliver to the applicant a duplicate of such notice, and the applicant shall post such duplicate notice upon the site applied for, and shall keep such notice posted upon the site for the space of seven days; and if within the said seven days the registrar shall receive no notice of objection, he shall, on being requested so to do, register the applicant as the holder of the site applied for, and shall thereupon issue to the holder a certificate in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto numbered 19; but if any person shall before the expiration of the said seven days deliver to the registrar a notice, in the form of the schedule hereto numbered 20, objecting to the registration of the applicant, and stating the grounds of his objection, the registrar shall refrain from making registration of such applicant as the holder of the site applied for until he shall be directed thereto by a judge of the court of mines or by a warden, or until he shall be satisfied that the objector has failed to take proceedings as hereinafter provided, or has failed to obtain an order preventing registration of the applicant. Within seven days of the delivery of the notice of objection, the objector shall commence proceedings in the court of mines, or before a warden, to prevent the registration of the applicant for the site applied for; but should he fail to commence proceedings as aforesaid within the said seven days, or fail to obtain an order preventing registration of the applicant, the registrar, on production of a certificate from the clerk of the court of mines or the clerk of the warden to the effect that the objector has failed as aforesaid, shall, if required so to do, register the applicant as the holder of the site applied for, and shall thereupon issue to the holder a certificate in the form prescribed in the schedule hereto numbered 19: Provided always that an applicant for a residence or business area may, at the time of making application therefor, lodge with the mining registrar a plan of the site applied for, and may require the registrar to attach such plan to the application, and when making registration to enter a copy of such plan in the register, or any registered holder of any residence or business area may at any time produce to the mining registrar a plan of such area, and require the registrar to enter such plan upon the register.

66. *Transfer, &c., of residence and business areas.*—The several provisions contained in clauses of this bye-law regulating the transfer and encumbrance of registered claims or shares shall be held and taken to apply to registered residence and business areas so far as they can be so applied: Provided always that the owner of a residence or business area shall, unless previously in occupation thereof, within fourteen days after the date of registration, take possession of and occupy said area for the purpose of residence or business, as the case may be.

67. *Form and extent of residence and business areas.*—The extent of a residence or business area shall not exceed one-quarter of an acre, and any such area may have frontage to any road or street not exceeding 82 feet 6 inches, except in the case of a corner allotment, in which case the frontage to any one road or street shall not exceed 132 feet.

68. *Forfeiture of business area.*—Any business area which shall have been unoccupied for a period of six months shall be forfeited; and any person, being the holder of a business license, who shall have obtained from a competent court or warden an order giving him possession of such business area, shall be entitled to be registered as the owner thereof, and upon production to the mining registrar of the business license, and the order as aforesaid, the registrar shall forthwith register such person accordingly: Provided always that it shall be competent for the court or the warden before which application for possession shall be made to inflict, by way of fine in lieu of forfeiture, a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

#### WATER-RIGHTS.

69. *Water-rights.*—Any person or persons holding sufficient miners' rights may, subject to the provisions of *The Mining Statute*, cut, construct, and use races, dams, and reservoirs for mining purposes through and upon any Crown land, and may take or divert water from any spring, lake, pool, or stream situate on or flowing through or adjoining Crown lands, and may collect and store any water falling upon and running through or over any Crown land, and may use such water for mining purposes, and for his or their domestic purposes, and may use, by way of easement, any unoccupied Crown lands; and the right to cut, construct, and use races, dams, and reservoirs, and to take, divert, collect, and store water as aforesaid, shall be termed or styled a water-right.

70. *Taking possession of water-rights.*—Any person or persons intending to divert and use, or collect, store, and use water as aforesaid, and for that purpose to cut or construct a race for leading or conveying such water, or to construct a dam or reservoir for conserving or storing such water, shall, for the purpose of taking possession, fix firmly in the ground at each end of the race, and at intervals of not more than a mile, along or as nearly as practicable along the intended course of the race, or (as the case may be) at each angle of the dam site, or reservoir site, a post projecting above the surface not less than three feet, and shall within forty-eight hours (Sundays and public holidays excepted) after taking possession make application, in writing, to the registrar of the division in which the water-right is wholly situated or in which the claim or claims or any portion of the claim or claims to which the water is to be conveyed shall be situated, and every such application shall be in the form contained in the schedule hereto numbered 21, and shall set forth the name or names of

the river, creek, or other source from which the water is to be obtained, particularising with sufficient accuracy the point in such river, creek, or other source from whence the water is to be diverted, the quantity of water in sluice-heads required, the number of dams (if any) in which such water is to be stored, and their situation, the length of the race, and its intended course, and shall state the date of the day and the hour of taking possession as aforesaid; and every such application shall be signed by the applicant or applicants, and shall contain the number and date of each miner's right or consolidated miner's right; and the registrar to whom such application shall be made shall issue to the applicant or applicants a certificate, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 22, setting forth fully the nature, extent, and description of the right or privilege applied for. And provided the applicants shall forthwith proceed, in the manner prescribed, to obtain survey and registration thereof, the fixing of such pegs as aforesaid shall be deemed a possession and occupation of such water-rights, dams, and races, and a sufficient title to the occupation thereof (except as against the holder or holders of a prior right or prior rights to such water-dams or races), until the applicant or applicants shall have been registered as the owner or owners of the same, or until such registration shall have been properly refused.

71. *Survey and registration of water-rights.*—Upon receipt of the certificate of application referred to in the clause hereof numbered 70, the applicant or applicants shall forthwith apply to the mining surveyor for survey of the course of the race or races and of the sites for dams or reservoirs referred to in such certificate, which shall be produced to the surveyor, and the applicant or applicants shall, within twenty-one days from the date of such certificate, obtain from such surveyor and deliver to the mining registrar of the division in which such water-right shall be wholly situated, or if the whole of the water-right be not within one division to the registrar of the division in which the claim, or any portion of the claim, to which such water is to be conducted shall be situated, a plan and description of the race, dam, or reservoir aforesaid, showing accurately the nature, extent, and locality of the water-right, the source or sources from which the water shall be taken or diverted, the position and extent of the site or sites of any dams or reservoirs, the length and bearings of the course of the race, and in the event of the water-right so applied for, or any portion of it, encroaching upon or interfering with, or appearing to encroach upon or interfere with, the rights of the owners of any other water-right or of any claim or other mining tenement, such encroachment or interference, or apparent encroachment or interference, shall be shown upon the plan or stated clearly in the description aforesaid; and upon receipt by the registrar within the time appointed of the plan and description aforesaid (provided the applicant or applicants be the holder or holders of sufficient miners' rights in force or of a sufficient consolidated miner's right in force, and there appear upon the face of such plan and description no objection to the registration of such water-right), such registrar shall post upon a proper notice-board, to be kept outside and in front of his office, a notice, in the form in the schedule hereto numbered 23, stating that he intends, on a certain day to be named in such notice not less than seven clear days from the date thereof, to make registration of such water-right; and unless he shall before the day so fixed as aforesaid, receive from some judge of a competent court or from a warden an injunction restraining him from making such registration, the registrar shall, after the full expiration of the time named in such notice, proceed forthwith to make registration of such water-right in a proper book or books to be kept by him for that purpose, by entering therein full particulars of the nature, extent, position, and locality of the said water-right, race, dam, or reservoir, and the source or sources from which such water shall be taken or diverted, the quantity of water so taken calculated in sluice-heads as hereinafter provided, the order of priority of such right in relation to any other right of water from the same source or sources, the names in full of the applicants, and the number and dates of the miners' rights or consolidated miner's right under which such water-right shall be held, and by drawing or delineating upon the face of such register a sketch copy of the plan which shall be delivered to him as aforesaid. But in case by the plan and description to be delivered to him as aforesaid it shall appear that the water-right delineated thereon or described therein encroaches upon or interferes with the rights of any persons other than the applicants, he shall refuse to post the notice aforesaid, or in case an injunction from a judge of a competent court or from a warden shall be served upon him directing him to refrain from making registration of such water-right, he shall refuse to make such registration until he shall receive a duly certified copy of an order directing or permitting him to make such registration, or legally discharging such injunction as aforesaid.

72. *Extension, &c., of races.*—Any person or persons finally registered for any water-right shall not be limited in the use thereof to the claim for which such right was originally registered, but may use the same for mining purposes upon any other claim: Provided always that when any such person or persons require to extend their race or watercourse beyond the point for which he or they were originally registered, they shall do so in accordance with the provisions of the clauses hereof numbered respectively 70 and 71.

73. *Measurement of water.*—Any person or persons diverting or using water for mining purposes shall use a gauge or measurement, to be called a "sluice-head," which sluice-head shall be such a quantity of water as shall pass through an aperture sixteen inches wide and one inch deep, with a pressure not exceeding six inches; and every person diverting and using such water as aforesaid shall cause a gate or hatch to be placed at the head of the race or at the source from which the water

used by him or them is taken: Provided always that in cases where water is obtained from several sources, the gate or hatch shall be placed in the race as near as possible to the head, but below the point of confluence from all the sources from which the water conveyed in the race is obtained.

74. *Quantity of water.*—The quantity of water to which any person or persons holding a miner's right or miners' rights shall be entitled shall be as follows:—

1st. For sluicing purposes—For every three men employed, one sluice-head.

2nd. For puddling with machine propelled by horse power—For every horse power employed, one-half of a sluice-head.

3rd. For puddling with machine propelled by steam power—Any quantity not exceeding two sluice-heads.

4th. For crushing purposes—For every stamp-head employed, one-eighth of a sluice-head.

5th. As feed for steam engine—In addition to the above quantity, such quantity as shall be *bond fide* required to supply such engine.

6th. As motive power to propel a water-wheel for pumping or crushing—Any quantity not exceeding three sluice-heads.

Provided always that any quantity of water may be used as motive power for crushing, puddling, or other machinery, when such water is not required for general mining or washing purposes.

75. *Width of ground for protection of race.*—Any person or persons occupying a race for the conveyance of water for mining purposes shall be entitled to a width of ten feet on each side of the race, measuring from the centre: Provided always that where the depth of a cutting exceeds eight feet, or where a tunnel is used, the width shall be twenty feet on each side of the race, measuring from the centre.

76. *Heads of races not to be shifted.*—No person or persons shall shift the head or heads of his or their race, or do any other act or thing so as to interfere with the rights of any other person or persons, or to diminish the supply of water to which such last-mentioned person or persons shall be entitled.

77. *Order of priority of rights.*—Holders of water-rights who shall take or divert water from a common source shall take precedence in respect thereof in the order in which they shall have been registered for the same; and if at any time the water becomes insufficient to supply all the persons registered in respect of the same, the person or persons lastly registered shall forego their rights during such deficiency of water, as against persons previously registered; but in the event of there being at any time any surplus water, any person or persons may construct a dam or dams for the purpose of conserving such surplus water, and such last-mentioned person or persons shall be entitled to use the water so conserved.

78. *Water shall not run to waste.*—No person or persons holding water-rights under this bye-law shall allow any water to run to waste, but such water shall be appropriated to the use of the next holder or holders of any right in respect of such water according to the date of their respective registration.

79. *Water-rights may be held in reserve.*—When any person or persons holding a water-right or water-rights shall not have a sufficient supply of water to enable him or them to carry on mining operations efficiently, or when from any other good cause the person or persons is or are compelled to suspend operations, on receipt of a statutory declaration in the form contained in the schedule hereto numbered 7, made by the person or persons holding such right or rights, or by a secretary or other person duly authorized on his or their behalf, and setting forth fully the reason or reasons for desiring to suspend, or the cause or causes of having suspended, works upon or in connection with such water-right or water-rights, and stating the period (not exceeding six months) during which it will be requisite to suspend such works, the registrar shall register such water-right or water-rights to be held in reserve and unworked for any period named in such declaration not exceeding six months, and shall issue to such person or persons or their agent a notice, in the form contained in the schedule hereto numbered 8, stating that the owner or owners of such water-right or water-rights is or are (subject to the provisions in the clause hereof numbered 16) protected from forfeiture of his or their title to such water-right or water-rights for a certain period named therein, and if the work be not resumed in connection with the water-right or water-rights registered as aforesaid within fourteen days after the expiration of the period of such protection registration, such right or rights shall be forfeitable, and may be taken possession of by any other person or persons who shall have applied to and obtained from a competent court or a warden an order in that behalf, and such last-mentioned person or persons shall, on production of such order to the mining registrar, be registered as the owner or owners of the water-right so forfeited.

80. *Quantity of water to be left in rivers or creeks.*—The holders of water-rights shall not be entitled to take water from any river or main creek or tributary creek when by so doing they will reduce the quantity of water in a river bed or main creek to less than one sluice-head, or in a tributary creek to less than half of a sluice-head.

81. *Penalty for breach of bye-laws.*—Under the provisions of *The Mining Statute 1865*, clause 237, it is provided that any person who shall infringe any lawful bye-law of any mining board shall, on conviction thereof before a competent court, forfeit and pay for every such offence a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds, and every such penalty shall be recovered in a summary way before a justice being also a warden.

82. *Title not to be injured by neglect of officer.*—The title to any claim or other mining tenement shall not be damaged or vitiated by reason of the non-performance, or the non-per-

formance within the prescribed time, of any act, matter, or thing required by this bye-law to be done by the applicant for, or the holder of, any claim or other mining tenement, if such applicant or holder can prove that the non-performance as aforesaid was caused by the neglect or default of any mining officer.

83. *Interpretation clause.*—In the construction and for the purpose of this bye-law, the following terms shall, if not inconsistent with the context or subject-matter, have the respective meanings hereby assigned to them, that is to say:—The word "registrar" or the words "mining registrar" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the mining registrar (or, in the absence of the mining registrar, an assistant mining registrar) appointed by the Governor in Council to act in and for the division in which any mining tenement, claim, share, or interest referred to shall be situated. The word "lead" shall mean and be interpreted to mean any auriferous deposit or any alluvial deposit, earth, drift, or gutter containing or supposed to contain gold. The words "depth of sinkings" shall mean and be interpreted to mean the depth to which it shall be necessary to sink a shaft for the purpose of working or mining a lead, or the depth below the surface at which the bed rock immediately under the lead shall be found or shall be known or be supposed to exist. The words "a sufficient miner's right" or the words "sufficient miners' rights" shall respectively mean and be interpreted to mean a miner's right or such a consolidated miner's right or so many miners' rights as shall be equal to one miner's right for every fifty claims (for one person) held thereunder. The words "mining tenement" shall mean and be interpreted to mean and include any parcel or parcels of Crown land held or occupied for the purpose of mining for gold, or any share or interest therein, or any water taken, diverted, stored, conserved, or used for the purpose or for or in connection with the pursuit of mining for gold or any share or interest therein, or any race, drain, dam, or reservoir held, occupied, or used for the purpose of diverting, conducting, storing, or conserving water for the purpose or in connection with the pursuit of gold mining, or any share or interest therein, or any Crown land held, occupied, used, or enjoyed as a site for residence or business under a miner's right or business license, or for a dam, reservoir, or machinery, or for a road, tramway, channel, drain, watercourse, or easement in connection with a claim or claims or a water-right, or any share or interest therein. The words "tail-race" shall mean and be interpreted to mean a race cut in the earth for running off debris or tailings and for collecting the gold from such debris or tailings, and shall include as well as the race so much of the land on either side thereof as shall be necessary to protect such race. The words "holder of a miner's right," "holder or holders of a miner's right or miners' rights," "shareholder," "company," "applicant or applicants," or "person or persons," shall respectively mean and be interpreted to mean holder of a miner's right or his agent, holder or holders of a miner's right or miners' rights or his or their agent, shareholder or his agent, company or their agent, applicant or his agent, applicant or applicants or his or their agents, person or persons or his or their agents; and for the purpose of this bye-law any act done by an agent duly authorized in writing shall be deemed to have been done by the person or persons by whom or for whom the agent was authorized to act. The words "plant or machinery" shall mean and be interpreted to mean, and shall include any machine or machinery, appliance or appliances, materials, gear, or implements used, employed, or fixed in, or for raising, extracting, or treating any earth, stone, rock, cement, gravel, metal, or mineral, or in or for raising, loading, conducting, or storing any water, or in or for sinking or boring in or through any earth, rock, cement, drift, or gravel, or in or for supporting any shaft, tunnel, gallery, adit, drive, or other underground works or excavations. A sleeping portion of or a sleeping interest in a share shall be deemed to be created at the time when such sleeping portion or interest is first transferred. And nothing herein contained shall be construed to interfere with, curtail, or set aside rights and privileges obtained previous to and enjoyed at the time of passing of this bye-law, in so far as such rights or privileges relate to the area, extent, or tenure of claims or other mining tenements, but any and every of such rights and privileges are hereby confirmed: Provided that any such claim or other mining tenement requiring, under the provisions of this bye-law, to be registered, which shall not have been previously registered, shall be registered within three calendar months after this bye-law shall have become law.

84. *Repealing clause.*—From and after the date on which this bye-law shall have the force of law throughout the Mining District of Ballarat, as provided in *The Mining Statute 1865*, section 72, the following bye-laws, that is to say, the bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, numbered III., published in the *Government Gazette* on the 17th day of August 1866, and the bye-law of the Mining Board of the Mining District of Ballarat, numbered X., published in the *Government Gazette* on the 1st day of March 1872, shall be and the same are hereby repealed, always saving and excepting the rights of all persons thereunder existing prior to and at the time of this bye-law coming into operation.

#### SCHEDULE 1.

##### Size of Registered Alluvial Claims.

Where the depth of sinking does not exceed 50 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding half an acre.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding one acre.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding one acre and a half.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons

who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to half an acre of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 50 feet, and does not exceed 100 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding one acre.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding two acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding three acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to one acre of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 100 feet, and does not exceed 150 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding two acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding four acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding six acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to two acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 150 feet, and does not exceed 200 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding five acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding ten acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding fifteen acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to five acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 200 feet and does not exceed 300 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be an area not exceeding nine acres.

A claim for two persons shall be an area not exceeding eighteen acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding twenty-seven acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to nine acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 300 feet and does not exceed 400 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding thirteen acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding twenty-six acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding thirty-nine acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for a number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to thirteen acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

Where the depth of sinking exceeds 400 feet:—

A claim for one person shall be any area not exceeding twenty acres.

A claim for two persons shall be any area not exceeding forty acres.

A claim for three persons shall be any area not exceeding sixty acres.

And so on in like proportion according to the number of persons, that is to say—A claim for any number of persons who take possession conjointly may be any size, provided the dimensions thereof do not exceed such an area as would be equal to twenty acres of land for each and every of the persons taking possession of such claim.

# QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

*Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.*

**BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Brennanah and Cooyma Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

**GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Moleside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the south-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. *Pursuant to Orders of 28 July 1873.*


