DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the twenty-eighth of March One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, portions of the Shire of Bet-Bet were constituted a Licensing District under the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke so much of the said proclamation as relates to the constitution of portions of the Shire of Bet-Bet to be a Licensing District under the above-recited Act; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby proclaim the whole of the Shire of Bet-Bet, with the exception of the Townships of Bealiba, Llanelly, and Moliagul, and also with the exception of the areas comprised within a circuit of one mile around the boundaries of those townships respectively, to be a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may from time to time by a notice in the *Government Gazette* proclaim as a street or road or as a town or village any portion or portions of Crown lands, and the lands in such town or village shall be sold by auction in the manner therein provided for the sale of Crown lands by public auction, and the lands upon which such street or road shall have been proclaimed shall be and be deemed to be thenceforward dedicated to the public: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim as a village the portion of Crown lands hereinafter described, to be designated by the name prefixed to the description thereof, that is to say:—

VILLAGE OF MOORA.—County of Rodney, parish of Moora: Commencing at the north-east angle of allotment 1 (country allotments on the Five-mile Creek); bounded thence by allotments 1 and 2 bearing S. 15° 38' W. forty chains; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 74° 22' E. thirty-six chains, N. 15° 38' E. forty chains, and N. 74° 22' W. thirty-six chains to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.L.20765.)

CUTTING OF TIMBER ON CERTAIN LANDS IN THE PARISH OF WARRANDYTE PROHIBITED.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything therein before contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut any timber on the Crown lands in the parish of Warrandyte which are hereinafter described, that is to say:—

WARRANDYTE.—Eight acres two rods, more or less, county of Evelyn, township of Warrandyte: Commencing at the point where the south-western side of Forbes street abuts on the Yarra River; bounded thence by that street to Yarra street; thence by Yarra street to the Wesleyan church site; thence by the eastern and northern boundaries of that site to the west angle thereof; thence by a road and a line bearing N. 46° 26' W. to the river aforesaid; and thence by that river upwards to the commencing point.—(73.J.23018.)

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common and place it under the management of any borough or shire council, mining or road board, or any person or persons, or any two or more of the said councils, boards, or persons, and direct the manner by which the fees shall be imposed, paid, collected, and recovered for depasturing thereon, and how such fees shall be disposed of, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the Crown lands hereinafter mentioned as a Common, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

The Heathcote United Town and Goldfield Common, the boundaries whereof were defined in a Proclamation bearing date the 26th day of August 1870, published in the *Government Gazette* of that date, together with the unappropriated Crown land, comprising an area of about eight thousand acres, within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing on the left bank of the Wild Duck Creek, at a point bearing N. 30° W. about fifty-two chains from the north-east angle of the land in the parish of Toobrac licensed to George Sharp; thence to the said angle of that land by a direct line; thence by the east boundary thereof bearing southerly twenty-three chains twenty-seven links; thence by lines bearing respectively S. 13° E. two hundred and seventy-five chains, S. 60° W. ninety-five chains, and N. 30° W. about six hundred and thirty chains to the road from Spring Plains to Heathcote; thence by that road north-easterly to the aforesaid creek; and thence by that creek upwards to the point of commencement: as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.J.21023.)

TOWN OF TOOLAMBA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF TOOLAMBA.—County of Rodney, parish of Murchison North: Commencing on the left bank of the Goulburn River at a point on a line formed by the prolongation of the north boundary of allotment 224; bounded thence by that line and boundary and a line bearing west about fifty-five chains to the east boundary of allotment 223; thence by that allotment and a line bearing north to the eastern boundary of allotment 142; thence by the eastern and north boundaries of that allotment to a point bearing south from the south-east angle of allotment 139; thence by a line and the east boundary of that allotment bearing north forty-two chains; thence by the south and eastern boundaries of allotment 141 to the north-east angle thereof; thence by a line bearing N. 15° E. one chain three links and a half to the south-east angle of the land in the parish of Toolamba licensed to James Bitcon, being the intersection of the western side of the road from Murchison to Shepparton by the north side of the road which forms the boundary between the parishes aforesaid; thence by the north side of the last-mentioned road bearing east about eighteen chains twenty-five links to a point bearing north one chain from the north-west angle of the land in the parish of Murchison North licensed to William E. Wright; thence by a line of which the west boundary of that land forms part bearing south about twenty chains to the aforesaid river; and thence up that river to the point of commencement; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.K.16432.)

PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS.

THE Governor in Council has approved of the Regulations herewith, in connection with the sum voted by Parliament for Fencing and Improving Public Parks and Gardens under the control of Borough Councils, Trustees, &c. (*vide* Division 54, 1873-4.)

REGULATIONS IN CONNECTION WITH THE VOTE OF £8000 FOR FENCING AND IMPROVING PUBLIC PARKS AND GARDENS UNDER THE CONTROL OF BOROUGH COUNCILS, TRUSTEES, COMMITTEES OF MANAGEMENT, ETC.

1. That the borough councils, trustees, committees of management, and other bodies having control of any public parks or gardens, such parks or gardens being beyond the limits of the city of Melbourne, shall furnish to the Minister of Lands and Agriculture, before the 15th of January 1874, a statement, in the subjoined form, showing the amount expended on improvements by each body out of funds derived from local contributions during the last financial year, namely, from 1st January 1873 to 31st December 1873. Such statement (and vouchers, if necessary) shall be verified by a statutory declaration, to be made in the subjoined form, by the town clerk of a borough, the secretary of a shire, the clerk of a road board, or by such trustee or member of a committee of management who has acted as treasurer for his colleagues.

2. That on receipt of the above statement so verified the Minister of Lands and Agriculture may cause to be paid to the proper officer of each borough council, shire council, committee of management, or other body, a sum equal to one-half of the amount shown to have been expended on improvements out of funds derived from local contributions during the period before mentioned, provided the whole sum shall not exceed Eight thousand pounds, and if the sums claimable are in excess of this amount, that they may be reduced *pro rata*.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRANANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—(including Branamah and Coyote Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

RULES OF THE ARARAT DISTRICT HOSPITAL AND BENEVOLENT ASYLUM.

1. The institution will afford gratuitously surgical and medical aid to any poor person requiring the same; will relieve the infirm, disabled, and destitute, and afford a home to those who require and are deserving of it; giving also out-door relief to families and individuals in temporary distress. Any person who shall be admitted, and shall be found able to pay, will be required to do so. Paying patients will be admitted to the hospital under certain conditions, and in accordance with the bye-laws of the institution. All property found on inmates who may die will be appropriated to defraying the expense of their maintenance and burial; the residue, if any, to be handed over to their legal representatives.

2. The institution shall be managed by a committee of sixteen members, which shall include a president, vice-president, treasurer, and not more than four honorary surgeons.

3. No person being a paid servant in the employ of the institution, nor any person who shall be interested in the execution of any contract entered into for the institution, shall be a member of the committee.

4. The committee shall appoint two auditors (not members of the committee) to examine the accounts for the past year; who shall, if satisfied, certify to the accuracy thereof prior to the general meeting.

5. The committee shall meet for general business once, at least, in each month, at such time and place as it may from time to time appoint; and for special business, on the requisition of five members. In the absence of the president, or vice-president, one of the members present shall be elected to act as chairman.

6. That every contributor of £50 in one sum shall be a life governor, with the privilege of voting at all general or special meetings of subscribers, and of giving six in-door and four out-door orders every year. And every contributor of £20 in one sum shall also be a life governor, with the privilege of voting at general and special meetings of subscribers, and of giving four in-door and three out-door orders every year. And every contributor of £5 in one sum shall be entitled to the privilege of voting at general and special meetings, and of giving four in-door and two out-door orders during the year of such contribution. And every contributor of £1 per annum shall have the privilege of voting at all general and special meetings of subscribers, and of giving one in-door and three out-door orders, provided the funds and accommodation of the institution will admit of the reception of such person, and also provided that the committee's approval has been given to such recommendation.

7. That no person (except life governors) shall have any right to vote at any meeting, unless they have within a year, and not less than fourteen days previous to such meeting, contributed £1 at least to the funds of the institution.

8. That accidents and such cases as may be deemed of decided emergency by the medical officer in attendance be received into the hospital at any time; and that in ordinary cases applications shall be dealt with only on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, at Twelve o'clock.

9. That no female for the purpose of confinement, child under five years of age, insane person, person affected with syphilis or any infectious disease, or any person who in the opinion of the medical officer in attendance is unfit to be an inmate, shall be received under any circumstances, except with the express permission of the visiting committee.

TREASURER.

10. The treasurer shall receive all money on behalf of the institution, and invest the same in such bank or banks as the committee of management shall direct, to the credit of the institution. He shall pay all accounts, after the same have been signed by the chairman of the meeting as approved by the committee, by drafts on the bank or banks, which shall be countersigned by the president, or vice-president, and secretary. He shall also keep an account of all money received and paid by him, and report the same at least once a month to a meeting of the committee.

HONORARY SURGEONS.

11. The honorary medical officers shall consist of four legally qualified medical practitioners, who shall be elected in the same way as other members of committee. They shall have access to the institution at all times; they shall perform all capital surgical operations, assisted by the resident surgeon; but no such operation shall be performed without a previous consultation of as many of the medical staff as can be obtained, except in cases of emergency; and they shall regularly consult in all cases of importance or protracted continuance in the institution.

VISITING COMMITTEE.

12. The visiting committee, consisting of three members of the managing committee, and the president, vice-president, and treasurer, shall have access to the institution at all times; and shall, at Noon on Mondays, Thursdays, and Saturdays, visit the institution, for the purpose of inspecting the arrangements thereof, also to deal with all applications. They shall make an entry in a book, to be kept for the purpose, of any remarks or suggestions they may deem necessary; and such book shall be laid before the general committee at each meeting.

RESIDENT SURGEON.

13. The resident surgeon shall be a legally qualified medical practitioner, who shall reside on the premises, and who shall not be absent therefrom for any lengthened period without the permission of the managing committee. He shall not be allowed to engage in private practice, under any circumstances, except by express authority of the committee. He

shall hold office under the direction of the committee; and one month's notice, on either side, shall terminate the period of his engagement.

14. He shall receive the certificates from applicants for admission, examine the nature of their cases, decide on their fitness for admission, either for in-door or out-door treatment, and report the same to the visiting committee; and shall also discharge all hospital patients as soon as he considers them fit to be discharged.

15. He shall have charge of all inmates in the institution, and their treatment; but in cases of difficulty or danger, or long continuance in the hospital, he is to consult the honorary surgeons, and report to the committee.

16. He shall be invested with paramount power within the institution, he being directly responsible to the general committee for the doing or not doing of each particular act. The hiring and dismissing of all inferior officers shall be vested in him.

17. He shall keep such accounts respecting the inmates as the committee may direct, in books to be kept for that purpose, and furnish a monthly report to the managing committee.

18. He shall have charge of all surgical instruments, drugs, and chemicals, and shall carefully examine them, both as to quality and quantity, and report any defects in either respect to the managing committee, and shall make an inventory of the same in a book to be kept for the purpose, and keep an account of the receipt and expenditure or loss and breakage of such instruments, drugs, and chemicals. There not being a dispenser, he must perform such duties as would devolve on that officer.

19. He shall enter regularly, in books to be kept for that purpose, the names of the inmates, as they are admitted or discharged, and note the nature and history of their diseases while under treatment; and shall receive all money and other property belonging to inmates, and shall account for the same to the committee.

20. He shall accompany the honorary surgeon through the wards, and report to them the state of the patients. He shall also visit each patient every morning and evening, and enquire if the treatment prescribed has been attended to; and if any cause of complaint exists he shall immediately remove the same, or report it to the committee at its next meeting.

21. He shall perform all minor operations of surgery and the *post mortem* examinations, and shall keep the key of the dead-house. He shall also give due notice to the honorary medical officers when a consultation is to be held, or an operation is to be performed; but in all cases of emergency he shall act to the best of his judgment.

SECRETARY AND COLLECTOR.

22. The secretary and collector shall keep the minutes, accounts, and records of the institution, compile all reports, conduct the correspondence, attend all meetings, and bring all business before the same, carry out all resolutions agreed to, and perform all clerical duties that may be ordered by the committee.

23. He shall convene the annual general meeting in the month of January in each year, at such time and place as may be fixed by the committee, by advertisement in the local papers, at least seven days previous to the meeting.

24. He shall convene special meetings of contributors in the same manner, when directed by the committee, or on the written application of ten contributors of at least £1 each, the object of such special meeting to be stated in the advertisement; and he shall also give special notice to each member of the committee of such meetings.

25. He shall collect subscriptions and all moneys due to the institution, give receipts for the same, furnish admission orders, according to amount of subscription, pay to the treasurer, at least once in every month, all moneys he may have received, and render an account of the same.

26. He shall be in attendance at the institution at the meetings of the visiting committee, and for the convenience of any other persons who may wish to see him, every Monday, Thursday, and Saturday, from Twelve to One p.m., except when required to be out of town collecting.

SERVANTS.

27. The servants shall live in the institution, and shall not leave it without the permission of the resident surgeon. They shall obey the orders of the said officer, be regular in their attendance, behave with tenderness to all inmates, and with civility and respect to strangers.

28. They shall pay great attention to cleanliness personally, and to all things entrusted to their charge; particularly to the bedding of the inmates, and have it changed as often as may be necessary, taking care that it is thoroughly dried and aired.

29. They shall administer to the inmates the medicines and diet at the times and in the manner directed by the resident surgeon, and they shall not permit the inmates to take anything which is not prescribed, and shall be careful to explain to them the instructions of the said officer; they shall watch attentively the state and symptoms of the patients, and report the same to the resident surgeon.

30. They shall not permit inmates to receive from visitors medicines, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor allow any portion of the medicines, diet, or any other things to be removed from the wards by the inmates or visitors without an order from the resident surgeon.

31. They shall be careful to collect and carry to the dispensary all empty phials, gallipots, &c., and shall attend at the dispensary at the time appointed to receive medicines and instructions.

32. They shall not admit any stranger without permission of the resident surgeon, except during the hours appointed for that purpose.

33. They shall be obedient to the regulations of the institution, and shall report immediately to the resident surgeon any impropriety of conduct, or infringement of the rules, by any inmate, visitor, or other person.

INMATES.

34. The inmates shall conduct themselves in an orderly manner, and shall strictly observe all the directions of the resident surgeon and servants, take their medicines and diet at the time directed, and shall not take any other than those prescribed; neither shall they conceal or put away any portion thereof.

35. They shall not leave their ward and go into another ward, nor leave the house, nor remain out for a longer time than may be granted, nor introduce visitors, nor receive medicines, victuals, liquors, tobacco, or any other thing, nor shall they smoke, without the express leave of the resident surgeon.

36. They shall not gamble, spit on the floor, deface or injure any part of the ward, furniture, bedding, clothing, books, or periodicals; nor sing, blaspheme, or use rude or indecent language.

37. Any inmate having any cause of complaint shall make the same known to the resident surgeon or visiting committee, whose duty it shall be to remedy the same, or report it to the committee at its next meeting.

38. Inmates judged by the resident surgeon as able to assist in the work of the institution shall, at his request, so employ themselves.

39. Inmates shall not sit up after Eight o'clock in the winter or Nine o'clock in the summer, and all inmates considered by the resident surgeon able to do so shall rise at Seven o'clock in the summer and Eight o'clock in the winter.

40. Persons receiving out-door relief must attend at the institution on Mondays, Thursdays, or Saturdays, at Twelve o'clock, and must observe the rules of the institution.

41. No person is allowed to give any fee, reward, or gratuity to any servant or other person connected with the hospital.

42. Visitors are admitted only on Wednesdays and Sundays, between the hours of Two and Five o'clock in the afternoon, except by a special order from a member of the managing committee or resident surgeon; and no visitor is allowed to remain more than one hour, except officiating ministers of religion, who may visit inmates at any time; but all visitors must retire when requested to do so.

43. Visitors shall not give or leave with any inmate medicine, victuals, tobacco, or liquor of any kind, nor any other thing, without the permission of the resident surgeon; nor interfere with the servants, or disturb the inmates by loud talking or unnecessary noise.

44. Any visitor or inmate violating any of the rules of the institution, or behaving with impropriety, will be compelled to retire or be dismissed, and will not be re-admitted at any time without special leave from the visiting committee.

45. Any servant or other person in any way connected with the institution (except in so far as is provided for in the sixteenth rule) who shall receive directly or indirectly any fee, reward, or gratuity, shall be immediately disqualified and dismissed, and shall not be permitted to hold any office or appointment in future.

MEETINGS.

46. All meetings in connection with the institution shall be open to subscribers, and to the representatives of the press, provided that no person present at committee meetings, who is not a member of committee, shall interfere or take any part in the proceedings.

The foregoing rules were confirmed and adopted at a special meeting of contributors, duly convened for such purpose, on the seventh day of October 1873.

SHIRE OF SWAN HILL.

No. 2 BYE-LAW.

BYE-LAW FOR REGULATING THE COURSE OF PROCEDURE OF THE COUNCIL AT THEIR MEETINGS.

IN pursuance of part 12 of the Shires Statute, the Council of the Shire of Swan Hill do ordain as follows, that is to say:—

1. The meetings of the council shall be held at the office of the council, in Nolan street, Kerang, at noon on the first Tuesday in every month.

2. The secretary shall attend at the office of the council daily between the hours of 10 a.m. and 4 p.m., except on general holidays, or when he is engaged on the business of the council, or when he has obtained leave of absence from the president or chairman.

3. At every ordinary meeting of the council, proceedings shall commence (in the absence of the president) by electing a chairman, and on the chair being taken, the minutes of the preceding meeting, and any subsequent entries in the minute book, shall be read and put for confirmation; and no discussion shall be permitted on the minutes, except as to their accuracy as a record of the proceedings.

4. After the confirmation of the minutes the order of business shall be as follows:—

i. Considering how far the orders and instructions given to the secretary and officers at the last meeting have been carried out, and reading copies of the letters issued in relation thereto.

ii. Reading correspondence, and considering and ordering thereon.

iii. Reading and ordering on reports of committees and officers.

iv. Receiving and reading petitions and memorials, and ordering thereon.

v. Orders of the day.

vi. Motions, of which previous notice has been duly given.

vii. Examination and passing of accounts for payment.

viii. Notices of motions for consideration at future meetings.

5. Every petition or memorial addressed to the council must be in writing and presented by a councillor, and on its presentation no debate shall take place thereon, except as to its being received, but it shall be taken into consideration at such time as the council may direct.

6. The orders of the day shall include all matters arising out of the proceedings of former meetings of the council, and any business which the president or chairman may think fit to bring under consideration.

7. Every notice of motion shall be given to the secretary in writing, and shall be read aloud by that officer at the meeting previous to that at which the same is to be taken into consideration; and every notice of motion shall be considered in the order in which it is given.

8. No motion or amendment shall be entertained or discussed unless it be seconded.

9. One amendment only shall be discussed at one time, but upon any amendment being carried the original motion shall be deemed rejected, and the amendment so carried shall take the place of the original motion; and only one amendment (if any) on such amendment shall then be moved.

10. Every councillor present shall vote, unless he be disabled by law from so doing; and no councillor, after he shall have entered an appearance at any meeting, shall quit the council chamber without leave of the president or chairman for the time being until the adjournment or termination of the meeting.

11. Every councillor, upon proposing a motion or amendment, or discussing any matter, must rise and address the president or chairman, and he shall not be interrupted, unless by a call to order, when he shall sit down until the question shall have been decided. The subject may then be resumed, or other business entered upon.

12. If two or more councillors rise to speak at the same time the president or chairman shall decide which of them is entitled to pre-audience.

13. No councillor shall speak twice on the same motion or amendment, except by way of explanation, or in reply upon any original motion of which he may have been the mover, or as the mover of the last proposed amendment; and the president or chairman shall, without waiting for the interposition of the council, call to order any councillor proceeding to speak a second time on the same motion or amendment. After the reply, the amendment or the original motion, as the case may be, shall be immediately put to the vote.

14. Any councillor moving or seconding any motion or amendment shall be held to have spoken on that motion or amendment.

15. The president or chairman shall, on taking the vote on any motion or amendment, put the question first in the affirmative and then in the negative; and the councillors shall in all cases vote by a show of hands.

16. No councillor shall digress from the subject under discussion, or impute improper motives, and all personal reflections shall be considered disorderly; and any councillor making use of any expression offensive to any other councillor shall, if required by the president or chairman, withdraw such expression and make a satisfactory apology to such councillor.

17. Any councillor may require the secretary to take down any particular words used by a councillor immediately on the same being used.

18. The councillors shall at meetings of the council designate each other by their official titles, viz., president, chairman, or councillor.

19. The president or chairman, when called upon to decide a point of order or practice, shall state the rule applicable to

the case, without argument or comment; and his decision as to what is order or explanation shall be final for the time being in each case.

20. Any councillor who shall refuse to obey when ruled out of order by the president or chairman, or to withdraw any offensive expression when required to do so, shall, for each such offence, forfeit a sum not exceeding £5.

21. Any councillor may of right require the production of any of the documents of the council relating to the question or matter in discussion.

22. Any councillor may enter his protest against any resolution of the council, provided such protest is not inconsistent with truth or disrespectful to the council. Notice of intention to protest, must, however, in every case be given on the adoption of the resolution protested against; and the protest signed by the councillor or councillors protesting, and specifying the reason for protesting, must, before the next meeting of the council, be entered by the protesting councillor in such part of the minute-book as is set apart for that purpose; and such entry shall be duly referred to in the minutes of the council, and shall be considered as part of such minutes.

23. No discussion shall be allowed on any motion for adjournment of the council; but if, on the question being put, the motion be negatived, the subject then under consideration or the next in the notice paper shall be discussed, or any other that may be allowed precedence, before any subsequent motion for adjournment shall be entertained; but if the motion for adjournment be carried, the motions then undiscussed shall have precedence at the next adjourned meeting of the council.
