## REGULATIONS UNDER "THE EDUCATION ACT 1872."

THE Governor in Council has made the following Regulations, and has rescinded all previous Regulations on the same subject, under the provisions of section 18 of *The Education Act 1872*, No. 447:—

TERMS UPON WHICH SCHOOL BUILDINGS MAY BE USED UNDER THE DIRECTION OF BOARDS OF ADVICE.

1. A guarantee must be given to repair any damage to the premises or school property.
2. If it is necessary to displace the furniture or school apparatus, this must be done at the expense and risk of the persons using the room, and everything must be replaced at least one hour before the commencement of the next school meeting.
3. Five shillings must be paid for the use of each room when used for general purposes to the head teacher, who will retain 2s. 6d. towards the expense of cleaning the room, and pay the balance to the Board of Advice towards a fund for prizes for the scholars.
4. When school rooms are used periodically for local purposes, the fee may, with the consent of the Board of Advice, be reduced to One shilling, to be paid to the teacher.
5. No charge will be made for the use of school rooms for meetings of Boards of Advice, or for elections.

NOTE.—The Minister will not approve of any use of State School buildings—

- (a.) If such use be objected to in writing by one-fifth of the parents of children attending such school.
- (b.) If it is likely to interfere with the work of the school.
- (c.) If the school property is likely to be injured.

No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI, hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide anew the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Belfast, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order in Council divide the said Shire of Belfast into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The Parish of Tarrayoukyan, in the Shire of Wannon.

REGULATIONS RELATIVE TO THE CUSTODY AND ISSUE OF FORMS OF LICENSES AND OTHER FORMS, AND THE COLLECTION OF RENTS AND FEES IN CONNECTION WITH THE ALIENATION AND OCCUPATION OF CROWN LANDS.

**H**IS Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has made the following Regulations relative to the custody and issue of Forms of Licenses and other Forms, and the collections of Rents and Fees in connection with alienation and occupation of Crown lands :—

1. All forms of licenses, and all forms for the filling up or registration of which fees are chargeable by the Department of Lands and Survey, shall be in the custody of the Treasurer, and shall be issued by him to the proper officers, who shall be responsible to and account to him for the disposal of such forms. Forms to be in custody of Treasurer.
2. The Treasurer shall keep the books necessary for the proper record of all forms received into his custody and issued therefrom; and he shall require all officers to whom he has supplied any forms to forward to him, quarterly, returns so prepared as to clearly set forth and account for all forms received by them, and to transmit at same time all cancelled forms not issued from books, and any forms to be withdrawn from issue. He shall make the necessary entries in his books from such returns when received, and forward the returns to the Commissioners of Audit. Any cancelled forms returned, and any forms to be withheld from issue, shall be destroyed in the presence of a Board consisting of a Commissioner of Audit, the Government Printer, and an officer to be named by the Treasurer. This Board shall report to the Treasurer the destruction of the forms. Treasurer to keep license registers.
3. The Treasurer shall keep the rent roll of all leases and licenses which do not confer the ultimate right to acquire in fee the land described in such leases and licenses, and such roll shall be kept under the different sections of *The Land Act 1869*. Treasurer to keep rent roll.
4. Said rent roll shall be formed by entry from authenticated statements to be furnished by the Department of Lands and Survey of such existing leases and licenses as extend to a later date than 30th day of June 1874, and by entry of all approvals of applications for leases or licenses to date from and after the 1st July 1874, as they appear from time to time in the *Gazette*; and all rents and license fees received by Collectors of Imposts, and Treasury Agents to be appointed under these Regulations, shall, day by day, be entered in the rent roll from the revenue statements received from the Receivers of Revenue.
5. After the close of each quarter the Treasury rent roll shall, so far as regards the entries of approved applications recorded during each quarter, be compared with the minutes of the Board of Land and Works and the recorded decisions of the Minister of Lands, by an officer of the Treasury Department, acting in concert with the officer in charge of the minutes of the proceedings of the Board.
6. The Treasurer shall report promptly to the Department of Lands and Survey any default by lessees or licensees in the payment of rent and fees when due. Treasurer to report default of payment to Lands Department.
7. The Department of Lands and Survey shall not without the concurrence of the Treasurer, perform any act for which a fee is payable until a notification has been received from the Treasury of payment of such fee, and no lease or license which has to issue under the signature of the Governor or the Board of Land and Works shall be issued from the Office of Lands and Survey until advice has been received at that office from the Treasury that the first instalment of rent or fee has been received at the Treasury. How leases and licenses are to issue.
8. All special licenses and all annual licenses, the applications for which require the approval of the Governor in Council or of the Board of Land and Works, or of the Minister of Lands, but do not issue under their signatures, shall be issued by an officer of the Department of Lands and Survey duly authorized for that purpose, and such licenses may be renewed by him year by year, provided always that he has in each case satisfied himself, from advice furnished from the Treasury, that the first quarterly payments have been received into the Treasury, and that no prohibition against such renewal exists.
9. Licenses, the applications for which do not require any such approval as recited in the preceding clause, shall, from and after the 1st July next, be issued by, and the fees for such licenses shall be payable to, Licensing Agents to be appointed under these Regulations. In the cases where payments are made quarterly the receipts for the same are to be endorsed on the licenses.
10. In order to afford facilities to licensees for making periodical payments, on account of licenses issued from the Lands Office, Melbourne, Treasury Agents shall be appointed to receive such payments as they fall due; and all postmasters who are managers of Savings Banks or issuers of money orders are hereby appointed Treasury Agents accordingly. Appointment of Treasury Agents.
11. Every Treasury Agent, when directed so to do by the Treasurer, shall open a register, in the form prescribed in Schedule **A** attached, for the record of his transactions, and shall enter therein, from the *Government Gazette*, the particulars of license fees payable to him, and the quarterly payments made to him by the licensees; he shall give receipts for periodical payments in the forms endorsed on the licenses, for which purpose the licensees will produce their licenses when tendering the periodical payments, and no other acquittance than by such endorsement shall on any account be given. He shall forward daily to the Receiver and Paymaster, Melbourne, after entry of particulars in a cash book the amount of license fees received, accompanied with a statement in the form prescribed in Schedule **B** attached. Duties of Treasury Agents.
12. The register of transactions kept by the Treasury Agents shall be open to the inspection of Bailiffs of Crown Lands, in order that the latter may extract therefrom such information as they may require in connection with their duties in that capacity.
13. Officers, when endorsing receipt upon any license for the quarter ending 31st December, shall stamp across the face of each license, with a stamp, to be supplied for such purpose, a note that the license ceases to be in force after the 31st day of December.
14. The Department of Lands and Survey shall, after approval of any application for a lease or license, notify such approval in the *Government Gazette*; and all changes, forfeitures, or other action taken by the Lands Department affecting holdings under leases or licenses, shall be similarly notified. Applications, &c., to be notified in Gazette.





REGULATIONS UNDER "THE LAND ACT 1869."

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the Regulations following:—

1. Adverting to the Treasury Regulations of this date prescribing among other things the manner in which certain annual licenses under *The Land Act 1869* shall be issued, the form for all such licenses shall be that in Schedule **A** hereunto attached, provided always that, when necessary, the Minister of Lands and Agriculture shall have authority to prescribe additional forms, and to alter or rescind such forms. Forms of licenses.

2. As all special licenses and all annual licenses under *The Land Act 1869*, conferring the exclusive right to occupy sites on Crown lands for any of the purposes specified in Schedule IX. of the Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of 30th day of May 1873, and those for sawmills, and for the exclusive right to occupy portions of State Forests, will, under the Treasury Regulations above referred to, have to be issued from the Lands Office, Melbourne, holders of such licenses who are desirous of continuing them after 30th day of June 1874 must, fourteen days prior to that date, signify their intention so to do to the Department of Lands and Survey, giving at the same time their address. Licenses for the remainder of the year will then be forwarded to them, provided always that the fees for the September quarter of the year 1874 shall have been first paid to the Treasury Agent named, and that advice of such payments shall have been received at the Treasury, Melbourne. Description of licenses to be issued from Lands Office, Melbourne.

3. Any person who desires to acquire a lease under Part III. of the *The Land Act 1869*, or a license for any of the purposes referred to in preceding clause, must forward application for same to the Office of Lands and Survey, Melbourne, in the form prescribed in Schedule **B** attached. The application must be accompanied by a plan of the land applied for, prepared by an authorized surveyor. Notification of the decision arrived at shall be sent from the Department of Lands and Survey to the applicant, and if such notification be one of approval it shall be accompanied by an addressed envelope and form of letter prescribed in Schedule **C** attached, under which he is to transmit the first instalment of rent to the Receiver and Paymaster named in the advice, which officer will in acknowledgment return a Treasury receipt for the money received, and the lease or license will in due course be forwarded. Action to be taken on applications for leases or licenses under The Land Act 1869.

4. Lessees must make the second and subsequent payments of rent specified in the conditions of their leases in advance to the District Receiver and Paymaster named in the letters of advice conveying the approval of the application, and will receive receipts for same from that officer. Periodical payments to be made by lessees and licensees.

5. Licensees must make second and subsequent payments in advance to the Receiver and Paymaster, or to the Treasury Agent mentioned in the letters of advice conveying the approval of the application; and on making such periodical payments they must produce their licenses, in order that the receipts for those payments may be endorsed thereon.

6. If the holder of a license desires to renew it, he must make payment of the amount of the fee for the first quarter of the next year, or for the whole year, as the case may be, at least fourteen days before 31st December of the current year; and if no objection exists, a new license will be issued to him. If he fails to make such prepayment, he will be deemed to have abandoned his holding. Renewal of licenses.

7. Persons desirous of having performed by the Department of Lands and Survey services for which fees are payable under *The Land Act 1869*, or under regulations, such as fees for reduction of rents of runs, subdivisions of runs, registration of liens, &c., must, prior to making application for such services, pay the fees prescribed; and they may, for such purpose, deposit the fees with any Receiver and Paymaster. In subsequently making applications for the services, they must specify in the applications the names and addresses of the Receivers and Paymasters to whom they made payments of the fees, and the dates of such payments. Applications for services.

8. The persons who, on the 30th June 1874, may hold office as Licensing Officers or Licensing Agents shall cease to hold such office, unless re-appointed Licensing Agents by the Treasurer, to act on and after 1st July; and they shall, whether re-appointed or not, within fourteen days after the 30th June next, close their accounts to that date, forward their returns of license forms to the Office of Lands and Survey, and send to the Treasury in a sealed packet, accompanied with a letter of advice of its contents, all the unused forms of the old licenses in their possession. Tenure of office of Licensing Officers

9. The Department of Lands and Survey shall, after checking the returns and making the necessary entries in the registers, close the registers and forward the returns to the Commissioners of Audit. Returns.

10. A copy of these Regulations shall be forwarded to every District Surveyor, District Bailiff of Crown Lands, Treasury Agent, and to all Collectors of Imposts to whom rents and license fees are payable, and the receipt thereof shall be acknowledged by each per return post.

At stations where the bags can be at once emptied, the contractor will be required to remove them when delivery is taken. At other stations notice will be sent to the contractor when the bags are empty. Bags to be removed at contractor's expense.

Tenders not complying with the terms of advertisement will not be entertained.

The successful tenderer will be required to enter into a bond for one-third of the estimated amount of the contract, within ten days after the acceptance is notified. Two approved sureties are required for contracts amounting to £150 and upwards, and one surety for contracts under £150.

Tenderers failing to take up their accepted tenders, or failing to carry out their contract satisfactorily, will be ineligible to again hold contracts for Government supplies.

## CONDITIONS.

1. The hay to be good, sound, and sweet, and properly trussed; the straw to be wheaten, and both to be in all respects of the best quality; oats (Victorian grown) and bran to be sound and sweet and of the best description; maize to be sound and sweet.

2. The supplies are for police, telegraph, and other horses, and are to be delivered on the order of the officer in charge of the district or station. The quantities stated in the schedule being only approximate, it must be understood that the Government may draw either more or less than those mentioned; and should new telegraph stations be formed, or additional horses be required to be stationed at any of the stations the contractor will be required to supply the additional forage. Should the additional number of horses, however, exceed two, the contractor may, if he desire it, terminate the contract by supplying at once the whole quantity due at the station under the contract according to the foregoing schedule.

3. The forage, when delivered, must be accompanied by the particulars of quantity, showing the net weight, to be endorsed on the back of the order, which, when signed by the officer in charge of the station for the net quantity received, will be returned to the contractor, and by him rendered in support of his account.

4. Each contractor will be required to prepare his own account in the prescribed form, and on presentation thereof to the officer in charge of the station or district, it will be forwarded for payment at the Treasury, Melbourne, or the Pay Office of the District, as may be indicated by the contractor on the account.

5. Should forage duly ordered under these contracts not be delivered within forty-eight hours of the time specified in the order for delivery, it will be competent for the contractor (should circumstances require it) to purchase the same at the risk of the contractor, from whose account any expense over and above the contract price is to be deducted.

6. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the forage as to quality of the same, it is to be decided by a board of survey, composed of persons named by the head of the department ordering the supply, and the decision of the board is to be considered final.

7. If the board shall decide that the forage is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor failing which it will be procured elsewhere, and the extra cost, if any, will be charged as in clause 5.

8. When a board of survey cannot be conveniently assembled, or when, for some other cause, injury would accrue either to the public service or to the contractor by waiting for a board of survey, the officer in charge will have the power to reject such supplies as are obviously of inferior quality, it being understood that he will be responsible to the Government for so doing; and the contractor must take back the rejected forage, and supply good in its stead, failing which it will be obtained by the officer requiring it, and the expense will be charged as in clause 5.

9. A repetition of irregularity in the quantity or quality of the forage, or of delay in delivering or replacing it when required, or refusal to execute orders, will subject the contractor, upon report from the Tender Board, to such mulct, not exceeding £20, as the Government may direct. It will also be in the power of the Government, upon such repetition, to terminate the contract forthwith.

10. Contractors are not at liberty to transfer their contracts under cover of power-of-attorney, coupled with an interest or otherwise; and no such transfer will be recognized by the Government.

11. It will be competent for the Secretary to the Tender Board, on behalf of the Government, or for the contractor on his own behalf, to terminate the contract, by giving in writing a notice of three full calendar months to that effect, it being understood that such notice can only be given from the 1st day of a month, and provided that no such notice can be given before the 30th September 1874; and in the event of a station being discontinued or any change in the supplies required, the contractor will receive the earliest possible intimation.
