## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria passed in the session held in the twenty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign (No. 265), called *The Police Offences Statute 1865*, it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may by proclamation in the *Government Gazette* extend all or any of the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to any city, town, district, or place in Victoria, and may define the limits of any such city, town, district, or place, and vary and alter such limits, and may revoke any such proclamation; and upon any such proclamation the provisions so proclaimed shall extend to and be in force in such city, town, district, or place: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, do, with the advice of the Executive Council, by this my Proclamation, extend all the provisions contained in Part I. of the said Statute to the respective townships hereinafter mentioned, that is to say:—

THE TOWNSHIP OF EUROA, and  
THE TOWNSHIP OF LONGWOOD.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this eighth day of April, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

### CROWN LANDS DEPARTMENT—SURVEY BRANCH.

#### SURVEYORS AND DRAFTSMEN.

APPLICATIONS will be received from candidates to fill the position of Pupil Draftsmen and Surveyors, in the Crown Lands Department, up to the 30th proximo.

Applications must be accompanied with certificates, in accordance with the subjoined regulations.

The candidate will be required to produce a reliable medical certificate of sound constitution, nor will he be admitted if affected with any physical infirmity which may in any way interfere with the efficient discharge of the duties he may be called on to perform.

#### QUALIFICATIONS FOR ADMISSION.

1st. Having completed the first and second years of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University, and his age at time of application must not exceed 24 years.

2nd. Having completed the first year of the course for the certificate of engineer in the Melbourne University. His age at time of entry must not exceed 23 years.

3rd. Having matriculated at the Melbourne or other recognized University; after passing in Algebra, Euclid, and Arithmetic; or passed the Civil Service Examination, including the subjects above-named; or produce such a certificate of competency in such subjects from the Board of Education of Victoria as shall satisfy this Department. His age at time of application must not exceed 22 years, nor be less than 16 years.

#### PERIOD OF SERVICE.

1st. An applicant of the first class will be required to pass six months in the offices of the Lands Department as a draftsman, and one year in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass nine months in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will have first to pass a probationary period of three (3) months in the offices of the Lands and Survey Department, after which period, if his progress is considered satisfactory, he will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for one year and nine months, when he will be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field-book, plan drawing, including texture delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

Should the applicant of the third class consider himself competent to pass the above examination at the end of the first year, and his progress in plotting and mapping be considered satisfactory, he will be examined as before stated, and, if successful, he may pass into the field and serve three years under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

#### REMUNERATION.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £78 per annum during the period of six months passed in the offices of the department, and £91 during the year passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid at the rate of £52 during the nine months passed in the offices of the department, £65 for the first year in the field, and £91 during the last year in the field.

3rd. Applicants of the third class will not be remunerated for the first three months of probation, but during the remainder of the period spent in the offices (one year and nine months) will be paid at the rate of £52 per annum. The salary during the first year in the field will be £65, during the second £91. In the case of an applicant in this class passing the specified examination at the end of the first year, he will be paid during the first and second years in the field at the rate of £65 per annum, and for the third year in the field at the rate of £91.

To obtain certificate of competency as a qualified surveyor it will be required of the candidate, after the end of the term

spent in the field, that he pass two months in the Melbourne Observatory to acquire a knowledge of such branches of practical astronomy as are necessary in the duties he would be called on to perform as a departmental surveyor. He will also be required to make a traverse and topographical survey of a portion of land to be shown him; to establish the true meridian by transit observation from which meridian the bearings of his survey will be reckoned; to level over a line to be pointed out to him, and to make a subdivision also as pointed out. Then to produce plan showing construction lines, subdivision section line topographical features with areas and dimensions of subdivision, accompanied by regulation field-book of survey, and the various computations.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant of the third class would have to pass the first two years as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation by logarithms including areas and reduction of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction including feature delineation.
