RAMOS ISLAND, INDISPENSABLE STRAITS.

RAMOS ISLAND, INDISPENSABLE STRAITS.

THE following remarks by Navigating Lieut. John Browne, which have been furnished by Commander Challis, of H.M.S. *Rosario*, are published for general information.

Ramos Island is about 2 miles long in a N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. direction, 200 feet high, having off its N.W. point an islet about 100 feet high, with two smaller ones between, and several pinnacle rocks.

The distance between the N.W. islet and Ramos Island is about $\frac{1}{2}$ mile.

Making Ramos Island from the northward it has the appearance of a saddle, with two small islets off its western side.

Passing to the eastward of these islands sounded in 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ fathoms, and observed shoal water extending from the island to the eastward, as far as could be observed from the mast-head, Ramos Island bearing N.W. by W. distant 3 miles. Shoal is about 4 miles across, north and south.

A heavy swell was running at the time, but no breakers were observed.

The channel to the west of the island appeared clear.

Lieut. Mansell, commanding H.M. schooner *Conflict*, reports having sounded in 7 fathoms 4 miles east of Ramos Island.

PROCEEDINGS AT AND FOR THE ELECTIONS FOR RODNEY AND CROWLANDS DISTRICTS DECLARED VALID.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Electoral Act 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that no election shall be void in consequence only of there having been no Returning Officer at the time of the issue of the writ or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened, the Governor-in-Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission; or may declare any or all of the proceedings at or for any election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission; and every such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Rodney, after the issue of the writ dated the twenty-fifth day of March last for the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, discovered that he and the Police Magistrate acting in the locality had in error certified Toolleen to be within the Heathcote (B) Division instead of within the Warranga Division of the said district: And whereas the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Crowlands also after the issue of the writ dated as aforesaid, for the election of two Members to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, discovered that he and the Police Magistrate acting in the locality had in like manner certified Warrack and Elmhurst to be respectively within the Glenpatrick Division instead of within the Malakhoff Division of the last-named district: And whereas Toolleen, Warrack and Elmhurst were, in pursuance of such certificates, appointed by the Governor in Council to be Polling-places for the several divisions of the said districts named in such certificates, and were in accordance therewith inserted as such in the writs dated as aforesaid: And whereas the poll was taken at Toolleen, Warrack and Elmhurst in accordance with the writs as issued for the districts aforesaid: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, by and with the advice of the Executive Council, and under the authority given in and by the 131st section of *The Electoral Act 1865*, No. 279, do hereby declare valid all the proceedings at or for the aforesaid elections for the respective Districts of Rodney and Crowlands, notwithstanding such accidental misfeasance as aforesaid.

AMENDED PORT AND HARBOR REGULATION.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time, in like manner, may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an amended Port and Harbor Regulation, and to be observed accordingly, in lieu of that published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th April 1873, No. 31, which is hereby repealed:—

No person shall take, lead, drive, or conduct any horse or other animal, or any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or any vehicle whatever drawn by any horse or horses, animal or animals, upon or along any public pier, jetty, or wharf without the consent of the harbor-master or piermaster in charge of such public pier, jetty, or wharf; and no owner or person in charge of any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or vehicle shall without the consent of the said harbor-master or piermaster leave the same or allow or permit or suffer the same to be left on such pier, jetty, or wharf.

PERIOD OF SERVICE.

2nd. An applicant of the second class will be required to pass nine months in the offices of the Lands Department, and two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

3rd. An applicant of the third class will have first to pass a probationary period of three (3) months in the offices of the Lands and Survey Department, after which period, if his progress is considered satisfactory, he will remain in the offices of the department as a draftsman for one year and nine months, when he will be examined in trigonometric computation by logarithms, including computation of areas and reduction of traverse surveys, plotting from field book, plan drawing, in-

cluding feature delineation; and, if he pass satisfactorily, will be required to spend two years in the field under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

Should the applicant of the third class consider himself competent to pass the above examination at the end of the first year, and his progress in plotting and mapping be considered satisfactory, he will be examined as before stated, and, if successful, he may pass into the field and serve three years under the direction of a departmental surveyor.

REMUNERATION.

1st. Applicants of the first class will be paid at the rate of £78 per annum during the period of six months passed in the offices of the department, and £91 during the year passed in the field.

2nd. Applicants of the second class will be paid at the rate of £52 during the nine months passed in the offices of the department, £65 for the first year in the field, and £91 during the last year in the field.

To obtain a certificate as qualified draftsman the applicant of the third class would have to pass the first two years as before specified; then six months in the field, the latter period at a salary of £52 per annum, and afterwards pass an examination in trigonometric computation by logarithms including areas and reduction of traverses, plotting from field-books, and their construction including feature delineation.
