RAMOS ISLAND, INDISPENSABLE STRAITS.

THE accompanying Notice to Mariners, which has been received from the Marine Board of New South Wales, is published for general information.

RAMOS ISLAND, INDISPENSABLE STRAITS

The following remarks by Navigating Lieut. John Browne, which have been furnished by Commander Challis, of H.M.S. Rosario, are published for general information.

Ramos Island is about 2 miles long in a N.W. by N. and S.E. by S. direction, 200 feet high, having off its N.W. point an islet about 100 feet high, with two smaller ones between, and several minacle rocks.

The distance between the N.W. islet and Ramos Island is

out 1½ mile. Making Ramos Island from the northward it has the appear-

ance of a saddle, with two small islets off its western side.

Fassing to the eastward of these islands sounded in 12th fathours, and observed shoal water extending from the island to the eastward, as far as could be observed from the masthead, Ramos Island bearing N.W. by W. distant 3 miles. Shoal is about 4 miles across, north and south.

A heavy swell was running at the time, but no breakers were observed.

The channel to the west of the island appeared clear.
Lieut. Mansell, commanding H.M. schooner Conflict, reports
having sounded in 7 fathoms 4 miles east of Ramos Island.

By His Excellency SIR George Errogson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by The Electoral Act 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that no election shall be void in consequence only of there having been no Returning Officer at the time of the issue of the writ or of any delay in the return of the writ; and where any accidental or unavoidable impediment, misfeasance, or omission shall have happened, the Governor-in-Council may take all such measures as may be necessary for removing such impediment or rectifying such misfeasance or omission; or may declare any or all of the proceedings at or for any election valid as to and notwithstanding such impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be vory such Order in Council shall state specifically the nature of the impediment, misfeasance, or omission, and shall be forthwith published in the Government Gazette: And whereas the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Rodney, after the issue of the writ dated the twenty-fifth day of March last for the election of a Member to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, discovered that he and the Police Magistrate acting in the locality had in error certified Toolleen to be within the Heathcote (B) Division instead of within the Waranga Division of the said district. And whereas the Returning Officer for the Electoral District of Crowlands also after the issue of the writ dated as aforesaid, for the election of two Members to serve in the Legislative Assembly for the said district, discovered that he and the Police Magistrate acting in the locality had in like manner certified Warrack and Elmhurst to be respectively within the Glenpatrick Division instead of within the Malakhoff Division of the last-named district. And whereas Toolleen, Warrack and Elmhurst in accordance with the writ

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHERAS by The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Government Gazette, may, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the sain ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time, in like manner, may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore 1, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an amended Port and Harbor Regulation, and to be observed accordingly, in lieu of that published in the Government Gazette of 18th April 1878, No. 31, which is hereby repealed:—

No person shall take, lead, drive, or conduct any horse or other animal, or any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or vany vehicle whatever drawn by any horse or horses, animal or animals, upon or along any public pier, jetty, or wharf without the consent of the harbor-master or piermaster in charge of such public pier, jetty, or wharf, and no owner or person in charge of any carriage, cab, dray, lorry, or vehicle shall without the consent of the said harbor-master or piermaster leave the same or allow or permit or suffer the same to be left on such pier, jetty, or wharf.
