ENDEAVOUR RIVER.

In consequence of the narrowness of the channel and the want of available space for swinging within the port, masters of vessels bound for the Endeavour River are cautioned not to enter without a pilot.

If when they arrive off the port, the pilot is not available, they must either stand off and on until he is able to get out to them or anchor off the mouth of the river in six fathoms, being careful to keep Walker Point open of Monkhouse Point. They must also have warps in readiness for mooring by the stern, if necessary.

Sailing vessels visiting the port should be provided with good long lines and handy kedges, as, during the S.E. trades, vessels always have to be warped out of the river.

A signal station will shortly be established, from which the necessary directions will be given to vessels arriving off the Endeavour, and warping buoys will also be laid down to facilitate the movements of vessels in and out of the port.

From Captain G. R. Goodfellow, Acting Political Agent, Kutch, to Charles Goane, Esq., Secretary to Government, Bombay, Political Department—(No. 10, dated Bhoop, the 13th January 1874).

I have the pleasure to report, for the information of His Excellency the Governor in Council, that His Highness the Rao has established a lighthouse at Mandavee.

2. The lantern, which was purchased in England, is fixed on a tower 127 feet 6 inches above low-water mark, on the south-west corner bastion of the town, and has a fixed dioptric lens apparatus to illumine 180°, and is of 6 feet 6 inches diameter, and of the 4th order, situated latitude 20° 49' 42" north, and longitude 69° 23' 8" east, and is visible about 18 miles.

3. I have taken the precaution to impress on His Highness the Rao the necessity that exists for satisfactory arrangements being made to ensure the light being properly kept up, and as I am satisfied with the assurance His Highness has given me, I consequently can now confidently report its establishment, should His Excellency in Council deem it advisable to notify the same for general information.

4. I trust this reform on the part of His Highness the Rao may have the commendation of Government.

CONSTITUTING A ROAD DISTRICT TO BE A SHIRE.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of April 1874.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute Amendment Act 1870* (34 Vict. No. 387, § 2) it is amongst other things enacted, that if at any time in any road district, whether single or united, and whether the area be one hundred square miles or less, the total net annual value of the rateable property, as appearing by the general rate then last made, shall have amounted to or exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if it shall seem fit, to constitute such district a shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute*, by such name as in and by the Order in Council may be assigned to the same; and the subdivisions, if any, of the district subsisting at the time of such constitution shall be and be called ridings of the shire: And whereas the total net annual value of the rateable property in the road district hereinafter mentioned, as appearing by the general rate now last made in such district, has exceeded Twelve thousand pounds, and it seems fit to constitute the same to be a shire: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order constitute the Road District hereinafter mentioned to be a Shire within the meaning of *The Shires Statute* by the name hereby assigned to the same, that is to say:—

The Towong Road District, which was created by a Proclamation bearing date the first day of March 1869, and enlarged by an Order in Council bearing date the fifth day of June 1871, shall be and is hereby constituted and shall be named the

SHIRE OF TOWONG.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-seventh day of April 1874.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 25) it is amongst other things enacted, that where any portion of Victoria shall have been annexed to any shire divided into ridings, or any part of any such shire has been severed from such shire, it shall be lawful for the Governor either to abolish all previous ridings of such shire or to divide anew such shire into such separate ridings as may seem fit, by such names and with such boundaries as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to the same, and at any time to vary or annul such order; and the number of such ridings shall be the same as that of the ridings theretofore subsisting, or in the case of annexation may be one more, or in the case of severance may be one less, than such number, if the Governor shall see fit; and such new ridings shall be in lieu of the last mentioned ridings; and upon any such abolition as aforesaid the shire shall be deemed to be a single shire to all intents and purposes: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the fourth day of December, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the Shire of Glenlyon was constituted; and by another Proclamation bearing date the twenty-eighth day of May, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the boundaries of the said shire were enlarged: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the thirteenth day of August, One thousand eight hundred and sixty-six, the said shire was divided into three ridings; and by another Order bearing date the sixth day of October, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-one, the said shire was divided anew: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor to abolish all previous ridings of the said shire and to divide it anew: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous ridings of the Shire of Glenlyon, and doth divide the said shire anew into three several ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE EAST RIDING.—Commencing on the western boundary of the shire where it is intersected by the main Daylesford to Malmesbury road; thence north-easterly by the centre of the said road to the junction of the Daylesford to Woodend road; thence by the last-named road to its intersection with Kangaroo Creek; thence southerly by the centre of Kangaroo Creek to Evans' old mill site; thence east to the three-chain road at Mew's Hill; thence westerly, southerly, and easterly by the said three-chain road to the Coliban River at Ender's Bridge, being the boundary of the Glenlyon Shire; thence by the boundary of the said shire southerly, westerly, and northerly to the commencing point.

NOTE.—In the above area is now included the late South Riding of the shire.

THE NORTH RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the Kangaroo Creek with the River Coliban; thence southerly by the centre of the Kangaroo Creek to the intersection of the creek with the Woodend road; thence by the centre of that road westerly to the eastern boundary of the main road from Glenlyon to Malmesbury; thence north-easterly by the eastern boundary of the said road to a point east of the south-east angle of the parish of Holcombe; thence west by a direct line to the said south-east angle; thence north by the east boundary of Holcombe parish to the shire boundary; thence by the shire boundary easterly, northwardly, and southerly to the commencing point.

THE WEST RIDING.—Commencing at the intersection of the main Daylesford to Malmesbury road with the west boundary of the shire; thence northwardly and eastwardly by the shire boundary to the north-east angle of the parish of Holcombe; thence south by the east boundary of the said parish to its south-east angle; thence east to the east side of the Daylesford to Malmesbury main road; thence south-westerly by the east side of the said main road to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the lands hereinafter mentioned to be a Common, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

THE BALMATTUM AND EUROA UNITED TOWN AND FARMERS' COMMON.—The unappropriated portions of the Euroa United Town and Farmers' Common and the Wondoonarook Agricultural Area Farmers' Common, together with the unappropriated portions of Crown lands hereinafter described shall be and constitute one common, to be designated the Balmattum and Euroa United Town and Farmers' Common.

Portions referred to:—

Parish of Balmattum—

Allotments 19, 20, 70a, 70b, 121a, 122, 123, 124, 125, 148, 149, 150, 151, 152, 153, and 154.

Parts of allotments 8, 13, 17, 68b, 113, 114, 121b, 145, 146, 147, B and F; and the block of land lying between allotments 101 and 102 and Francis Gall's selection.

—The deaths in March exceeded those in February by 19. They also exceeded the average of March in the previous ten years by 126. If allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of March by 40.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 92° on the 11th, and the lowest was 47° on the 1st and 24th. The mean temperature of the month (62.4°) was nearly a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in one day (31.5°) took place on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 92° to a minimum of 61°. The least range (5°) was on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 61° to a minimum of 56°. The mean daily range was 16.94°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.965) was a fraction under the average.

Males contributed 55 per cent. and females 45 per cent. to the total mortality of the month; children who had not attained their fifth year of age contributed 46 per cent. to that mortality as against 49 per cent. in March 1873; 55 per cent. in March 1872; 52 per cent. in March 1871; 47 per cent. in March 1870; 43 per cent. in March 1869; 61 per cent. in March 1868; 63 per cent. in March 1867; 57 per cent. in March 1866; 59 per cent. in March 1865; and 58 per cent. in March 1864.

The number of persons who died at the age of 75 and upwards was 9, viz.:—A butcher aged 83 and a seaman aged 75 of old age, a laborer aged 88 of bronchitis, two females aged 75 of old age, a female aged 75 of asthma, two females aged 77 of paralysis a female aged 78 of apoplexy.

Seventeen violent deaths occurred during the month, 11 of which were set down as accidental and 6 as suicidal. The accidental deaths were those of a laborer aged 45, and of a tollgate-keeper aged 36, who were killed by being passed over by drays; of a house painter aged 26, who died of concussion of the brain caused by a fall from a ladder; of a lad aged 15, who was killed by a steam lift; of a laborer aged 41, who died of erysipelas caused by a blow on the head; of a laborer aged 65, who was suffocated by food; of a seaman aged 65, who was drowned while in a state of intoxication; of a male child aged 2, who was accidentally drowned; of a male infant aged 16 days, who was suffocated in bed; of a male child aged 1, who died of scalds; and of a male infant aged 2 hours, who died from the effects of malpresentation at birth. Of the 6 suicidal deaths, 3 were caused by poison, and 3 by hanging. The first were those of a furrier aged 45, of a bootmaker aged 42, and of a mendicant aged 45, the agencies being nitric acid, strychnine, and opium respectively. The deaths by hanging were those of a cook aged 40, of a hatter aged 44, and of a man of occupation unknown aged 35.

Ninety-two deaths, or 18 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—46 in the Melbourne Hospital; 11 in the Alfred Hospital; 3 in the Lying-in Hospital; 10 in the Benevolent Asylum; 7 in the Immigrants' Home; 4 in the Yarra, Bend Lunatic Asylum; 7 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Industrial Schools; and 2 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 229, of which 140, or 61 per cent., were of males; 89, or 39 per cent. were of females. Of these 187 were under one year of age, 35 were between one and two, 16 were between two and three, 1 was between three and four, and 10 were between four and five.

The persons dying at more advanced ages than five years numbered 273. Of these 134, or 49 per cent., were males, and 139, or 51 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 29 were between twenty-five and thirty, 20 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 34 were between forty and forty-five, 26 were between forty-five and fifty, 22 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 18 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 7 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 2 were upwards of eighty.

The deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 176 in the month under review as against 179 in February. Under this head dysentery and diarrhoea caused 78 deaths, as against 108 in February. Seven deaths were reported from metria and 2 from childbirth in March, as against 1 from metria and 2 from childbirth in February. Fifty deaths were set down to phthisis in March and 41 in February.

The number of deaths in the quarter ended 31st March 1874 was 1,519, and the mean temperature in the shade was 64.2°. The deaths numbered 355 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, or if allowance be made for the increase of population they numbered 88 more than that average. The mean temperature during the same period was rather more than half a degree lower than the average.

And the Board are to be held free from all risk and responsibility in respect of any loss or damage arising on the loading or unloading, or from suffocation, or from being trampled on, bruised, or otherwise injured in transit, or from fire, or from any other cause whatsoever not arising from such gross negligence as aforesaid, or where the loss or injury arises wholly or partially from fear or restiveness.

Horses, cattle, or other animals to be carried, must be at the stations thirty minutes before the departure of the train by which they are intended to be forwarded. And the Board do not undertake to forward horses, cattle, or other animals, at or by any particular time or train.

DOGS.

Dogs will be charged for at the rate of One halfpenny per mile, subject, however, that the sum of 6d. shall be the minimum charge in each case, and must be provided with chains or other sufficient means to secure them, otherwise the Board will not be responsible for their safety.

Note.—In calculating the above rates, part of a mile will be charged for as a whole mile.

And if the declared value of any horse shall exceed the sum of Fifty pounds, or any head of cattle the sum of Twenty pounds, or any sheep, pig, or other small animal the sum of One pound, the price of conveyance will, in addition to the fare hereinbefore specified, be after the rate of One per centum upon the declared value above each of the above sums, whatever may be amount of such value, and for whatever distance the animal is to be carried.

5. The supplies coming under the head of Rations and Medical Comforts are to be delivered direct to the establishment entitled thereto on the written order of the officer in charge. All other supplies will be ordered by the head of department concerned.
6. The order issued by the head of department must accompany the goods, and the account is to be rendered simultaneously with delivery of the supplies. In other cases the account is to be rendered monthly. The rates or quantities quoted in the orders cannot be exceeded.
7. Should the contractor fail to supply any articles at the time mentioned in the order they will be otherwise procured and the expense over and above the contract price will be deducted from his account.
8. In the event of a difference of opinion between the contractor and the officer receiving the supplies as to the quality, the same to be decided, in cases where the article is not of a perishable nature, by a board of survey composed of persons named by the head of the department, and the decision of the board is to be considered final. 9. If the board shall decide that the article is not of proper quality, it must be immediately replaced by the contractor; failing which it will be procured by the officer requiring it, and the expense charged as in clause 7.

11.
