MAKING A NEW ROAD IN THE PARISH OF ECKLIN.

WHEREAS the Council of the Shire of Warrnambool have purchased, under the provisions of the *Shires Statute*, certain land in the county of Hampden, being part of allotment 2 of section 2 in the parish of Ecklin, county of Hampden, which land is within the said shire, for the purpose of opening and making a new road: Now therefore the Council of the Shire of Warrnambool, in pursuance of the provisions of the said statute, and of every power enabling them in that behalf, do hereby order and direct that the said land so purchased as aforesaid shall be a road within the meaning of the said statute from the day of the date hereof, and that such road shall be in lieu of the following former roads in the said parish, that is to say:—First road, ninety-four chains sixty-four links in length and one chain wide, bounding allotments 1 and 2, section 1, on the south, and allotment 3 of section 1 on the east; second road, sixty-one chains fifty-eight links in length and one chain wide, bounding allotment 2 of section 2 on the east; third road, seventy-six chains twenty-three links in length and one chain wide, bounding allotments 7 A and 8 of section 1 on the south.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 23 April 1873.

BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

HAPPY VALLEY QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the head of the Muddy Creek; thence westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the east boundary of the Glenvale run; thence northerly by the east boundary of that run to the Clonbinane run; thence northerly and north-easterly by the east and south-east boundaries thereof to the southern boundary of the Flowerdale run; thence by the said boundary easterly to the Glenburn run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Muddy Creek aforesaid; and thence to the commencing point.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

Town of MOORPOONA.—County of Rodney, parish of Moorpoona: Commencing at the point where the southern side of the Runnymede to Shepparton road intersects the left bank of the Goulburn River; thence by that road south-westerly to allotment 2; thence by that allotment bearing S. 42° 28' E. three chains ten links to the Goulburn River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point. The bearing given refers to the true meridian.—(M.458.) (74.R.42365.)

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may make and proclaim reserves for the preservation and growth of timber, and may from time to time, after one month's notice shall be given in the *Government Gazette*, alter and revoke any such proclamation, and the Board of Land and Works may issue licenses to cut timber upon such reserve or any part thereof on such terms and conditions, and subject to the payment of such license fee, as shall from time to time be approved of by the Governor and set forth in such license: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby, in accordance with the provisions of the 53rd section of the above-recited Act, proclaim the land hereinafter described to be a reserve for the preservation and growth of timber, that is to say:—

ELLESMERE AND AXEDALE STATE FOREST.—(Land which has been temporarily reserved for State Forest purposes), excepting the portions thereof which may have been applied for under the 19th or 49th section of the said Act prior to the date of this proclamation, and for occupation of which portions licenses may hereafter be granted.—Eighteen thousand acres or thereabouts, county of Bendigo, parishes of Ellesmere, Axedale, Wellsford, and Bagshot: Commencing at the point where the north boundary of the parish of Ellesmere abuts on the Campaspe River; thence up that river to the south boundary of section 5, parish of Axedale; thence by the south boundaries of that section and of sections 9, 10, and 11 to the west boundary of the parish; thence north to the north-west angle of allotment 6 of section 11; thence west to the west boundary of the parish of Wellsford; thence north to the parish of Bagshot; thence by the south and east boundaries of section 18, and by the south boundaries of sections 6 and 7 of that parish to the west boundary of Ellesmere; and thence by the west and north boundaries of that parish to the commencing point.—(74.N.484.)

REGULATIONS AS TO LICENSES UNDER SECTION 47 OF "THE LAND ACT, 1869."

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind to the extent hereinafter mentioned the rules, regulations, and orders hereinafter expressed to be rescinded, and doth make the regulations following:—

1. Chapter VII., Section 1., and Schedule 9, of the Regulations dated the 28th April 1873, so far as the same relate to the fees and conditions to which licenses granted to applicants under Subdivision VII. of the 47th Section of *The Land Act 1869*, are hereby rescinded.

2. Every license granted to any applicant under Subdivision VII. of Section 47 of *The Land Act 1869* shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such reasonable fee as shall from time to time be determined in accordance with the regulations of the Governor in Council.

SCHEDULE.

1. This license shall not be deemed to prevent the land comprised therein or any part or parts thereof from being sold, leased, or licensed under any of the provisions of Parts I., II., or III. of *The Land Act 1869*, except Subdivision VII. of the 47th Section thereof, or proclaimed a common, or occupied by virtue of any miner's right or business license, or alienated or dealt with under the authority of *The Land Act 1869*, or any other Act now or hereafter to be in force, otherwise than for pastoral or depasturing purposes, or resumed by order of the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, for railways, roads, telegraph lines, dams, reservoirs, races, catchwater drains, pipe racks, quarries, or other public purposes; and no licensee shall in any such case be entitled to compensation other than the return of such portion of the fee paid by him as the Board of Land and Works may think fit.

2. If the licensee, or any person claiming an interest through or under the licensee in the land comprised in this license, shall at any time during the period for which the license has been issued employ any person to apply for a license of an allotment under *The Land Act 1869* contrary to the true intent of the provisions thereof, or shall make or cause to be made any agreement or contract, or shall give or take or cause to be given or taken any negotiable security, for the purpose of defeating or evading the provisions of, or shall in any way whatsoever directly or indirectly commit or be privy to a fraud upon the said Act, this license shall be void.

3. No land comprised in roads from time to time surveyed and marked out within the boundaries of the land comprised in this license, and no land temporarily or permanently reserved, shall be deemed within the operations of this license.

4. No claim whatsoever shall be made or entertained by reason of this license not being received.

ALFRED GRAVING DOCK.

RULES 5 AND 6.

RULES Nos. 5 and 6, for "The Management of the Alfred Graving Dock," and published in the *Government Gazette* of 20th March 1874, having been amended by His Excellency the Governor in Council, are published for general information.

5. The owner, master, or agent of any vessel desiring the use of the dock, should make his application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the Office of the Chief Harbor Master, such application to be lodged between the hours of Nine a.m. and Four p.m., on week days, which will be duly registered in order of receipt. Should any dispute arise as to priority for registration, such shall be submitted to and decided by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or other Minister acting in his behalf, whose decision shall be final. With the application for registration, and before registration is made, the sum of Ten pounds (£10) shall be paid to the Secretary for Harbors as "entrance fee," which sum shall be allowed as part payment of dock dues, provided that such dock dues shall be settled within seven days after delivery of the account for the same, otherwise such fee will be forfeited, and dock dues must be paid in full. No vessel will be taken into dock until all claims due in respect to such vessel, or other vessels belonging to the same owners, or having the same master or agent, shall have been paid. The Chief Harbor Master will duly intimate to the applicant the date when the dock will be available.

6. Should any vessel not be in position and ready to be warped into dock at such time as may be specified in writing by the Chief Harbor Master, and addressed to the person making the application, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the entrance fee being also forfeited, and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in connection with the docking, unless the inability to dock shall have occurred through stress of weather, which the Chief Harbor Master shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the entrance fee.
