#### QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of The Scab Act 1870, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Qarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

BRENANAR QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpoichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

WHERIAS by The Land Act 1869 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not aircady included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the Government Guzette may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor-may from time-to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the Government Gazette the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, larbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

Town or Moorgoona.—County of Rodney, parish of Moo-

Town or Moonoopa.—County of Redney, parish of Mooroopaa. Commencing at the point where the southern side of the Runnymede to Shepparton road intersects.the left bank of the Goulburn River; thence by that road south-westerly to allotment 2; thence by that-allotment bearing S. 42° 28′ E. three chains ten links to the Goulburn River aforesaid; and thence down that river to the commencing point. The bearing given refers to the true meridian.—(M.458.) (7.4.R.42365.)

REGULATIONS AS TO LICENSES UNDER SECTION 47 OF "THE LAND ACT 1869."

WHEREAS by The Land Act-1869 power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind to the extent hereinafter mentioned the rules, regulations, and orders hereinafter expressed to be rescinded, and doth make the regulations following:—

- 1. Chapter vii., Section i., and Schedule 9,10t the Regulations dated the 28th April 1873, so far as the same relate to the fees and conditions to which licenses granted to applicants under Subdivision vii. of the 47th Section of The Land Act 1869, are hereby rescinded.
- 2. Every license granted to any applicant under Subdivision VII. of Section 47 of \*The Land Act. 1869 shall be subject to the conditions set forth in the schedule hereto, and to such reasonable fee as shall from time to time be determined in accordance with the regulations of the Governor in Council.

Should any vessel not be in position and ready to be warped into dock at such time as may be specified in writing by the Chief Harbor Master, and addressed to the person making the application, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the entrance fee being also forfeited, and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in connection with the docking, unless the inability to dock shall have occurred through stress of weather, which the Chief Harbor Master shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the entrance fee.
