PUBLIC STREETS IN THE BOROUGH OF ST. ARNAUD.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Fergusson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time upon the request of the council by notice in the *Government Gazette* to proclaim any land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way to be a public street within the meaning of the said Act, and such land reserved or used for a street, highway, thoroughfare, bridge, square, court, alley, or right-of-way shall thereupon and thenceforth from the date of such proclamation become and be absolutely dedicated to the public and reserved for public use as a public street within the meaning of any law now or hereafter in force; provided that no such proclamation shall be deemed to be a proclamation as a main road as thereinafter provided; and provided further that every and any such proclamation may be at any time revoked, if necessary, by the Governor: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this notice proclaim to be public streets within the meaning of the said Act the lands reserved or used for the streets, highways, or thoroughfares in the Borough of St. Arnaud which are herein-after described, that is to say:—

Streets in the Borough of St. Arnaud.

Golden street; 66 feet wide, from Market street to Jennings street.

Jennings street; variable width, from Napier street to Dundas street, as colored yellow on plan attached to correspondence 74.N.1112, deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-sixth day of May, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-seventh year of Her Majesty's reign.

HORSES MALICIOUSLY WOUNDED, AT HOPKINS, NEAR ARARAT.

NOTE.—During the quarter the gain to the population by excess of births over deaths was 2,730, viz.:—1,209 males and 1,521 females, but the loss by excess of departures over arrivals was 746, viz.:—502 males and 144 females. The difference between these numbers leaves a balance on the side of increase amounting to 1,984, viz.:—607 males and 1,377 females as shown in the table. The figures of population for the 31st December 1873 differ slightly from those previously published, in consequence of a final checking of the deputy-registrar's returns having developed a few inaccuracies which have now been remedied.

The deaths in April were fewer than those in March by 103, but exceeded the average of April in the previous ten years by 43. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of April by 39.

During the month the highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory was 78.5° on the 9th, and the lowest was 41.1° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (58.9°) was within a small fraction of the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in one day (25.8°) took place on the 12th from a maximum of 78° to a minimum of 52.2°, and the least (7.1°) on the 18th from a maximum of 63.5° to a minimum of 56.4°. The mean daily range was 19°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30.050 inches) was slightly above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. and females 47 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Thirty-two and a-half per cent. of the deaths were of children under five years of age, as against 42 per cent. in April 1873; 50 per cent. in April 1872; 49 per cent. in April 1871; 50 per cent. in April 1870; 47 per cent. in April 1869; 52 per cent. in April 1868; 56 per cent. in April 1867; 54 per cent. in April 1866; 60 per cent. in April 1865; and 62 per cent. in April 1864.

Twelve persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz.:—A gentleman aged 87 of hæmaturia, a weaver aged 82, two gardeners aged respectively 81 and 88, a commercial traveller aged 76, and a female aged 95 of old age, a laborer aged 82 of dementia, a male described as a freeholder aged 80 of dropsy, two females aged respectively 84 and 85 of paralysis, a female aged 76 of rheumatism, and a female aged 80 of erysipelas.

Twenty-seven violent deaths were reported during the month. Of these 22 were set down to accidental causes, and 5 to suicide. The following are the particulars:—A cab-owner aged 34, and a girl aged 4 were killed by being passed over by cabs; a Presbyterian minister died of injuries received by riding against a vehicle; a boy aged 9 was killed by a dray; a boy aged 14 was killed by being struck by a locomotive engine; a laborer aged 34 was killed by being crushed between two trucks; a laborer aged 32, and a gardener aged 60 died of fractures of the leg; a shoemaker aged 24 died of fracture of the ribs; a laborer aged 54 died of fracture of the ribs and collar-bone; a farm laborer aged 42, and a saddler aged 43 died of fractures of the spine; a farmer aged 71 died of injuries to the back; a male child aged 2, and a girl aged 8 died of scalds; a gas-fitter aged 41, and a female aged 39 died of lead poisoning; a horse-trainer aged 69 was killed by taking an overdose of laudanum; a sailor of age unknown, a coin dealer aged 35, and a laborer aged 26 were drowned accidentally; an infant aged 2 days was killed by overlying. The suicidal deaths were those of an accountant aged 36, who cut his throat; of a presser aged 23, a dressmaker aged 25, and a female aged 18, who drowned themselves; and of a carrier aged 65, who hanged himself.

One hundred and three deaths, or 26 per cent. of the total number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital, 51; Alfred Hospital, 6; Benevolent Asylum, 8; Lying-in Hospital, 4; Immigrants' Home, 10; Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 7; Yarra Bend Asylum, 9; Industrial Schools, 3; Children's Hospital, 1; Gaol, 2; Asylum for the Blind, 1; Melbourne Home, 1.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 130, of which 66, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 64, or 49 per cent. were of females. Of those who died 89 were under one year of age, 26 were between one and two years, 7 were between two and three, 4 were between three and four, and 4 were between four and five.

The persons dying at a more advanced age than five years numbered 270. Of these 145, or 54 per cent., were males, and 125 or 46 per cent., were females; 18 were between five and ten, 11 were between ten and fifteen, 17 were between fifteen and twenty, 17 were between twenty and twenty-five, 16 were between twenty-five and thirty, 35 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 27 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 15 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 12 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, 10 were upwards of eighty, and 3 were of age unspecified.

The mortality from zymotic diseases fell from 176 in March to 109 in April, the chief diminution being in deaths from diarrhoea and dysentery which decreased from 78 to 30. Deaths from typhoid fever increased from 24 in February and 31 in March to 34 in April, and deaths from diphtheria increased from 10 in March to 15 in April. Deaths from childbirth and metria fell from 9 in March to 6 in April. The number of deaths from phthisis in the month under review was 52, as against 50 in the previous month.

HYDROGRAPHIC INFORMATION.

EXTRACT FROM REMARK BOOK OF NAV. LIEUT. HENRY HOSKEN,
OF H.M.S. PEARL.

Fiji Group.

Kadavu.—The Astrolabe reef, which stretches to the north of Kadavu, is imperfectly delineated on General Chart 2691. From observations taken when off the northern extreme of the reef, the north rock was found to be one mile too far north; it should be in lat. $18^{\circ} 37' S.$, one mile and a half inside the extreme of the reef.

The reef also stretches two miles and a-half further to the eastward (abreast the N. end of Ono Id.) than shown on the chart.

West Bay, Galoa Bay.—Beacons.—There are now two beacons erected, one on the southern hummock of Galoa Id., the other on the main land of Kadavu Id. When in line of bearing $N. 89^{\circ} W.$, they lead through the channel between Middle reef and South reef, but as they are not placed at right angles to the passage they lead dangerously close to both reefs. The inner beacon in misty weather is often obscured.

Buoys.—The Mail Company have placed a red buoy just inside the south edge of middle patch, another red buoy outside the extreme of the spit which stretches off the south extreme of Galoa Id., and a black buoy on the centre patch. These buoys are indifferently moored, and cannot be relied on.

Viti Levu.—*Navua*.—The land about Navua, south side of Viti Levu, is not correctly laid down on the General Chart. Between the reefs stretching off the main land and the reefs N. of Begu Id. there is only a passage of two miles wide, instead of eight miles as shown on the chart.

Taviuni.—*Vuna Point*.—Vuna Point opened out clear of South Point, N.W. $\frac{1}{2}$ N., forming a bay under the reef which stretches to the westward. Venu Point stretches out two miles further than shown on General Chart, which leaves the extremity of the reef only two miles from the point.

Somo-somo Straits.—*Rabi Id.*—Bring Rabi Id. to bear N. $\frac{1}{2}$ E.; steer for it, passing between the shoal patches which extend $\frac{1}{2}$ of a mile to the West of Goat Id., and a number of detached reefs which stretch off to the eastward from Mt. Cocoa-nut Pt. about two miles, leaving a channel of not more than two miles in width. Rabi Id. appears to be placed one mile and a half too far to the E. on the chart.

Goat Id.—A reef surrounds Goat Island, stretching off about 1° south, $\frac{1}{2}$ W. and 1° N. Between Goat Id. and Taviuni there is said to be an intricate channel for small craft.

Anchorage.—The anchorages off Vuna Plantation, N. of Vuna reef, and the one off Somo-somo, are very close in-shore, with deep water 15 to 30 feet, and circumscribed. The former has very bad holding ground, but the latter, having soft bottom, affords fair holding ground.

New Caledonia.

New Caledonia.—*Kie Inner Bank*.—*Havannah Passage*.—The Kie Inner Bank could not be made out from the *Pearl's* masthead, although she passed close to its assigned position. It is not shown on any of the charts of the recent French surveys, nor is its existence known to the French officers or pilots.

Passage from Woodin Channel to Noumea.—*Best Passage*.—The best passage, the one used by the French men-of-war, and recommended by the pilots, is that called the Tareti Channel, pass north of Tareti (sandbank) and south of the "Nakae Shoals;" these, together with the "Four Northern Banks," always show above water; then midchannel for Noumea. This is better than the Porcupine Id. passage, recommended on the chart, on account of the Oliver Bank and Providence Shoal not always being visible. They were not seen from the masthead, as the *Pearl* passed near them.

Newly-discovered dangers.—Information received from M. Villemot, Lieut. de Vaisseau, commanding the French War Transport *Cher*.

Roche du Var.—The Roche du Var is a dangerous rock lying $7\frac{1}{2}$ N.N.E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from the entrance to the Havannah Passage. It is in latitude $22^{\circ} 14' 25'' S.$, longitude $167^{\circ} 9' 15'' E.$ From it a peak on the mainland is in line with S. extreme of Nau Id.,

bearing S. $66^{\circ} \frac{1}{2}$ W., and the S. extreme of Cape Ndua bears S. $41^{\circ} \frac{1}{2}$ W. There is only a depth of two metres on it.

Information received from M. Gustave Fabre, pilot for New Caledonia.

Dangerous Reef.—There is a reef (about $1\frac{1}{2}$ in diameter) not marked on chart No. 2906, corrected to March 1869, with nine feet of water over it, which generally breaks. It lies nearly in the fairway from the I. of Pines to Woodin Passage. It is $2\frac{1}{2}$ S.E. by E. $\frac{1}{2}$ E. from Nuare Id., and $2\frac{1}{2}$ W. by S. $\frac{1}{2}$ S. from Amere Id., being in latitude $22^{\circ} 27' 12'' S.$, long. $167^{\circ} 4' E.$

The 3 $\frac{1}{2}$ fm. shoal less water.—The small shoal of $3\frac{1}{2}$ fms. which lies $1\frac{1}{2}$ E. of Uun Id., in lat. $22^{\circ} 25\frac{1}{2}' S.$, long. $166^{\circ} 53' E.$, has only three feet of water over it. The sea breaks over it.

Senes Reef.—The Senes Reef breaks with wly. and s-wly. winds.

The Larégnère Reef.—The Larégnère reef always breaks.

Constantine Passage.—The Constantine passage is nearly blocked up by a long reef running parallel to the shore, not shown on chart No. 936 b of 1856 and 1867.

Nékété Passage.—The Nékété passage is reduced in width to about $\frac{1}{4}$ by an extension of the reefs which form it.

Extract from the *Moniteur* of 4th-February 1874:—

Nereus Shoal.—Mr. Hovell, commanding the British ship *Australasian Packet*, states that he saw the Nereus Shoal in lat. $20^{\circ} 10' S.$, long. $160^{\circ} 5' E.$, whereas on the charts it is shown in lat. $20^{\circ} 5' S.$, long. $160^{\circ} 80' E.$

PETRIE REEF, WESTERN PACIFIC.

PETRIE REEF, discovered by Lieutenant Petrie, in 1835, and marked *Petrie* (?) on the Admiralty Charts, was sighted on the 5th March by Captain Goodall, in the *May Queen*. He places the reef, which he describes as about $5\frac{1}{2}$ miles long by 3 miles wide, in the following position, viz.:

North point, latitude $18^{\circ} 31' 0'' S.$
longitude $164^{\circ} 26' 0'' E.$

South point, latitude $11^{\circ} 36' 26'' S.$
longitude $164^{\circ} 24' 35'' E.$

On the north-west side he observed an opening into a lagoon apparently of deep water. This opening was about two miles wide, with a detached reef just within the entrance and towards its north-eastern side. There appeared also to be a small opening at the southern extremity of the main reef. The sand banks on the western and south-eastern sides of the reef were estimated at low water to be 20 to 25 feet high. Off the northern extremity of the reef a strong tide rip was observed, the stream setting to the north-east.
