BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERAGE AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

i. On every house or tenement of £15 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £15, a rate of Eight pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700

iii. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £500, and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation above £500.

iv. Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

v. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

vi. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be, at the Melbourne wharves Four shillings per one thousand gallons, at other places Six shillings per one thousand gallons.

vii. For water supplied by the Board by measurement the charge will be (except in cases of special agreement with the Board) at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter. Syphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

4. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works, and

any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such license shall be granted by the board the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connections with submains must be made with proper ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{4}$ -inch.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the board may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and from which not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

16. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

Solomon Islands.

Ramos Island, Indispensable Straits, is a small island 2' long N.W. by N. and S.E. by S., and about 200 feet high, having off its N.W. point an islet about 100 feet high with two smaller ones and several pinnacle rocks between. Making Ramos Island from the S. it has the appearance of a saddle with two small islands off its western side. These islands appear to be connected by a reef probably more than 10 miles to the eastward.

Soundings were obtained in 12½ fathoms 3' to the S.E. of Ramos Island. The shoal water runs about 4' across in a N. and S. direction. From observations made in the offing and bearings of Cape Pinto, Isabel Island, and Cape Astrolabe, Malaya Island, the S.E. Peak of Ramos Island should be in lat. 8° 14' S., long. 160° 6' E.

The passage between Ramos Island and Cape Astrolabe should not be taken by large vessels. No breakers were seen although there was a heavy swell.

Isabel Island, Port Praslin.—The scale of miles on the plan of Port Praslin (Chart 209) should be half-miles, which would narrow the entrance to 2½ cables. The longitude Port Praslin made to be 158° 12' E., Cape Comfort being the same distance (8 miles) to the W. of position on Admiralty Chart.

To the eastward of the entrance for about 16' there is a chain of small islands fronted by reefs, with apparently numerous clear passages, some of which closely resemble the entrance to the port.

The island forming the eastern side of entrance is not so high as the plan (Chart 209) has it. There are two other openings west of Port Praslin.

The appearance of the interior of the harbor is altered by the growth of Mangrove bushes, which have filled up the channels between Watering Place Island and the three islets placed immediately S. of it.

Cape Henslow, Guadalcanar.—Observation taken in the offing placed Cape Henslow in lat. 9° 54' S., long. 160° 33' E. Shoal water runs off the Point to the eastward for about 2'. In a light N. of C. Henslow stands the native village of Bulu.

Carteret Nine Islands are low and woody.

St. John's Island was seen at a distance of 35'. It is high and wooded.

New Ireland, Blossville Island is about 200 feet long and 70 feet high. Off the coast of New Ireland, as far as Lakiliki Bay (Metlik), the *Rosario* carried deep water until about 1' from N.W. entrance to a bay where a shoal point runs off to the eastward. Inside the parallel of Cape Bougainville the water shoals rapidly from 7 to 3 fathoms sand, and the bay affords no shelter from the ordinary trade wind. Lountass Island and Cape St. George appear bold without outlying dangers.

Duke of York Islands.—The peninsula marked Gabert Point (Chart 764) is an island. No water is now obtainable at Port Hunter. Jacquot Point is placed too far south.

Great caution is necessary in navigating the Solomon Islands during the night or thick weather, as the positions on the charts are very much out. 23 miles to the eastward of Port Praslin the land is 15' too far to the N. Taking North Cape, Bouka Island, and the east end of Isabel Island as rightly placed, the whole intervening land should be some 8 to 10 miles further to the S.W. The position assigned to Mount Balbi, Bougainville Island, by Raper, appeared to be nearly correct, viz., lat. 5° 56' S., long. 154° 29' E.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyooa Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brenanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranna run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.
