THE SHIRE OF WANNON DIVIDED.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-second day of June 1874.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

Mr. Francis

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 13) it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election, or general election, or first appointment of councillors, whether under the Act No. CLXXVI. hereby repealed or this Act, for any shire, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll in such shire, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide anew the shire into two or into three ridings, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time, subject to the like conditions, alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor by the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition to that effect signed by one-fourth of the number of voters on the voters' roll of the Shire of Wannon, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order in Council divide the said Shire of Wannon into three ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE BALMORAL RIDING.—Commencing at the north-east angle of the parish of Wookurkook; thence westerly by the northern boundary of said parish to the north-west angle

thereof; thence south by the road on the western margin of said parish and of the parish of Gatim-gatum to the north-east angle of allotment 5A of section 1 of the last said parish; thence westerly by the north boundary of said allotment and the road on the northern margin of the parish of Gatim-gatum to the north-west angle of said parish; thence southerly by the western boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence south by a road to the south-west angle of allotment 2B of section 2 of the parish of Urangara; thence further south by the west boundary of said parish to the south-west angle thereof; thence westerly by the southern boundaries of the parishes of Carrak and Brit-brit to the intersection of the main road from Green-hills to Harrow; thence northerly by that road to the Glenelg River; thence up the course of that river to the eastern boundary of the parish of Pendyk-pendyk; thence south by the said boundary to the commencing point.

THE COLERAINE RIDING.—Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish of Urangara; thence east by the southern boundary of said parish to the intersection of the road running between sections 2 and 3 of the parish of Toolang; thence southerly by the said road and the western boundary of allotment 4 of section 17 of the said parish to the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth; thence westerly by the northern boundary of the parish of Redruth to the north-west angle thereof; thence southerly by the western boundary of the said parish of Redruth to the River Wannon; thence north-westerly by the course of the River Wannon to the west angle of allotment 1 of section 18 parish of Carapook; thence north-easterly, easterly, and northerly by the road bounding said section 18 on the west and north and section 10 of said parish on the west to its junction with the main road from Coleraine to Casterton; thence easterly by the said main road to its junction with the main road from Green-hills to Harrow, where the last said road enters the Koroit pre-emptive section; thence northerly by the last said road to the intersection of the southern boundary of the parish of Brit-brit; thence easterly by the southern boundary of that parish and of the parish of Carrak to the commencing point.

THE NARREEN RIDING.—Commencing at the junction of the road bounding section 10 of the parish of Carapook on the west with the main road from Coleraine to Casterton; thence north-westerly by said main road to the junction of the road at the western angle of section 4, parish of Carapook; thence northerly by that road and its continuation between allotments 3, 4, 5, and allotments 6, 8, 9, of section 3 of the said parish, and allotments 1, 2, 6, and 7 and 9 of section 15 of the parish of Bruk-bruk, and between section 14 and allotment 7 of section 13 and allotment 2 and allotments 1 and 4 of said section 13, and between section 10 and section 11, and running along the western boundaries of allotments 1, 2, 3, and 4 of section 6, and 1 and 4 of section 3, all of the said parish of Bruk-bruk, to its northern boundary; thence westerly by that boundary to the south-western angle of section 14 of the parish of Dewrang; thence by a right line northerly to the south-east angle of allotment 2 of section 2 of said parish; thence northerly by the road on the east of said allotment and of allotment 1 of said section to the northern boundary of said parish; thence north by the road on the east of the parish of Kooloomert to the Pigeon Ponds; thence by the main channel of the Pigeon Ponds to the River Glenelg; thence by following upwards the course of the said river to the crossing of the main road from Green-hills to Harrow; thence southerly by the said main road to the junction of the main road from Coleraine to Casterton; thence westerly by the east said main road to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyocora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brenanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD LANDS IN THE
Dunn's Farm, parish of Clunes, section C, allotments 20, 27, and 28.
Hope's Farm, parish of Clunes, section C, allotments 29, 30, 31, and 32.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE
Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypanial in the county of Gladstone.

BOARD OF LAND AND WORKS.

BYE-LAWS.

MELBOURNE SEWERAGE AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by *The Public Works Statute 1865*, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

i. On every house or tenement of £15 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

ii. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £15, a rate of Eight pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, Two pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700.

iii. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £500, and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation above £500.

iv. Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.

v. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

vi. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be, at the Melbourne wharves Four shillings per one thousand gallons, at other places Six shillings per one thousand gallons.

vii. For water supplied by the Board by measurement the charge will be (except in cases of special agreement with the Board) at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons.

3. The minimum quantity of water to be charged for in each case where water is supplied by measure shall be (1), if for domestic and other than domestic purposes, the quantity of which the charge at 1s. per 1000 gallons would be equal to the amount of the assessed rate which would be payable for the premises so supplied if supplied otherwise than by measure; and (2) if for other than domestic purposes only, 25,000 gallons per quarter. Siphon-pumps will not be allowed unless the water is supplied by measure.

4. Any person receiving water from the board who shall take and carry away such water from his premises, or who shall allow any person to take or carry away such water, or shall sell the same to any other person, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

5. Any person not having agreed to be supplied by the board who shall take or carry away water from any drinking-tap, trough, or private or public service-pipe, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds.

6. Before any person shall affix any service-pipe to any pipe of the board, or alter, repair, or in any manner interfere with any pipe of the board, or any service-pipe, cock, or fitting connected with the pipes of the board, he shall obtain from the board a license in that behalf to execute such works, and any unlicensed person affixing, altering, repairing, or in any manner interfering with any such pipe, service-pipe, cock, or fitting as aforesaid shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Ten pounds.

7. Before any such license shall be granted by the board the person applying for same shall satisfy the board that he is a competent plumber.

8. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall offend by opening any ground, so as to uncover any pipe or pipes the property of the board, without giving two days' notice to the board of his intention so to do, or who shall in any way tamper with or alter any pipe the property of the board, without the permission in writing of the board being first obtained, or who shall wilfully or carelessly break, injure, or open any lock, cock, valve, pipe, work, or engine, the property of the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Twenty pounds.

9. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, who shall lay any pipe to communicate with the pipes of the board without giving two days' notice of the day and hour when such pipe is intended to be made to communicate with the pipes of the board, or who shall make such communication except under the superintendence and according to the directions of some officer of the board, or who shall lay any leaden or other pipe to communicate with the pipe of the board of a strength and material not sanctioned by the board, shall be liable for each such offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board. and galvanized iron piping of approved quality only will be allowed for external and internal services. Ordinary connections with submains must be made with proper ferrules, to which, for iron services, a length of not less than three feet of lead pipe must be attached. One service-pipe only to each tenement will be permitted, and for houses rated at Twenty pounds per annum and under, the bore of such service-pipe must not exceed $\frac{1}{2}$ -inch.

10. If any person shall neglect to repair any service-pipe conveying water from the pipes of the board into the premises of such person, after having received notice from any officer of the board that such service-pipe requires repairing, the board may stop the water from flowing into such premises, either by cutting off the service-pipe or otherwise, as to the said board may seem fit, until the necessary repairs shall have been effected. The service-pipes from the main being the property of the owners or occupiers of the tenements supplied by such service-pipes, the occupier (if any), and if none, the owner shall in every instance in which any damage shall be caused by reason of such service-pipe being leaky or otherwise out of repair or broken, be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

11. Any person supplied with water by the board who shall wilfully or negligently allow the same to run to waste, shall be liable for each offence to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

12. No meter shall be allowed to be affixed unless the dial of the same is capable of registering (1,000,000) one million gallons, except by special consent of the board.

13. If any meter should cease registering, or be reported by the inspector as out of repair or registering inaccurately, the board shall estimate and charge for the water consumed during the period such meter was not in working order, and until it is repaired and refixed, either by taking an average of the quantity used during the previous quarter or during the corresponding period of the previous year, or the board may insert a check meter on the service-pipe.

14. Overflow pipes to private baths will not be permitted. Water closets will not be allowed to be supplied direct from the main, but from a cistern so constructed that the water cannot flow continuously, and from which not more than two gallons can escape at each flush.

15. Any person, whether licensed as aforesaid or not, connecting any service-pipe, or branch service-pipe, with any steam boiler for the purpose of feeding or supplying the same with water, without first affixing a self-acting valve for preventing the pressure of the steam reversing or affecting the dial of the meter, shall be liable to a penalty not exceeding Five pounds; and in the event of continuing the offence, to a further penalty of Two pounds for each day after notice of the offence from the board.

16. In the construction of these bye-laws, the word "person" shall be deemed to extend to and include a corporation, whether aggregate or sole.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, that is to say:—

TOWNSHIP IN THE PARISH OF JUNG-JUNG.—County of Borung, parish of Jung-jung: Commencing at a point on the western bank of the Yarrambeac Creek bearing east three chains, more or less, from the south-east angle of William Coombes' 19th section block, No. 24203; bounded thence by a line and that block bearing west about seventy chains; thence by William Coombes' 19th section block, No. 24257, bearing south fifty chains fifty-five links; thence by a road bearing east about sixty-nine chains to the Yarrambeac Creek aforesaid; and thence down that creek to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(J.32.) (O.B.1564.)
