DISSOLUTION OF A UNION UNDER THE "WEIGHTS AND MEASURES STATUTE 1864."

PROCLAMATION

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Fericusor Bower, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by an Act of the Parliament of Victoria, passed in the twenty-seventh year of the reign of Her present Majesty, called The Weights and Measures Statute 1864, it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, at any time, if he think fit, and shall, at the request of not less than half the councils or boards constituting any union proclaimed under the said Act, dissolve the same by proclamation: And whereas the Borough of Wangaratta, the Shire of Oxley, and the Shire of North Ovens were proclaimed a union on the tenth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-nine: And whereas the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, the Council of the Shire of Oxley, and the Conneil of the Shire of Oxley, and the Council of the Borough of Wangaratta, the Round of the Shire of Oxley, and the Council of the Shire of Oxley, and the Council of the Shire of Oxley, and the Sorough of Wangaratta, the Shire of North Ovens have requested that the said union may be dissolved: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do by this my proclamation dissolve the union of the Borough of Wangaratta, the Shire of Oxley, and the Shire of North Ovens, for the purposes of the said Act.

The deaths in May were three fewer than those in April. They exceeded the average of the month of May in the previous ten years by 67. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than that average by 8.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at Melbourne Observatory during the month was 72.6° on the 9th, and the lowest was 36.1° on the 16th. The mean temperature of the month (52.4°) was four-fifths of a degree below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in one day (24.9°) took place on the 16th from a maximum of 61° to a minimum of 36.1°, and the lesst (85°) on the 29th from a maximum of 36.3° to a minimum of 45.1°. The mean daily range was 15.7°. The mean atmospheric pressure (20°959 inches) was a fraction below the average.

Deaths of males amounted to 56 per cent. and deaths of females to 44 per cent. to the mortality of the month. Thirty-nine per cent. of the deaths were of children who had not attained their fifth year as against 40 per cent. in May 1873, 46 per cent. in May 1873, 38 per cent. in May 1870, 48 per cent. in May 1869, 45 per cent. in May 1868, 48 per cent. in May 1867, 47 per cent. in May 1868, 48 per cent.

Thirteen persons of the age of 75 or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A gardener aged 76, two laborers aged respectively 76 and 78, a blacksmith aged 80, an artist aged 85, a medical man aged 86, and two females aged respectively 81 and 86 of old age; a female lodginghouse-keeper aged 78, and a gentleman aged 81 of valvular disease of the heart; a shipwright aged 75 of asthma, and two females each aged 79, one of chronic bronchitis, the other of compression of the brain.

Eighteen violent deaths occurred during the month. Of these 16 have been set down as accidental, 1 as homicidal, and 1 as suicidal. The particulars of the accidental deaths are as follow:—Three boys of the respective ages of 8, 9, and 12 were passed over by vehicles; 2 seamen aged respectively 25 and 31 were killed by falls, one from the yard of a ship, the other into the hold of a steamer; a blacksmith aged 38 died of dislocation of the neck from falling down stairs when drunk; a laborer aged 40 died of fracture of the skull from a lall while drunk; a laborer at the Railways aged 73 died of fracture of the skull resulting from being struck by a locomotive; a butcher aged 56 died of upture of the urethra caused by a fall from a horse; a man of occupation not known aged 72 died of "upture of the liver and other injuries." Three children died of suffocation, viz.—A newly born male infant, and a child aged nearly 2 years in cess-pits, and a male infant aged 5 months by overlying; a boy aged 5 was drowned in an underground tank; a female aged 51 died from the effects of burns; the death of an infant aged 2 days was caused by injuries received at birth. The homicidal death was that of a male infant aged 4 weeks who was overlain by the mother, verdict manslaughter. The suicide was that of a female aged 50 who threw herself from a window.

Eighty-seven deaths, or 22 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—38 in the Melbourne Hospital; 11 in the Benevolent Asylum; 8 in the Alfred Hospital; 7 in Yarra Bend Asylum; 4 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum, 6 in the Lying-in Hospital,; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 5 in the Gaol; and 2 in the Childrens' Hospital.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 153, of which 87, or 57 per cent, were of males, and 66, or 43 per cent, were of females. Of those who died 95 were under one year of age, 30 were between one and two years, 10 were between two and three years, 13 were between three and four years, and 5 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 244. Of whom 137, or 56 per cent, were males; 107 or 44 per cent, were females; 17 were between five and ten, 13 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between filteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty-five, 20 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between fifty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 18 were between fifty and fifty-five, 10 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 10 were between sixty-five and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy, 18 were between seventy and seventy, 18 were between seventy five, 10 were above eighty years of age, and of 1 the age was unspecified.

Zymotic diseases caused 109 deaths in April and 104 in May. Under this head deaths from diarrhoa and dysentery fell from 30 to 17, and deaths from typhoid fevers fell from 34 to 30. On the other hand deaths from scarlatina and diphtheria rose from 12 to 17. Four deaths from childbirth and metria occurred in May as against 6 in April, and 39 deaths occurred from phthisis as against 52 in April.

SALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE. SALE PUBLIC CEMETERY.

Rules and Regulations for the Management of the Sale Public Cemetery.

The charges for burying in or otherwise using the cemetery must be paid before an order can be given for the particular work or privilege required.

2. The charge for occupying ground may be remitted by the trustees when it is shown to their satisfaction that the relatives or friends of the deceased are unable to pay the charge, but all such burials must be made in that part of the cemetery marked "free ground" on the plan, and it the caretaker be required to dig the grave, then the usual fee for that service must be paid.

3. Orders for interments must be given to the caretaker at least six working hours before the time appointed for the burial, so as to allow sufficient time for digging the grave within working hours, otherwise the charge for digging will be increased by one-half.

4. The caretaker will dig all ordinary graves, but when the friends of any indigent person deceased wish to dig the grave themselves, or when brick graves or vaults are required, then the excavations must be made and the ground filled in or removed under the inspection and to the satisfaction of the caretaker.

5. The hours fixed for interment are from Ten o'clock a.m. fill Six p.m. from September to April inclusive, and from Ten a.m. till Four p.m. during the other four months, except on Sundays, when the hours are from Two o'clock till Five p.m. throughout the year.

6. All monuments, vaults, graves, gravestones, and fences must be kept in proper condition and repair by the owners,

otherwise they may be removed by the trustees after having given notice of their intention to remove them by posting such notice to the last-known address of one of the parties con-

notice to the last-known address of one of the parties concerned.

7. Every coffin in a vault or brick grave must be bricked in and cemented and covered by a slab of stone, slate, iron, or good blue or red-gum planking.

8. A drawing of every stone, tomb, pedestal, and plan of every monument or tablet proposed to be creeted, and a copy of every inscription, must be submitted to the trustees, without whose approval it shall not be erected or inscribed.

9. The grounds will be open to the public daily from sunrise till sunset.

10. No grave will be allowed to be re-opened for further interment at a shorter interval than twelve years, except it be to place a second coffin on top of the first, and this will be delpth of six feet or more.

11. Persons desirous of exhuming their relatives for the purpose of removal to another cemetery, will be allowed to do so upon satisfying the trustees that the removal can be made without offence, and upon payment of the usual fee.

12. No new grave can be made without paying for the ground or satisfying the trustees that it has been already paid for.

MELBOURNE SEWERAGE AND WATER SUPPLY.

MELBOURNE SEWERAGE AND WATER SUPPLY.

THE Board of Land and Works doth hereby, pursuant to, and in exercise and execution of, the powers and authorities conferred on such Board by The Public Works Statute 1865, make the Bye-laws following:—

1. All bye-laws heretofore made relating to the Melbourne Sewers and Water Supply shall be and the same are hereby repealed, except as to anything done or committed or the recovery of any rates due and payable thereunder.

2. The following rates and charges are those which the owners and occupiers of lands and tenements shall pay in respect of water supplied by the Board, that is to say:—

1. On every house or tenement of £15 annual value and under, Ten shillings per annum.

- 11. On every house or tenement above the annual value of £15, a rate of Eight pence for each pound sterling on the amount of the valuation up to £300 inclusive, I wo pounds per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £300 up to £700, and One pound ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation in excess of £700
- III. Tenements built and used for storage purposes only, shall be subject to a rate of Two pounds ten shillings per centum on the amount of the valuation up to £500, and One pound five shillings per centum on the amount of such valuation above £500.
- Iv. Water troughs will be charged for at the rate of Twenty shillings per annum each.
- v. Water for steam boilers will be charged for at the rate of Ten shillings per annum for each horse-power of such steam boiler.

- vi. For water supplied to shipping the charge will be, at the Melbourne wharves Four shillings per one thousand gallons, at other places Six shillings per one thousand gallons.
- vii. For water supplied by the Board by measurement the charge will be (except in cases of special agreement with the Board) at the rate of One shilling per one thousand gallons.
