THE SHIRE OF KYNETON DIVIDED ANEW.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of July 1874.

PRESENT:

His Excellency the Governor.

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 25) it is amongst other things enacted, that where any portion of Victoria shall have been annexed to any shire divided into ridings, or any part of any such shire has been severed from such shire, it shall be lawful for the Governor either to abolish all previous ridings of such shire or to divide anew such shire into such separate ridings as may seem fit, by such names and by such boundaries as shall in and by the Order in Council be assigned to the same, and at any time to vary or annul such order; and the number of such ridings shall be the same as that of the ridings theretofore subsisting, or in the case of annexation may be one more, or in the case of severance may be one less, than such number, if the Governor shall see fit; and such new riding shall be in lieu of the last mentioned ridings; and upon any such abolition as aforesaid the shire shall be deemed to be a single shire to all intents and purposes: And whereas by an Order in Council dated the twenty-eighth day of December One thousand eight hundred and sixty-four, the Kyneton united road district was divided into four subdivisions: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony, bearing date the third day of January One thousand eight hundred and sixty-five, the said District was constituted the Shire of Kyneton: And whereas it has seemed fit to the Governor to abolish all previous ridings of the said shire and to divide it anew: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth by this present Order abolish all previous ridings of the Shire of Kyneton, and doth divide the said shire anew into four several ridings, to be designated by the names and to be comprised within the boundaries which are hereinafter assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

THE KYNETON RIDING.—Commencing at a point on the River Campaspe, being the south-eastern angle of section 26, parish of Carlsruhe; thence by the eastern boundary of sections 26, 29, 30, and 31 of the same parish to the north-east angle of section 31; thence west by the north boundary of said section 31 and a direct line to the north-eastern angle of suburban portion 18; thence west by the southern side of a Government road to the north-western angle of suburban portion 17; thence west one chain; thence north by the western side of a Government road to the north-eastern angle of section 42; thence by a line bearing north-westerly, being the south-western boundary of a Government road to a road forming the eastern side of that road, and by the northern and western boundaries of the Racecourse Reserve to the River Campaspe; and thence southerly and easterly by the right bank of the River Campaspe to the south-eastern angle of section 26, the commencing point.

THE CARLSRUHE RIDING.—Commencing on the Campaspe River at the south-east angle of the parish of Lauriston; thence north-westerly by that river to the south-east angle of section 26, parish of Carlsruhe; thence north by the east boundaries of sections 26, 29, 30, and 31 of the same parish to the north-east angle of section 31; thence west to the west boundary of the parish of Carlsruhe; thence north by the western boundaries of the parishes of Carlsruhe and Langley to the north-west angle of portion 8 in the parish of Langley; thence east to Piper's Creek; thence northerly by the centre of Piper's Creek to due east of the south-east angle of portion 8, section 1, parish of Emberton; thence by a direct line bearing easterly to the north-west angle of allotment 16 in the parish of Baynton; thence by the northern boundary of said parish of Baynton easterly to the centre of Pohlman's Creek; thence south-easterly by the centre of Pohlman's Creek to the south-east angle of allotment 2 in the parish of Baynton; thence by a direct line to the head of Mollison's Creek; thence northerly, easterly, and southerly by the centre of Mollison's Creek to the junction of the southern branch of said creek, forming portion of the western boundary of the Pvalong Road District; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Pvalong Road District and a direct south line to the electoral boundary of the county of Bourke or southern boundary of the electoral district of Dalhousie; thence westerly to the north-west angle of the Lancefield Road District; thence southerly by the western boundary of the Lancefield Road District to the north-east angle of the Woodend, Newham, and Rochford Road District; thence southerly and westerly by the northern boundary of the last-named road district to the north-west angle of the parish of Newham; thence south by the western boundary of the parish of Newham to the south-east angle of the parish of Carlsruhe; thence west by the south boundary of the parish of Carlsruhe to the commencing point.

THE LAURISTON AND EDGECOMBE RIDING.—Commencing at Price's bridge over the Coliban River on the Daylesford to Kyneton road; thence westerly by that road to the Kangaroo Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the Coliban River; thence northerly by that river to the south-east angle of the borough of Taradale; thence north by the east boundary of the borough of Edgecombe; thence east by the said north boundary to the north-east angle of same parish; thence south by the east

boundary of the parishes of Edgecombe and Lauriston to the north-west angle of section 31 in the parish of Carlsruhe; thence west by the southern side of a Government road to the north-western angle of suburban portion 17; thence west one chain; thence north one chain to the south-eastern angle of section 43; thence north by the western side of a Government road to the north-eastern angle of section 42; thence by a line bearing north-westerly, being the south-western boundary of a Government road, to a road forming the eastern boundary of portion D, section 45; thence by the eastern side of that road, and by the northern and western boundaries of the Racecourse Reserve to the river Campaspe; and thence southerly and easterly by the right bank of the Campaspe River to the south-east angle of the parish of Lauriston; thence west by the south boundary of the last-named parish to the Little Coliban River; thence down the Little Coliban River to the Coliban River; thence southerly by that river to the commencing point. Excepting that portion contained within the boundaries of the borough of Malmsbury.

THE TYLDEN AND TRENTHAM RIDING.—Commencing at the western source of the Coliban River; thence by that river to the bridge at Enders; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by the three-chain road to Mews' Hill, at a point opposite a one-chain road and bearing easterly from Evan's old mill site; thence by that one-chain road westerly to the Kangaroo Creek; thence northerly by the Kangaroo Creek to the road from Daylesford to Kyneton; thence easterly by that road to the Coliban River at Price's Bridge; thence northerly by that river to the junction of the Little Coliban River; thence easterly by the Little Coliban River to the north-west angle of portion 1, parish of Tylden; thence east to the Campaspe River; thence southerly by the Campaspe River to the south-west angle of portion 111, parish of Woodend; thence east to the south-east angle of portion 110 in the same parish; thence south to the Great Dividing Range, forming the northern boundary of the county of Bourke; thence westerly by the Great Dividing Range to the commencing point.

And the Honorable Duncan Gillies, Her Majesty's Commissioner of Railways and Roads for Victoria, shall give the necessary directions herein accordingly.

NOTICE PURSUANT TO SEC. 13 OF "THE FRIENDLY SOCIETIES STATUTE 1865."

To Mrs. ISABELLA NASH, Secretary of the Independent Order of Shepherdesses, Station Hotham No. 1.

TAKE notice that the transcripts of rules lodged with me on or about the 1st of June instant, and signed by yourself, Jessy Carlyle, Adelaide Goslin, and Jane Cormack, are inconsistent with *The Friendly Societies Statute 1865* and the laws in force in Victoria, in the following particulars:—

1. That the objects of the society are stated to be, among other things, "the establishment of a fund for supplying books, stationery, and such articles as may be necessary for the management of the society and paying the expenses of such management, also for the mutual improvement and amusement of its members," some of which objects are among the purposes for which a society may be established under the Statute as enumerated in the 4th section thereof.
2. That the objects of the society are stated to be, among other things, the establishment of a fund for the interment of its deceased members without any reference to the restrictions contained in the 21st section of the Statute.
3. The rules do not specify any place as the "place of business of the society."
4. The rules do not provide any mode of appointing a committee of management.
5. The provisions for appointing and removing officers of the society and filling up offices, and for making new rules and altering or repealing existing rules, are insufficient and obscure.
6. There is no provision as to the number of shares to be held by any one member.
7. There is no provision for the publication of a general balance of the assets and liabilities at least once a year.
8. The species of security to be given by the secretary and treasurer is not specified.
9. There is no provision for winding-up the affairs of the society and dissolving the same, and distributing the assets thereof.
10. The rules are throughout obscure and inconsistent, and in particular the words "station," "society," and "order," are used without its appearing whether they are intended to have the same or different meanings. And the same is the case with the words "member" and "sister". There is no explanation of the phrase "financial member" at all. It is provided that the treasurer is not to hold in her hands more than £20 of the station money without providing what she is to do with the surplus. It is also provided that trustees should in certain events be expelled, while a trustee cannot consistently with the rules be a member of the society.

And take further notice that, unless amended rules are submitted to me, complying with the requirements of the Act, within fourteen days after the receipt by you of this notice, I shall cause a copy thereof to be published in the *Victoria Government Gazette*, as directed by the 13th section of the said Statute.

Pursuant to Order of 23 April 1873.

No. 24, § 5) it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor in Council may, by proclamation in the *Government Gazette*, divide the Colony of Victoria into districts, and assign the said colony and districts to the Registrar-General and Deputy-Registrars respectively, or to so many of them as he may think fit, and may define the limits of such districts, and from time to time revoke, vary, and alter such division and the limits of such districts: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the sixth day of July instant, the portion of the Colony of Victoria comprising the localities therein mentioned was divided into districts which were therein defined; And it is expedient to alter the limits of one of such districts distinguished by the designation of South Melbourne: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, in pursuance of the provisions and for the purposes of the said Act, do hereby revoke the limits of the said South Melbourne district; and, with the advice aforesaid, I do hereby define anew the limits of the said district as follows, that is to say:—

SOUTH MELBOURNE.—Bounded on the north by Victoria street and Victoria parade; on the south-west by Elizabeth street; thence by the River Yarra Yarra and along the St. Kilda road, to include the Immigrants' Home, the Industrial Schools, and the Military Barracks; on the south by the River Yarra Yarra; and on the east by Hoddle street (Punt road).

NOTE.—The Melbourne Hospital and the Gaol are in Gipps Ward; the Alfred Hospital and Immigrants' Home are in Albert Ward; the Lying-in Hospital is in Smith Ward; the Children's Hospital is in La Trobe Ward; the Industrial Schools are in Emerald Hill Town; the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum is in Kew Borough; the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum and the Pentridge Stockade are in "Remainder of District;" the Benevolent Asylum is tabulated in Hotham Borough.

The births registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of June numbered 714, and the deaths which occurred numbered 331. The excess of the former over the latter was thus 383.

The mortality of Melbourne and suburbs, together with the mean temperature in the shade and the mean atmospheric pressure, during the month of June for the ten years 1864-1873, were as follow:—

The deaths in June were fewer than those in May by 68. They exceeded the average of June in the previous ten years by 80; but if allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have been 39 less than that average.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62'5° on the 6th. The lowest was 31'8° on the 27th. The mean temperature of the month (48'9°) was 1'3° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24'2°) took place on the 27th, viz., from a maximum of 56° to a minimum of 31'8°. The least range (6'1°) was on the 7th, viz., from a maximum of 55'5° to a minimum of 49'4°. The mean daily range was 13'1°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'962 inches) was slightly below the average.

Fifty-five per cent. of the deaths which occurred during the month were of males and 45 per cent. were of females. Thirty-two per cent. were of children who had not attained their fifth year as against 33 per cent. in June 1873, 42 per cent. in June 1872, 37 per cent. in June 1871 and 1872, 40 per cent. in June 1869, 45 per cent. in June 1868, 51 per cent. in June 1867, 41 per cent. in June 1866, 48 per cent. in June 1865, and 45 per cent. in June 1864.

The period has been more than usually fatal to old people, no less than 19 persons of 75 years of age and upwards having died during the month. The following are the particulars:—A laborer aged 75 died of diarrhoea; a male, of occupation not stated, aged 76 died of phthisis; a baker aged 78 died of erysipelas; a warehouseman aged 80 died of pneumonia; a manufacturer aged 81 died of cerebral affusion; an insane pensioner aged 81 died of the effects of a self-inflicted wound in the throat; a shoemaker aged 82 died of apoplexy; a bricklayer aged 90 died of old age and dementia; a farmer aged 75, a laborer aged 78, a male, of occupation not stated, aged 80, a carpenter aged 92, a farmer aged 94, a butcher aged 103, a female aged 78, and a female aged 91 died of old age, a female aged 78 died of heart disease, a female aged 78 died of inflammation of the lungs, and a female aged 87 died of disease of the brain.

Sixteen violent deaths occurred during the month. Of these 12 were set down to accident, viz.:—Those of a boy aged 4 who was run over by a dray; a boy aged 9 who died of internal injuries caused by two drays coming into collision; a lad aged 15 who died of the effects of his feet being crushed by a train on the night of the torchlight procession; a drayman aged 25 who died of internal injuries caused by a fall; a laborer aged 28 days who died of umbilical hemorrhage; a male child aged 2, and a female aged the kick of a horse; a female infant aged 42 who was found drowned in the River Yarra; a male infant aged 9 days who died of scalds; a female aged 82 who died of jaundice the result of injuries received at sea. The remaining four deaths were set down to ship's steward aged 60 who died of jaundice the result of injuries received at sea. The remaining four deaths were set down as suicidal, viz.:—That of a pensioner aged 81 who cut his throat with a razor; of a female aged 22 who drowned herself; of a fireman aged 34 who strangled himself with a saddle-strap; and of a female aged 65 who hanged herself. In the case of the first three of these deaths the person committing suicide was proved to be of unsound mind.

Eighty-nine deaths, or 27 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—47 in the Melbourne Hospital; 6 in the Immigrants' Home; 2 in the Industrial Schools; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 5 in the Alfred Hospital; 2 in the

Lying-in Hospital; 6 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Gaol; 7 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; and 10 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 165, of which 63, or 60 per cent., were of males, and 42, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 66 were under one year of age, 15 between one and two years, 8 between two and three years, 8 between three and four years, and 8 between four and five years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 226. Of these 118, or 52 per cent., were males, and 108, or 48 per cent., were females; 20 were between five and ten, 5 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 15 were between twenty and twenty-five, 17 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 19 were between thirty-five and forty, 16 were between forty and forty-five, 18 were between forty-five and fifty, 15 were between fifty and fifty-five, 18 were between fifty-five and sixty, 15 were between sixty and sixty-five, 7 were between sixty-five and seventy, 16 were between seventy and seventy-five, 8 were between seventy-five and eighty, 11 were upwards of eighty, and of one the age was unspecified.

REGULATION UNDER "THE DISEASES IN STOCK ACT 1872."

THE Governor in Council has rescinded the sixth clause of the Regulations under *The Diseases in Stock Act 1872*, which were approved on the 18th of January 1873, and has substituted the following Regulation in lieu thereof:—

6. No Inspector shall authorize any of the said stock to be introduced or to travel until he has inspected such stock, and is satisfied that it is free from any of the diseases mentioned in the first schedule hereto, and has counted the same, or been otherwise satisfied in regard to the number of stock to be so imported, and received the charge imposed by the seventh section of the said Act in respect thereof, for which charge a receipt shall be given in the form of the third schedule hereto, and has received a statutory declaration made by the owner or person in charge, stating the number and description of stock which he is desirous to import, and that it is free from disease.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed, or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Commons hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CARRIGHAM AND CHEPSTOWE UNITED GOLDFIELD AND TOWN COMMON.—The Carrigham and Chepstowe United Goldfield and Town Common, proclaimed by Order of the 7th October 1867, and increased by Order of the 29th June 1869, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land within the boundaries described as follow, viz.:—Commencing at the point where the south boundary of the existing common intersects the east boundary of George Hossack's licensed land; thence by the existing common easterly about two hundred chains and north-easterly about sixty chains; thence again by that common and by the Browns and Scarsdale Borough Common south about one hundred and fifty-three chains to a point bearing east from the south-east angle of A.
