The increase by excess of births over deaths during the quarter amounted to 3,815, viz.:—1,718 males and 2,097 females, and the increase by excess of arrivals over departures to 758, viz.:—561 males and 197 females. The sum of these increases is equal to 4,573, viz.:—2,279 males and 2,294 females, as shown in the table. The excess of arrivals from, over departures to the other colonies during the quarter was 559, viz.:—321 males and 188 females; and the excess of arrivals from, over departures to foreign ports, was 104, viz.:—49 males and 55 females; but the excess of departures to the United Kingdom over arrivals therefrom was 155, viz.:—89 males and 66 females.

The births of 742 children, viz., 367 boys and 375 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of July. In the month of June 714 births were registered or 28 less than in the month under review.

The deaths in July numbered 378, viz., 211 of males and 167 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 364. The deaths exceeded those in June by 47, and exceeded the average of July during the previous ten years by 91. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 25 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 62°·8° on the 24th, and the lowest was 30°·0° on the 31st. The mean temperature of the month (46°·3°) was 1°·3° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (24°·7°) took place on the 22nd, viz., from a maximum of 61°·2° to a minimum of 36°·5°. The least range (4°·8°) was on the 8th, viz., from a maximum of 49°·2° to a minimum of 44°·4°. The mean daily range was 16°·4°. The mean atmospheric pressure (30°·069 inches) was a fraction above the average.

Fifty-six per cent. of the deaths which occurred during the month were of males and 44 per cent. were of females. Thirty-eight per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of five years as against 36 per cent. in July 1873, 36 per cent. in July 1872, 34 per cent. in July 1871, 39 per cent. in July 1870, 37 per cent. in July 1869, 44 per cent. in July 1868, 44 per cent. in July 1867, 40 per cent. in July 1866, 44 per cent. in July 1865, and 44 per cent. in July 1864.

Thirteen persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz., a shepherd aged 76 of congestion of the brain; a police pensioner aged 76 of bronchitis and old age; a female aged 77 of influenza; a male, of occupation not stated, aged 78 of bronchitis; a gardener aged 80 of old age and diarrhoea; a plumber aged 84 of cancer of the throat; an overseer of works aged 80, a shipwright aged 90, and five females aged respectively 78, 78, 80, 84, and 86 of old age.

Eighteen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—A male infant aged 8 months died of concussion of the brain caused by falling down stairs; a boy nearly 7 years of age died of injuries received by falling from a dray; a man-cook aged 42 died of injuries to the brain caused by falling on a hoe; a seaman aged 50 broke his neck by falling into the water in Hobson's Bay; a boy aged 4 died of tetanus caused by injuries to the leg; a lad aged 14 was killed by a railway train passing over him; a female infant aged 8 days died of umbilical hæmorrhage; a girl aged 2 years died of scalds; a mariner and a jumper each aged 50, and a prostitute aged 40 were drowned; a male infant was accidentally suffocated at birth; a male infant aged one day and a female infant aged 8 months were suffocated in bed; a girl aged 13 died from the effects of chloroform properly administered; an artilleryman aged 28 threw himself from a window, causing death; a waiter aged 53 and a female aged 52 committed suicide by cutting their throats.

Ninety-five deaths, or 25 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—53 in the Melbourne Hospital; 11 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 6 in the Alfred Hospital; 5 in the Lying-in Hospital; 5 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; and 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 148, of which 85, or 57 per cent., were of males, and 58, or 41 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 100 were under one year of age, 17 were between one and two years, 9 were between two and three years, 4 were between three and four, and 13 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 235. Of these 126, or 54 per cent., were males and 109, or 46 per cent., were females; 11 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 23 were between twenty-five and thirty, 24 were between thirty and thirty-five, 16 were between thirty-five and forty, 29 were between forty and forty-five, 25 were between forty-five and fifty, 24 were between fifty and fifty-five, 13 were between fifty-five and sixty, 9 were between sixty and sixty-five, 8 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 6 were between seventy-five and eighty, 7 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases numbered 70, as against 69 in June. Under this head scarlatina caused 8 and diphtheria 8 deaths, as against 1 death and 11 deaths in June. Metria, combined with childbirth, caused 7 deaths, as against the same number in June; and phthisis caused 44 deaths, as against 34 in June.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 23 April 1873.

BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run; on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypaniel in the county of Gladstone.

Parish of Kinypaniel—Mackins.—Comprising allotment 95, on the River Loddon, in the county of Gladstone.

**REGULATIONS PROVIDING FOR APPEAL AGAINST RECOMMENDATIONS OF LOCAL
LAND BOARDS, AND FOR APPLICATIONS FOR FORFEITURE OF LICENSES.**

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirty-first day of August 1874.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act* 1869 it is amongst other things enacted that the Governor shall have power from time to time to make rules, regulations, and orders for providing for all proceedings, forms of grants, leases, licenses, and other instruments, and for the execution of all other matters and things arising under and consistent with the said Act, and not therein expressly provided for, and for the more fully carrying out the objects and purposes and guarding against evasions and violations of the said Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth hereby rescind the Regulations made on the 17th day of August 1874, and in lieu thereof doth make the Regulations following :—

APPEALS FROM LOCAL LAND BOARDS.

1. Any person who may be dissatisfied with the recommendation of a Local Land Board may appeal against the same to the Minister, provided that the ground of objection to such recommendation be set forth in writing and forwarded to the Minister not later than seven days after the sitting of the Local Land Board, with a request that such appeal may be heard. No appeal will be entertained after the expiration of the said seven days, except where the applicant is able to show, supported by a statutory declaration, that he received no notice to attend, and was not aware of the sitting of and did not attend the Local Land Board, and further that he has a claim on the merits for re-hearing. No verbal application will be entertained.

2. If the Minister be of opinion that the grounds of objection set forth in such before-mentioned statement are sufficient, he will order the appeal to be set down for hearing by himself, or by persons whom he may appoint to hear the same and report thereon in writing to him, and due notice will be given to all parties who appear to be interested in such appeal.

3. In order to afford time for the collection and examination of papers relating to the subject of appeal, and for the transmission of notices as hereinbefore provided, no appeal, unless otherwise expressly directed by the Minister, will be set down for hearing before the expiration of fourteen days from the date of sitting of the Local Land Board.

4. Unless otherwise expressly directed by the Minister, an appeal will only be allowed when based on the following or similar grounds, viz. :—

- 1st. That the appellant had not received due notice to attend at, or that a fair opportunity was not afforded by the Local Land Board for statement of his case; or,
- 2nd. That the Local Land Board refused to hear material evidence; or,
- 3rd. That any member or members of the Local Land Board were interested in the case.

FORFEITURES.

No application for forfeiture of any license issued under *The Land Act* 1869 on the ground that the licensee has been guilty of fraud, illegality, or of a violation of the said Act, or has committed a breach of or has not fulfilled any of the conditions of such license, will be entertained, except as hereinafter provided.

Any person may deliver or send to the District Surveyor in whose district the land held under license is situate an application for forfeiture thereof, with a statutory declaration setting forth the grounds and particulars on which such application is made on the following heads :—

- 1st. The time when the selection was made, the situation and area of the land, and name of licensee thereof.
- 2nd. The nature of improvements (if any) on the land.
- 3rd. The name or names of the person or persons (if any) resident on the land.
- 4th. The use to which the land has been applied.
- 5th. The conditions of the license which the applicant for forfeiture thereof alleges to have been broken or not fulfilled, or particulars of any alleged acts of fraud, illegality, or violation of the Act on the part of the licensee.
- 6th. The occupation of the applicant, and the extent of land (if any) held by him under conveyance, Crown grant, lease, or license, and the use to which it is applied.

The District Surveyor shall report thereon to the Minister, who, if he considers the facts adduced such as to justify public enquiry, may call upon the licensee to show cause against forfeiture of his license, and refer the matter to a Local Land Board to hear the same.

If such hearing result in the recommendation by the Local Land Board that the license be forfeited, the Local Land Board may direct that the land be sold by public auction at such upset price and with such a valuation as shall then be fixed, or the Board may at once recommend that, in case such license should be declared forfeited, a license of the said land in respect of which such forfeited license had been issued should be granted to the applicant, if in other respects eligible, subject to such conditions as to depositing a sum of money as payment for improvements or otherwise as the Board may fix or impose, or that the said land should be thrown open for selection within fourteen days after such forfeiture be declared; and the money so deposited shall be paid either into the general revenue, or to the person whose land has been forfeited, or partly into the one and partly to the other, as the Minister upon recommendation of the Local Land Board may direct.

If any person should make an application for forfeiture of any license on any ground of which the Board of Land and Works is already cognizant of, he will at once receive notice thereof, and will not be entitled to the recommendation of the Local Board for a license in respect of such land should the same be forfeited.

These Regulations shall come into force on the eighth day of September A.D. 1874.

FORM OF APPEAL AGAINST THE RECOMMENDATION OF LOCAL LAND BOARD.

Place where and time when Local Land Board was held. Here state the recommendation objected to.

1. I, John Styles, of Smeaton, object to the recommendation of the Local Land Board held at Echuca on the 17th day of October A.D. 1873.

2. That at such Local Land Board I was (an applicant under section 19 of *The Land Act* 1869 for allotment 10, section 5, parish of Millewa, and the said Local Land Board recommended that John Smith should receive a license for the said land).

3. That the grounds of my objection to such recommendation are :—

(a.) That I have not received any notice whatever to attend the said Local Land Board; or

(b.) That a fair opportunity was not afforded by the Local Land Board to state my case (because when the case was first called on it was postponed without my consent, and when called on again the Chairman of the Board said the case had been decided); or

(c.) The said Board refused to receive the evidence of Thomas Robinson, who could prove I was the first person to mark out the said land; or

(d.) That Charles Smith, one of the members of the said Board, is interested in the decision of the said Board by reason that he is the partner of the said John Smith.

4. That I claim to have a license granted to me for the said land, inasmuch as I was the first applicant.

Describe the reason why a fair opportunity was not afforded

Describe the material evidence rejected.

By His Excellency Sir George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby increase the Common hereinafter mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

CAMPBELL'S CREEK DIGGINGS GOLDFIELD COMMON.—The Campbell's Diggings (Moyston) Goldfield Common, proclaimed by Order of the 28th January 1861, and increased by Order of the 30th July 1866, is hereby further extended by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, excepting a track two chains wide, extending easterly from the north-east angle of John McGee's licensed land to the road from Moyston to Stawell, viz.:—Commencing at a point on the western boundary

TOWN OF TURRUMBERY.—County of Gunbower, parish of Patho: Commencing at the north-west angle of James McKay's 19th section block, No. 44884; bounded thence by that block bearing south eighty chains; thence by a road bearing west to the south-east angle of John Daly's 19th section block, No. 74/484; thence by that block and by a line bearing north eighty chains; and thence by a line bearing east to the point of commencement.
