#### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Justices of the Peace Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted that Courts of General Sessions of the Peace shall be holden in and for such places or districts within Victoria as the Governor in Council appoints; and the Governor in Council may from time to time define and appoint the limits and boundaries of the places or districts within which all such courts shall have jurisdiction respectively, and the places and times at which such courts shall be holden: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby appoint the Court of General Sessions of the Peace at the undermentioned place to be holden on the day hereinafter mentioned, for and in lieu of the day appointed by a former Proclamation for the holding of the said court, that is to say:—

At Kilmore, on Wednesday the fourth day of November in the present year, in lieu of Tuesday the twenty-second day of December next.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this seventh day of September, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

Parcels containing articles and property of a description not mentioned or specified in the first section of the Act of the Parliament of Victoria numbered 78, such articles and property being over £10 in value, shall, in addition to the amount chargeable by the foregoing scale of rates, be charged a further sum equal to one per centum upon the declared value thereof.

Furniture and musical instruments shall be charged an amount for the same distance and weight equal to double the above scale of rates.

Packed parcels shall be charged an amount for the same distance and weight equal to four times the above scale.

Corpses will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case.

Parcels containing newspaper despatches will only be charged at one-half the above scale of rates, but 6d. shall be the minimum charge for such parcels. Newspapers—single copies 25s. per annum, or in parcels at half the above charges, but 3d. shall be the minimum charge. Hat-boxes, empty, in nests, or containing hats, double rates. All parcels to be delivered to a porter at the forwarding station fifteen minutes previous to the departure of the train for which they are intended, otherwise the department will not be liable for any loss, miscarriage, or detention of the same.

The department will not be responsible for any damage accruing to parcels containing glass, when only packed in paper.

Special Contracts may be made with the Board for the Carriage of GOLD DUST, AND GOLD AND SILVER COIN,

Upon the Special Conditions and at the Rates mentioned below.

The following charges are made, and the gold dust or coin will be carried on condition of its being in charge of owners or persons bringing the same, and at their risk, and that the Board of Land and Works will not be responsible for any loss or damage thereto, unless arising from gross negligence by the Board or their servants, or by reason of any defect and insufficiency in the carriage or truck provided by the Board.

CARRIAGES.

Carriages, gigs, dog-carts, and vehicles of a similar description will be charged for at the rate of 6d. per mile, subject, however, that the sum of £1 shall be the minimum charge in any case. Two vehicles belonging to the same owner, and loaded on one truck, 9d. per truck per mile. Three vehicles on same terms, 1s. per truck per mile; minimum, Twenty shillings. For vehicles sent for repair, return tickets available for four weeks will be issued at 50 per cent. additional on these rates.

LUGGAGE.

First-class passengers are allowed to carry 84 lbs., second-class passengers 56 lbs., free of charge, the same to consist of personal luggage only; all excess above that weight will be charged at the undermentioned "Excess Luggage" rates. Passengers having Luggage must deliver it to the Station Porter fifteen minutes before the starting of the train, so as to give sufficient time to have it weighed (if in excess), checked, and stowed. No luggage will be allowed to be placed in the carriages unless of such size that it can be placed under or over the seat without inconvenience to other passengers; but the department does not hold itself liable for the loss of luggage, whether free or at excess rates, unless the regulations for the carriage of the same exhibited at all stations have been complied with.

Passengers must have their names, and the station to which they are proceeding, distinctly marked on their luggage, and satisfy themselves that it is placed on the trains.

DESCRIPTION OF LICENSES TO BE ISSUED FROM LANDS OFFICE,  
MELBOURNE.

2. WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognized as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby

define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, that is to say:—

**TOWNSHIP OF CORINDHAP.**—County of Grenville, parish of Corindhap: Commencing at the north-west angle of allotment 122, being a point on the left bank of the Corindhap Creek; thence by the north and east boundaries of that allotment and by the east boundaries of allotments 121 and 108 to a point bearing west from the north-west angle of the Kuruc-a-ruc pre-emptive section; thence by a line and the north boundary of that section bearing east about forty-eight chains to a point bearing south one chain from the south-west angle of the land licensed to Robert Butterworth; thence by a line and the west boundary of that land to the north-west angle thereof; thence by the south-west boundary of the land licensed to J. **BENALLA AGRICULTURAL AREA FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Benalla Agricultural Area Farmer's Common, proclaimed by Order of the 16th August 1870, is hereby increased by adding thereto the allotments of land hereinafter enumerated, viz.—Parish of Winton, allotments 72, 73, 76 B, 77, and that portion of allotment 43 not already included in the common, and parish of Kelfeera, allotments 57 and 58; as shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne. **THE** Governor in Council has approved of the subjoined Regulations for Commons.

## WIMMERA SHIRE COMMONS.

**REGULATIONS** made by the Council of the Shire of Wimmera for the Management of Commons within the Shire, as provided in regulation No. 58 under *The Land Act 1869* relative to commons, and approved by the Governor on the 13th June 1870.

1. The assessment on stock depasturing on commons within the shire shall be respectively as follows:—Large cattle over six months old 8s. per head per year, horses over six months old 12s. per head per year, sheep over six months old 2s. per head per year, goats over six months old 6s. per head per year.

2. Special licenses to depasture sheep intended for slaughter will be issued to any butcher approved of by the managers, the number not to exceed 100 sheep at one time, fee £1 5s. per quarter.

3. All fees to be paid quarterly, in advance, the quarters to commence on the 1st day of January, 1st of April, 1st July, and 1st October in each year.

4. Bulls and entire horses will not be permitted to run on the common without the written consent of the council.

5. The herdsman will be required to muster the stock as often as the council shall think necessary, in some convenient place to be appointed by the council, to be branded with the common brand; public notice to be given by placards posted by the herdsman not less than three days previously. All stock to be branded by the herdsman; horses to be exempted from being branded.

6. All stock must be branded before being registered, and all goats over the age of six months must wear round their necks a wooden collar after the form of a triangle; each arm of such collar shall be eighteen inches in length. Goats found depasturing on the common without such collar shall be deemed trespassing and will be dealt with accordingly.

7. No stock of any kind shall be turned on the common without giving due notice to the herdsman with description of brands, otherwise they will be impounded.

8. The fees to be paid on stock remaining on a common over twenty-four hours shall be as follows:—Large cattle 3d. per head per night, horses 3d. per head per night, small cattle 1d. per head per night.

9. All stock upon which the fees due have not been paid when demanded by the herdsman will be impounded.

10. The herdsman to have authority to impound all straying or unauthorized stock found on the common, a registry of which he will be required to keep, so that all damages and fees arising therefrom may be properly accounted for.

11. It shall be necessary for the owners of any cattle or sheep diseased or supposed to be diseased to remove such cattle or sheep from the common within twenty-four hours after notice, in writing, requiring them so to do, has been given them by the herdsman or one of the managers, and in the event of the owner's refusal or neglect so to do, he shall be considered as a trespasser, and be proceeded against accordingly.

12. Should the council have any reasonable suspicion that the stock applied for to be depastured on the common is not the *bona fide* property of the applicants, the council may, if it think proper, before granting a license, require the person or persons so applying to make a declaration on oath before some justice of the peace, specifying that the stock applied for to be licensed are his property and not that of any other.

13. The council is not to be held responsible for any neglect or irregularities of the herdsman.

14. Each herdsman shall provide security for the honest and faithful discharge of his duties in the sum of Fifty pounds sterling.

15. The council shall, at their meeting immediately preceding the commencement of each quarter, fix the maximum number of stock each commoner may be allowed to depasture during the quarter then next ensuing, over and above the number they are entitled to by the additional regulations relative to commons, framed by the Governor in Council and published in the *Government Gazette*.

The foregoing regulations were adopted at a committee meeting of the Wimmera Shire Council, held at the Shire Offices, Horsbarn, on Wednesday the fifteenth day of July A.D. 1874.

**BOARDING OUT CHILDREN FROM INDUSTRIAL SCHOOLS.**

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has rescinded the 4th and 17th of the Regulations dated 26th May 1873 (published in the *Gazette* of the 6th of June 1873), and has substituted in lieu thereof the Regulations following, that is to say:—

4. The family of a foster-parent must not at any time consist of more than six (6), including the children boarded from the Government, but exclusive of herself, and, if married, her husband. No more than two (2) children—except in the case of families of more than two (2)—may be placed with one foster-parent.

17. Payments will be made for the children at the rate of Twelve shillings per week for each child up to the age of one (1) year, Seven (7) shillings per week up to the age of seven (7) years, Six (6) shillings per week to the age of ten (10) years, and Five (5) shillings per week to the age of twelve (12) years, and Three (3) shillings per week from the age of twelve (12) years to that of thirteen years. If retained after reaching the age of thirteen (13) years it will then be under the licensing regulations of the department. Should the Government decide to reduce the rates of pay, three (3) months' notice will be given to the foster-parents.
