DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute, 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:-

The Western Riding of the Shire of Echuca.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this thirty-first day of August, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

NOTICE TO MARINERS.

ALTERATIONS AND ADDITIONS TO BUOYS AND BEACONS LAID DOWN IN WESTERN PORT.

THE following Notice to Mariners is published for general information.

PILOTS, masters of vessels, fishermen, and others are informed that:-

(1.) A Beacon has been erected on the Crayfish Rock, sixteen feet high, with a five (5) foot square on the top, painted white.

(2.) A Black Cask Buoy (50 gallons) has been laid down in 8 feet at low water, to mark the dangers off Adams Point, and the following magnetic bearings mark the position of this buoy:-

Brilla Island	...	S. ½ E.
Eagle Rock	...	W. b. S. ½ S.
Crayfish Rock Beacon	...	S.W. ½ W.

(3.) A Beacon has also been erected on a patch of rock just awash at low water, off Stony Point Reef Island. The beacon is a little more than a cable's length off the point, is 20 feet high with a 4½ foot square painted white.

(4.) The Buoy on Maggie Shoal has been changed in color from chequered (black and white) to white only.

(5.) The Buoy off McIlaffie's Reef has been changed in color from red to white.

QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 23 April 1873.

BERNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Bernanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Cato's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Bernanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run; on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD PROPERTIES IN THE
Parish of Powlett—Clancy.—Comprising allotments 10 and 12, lying on the north side of the main road from Salisbury Plains pre-emptive right to Kinypanial in the county of Gladstone.
Parish of Kinypanial—Mackins.—Comprising allotment 95, on the River Loddon, in the county of Gladstone.

TULLAROOP QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east angle of W. Teel's 42nd section block, being also the south-east angle of allotment 34, section 7, parish of Eddington, being a point on the Tullaroop Creek; thence west to the south-west angle of the land granted to William Heer; thence southerly along the three-chain road to its junction with the one-chain road leading to Maryborough, and by that road in a south-westerly direction to its intersection with the western boundary of the parish of Eddington; thence south along the said parish boundary one mile and twenty-eight chains; thence east one mile and fourteen chains; thence southerly along the three-chain road fifteen chains; thence east one mile and five chains to the Tullaroop Creek; thence northerly by that creek to the point of commencement.

Pursuant to Order of 1 September 1873.

WARANGA QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the south-east corner of Toolamba run, on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and Wanalta East run to Gobareep run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Colbinabbin South run; thence by a portion of the northern and eastern boundaries of that run to Postlethwaite run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence by that river to the point of commencement: Provided that the road from Corop to Rushworth and Whroo shall form no part of the said quarantine district.

Pursuant to Order of 24 November 1873.

MANSFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the source of the Howqua River in Mount Howitt; thence down that river to Tarika run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run to Jamieson River; thence down that river to Goulburn River; thence down that river to its junction with the Delatite River; thence up that river to Wappan run; thence by the south-western boundary of that run to Borodomanan South run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to Miller's Ponds run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run and the Kalkin run to the Goulburn River; thence down that river to Balmah Hill run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that run, Killingworth, Murrindindi East, Island, and Muddy Creek, A runs to the Main Dividing Range; and hence by that range easterly and northerly to the point of commencement: Provided always that the Upper Thornton run shall form no part of said quarantine district.

Pursuant to Order of 23 February 1874.

SAINTFIELD QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the eastern boundary of Bailey Hill run abuts on Borodomanin run; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of Borodomanin run, by the northern boundary of Junction run, by the western boundary of Lima run, by the southern boundaries of Warrenbayne, Honeysuckle North, and Faithfull's Creek, and by the eastern boundaries of Seven Creeks, Wombat Hill, and Bailey Hill runs to the commencing point: Provided that all runs intersected by the boundaries above described shall be held to be within the Saintfield

Quarantine District: Provided, further, that all public roads, as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads, as are included in the boundaries above described shall form no part of the said Quarantine District.

Pursuant to Order of 2 March 1874.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Conpton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

Pursuant to Order of 9 March 1874.

CLEAN DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 66th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Clean Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter defined shall be Clean Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 28 April 1873.

GEELONG CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forrest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said southern boundary and the north-eastern boundary of said run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs, and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairngal run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairngal run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to the south-east corner of allotment 80 parish of Mannibadar; thence by a straight line easterly to the junction of a small creek with the River Leigh about twenty-six chains north of the Mount Mercer Cattle Station pre-emptive right; thence down the said River Leigh to the boundary of Golf Hill property easterly and southerly to the boundary of Native Creek property; thence southerly by the boundary of said property to the Burnside property; thence southerly and westerly by the boundaries of Barwon Park, Murdiduke, Ingelby, and Yan-yan Gurt properties to the west corner of allotment 20 A, parish of Bamba; thence southerly by the surveyed road to Loutitt Bay, and thence south-westerly by the sea shore to the point of commencement.

HEXHAM CLEAN DISTRICT.—Commencing at Cape Otway; thence by a line bearing northerly to the south-east angle of the Forest run; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Pirron Yallock runs to the shore of Lake Corangamite; thence by the eastern boundary of that lake to the Junction Creek, which forms the southern boundary of the Poliah run; thence by the said boundary and the north-eastern boundary of that run to the Frenchman's station; thence by the eastern boundaries of that and Glenfine runs and by the northern boundary of the last-named run to the Nairnall run; thence by a portion of the eastern boundary of Nairnall run and the eastern boundary of Mount Bute run to Mount Emu run; thence by the southern boundary of that run westerly to Benjamin run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the St. Enoch's run; thence by the southern boundaries of that, Fiery Creek, and View Lake runs, and also by the western boundary of the last-named run to the Lake Manonia run; thence by the southern boundary of that run to the Greenvale run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run to the Pollockdale run; thence by the eastern and southern boundaries of that run and the southern boundaries of Mount Sturgeon No. 4, Mount Sturgeon No. 3, and Mount Sturgeon No. 2 runs to the Grange Burn; thence down the Grange Burn to Hamilton; thence south-westerly by the main road *via* Brankholme and Heywood to Portland town boundary; thence by the said boundary easterly to the sea-coast, and thence by the sea-coast to the commencing point. Provided that the three-chain road from Hamilton (*via* Dunkeld and Wycliffe) to Skipton shall form no part of the Hexham Clean District.

2. On application for permission to make a vault or erect a monument in the cemetery, being made to the trustees, a certificate of permission will be granted on payment of the proper fees.
3. Charges will be remitted on the burial of any poor person in this cemetery on the certificate of a minister of religion, or other evidence, proving, to the satisfaction of the trustees, that the relatives of the deceased were unable to pay the usual fees.
4. The sexton shall dig all ordinary graves, unless otherwise specially ordered, on payment of the proper fees.
5. All monuments, vaults, graves, and gravestones, must be kept in repair and in proper condition at the expense of the owners.
6. All persons destroying the fences, or in any way injuring the cemetery, will be prosecuted as the law directs.
7. Every coffin in a vault must be bricked in or cemented, or covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
8. A plan of the ground and a register will be kept, which may be examined.
9. When a meeting of the trustees is required the same to be called by the secretary. Three to form a quorum.
10. The trustees reserve to themselves the right of making any alteration from time to time in these regulations and charges, subject to the approval of His Excellency the Governor in Council.

No. 4. For appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through certain parts of the borough

any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria, or of any other colony, to any other part.

No. 5. For prohibiting or restraining the travelling with or driving of loaded drays or carts on Sundays through or within the limits of the borough.

No. 6. For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal, of chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes.

No. 7. For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building, and for regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials, of the party-walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for, and mode of, enclosing the same.

No. 8. For prescribing the distance from any building within which it shall not be lawful to make or keep any stack of hay, corn, or straw, or other produce, if not placed under roof or cover; and, where placed under roof or cover, for prohibiting or restraining the use for such covering of inflammable materials.

No. 9. For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any street or public place, or from any building, within which it shall not be lawful, save in some properly constructed fireplace within some building, to make or light any fire.

No. 10. For appointing, by limits set forth therein, a portion of the borough in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine.

No. 11. For appointing the hours of the night between which it shall be lawful to empty any privy, or load, carry, remove, or deposit, any nightsoil, offal, or other offensive matter, and for appointing the place at which such nightsoil, offal, refuse, or matter, shall be deposited.

No. 12. For regulating the inspection of private slaughter-houses.

No. 13. For appointing the fees for licenses and registration of private slaughter-houses.

No. 14. Providing for the keeping of private slaughter-houses in a cleanly and proper state and for the removal of filth therefrom.

No. 15. For appointing the sums to be paid for licenses for carts.

No. 16. For appointing the amount of rewards to be paid to water-carriers attending at fires.
