COURTS (COLONIAL) JURISDICTION ACT.

THE Governor has directed the subjoined Despatch and Act of the Imperial Parliament to be published for general information.

SIR,—I have the honor to transmit a copy of an Act, 37 and 38 Victoria, cap. 27, which has passed this Session, intituled *An Act to regulate the sentences imposed by Colonial Courts where jurisdiction to try is conferred by Imperial Acts.* Imperial Act, and 38 Vict., c. 27.

2. As you are aware jurisdiction is given by certain Imperial Acts, as, for instance, 9 George 4, cap. 83, section 4, and 12 and 13 Victoria, cap. 96, to Colonial Courts to try offences committed beyond the jurisdiction of those Courts, and the persons convicted are made liable to suffer such punishment as by any law or laws in force at the time of the passing of such Acts they would have been liable to if the offence had been committed and tried in England.

3. Difficulties have recently arisen, both in Victoria and Malta, in deciding what sentences could be passed upon persons tried and convicted in the Colonial Courts for offences committed out of the Colonies, but made triable within them by Imperial Act; and the Act now transmitted has been passed with a view to prevent any such questions arising for the future.

4. The Act provides that such punishment may be inflicted in such cases as might have been inflicted if the offences had been committed within the colony.

5. The Act also includes cases, if any, where offences, if committed within the local jurisdiction of a Colonial Court, are by Imperial Act made punishable according to the Law of England.

6. Moreover, special provision is made at the end of the third section to meet the case of an offence not punishable by the Law of the Colony in which the trial takes place; and the Colonial Court is in such case empowered to impose such punishment (other than capital punishment) as shall seem to the Court most nearly to correspond to the punishment to which such person would have been liable in case such crime or offence had been tried in England.

7. These cases will, probably, be of rare occurrence; but it was thought desirable to embrace all possible cases, and to make the legislation upon the subject final and complete.

8. The usual steps should be taken to make the provisions of this Act known in the Colony under your Government.

CHAPTER 27.

AN ACT TO REGULATE THE SENTENCES IMPOSED BY COLONIAL COURTS WHERE JURISDICTION TO TRY IS A.D. 1874. CONFERRED BY IMPERIAL ACTS.

[30th June 1874.]

WHEREAS by certain Acts of Parliament jurisdiction is conferred on courts in Her Majesty's colonies to try persons charged with certain crimes or offences, and doubts have arisen as to the proper sentences to be imposed upon conviction of such persons; and it is expedient to remove such doubts:

Be it enacted by the Queen's most Excellent Majesty, by and with the advice and consent of the Lords Spiritual and Temporal, and Commons, in this present Parliament assembled, and by the authority of the same, as follows:

1. This Act may be cited for all purposes as The Courts (Colonial) Jurisdiction Act 1874.

Short title.

2. For the purposes of this Act,—

The term "colony" shall not include any places within the United Kingdom, the Isle of Man, or the Channel Islands, but shall include such territories as may for the time being be vested in Her Majesty by virtue of an Act of Parliament for the Government of India, and any plantation, territory, or settlement situate elsewhere within Her Majesty's dominions, and subject to the same local government; and for the purposes of this Act, all plantations, territories, and settlements under a central legislature shall be deemed to be one colony under the same local government.

Definition of term "colony."

3. When, by virtue of any Act of Parliament now or hereafter to be passed, a person is tried in a court of any colony for any crime or offence committed upon the high seas or elsewhere out of the territorial limits of such colony and of the local jurisdiction of such court, or if committed within such local jurisdiction made punishable by that Act, such person shall, upon conviction, be liable to such punishment as might have been inflicted upon him if the crime or offence had been committed within the limits of such colony and of the local jurisdiction of the court, and to no other, anything in any Act to the contrary notwithstanding: Provided always, that if the crime or offence is a crime or offence not punishable by the law of the colony in which the trial takes place, the person shall, on conviction, be liable to such punishment (other than capital punishment) as shall seem to the court most nearly to correspond to the punishment to which such person would have been liable in case such crime or offence had been tried in England.

At trials in any colonial courts by virtue of Imperial Acts, courts empowered to pass sentences as if crimes had been committed in the colony.

BOARD OF TRADE.

THE following alterations and additions in the International Code of Signals are printed for the information of the Governments of the countries that have adopted and translated the Signal Book, in order that the corrections may be noted for insertion in the next editions they may respectively publish.

The following additional signals should be placed before the Signal II.B., Section I. Part I., containing danger or distress signals.

DISTRESS AND PILOT SIGNALS.

SIGNALS OF DISTRESS.

In the daytime.—The following signals, numbered 1, 2, and 3, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals of distress in the daytime:—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute;
2. The international code signal of distress indicated by N C;
3. The distant signal, consisting of a square flag having either above or below it a ball, or anything resembling a ball.

At night.—The following signals, numbered 1, 2, 3, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals of distress at night:—

1. A gun fired at intervals of about a minute;
2. Flames on the ship (as from a burning tar barrel, oil barrel, &c.);
3. Rockets or shells, of any color or description, fired one at a time, at short intervals.

SIGNALS TO BE MADE BY SHIPS WANTING A PILOT.

In the daytime.—The following signals, numbered 1 and 2, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals for a pilot in the daytime, viz.:—

1. To be hoisted at the fore, the Jack or other national color usually worn by merchant ships, having round it a white border one-fifth of the breadth of the flag; or
2. The international code pilotage signal indicated by P T.

At night.—The following signals, numbered 1 and 2, when used or displayed together or separately, shall be deemed to be signals for a pilot at night, viz.:—

1. The pyrotechnic light commonly known as a blue-light every fifteen minutes; or
2. A bright white light, flashed or shown at short or frequent intervals just above the bulwarks, for about a minute at a time.

N.B.—The use of the above distress and pilot signals have been made compulsory in England by *The Merchant Shipping Act 1873*. A copy of the Act is attached to this circular.

ADDITIONAL SIGNAL STATIONS.

DENMARK.

A signal station for the use of ships at sea, in connection with the Telegraph Station, has been opened at Hirtshals, on the north-west coast of Jutland.

ENGLAND (HELGOLAND).

A Signal Station has been established at the Old Lighthouse, Heligoland, from whence communication by telegram with the continent may be obtained.

GERMANY.

A Signal Station has been established on the Lighthouse of the Island of Wangerooge (situated to the westward of the entrance to the River Weser) by which ships of all nations can communicate with the Telegraph Station which is connected with the German mainland telegraph line.

The births of 662 children, viz., 357 boys and 305 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of August. In the month of July 742 births were registered, or 80 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in August numbered 401, viz., 233 of males and 168 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 261. The deaths exceeded those in July by 23, and exceeded the average of August during the previous ten years by 127. If, however allowance be made for the increase of population they will be found to have exceeded the average of August by 64 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 68.1° on the 21st; the lowest was 29.3° on the 5th. The mean temperature of the month (47.7°) was more than two degrees below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (28°) took place on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 57.3° to a minimum of 29.3°. The least range (6.7°) was on the 25th, viz., from a maximum of 49.9° to a minimum of 43.2°. The mean daily range was 17.3°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.893 inches) was below the average.

Of the deaths which occurred during the month 58 per cent. were of males and 42 per cent. were of females. Thirty per cent. were of children who had not attained the age of five years as against 30 per cent. in August 1873, 32.5 per cent. in August 1872, 45 per cent. in August 1871, 41 per cent. in August 1870, 35 per cent. in August 1869, 43 per cent. in August 1868, 39 per cent. in August 1867, 44 per cent. in August 1866, 49 per cent. in August 1865, and 34 per cent. in August 1864.

Thirteen persons of 75 years of age and upwards died during the month, viz., a female aged 75 of burns; a male patient in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum aged 76 of pleurisy; a laborer aged 76 of paralysis; a female aged 76, a carrier aged 80, and a laborer aged 93 of bronchitis; a saddler aged 80 of inflammation of the bowels; a female aged 82 of old age and epilepsy; a mariner aged 76, a shepherd aged 80, a female aged 80, a farmer aged 83, and a female aged 84 of old age.

Thirteen violent deaths occurred during the month, of which the following are the particulars:—An engine cleaner aged 20 was killed by being crushed between the buffers of two engines; a man of occupation not stated aged 22 died of fracture of the skull caused by a fall; a musician aged 35 died of rupture of a blood vessel also caused by a fall; a builder aged 50 died of fracture of the spine resulting also from a fall; and a cooper aged 54 died of fracture of the pelvis caused likewise by a fall; a laborer aged 49 died of internal injuries caused by a dray wheel passing over his body; a female aged 75 died of burns; a male infant aged 24 days and a female infant aged 25 days were suffocated in bed; a carpenter aged 60 was suffocated by food; a coachman aged 56, a laborer aged 40, and an engineer aged 52, committed suicide, the first by poison (oxalic acid) the two last by hanging.

Ninety-five deaths, or 24 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—47 in the Melbourne Hospital; 9 in the Immigrants' Home; 7 in the Alfred Hospital; 7 in the Lying-in Hospital; 10 in the Benevolent Asylum; 3 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 11 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; and 1 in the Melbourne Gaol.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 119, of which 72, or 60 per cent., were of males, 47, or 40 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 92 were under one year of age, 11 were between one and two years, 6 were between two and three years, 4 were between three and four years, and 6 were between four and five years.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 282. Of these 161, or 57 per cent., were males and 121, or 43 per cent., were females; 14 were between five and ten, 15 were between ten and fifteen, 9 were between fifteen and twenty, 16 were between twenty and twenty-five, 18 were between twenty-five and thirty, 27 were between thirty and thirty-five, 22 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 20 were between forty-five and fifty, 26 were between fifty and fifty-five, 28 were between fifty-five and sixty, 22 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 13 were between seventy and seventy-five, 5 were between seventy-five and eighty, 8 were upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases fell from 70 in July to 58 in August. Under this head scarlatina caused 3 and 2 deaths, diphtheria 8 and 8 deaths, and typhoid fever 12 and 11 deaths in the two months. Metria, combined with childbirth, caused 7 deaths in the former and 9 in the latter month; and phthisis caused 45 deaths in the former month and 60 deaths in the latter.
