DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGEABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such Proclamation: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the thirty-first day of August now last past, the Western Riding of the Shire of Echuca was constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act, and it is expedient to alter such district: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, in lieu of the district named in the Proclamation above referred to, that is to say:—

All that portion of the Western Riding of the Shire of Echuca, commencing at the Murray River near the north-west corner of allotment 168, parish of Wharparilla; thence by a line bearing east thirty-one chains to the north-east corner of said allotment 168; thence by a line running due south

separating the parishes of Wharparilla and Torrumberry, Ballendella and Bamawm, Rochester and Diggora, continuing that southern boundary of the last-named parish (Diggora) to the southern boundary of the Western Riding of the aforesaid shire on the Campaspe River south of allotment 10, parish of Burnewang West.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this nineteenth day of October, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

PROPOSED ATTACHMENT OF PART OF THE SHIRE OF KYNETON TO THE SHIRE OF PYALONG.

NOTICE is hereby given, in accordance with the provisions of *The Shires Statute 1869*, sections 22 and 29, that certain persons, purporting to be a majority of the ratepayers of the part of the Shire of Kyneton hereinafter described, have by petition under their hands prayed the Governor that such part be severed from such shire and attached to the Shire of Pyalong.

The part is described by metes and bounds as follows:—Commencing at the junction of Mollison's Creek with creek which has its source in portions 78, 79, parish of Lancefield, and known as the "Bald Hill Creek"; thence south from said junction to the dividing range which forms the county boundary; thence westerly by said county boundary to the Lancefield parish boundary; thence north-westerly and north-easterly by said parish boundary to "Big Hill Creek"; thence by said creek (which forms the north boundary of parish of Lancefield) to the south-west angle of P. QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.

BRENNANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brennanah and Coyoora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypaniel; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brennanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

Quarantine District: Provided, further, that all public roads, as well as the commons intersected by and along these roads, as are included in the boundaries above described shall form no part of the said Quarantine District.

POSTLETHWAITE OR BAILLESTON QUARANTINE DISTRICT.—Commencing at the point where the southern boundary of the Protectorate run abuts on the Goulburn River; thence by the southern boundaries of that run and the Waranga run, the south-eastern boundary of Colbinabbin South run, and by the northern and eastern boundaries of Cherrington run to Compton's Creek run; thence by the northern boundary of that run to the Goulburn River; and thence down that river to the commencing point.

3. The following clauses of part four of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, clauses 1 and 2, for public libraries and museums; 3 to 10, regulations of public gardens, &c.; and this shall be called bye-law No. 3.
4. The following clauses of part five of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, 1 to 4, regulations for buildings; 5 to 8, for ruinous or dangerous buildings, &c.; and this shall be called bye-law No. 4.
5. The following clauses of part seven of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, 1 and 2, for foul chimneys; 3 to 7, deposits, &c., of inflammable materials, &c.; and this shall be called bye-law No. 5.
6. The following clauses of part eight of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, 1 to 10, nuisances of various kinds; 11 to 16, regulating private slaughter-houses; and this shall be called bye-law No. 6.
7. The following clauses of part nine of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, 2 to 4, miscellaneous matters; and this shall be called bye-law No. 7.

8. The following clauses of part ten of the 12th schedule to the said Act are hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, 64 and 65, carts and carterers; 72 and a portion of 73, removing nightsoil, &c.; and this shall be called bye-law No. 8.

9. The whole of part eleven of the 12th schedule of the said Act is hereby adopted in and for the said borough, that is to say, clauses 1 to 57, regulation of proceedings of council officers, &c.; and this shall be called bye-law No. 9.

Subdivision 1, part 1: Regulation No. 1.—For regulating the height from the ground of porticoes, and for appointing the materials of such porticoes.

Subdivision 3, part 1: Regulation No. 2.—For regulating the materials and the size, the level and the fall, of any drain or trunk to be laid or constructed under any footway.

Subdivision 4, part 1: Regulation No. 3.—For regulating the width, depression, and inclination of crossings across or over footways and channels, and the materials for making and constructing the same, the mode of laying and bedding such materials, the length, width, size, strength, and fall of bridge crossings, and the said inclination and fall.

Subdivision 9, part 1: Regulation No. 4.—For appointing the hours during which it shall not be lawful to drive into or through certain parts of the borough any cattle intended for sale, slaughter, or shipment, or travelling from one part of Victoria, or of any other colony, to any other part.

Subdivision 11, part 1: Regulation No. 5.—For prohibiting or restraining the travelling with or driving of loaded drays or carts on Sundays through or within the limits of the borough.

Subdivision 1, part 5: Regulation No. 6.—For prohibiting or restraining the use of combustible materials in the construction, alteration, repair, or renewal of chimneys, flues, smoke-vents, or stove-pipes.

Subdivision 1, part 5: Regulation No. 7.—For regulating the distance from any other building at which it shall be lawful to construct any building, and for regulating the height, thickness, construction, or materials of the party-walls of buildings adjoining each other, and of the external walls of buildings and of chimneys, and the materials for and mode of enclosing the same.

Subdivision 2, part 7: Regulation No. 8.—For prescribing the distance from any building within which it shall not be lawful to make or keep any stack of hay, corn, straw, or other produce, if not placed under roof or cover, and where placed under roof or cover for prohibiting or restraining the use for such covering of inflammable materials.

Subdivision 2, part 7: Regulation No. 9.—For prescribing the distance from any adjoining land, or from any street or public place, or from any building, within which it shall not be lawful, save in some properly constructed fireplace within some building, to make or light any fire.

Subdivision 1, part 8: Regulation No. 10.—For appointing, by limits set forth therein, a portion of the borough in which it shall not be lawful to keep any swine.

Subdivision 1, part 8: Regulation No. 11.—For appointing the hours of the night between which it shall be lawful to empty any privy, or load, carry, remove, or deposit any night-soil, offal, or other offensive matter; and for appointing the place at which such nightsoil, offal, refuse, or matter shall be deposited.

Subdivision 2, part 8: Regulation No. 12.—For regulating the inspection of private slaughter-houses.

Subdivision 2, part 8: Regulation No. 13.—For appointing the fees for licenses and registration of private slaughter-houses.

Subdivision 2, part 8: Regulation No. 14.—Providing for the keeping of private slaughter-houses in a cleanly and proper state, and for the removal of filth therefrom.

Subdivision 2, part 10: Regulation No. 15.—For appointing the sums to be paid for licenses for carts.

Subdivision 2, part 10: Regulation No. 16.—For appointing the amount of rewards to be paid to water-carriers attending at fires.
