DISTRICT WHERE CERTIFICATES MAY BE GRANTED FOR PUBLICANS' LICENSES CHARGE-ABLE WITH FEE OF £10.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sin George Ferguson Bowen, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Depen-dencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

VIEREAS by The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 amendment Act it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council, and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses assaforesaid, for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds, and on the like application of the council of any borough not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may, if he shall think fit, proclaimany portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds, and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such Proclamation : And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the seal of the colony bearing date the thirty-first day of August now last past, the Western Riding of the Shire of Echuca was constituted a district for the purposes of the said Act, and it is expedient to alter such district. Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the district hereinafter mentioned as a district within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, in lieu of the district named in the Proclamation above referred to, that is to say:—

All that portion of the Western Riding of the Shire of Echuca, commencing at the Murray River near th

separating the parishes of Wharparilla and Torrumberry, Ballendella and Bamawm, Rochester and Diggora, continuing that southern boundary of the last-named parish (Diggora) to the southern boundary of the Western Riding of the atoresaid shire on the Campaspe River south of allotment 10, parish of Burnewang West.
