PUBLIC STREET OR ROAD IN THE BOROUGH AND SHIRE OF CRESWICK.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR GEORGE FERGUSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c., &c.

IN pursuance of the provisions contained in the 415th section of *The Boroughs Statute* (33 Vict. No. 359) and in the 376th section of *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358), I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, acting upon the request of the respective Councils of the Borough of Creswick and the Shire of Creswick, do by this notice proclaim to be a public street or road within the meaning of the said Acts the lands reserved or used for the street, highway, or thoroughfare hereinafter described, that is to say:-

Street in the Borough of Creswick.

From a point one chain fifty links east of the south-east angle of allotment 12 of section O, parish of Creswick, bearing west about forty-three chains to the east boundary of the parish of Ascot, and south about five chains to Creswick Creek; width 99 feet. As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.L.23592.)

Road in the Shire of Creswick.

From the road to Clunes, at the east boundary of allotment 4 of section M, parish of Creswick, bearing south to the north boundary of the borough of Creswick; width 99 feet. As shown on the plan deposited at the Crown Lands Office, Melbourne.—(73.L.28592.)

GOD SAVE THE QUEEN!

PART OF THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON ATTACHED TO THE SHIRE OF KYNETON.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the thirteenth day of October 1873.

PRESENT:

WHEREAS by *The Shires Statute* (33 Vict. No. 358, § 22) it is amongst other things enacted, that if the whole or a majority of the ratepayers of any part of a shire or road district in which an annual or general election or first appointment of members has taken place, shall, by petition under their hands, describing such part by metes and bounds, pray the Governor that such part be severed from such shire or road district, or if any part of any shire or road district shall not have been alienated from the Crown and be unoccupied, it shall be lawful for the Governor, if he shall think fit so to do, to order that such part, or so much thereof as the Governor shall think proper, be severed from such shire or road district respectively, and by the same or any other order to direct that the portion so severed from such shire or road district respectively shall be attached to any other shire, borough, road district, riding, or subdivision to be named in such order, and the same shall take effect upon the publication of such order in the *Government Gazette*: And whereas the powers conferred upon the Governor in the section of the Act above recited are now exercised upon a petition of a majority of the ratepayers of a part of the Shire of Glenlyon therein described, and notices of such petition have been published in the manner prescribed in the twenty-ninth section of the same Act: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, and in compliance with the prayer of the petition hereinbefore mentioned, doth by this present Order sever the part of the Shire of Glenlyon described in such petition from such shire; and doth direct that the portion so severed from such shire shall be attached to the Shire of Kyneton; and, with the advice aforesaid, doth hereby re-define the boundaries of the South Riding of the Shire of Glenlyon as hereby diminished, and of the Tylden and Trentham Riding and the Lauriston and Edgcombe Riding of the Shire of Kyneton added to, in manner following, that is to say:-

THE SOUTH RIDING OF THE SHIRE OF GLENLYON.—Commencing at the western source of the Coliban River; thence by that river to the bridge at Enders; thence westerly, northerly, and easterly by the three-chain road to Mew's Hill at a point opposite a one-chain road, and bearing easterly from Evans' old mill site; thence by that one-chain road westerly to the Kangaroo Creek; thence by that creek to the north-east angle of W. King's 42nd section block, parish of Coliban; thence south by the east boundary of W. King's block and the west boundary of Mr. Mitchell's 42nd section block to the

south-west angle of the last-named block: thence south-westerly to the north-west angle of Roskelly's 42nd section block; thence south by its west boundary to its south-west angle; thence south-westerly by a direct line to the north-west angle of G. Bowie's 42nd section block; thence south-westerly and westwardly by the western boundary of G. Bowie's and W. Sowerby's 42nd section blocks to the south-west angle of W. Sowerby's block; thence by a direct line south to the shire boundary; thence by the shire boundary easterly to a point south of the western source of the Coliban River; thence north to the point of commencement.
