The births of 601 children, viz., 316 boys and 285 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of October. In the month of September 726 births were registered, or 125 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in October numbered 306, viz., 163 of males and 143 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 295. The deaths exceeded those in September by 12, and exceeded the average of October during the previous ten years by 38. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have been less than the average of those ten years by 24.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 88'5° on the 18th, and the lowest was 37'2° on the 1st. The mean temperature of the month (59'2°) was more than two degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (36'8°) took place on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 81'2° to a minimum of 44'4°. The least range (9'3°) was on the 5th, viz., from a maximum of 57'1° to a minimum of 47'8°. The mean daily range was 21'6°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29'999 inches) was nearly an eighth of an inch (121 in.) above the average.

Males contributed 53 per cent. of the deaths and females 47 per cent. Thirty-five per cent. were of children under five years of age as against 37 per cent. in October 1873, 37 per cent. in October 1872, 41 per cent. in October 1871, 32 per cent. in October 1870, 40 per cent. in October 1869, 45 per cent. in October 1868, 40 per cent. in October 1867, 51 per cent. in October 1866, 52 per cent. in October 1865, 41 per cent. in October 1864.

Three persons of 75 years old or upwards died during the month, viz.:—A gardener, aged 75, of cancer; a male, aged 86, and a female, aged 79, of old age. On no other occasion, since December 1872, do the records show so small a mortality amongst old people. In September the numbers dying at the age of 75 or upwards amounted to 19, in August to 13, in July to 13, and in June to 19.

The violent deaths which occurred during the month numbered 16, of which 11 were set down as accidental, 2 as homicidal, and 3 as suicidal. The particulars are as follow:—A boy aged 3 received fatal injuries through being thrown from a cart; a bricklayer aged 38 was killed by a fall from a scaffold; a builder aged 39 died of fracture of the thigh; a laborer aged 50 died of the effects of injuries to the leg caused by its being crushed in a steam mill; a child aged 32 weeks died of sunstroke; a servant aged 38 was burnt to death in Carlton; two seamen aged 32 and 35 or 40 respectively were found drowned, the former in Hobson's Bay, and the latter in the River Yarra; a female aged 16 was also drowned in the Yarra; an infant aged 8 weeks was suffocated in bed; and a female infant aged 12 days died of umbilical hæmorrhage; a newly-born female infant was murdered by suffocation; a female aged 39 was murdered by her husband; a barman aged 51 committed suicide by shooting himself in the head; a female aged 37 drowned herself whilst of unsound mind, brought on by excessive drinking; and a female aged 49 poisoned herself.

Seventy-eight deaths, or 26 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—41 in the Melbourne Hospital; 5 in the Immigrants' Home; 5 in the Alfred Hospital; 6 in the Lying-in Hospital; 7 in the Benevolent Asylum; 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 1 in the Melbourne Gaol; 1 in the Pentridge Stockade; 1 in the Sailors' Home; and 1 in the Industrial Home.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 108, of which 53, or 54 per cent., were of males; and 50, or 46 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 74 were under one year of age, 12 were between one and two, 5 were between two and three, 8 were between three and four, and 9 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 198. Of these 105, or 53 per cent., were males and 93, or 47 per cent., were females; 10 were between five and ten, 8 were between ten and fifteen, 11 were between fifteen and twenty, 11 were between twenty and twenty-five, 15 were between twenty-five and thirty, 21 were between thirty and thirty-five, 24 were between thirty-five and forty, 23 were between forty and forty-five, 12 were between forty-five and fifty, 20 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 13 were between sixty and sixty-five, 6 were between sixty-five and seventy, 7 were between seventy and seventy-five, 2 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 1 was upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 47 in September to 64 in October. Two of the deaths in the latter month were from measles, being the first which have been recorded from that complaint since November 1872. Phthisis caused 43 deaths in the former and 41 in the latter month. Childbirth, combined with metria, caused 9 deaths in each of the last 3 months. The births registered in these 3 months amounted to 1,989. This would indicate the death of 1 mother to every 74 children born alive, a mortality much above the average of this colony or of England, in both of which, over a series of years, 1 mother died to every 203 or 204 births of living children born.

REGULATIONS FOR VOLUNTEER ENGINEERS.

30. At the commencement of any year the following volunteers, and no others, will be classed as effective in the above-named branch of the force:—

(a.) Any volunteer who was enrolled before the 1st October of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—

- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
- (2.) Attended seven parades of the corps.
- (3.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
- (4.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
- (5.) Attended twenty musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which twelve at least were for engineering instruction.
- (6.) Gone through a course of musketry instruction.

(b.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st October and 31st December of the year next preceding and who has during that year—

- (1.) Attended one battalion parade.
- (2.) Attended and passed an official inspection.
- (3.) Passed an official inspection in some branch of military engineering.
- (4.) Attended five parades of the corps.
- (5.) Attended fourteen musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which ten at least were for engineering instruction.

(c.) Any volunteer who was enrolled between the 1st January and 31st March of the year next preceding, and who has during that year—

- (1.) Attended and passed one parade for official inspection.
- (2.) Attended three parades of the corps.
- (3.) Attended ten musters of the corps for exercise and instruction, of which seven at least were for engineering instruction.

Parades.

31. (a.) A parade shall mean an assembly of the corps under arms for instruction in the field exercises and evolutions of infantry, or for instruction in military engineering, at which not less than twenty members are present for three quarters of an hour at least.

(b.) A muster of the corps shall mean an assembly of the corps for squad, company, or garrison gun drill, or for exercises in military engineering.

(c.) A battalion parade shall mean an assemblage of the corps under arms, with one or more other corps for battalion drill in field exercises, at which not less than twenty members are present.

(d.) For the purposes of battalion drill or inspection, the officer commanding the force may order other parades of the corps, which may be returned by the officer commanding the corps.

Enrolment.

32. No person shall be enrolled as a member of the Engineers unless he shall have been educated as an architect, surveyor, civil, mechanical or mining engineer, architectural, mechanical or topographical draughtsman, photographer, telegraphist, lithographer, carpenter, cabinetmaker, turner, plasterer, modeller, mason, bricklayer, smith, Wright, cooper, painter, plumber, fitter, coachbuilder, engraver, upholsterer, polisher, watchmaker, hummerman, saddle, harness or collar maker, miner, or shall have served in the corps of Royal Engineers, or as an able seaman in the Royal Navy.

DRAWBACK REGULATIONS, 1874

IT is hereby notified, for general information, that His Excellency the Governor in Council has been pleased to direct that the rate of drawback allowed on girls' boots, Nos. 7-10, shall be 7s. per dozen pairs in lieu of 17s. per dozen pairs, as mentioned in schedule 1 of Drawback Regulations, published in supplement to the *Government Gazette* on 30th October last, to take effect from 2nd ultimo.

The Governor in Council has also been pleased to direct that "rock-salt" be added to the list of articles upon which drawback is allowed on exportation, and that such drawback be at the rate of 20s. per ton. "DISEASED CATTLE ACT AMENDMENT ACT 1873."

6. From and after the first day of April, One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, no cattle shipped to New Zealand from any foreign district shall be landed in New Zealand unless the owner of such cattle shall produce to the cattle inspector at the port or place in New Zealand where the same shall arrive, a certificate in writing, signed by a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, to the effect that such cattle were inspected and examined by him immediately before shipment, and that they were at the time of such examination and shipment free from any contagious or infectious disease whatever, and which would be likely to propagate amongst men or animals any such contagious or infectious disease, or any other disease.

7. Every such certificate of inspection and examination shall be attested before a justice of the peace or a notary public.

Every such certificate so attested before a justice of the peace or a notary public as aforesaid shall, for all purposes, be receivable in the colony as sufficient evidence of compliance with the provisions of this Act by any such owner as aforesaid.

8. From and after the passing of this Act, no cattle imported from any foreign district shall be landed at any port or place in the Colony of New Zealand except at a port proclaimed to be a port where cattle may be landed; and such cattle shall only be landed at such place in such port as the Local Cattle Board may from time to time appoint.

The Governor may from time to time proclaim such ports within the colony as he thinks fit to be ports at which cattle may be landed; and from and after the publication of such Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, cattle shall be landed at such proclaimed port, and at no other port or place.

9. Whenever it shall appear to the Local Cattle Board that any such cattle as last aforesaid are affected with any disease which is by this Act, or may hereafter be, declared to be a disease for the purposes of this Act, the Local Cattle Board at the port or place where such cattle shall arrive shall cause the same to be forthwith destroyed, and the owner thereof shall not be entitled to any compensation whatsoever for the cattle so destroyed.

Whenever cattle imported from a foreign district shall be driven or taken to a quarantine ground, or to any place to be appointed under this Act as a place to which cattle shall be driven or taken, such cattle shall be kept therein at the risk and expense of the owner for such period as may be prescribed by any regulations to be made in that behalf. And in case

any such disease as aforesaid shall break out amongst such cattle when in quarantine, or in such place as aforesaid, the same shall be destroyed by the owner on being required to do so by the Local Cattle Board, and such owner shall not be entitled to any compensation whatsoever by reason of such destruction.

A PROCLAMATION.

WHEREAS by the eighth section of *The Diseased Cattle Act amendment Act 1873*, it is enacted that from and after the passing of the said Act no cattle imported from any foreign district shall be landed at any port or place in the Colony of New Zealand, except at a port proclaimed to be a port where cattle may be landed, and such cattle shall only be landed at such place in such port as the Local Cattle Board may from time to time appoint:

And it is further enacted that the Governor may from time to time proclaim such ports within the colony as he thinks fit to be ports at which cattle may be landed, and from and after the publication of such Proclamation in the *New Zealand Gazette*, cattle shall be landed at such proclaimed port, and at no other port or place:

Now know ye, that I, Sir James Fergusson, Baronet, the Governor of the Colony of New Zealand aforesaid, in pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, do hereby proclaim the ports set forth in the annexed schedule as ports at which cattle may be landed, in accordance with the provisions of the said Act; And in further pursuance and exercise of the said power and authority, I do hereby declare that this Proclamation shall come into force on the seventeenth day of October instant.

PORTS AND HARBORS OF VICTORIA.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency Sir GEORGE FERGUSSON BOWEN, Knight Grand Cross of the Most Distinguished Order of Saint Michael and Saint George, Governor and Commander-in-Chief in and over the Colony of Victoria and its Dependencies, and Vice-Admiral of the same, &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, by Proclamation published in the *Government Gazette*, may, from time to time, define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation and good government and management of all public wharfs, and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and from time to time, in like manner, may alter, amend, or repeal any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations, and substitute others in their stead: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the following to be an amended Port and Harbor Regulation, and to be observed accordingly, in lieu of those published in the *Government Gazette* of 18th February 1870, No. 13, which is hereby repealed:—

92. Steamers must proceed at moderate speed whilst navigating amongst the shipping in any port.

Steamers when navigating the River Yarra must slow, and keep their engines at less than half speed between the Melbourne town boundary post and the Melbourne wharfs, and when passing shipping moored at any wharf in the said river, either above or below the town boundary, shall further reduce their speed to less than three nautical miles per hour.

Given under my Hand and the Seal of the Colony, at Melbourne, this twenty-fifth day of November, in the year of our Lord One thousand eight hundred and seventy-four, and in the thirty-eighth year of Her Majesty's reign.

TREASURY REGULATIONS FOR COLLECTION OF LAND REVENUE.

THE Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, has been pleased to approve of the following Regulations for the collection of Land Revenue by the Treasury Department, to come into operation on the 1st January 1875.

These regulations are in substitution for those "Relating to the custody and issue of Forms of Licenses and other forms, and the collection of Rents and Fees in connection with the alienation and occupation of Crown Lands," which appeared in the *Government Gazette* of the 27th February ultimo, page 407.

PART I.—AUCTION.

1. Auction sales pursuant to Part II., sections 34 to 38, of the Land Act are to be attended by an officer from a Receipt and Pay Office of the Treasury (other than the officer appointed to conduct the sale), by whom all deposits, valuations, and balances, fees, and assurance moneys paid at the time of sale are to be received. Balances, &c., paid after the day of sale are to be received at Receipt and Pay Offices of the Treasury, as heretofore. Payments at auction.

2. Land sale reports, prepared for the Lands Department, are to be certified by the officer appointed to conduct the sale, as well as by the Treasury officer who attended to receive the money. They are to be forwarded by the officer conducting the sale to the Lands Department. All moneys derived from auction are to appear in the "Red-faced Reports" hereinafter mentioned. Land sale reports.

PART II.—LICENSES AND LEASES.

3. All District Surveyors are Land Officers only for the purpose of receiving applications in respect to the occupation of Lands, and their offices respectively are Land Offices pursuant to the 17th section of the Act. All Receivers are to be Land Officers and their offices Land Offices for the purpose only of receiving payments on account of such applications, as well as subsequent payments. But no District Surveyor is to receive money, and no Receiver is to receive applications in respect to the occupation of lands. Land officers.

4. Payment under the Land Law of 1865, or of any previous year, are to be made only to a Receiver. Payments under former Land Laws.

5. Payments for such licenses and leases under Part III., secs. 45 to 56, of the Act as require the approval of the Minister or of the Board of Land and Works, including all those enumerated in Schedule IX. of the Land Regulations, those in Cap. VIII., part 1, clause 11, and those in Cap. VIII., parts 2 and 3, are to be made only to a Receiver. Present licensees affected by this clause who are desirous of continuing their licenses must, twenty-one days at least prior to the expiration of the same, signify their intention so to do to the Occupation Branch, giving their correct postal address. Present lessees must make payments of rent in advance to the proper Receiver, producing in each case the lease and last receipt for his information, and taking his "Treasury receipt" for the amount paid to him. Payments for licenses and leases not agricultural nor pastoral, requiring Ministerial approval. Present licensees. Present lessees.

6. Payments for licenses which do not require the approval of the Minister or of the Board, including those enumerated in Schedule X. of the Land Regulations, and those provided for by Cap. VIII., part 1, clauses 1 to 10 (except as excepted by clause 11), and by Schedule XI. of the same, may be collected by any Receiver or, where there is no Receiver, by a Clerk of Petty Sessions. All such officers are required to make themselves acquainted with the Land Regulations and with these Regulations; and are to collect such sums only, and for such purposes, as are allowed by Act or Regulation. All license forms in the possession of Licensing Officers or Agents are to be sent to the Occupation Branch with their quarterly returns to 31st December 1874; and the Occupation Branch, after recording same, is to transmit them for destruction to a Board composed of officers from the Treasury, Lands, and Audit Departments. No further or other appointment, except that of Collector of Imposts as such Receiver, or Clerk of Petty Sessions, will be required; and all appointments heretofore made of Licensing Agents or Licensing Officers, or of Collector of Imposts, in connection with such offices, are hereby revoked as and from 31st December 1874. Payments for licenses not requiring Ministerial approval.

7. Payments under Part V. of the Act, secs. 63 to 88, also under secs. 39, 40, 96, 98, 99, and 109, and those required by Cap. XVI. of the Land Regulations, except that for the registration of liens, are to be made only to a Receiver; and the same practice is to be pursued by the Lands Department in advising the Treasury as heretofore. Payments under pastoral licenses, and miscellaneous.

8. The fees payable to Authorized Surveyors are to follow the same course, and be collected by the Receivers and the Postmasters, in the same manner as heretofore. Fees to authorized surveyors.

9. Should money be paid by an Agent, the name and address of such Agent is to be noted in the butt of the receipt book. Payments by agents.

10. The returns called "Red-faced Reports" are to be prepared by the Receivers and by Land Officers appointed to receive first payments, for the same period and amount as the statements of revenue under the Audit Act, and are to be rendered to the Treasury at the same time. They are to contain full particulars of all Land Revenue. The said "Red-faced Reports" are day by day to be certified by the Accountant to the Treasury as to the actual lodgment of the money in the public account, and to be forthwith forwarded to the Occupation Branch with such certificate. Red-faced reports.

How licenses not
requiring Minis-

11. In regard to such licenses as are defined in clause 6 of these Regulations, the fees for which are to be collected by any Receiver, or where there is no Receiver by any Clerk of Petty Sessions, the following course is to be observed. The said officers are to be *ex officio* Issuers of such licenses as do not require Ministerial approval. Forms of license, priced on the face thereof, and having a currency not exceeding three months, are to be supplied to the Issuers by the Receivers, and no other forms are to be used by such Issuers, nor is any form to be altered, nor any manuscript or temporary receipt or acknowledgment given. No general book or unpriced form is to be in any case used. Monthly returns of licenses issued, giving names, dates, and particulars, are to be sent to the Bailiff for the district. Quarterly returns of receipts and issues are to be prepared by such Issuers in duplicate, one copy of which is to be sent direct to the Occupation Branch, the other to the Audit Office.

Stock of forms.

12. Receivers are to obtain their stock from the License Branch of the Treasury; and are to take care that they do not supply forms to a greater value in the whole than is prescribed by the Instructions to Receivers and Paymasters.

Lists of arrears.

13. As soon as possible after the 30th of June and 31st December in each year Receivers are to transmit to the Occupation Branch a list of all rents and fees in arrear.

REVOKING FORMER REGULATIONS FOR THE CUSTODY AND ISSUE OF FORMS OF LICENSES AND THE COLLECTION OF RENTS, ETC., IN CONNECTION WITH CROWN LANDS.

THE Governor in Council has revoked the Order in Council of the 26th February 1874 making Regulations relative to the custody and issue of Forms of Licenses and other Forms and the collection of rents and fees in connection with the alienation and occupation of Crown lands, and the Orders in Council of the 29th June and 22nd September 1874 authorizing the suspension of the said Regulations until 30th September and 31st December 1874.

REGULATIONS FOR THE ISSUE OF LICENSES, LEASES, AND GRANTS, AND THE RECEIPT OF MONEYS APPERTAINING TO THE LANDS DEPARTMENT.

At the Executive Council Chamber, Melbourne, the twenty-fifth day of November 1874.

WHEREAS by the 110th section of *The Land Act 1869* power is given to the Governor in Council from time to time to make, alter, and rescind rules, regulations, and orders for the various purposes therein specified: Now, therefore, His Excellency the Governor, acting by and with the advice of the Executive Council, doth make the Regulations following:—

LICENSES AND LEASES.

1. All licenses and leases shall be prepared by the Occupation Branch, and those not requiring the signature of the Governor may be signed by the Assistant Surveyor-General, who alone shall be the licensing agent. In his absence the Registrar of Occupation may act on his behalf. Priced licenses which do not require the approval of the Minister need not be signed by the Assistant Surveyor-General, but are to be supplied to the Licensing Branch of the Treasury from his office, and are to recite they are granted under his authority.

2. All rents and fees will be collected by the Treasury, which shall be advised through the *Government Gazette*, and such advice shall give the date, name, parish, area, amount to be collected, and office whereat payable, in respect of each license or lease, as the case may be, and shall contain such further information as from time to time may be deemed desirable; and the Occupation Branch is to be advised by the officer who receives the money of its receipt through the Treasury by the usual "Red-faced Report."

3. No fees or rents for any license or lease will be received after the Occupation Branch has forwarded to the Treasury an intimation directing that money shall not be received on account of such license or lease; and fees or rents in arrear shall not be received as such if tendered after the same shall have been due three months. But the money may be accepted and paid into the credit of the Trust Fund, and a conditional receipt given in the Form A, on application in Form B, and in such a case the Occupa-

tion? Branch is to be immediately informed that payment has been made. If the Occupation Branch acquaint the Treasury that such money may be received as rent or fees, the money is to be transferred to Revenue. If on the other hand, the Occupation Branch object to the receipt of such fees or rents the money will be returned by the Treasury to the person who paid it.

4. All licenses which have a fixed price, and which do not require the approval of the Minister, will be disposed of through the Treasury, but shall be signed by the officer entrusted with their issue.

5. The Occupation Branch is to prepare registers for licenses and leases having a longer currency than one year, and others for licenses having a currency for one year or under.

6. Such registers are to be kept in the following or such other form as the Minister may from time to time direct:—

7. The Occupation Branch is to prepare, at intervals of not more than two months, a list of all licensees and lessees who shall appear to be in arrear, and submit the same to the Minister, with the view of obtaining his authority to call upon such persons (if there be no objection to the receipt of their fees or rents) to show cause for not having paid such fees or rents. In February and August of each year the Occupation Branch is to gazette complete lists of all fees and rents in arrear, pursuant to the 29th section of the Land Act, and a further list of all arrears under sections 45 to 56.

8. The same rules prescribed for dealing with licenses and leases having a longer currency than one year shall apply to licenses having a currency of one year or under, except that no intimation is to be given to the Treasury to receive any payment for renewal. In fact, such licenses will not be renewed. Instead of renewing them, new licenses will, if it is deemed advisable to do so, be issued; but such licences need not be gazetted.

9. The Occupation Branch is to register the information afforded by the "Red-faced Reports" in the Registers opposite the Minister's approval, to note all refunds, deal with all errors, advise the Audit Office monthly of all corrections, and to have the entire supervision of the business.

RECEIPT OF OTHER MONEYS.—CROWN GRANTS AND LEASES.

10. A Crown grant or lease may be prepared by the Lands Department when information has been received by it from the Treasury through the "Red-faced Report" that the sum of money which ought to be paid therefor has been received at the Treasury.

AUCTION SALES.

11. Land sale reports, prepared for the Lands Department, are to be certified by the officer appointed to conduct the sale, as well as by the Treasury officer who attended to receive the money. They are to be forwarded to the Lands Department. All moneys derived from auction are to appear in the "Red-faced Reports."

PASTORAL OCCUPATION.

12. The rules applicable to licenses having a currency of one year or under are to be taken as applying also to licenses for Pastoral occupation.

OCCASIONAL FEES.

13. Payments for the purchase of plans, or the inspection of original maps, or for the registration of liens, or for any other duty to be performed by the Lands Department other than for the occupation of land, may be received by an officer of the Lands Department, who shall be approved by the Treasurer.

14. Where the word "Treasury" is used in these regulations it shall mean any Treasury officer duly authorized by the Treasury Department to receive communications from the Lands Department.

15. All officers of the Lands Department are **FORBIDDEN** to receive moneys on account of the Lands Department, or to act as agents in the transmission of such moneys. They are **FORBIDDEN** also to act as agents directly or indirectly in regard to the general business of the Lands Department. **All** persons making application for information in the country districts are to apply to the District Survey Offices, and in Melbourne to the officers of the Enquiry Branch, by whom information on personal application is to be furnished. If the result of such application be unsatisfactory, reference is to be made to the Secretary for Lands.

BAILIFFS.

16. The Occupation Branch is to have the direction of the Crown Lands Bailiffs, and the general supervision of all business relating to occupation. It is to advise the Bailiffs by means of a copy of the *Gazette* of all licenses or leases which have been issued in their respective districts during the previous month; to require the Bailiffs to enter in their note-book full particulars of all licenses, of whatever kind, issued under secs. 45 to 56 of the Act; to call their attention to arrears in payment; and to require them to send in their diaries for perusal at intervals of not less than three months.

17. The Bailiffs are not to harass persons who have duly paid their fees by demanding production of the licenses; but all persons who are in arrear, or have paid insufficient fees under secs. 45 to 56 of the Act, and all persons in unauthorized occupation, are after due notice to be proceeded against in the nearest Petty Sessions Court. The Bailiff is, however, before taking proceedings, to enquire whether the license fee has been paid.

18. Bailiffs are not, without special authority, to levy or recover rent or license fees under sec. 91 of the Act, and when they do they are to pay the amounts forthwith to the nearest Receiver, and to report the same to the Occupation Branch, which is to advise the Audit Office. Bailiffs are on no account to receive any other rents or license fees whatever, or to act as agents for other officers in the receipt of money.

MELBOURNE GENERAL CEMETERY.

IN pursuance of the powers vested in them, the Trustees of the Melbourne General Cemetery rescind the Rules and Regulations published in the *Government Gazette* of the 25th day of May 1860, and make the following Rules and Regulations, that is to say:—

RULES AND REGULATIONS.

1. That all fees and charges shall be paid when applications are made or orders given.
2. That any person desiring ground for a private grave or a vault, tomb, monument, cenotaph, tombstone, or for any other purpose in the cemetery under the above Act, shall apply to the trustees thereof. If approved, the trustees, on the payment of the required fees, shall issue to such person so applying a certificate of right of burial in the form specified in schedule A.
3. That any person desiring to construct a brick grave, vault, or tomb, or to erect a monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall fence, or any other erection in any part of the cemetery, shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a plan, design, or drawing of such with full particulars for approval.
4. That any order for interment shall be given at the cemetery six working hours prior to the time fixed for the burial, otherwise an extra charge shall be made. No free interment shall be allowed without said notice.
5. That the name, age, late place of residence, probable cause of death of the deceased, and other particulars mentioned in schedule C shall be furnished at the time of giving the order.
6. That the trustees shall cause all ordinary graves to be dug; but any person wanting a brick grave or vault shall be permitted to construct the same, under directions of the surveyor, on payment of the required fees; and every coffin placed therein shall be bricked in, cemented, and covered by a slab of stone, slate, or iron.
7. That every coffin shall have on the lid a lead or copper plate with the name of the deceased stamped thereon.
8. That every grave shall be at least seven feet deep, and no interment shall be allowed in any grave with a less depth than three feet from the top of the coffin to the original surface of the ground, after such interment.
9. That no interment shall be permitted in any private grave or vault, without the production of the certificate of right of burial, or other satisfactory evidence that the person desiring to bury therein is entitled to do so, except as provided for in the next rule.
10. That in the case of an application for interment in any private grave or vault, to which during life the deceased person had no claim, the written consent of the owner shall be given in with the order.
11. That no burial shall be permitted to take place in said cemetery without a certificate from a deputy registrar of deaths or a coroner. Such certificate shall be delivered to the gatekeeper before the funeral enters the cemetery.

12. That the hours fixed for burials shall be as follows:—
 On week days, September to April inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 5 p.m.; May to August inclusive, from 8 a.m. to 4 p.m. On Sundays, throughout the year, from 2 to 5 p.m.

13. That no burial shall be allowed to take place between the hours of 7 p.m. and 7 a.m. except by special permission of the trustees.

14. That the time fixed for any burial shall be the time when the funeral is to be at the cemetery, and the same shall be punctually observed.

15. That every funeral entering by the principal entrance shall pass to the west of the enclosure opposite thereto, and no vehicle except the hearse and mourning coaches shall be permitted to pass the line of posts fixed at the north-west of said entrance, or to stand south of the said line of posts. Breaking out of the procession after passing the point indicated by the notice-board in the cemetery crescent is forbidden. Horses shall not be allowed to proceed faster than at a walking pace within the cemetery.

16. That every grave, vault, tomb, monument, tombstone, cenotaph, wall, fence, or any other erection shall be maintained and kept in thorough repair and proper condition by and at the expense of the owner.

17. That any person desiring to place any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery shall apply to the trustees for permission to do so, and at the same time submit a copy thereof.

18. That any person putting up any erection or placing any inscription or epitaph in any part of the cemetery without the permission of the trustees shall be liable to the penalties imposed by the above Act for so doing, and to be further dealt with as a trespasser.

19. That every erection shall be placed on proper and substantial foundations (extending to the bottom of the grave when ordered). No Bath, Caen, or other soft stone shall be allowed to be used in any work. All stones, refuse, and rubbish remaining after any work is completed shall be removed at once. Copper cramps only shall be allowed in the erection of tablets or other exposed stone-work.

20. That all materials required in the completion of any stone or other work shall be fully prepared before being taken into the cemetery, and shall be admitted only at the principal entrance, and no vehicle conveying any such materials with wheels less than four inches broad shall be permitted to enter.

21. That no catacomb shall be allowed.

22. That no wooden erection shall be allowed.

23. That the trustees shall not (unless in very exceptional cases) permit the removal of any corpse from any grave for re-interment either in said or any other cemetery.

24. That before any such exceptional case can be dealt with by the trustees, a written application setting forth the reasons for the proposed removal and verified by a statutory declaration shall be produced by the nearest available representative of the deceased, and in the event of said application being granted the permission of the minister administering *The Coroners Statute 1865*, and the Act numbered CCCXXXVIII., in addition to that of the trustees, shall be obtained. If found necessary, the coffin shall be enclosed in a second and air-tight coffin prior to removal.

25. That any workman not employed by the trustees shall be under the supervision and control of the surveyor who shall have power to regulate his hours of labor, to see that his work is completed satisfactorily and with despatch, and to remove him summarily from the cemetery upon any cause of offence.

26. That, unless otherwise ordered, the principal entrance shall be open daily from 6 a.m. to 6 p.m. from 1st September to 30th April, and from 7 a.m. to 6 p.m. during the other months of the year.

27. That no child under 10 years shall be admitted into the cemetery except in charge of a responsible person.

28. That no smoking shall be allowed within the cemetery, nor any fireworks discharged therein.

29. That no dogs shall be admitted into the cemetery.

30. That any person violating the rules of propriety and decorum, or committing any nuisance or trespass, or injuring any tree, shrub, flower border, or any erection, or otherwise infringing the above Act, or any rule, regulation or bye-law made for protecting the cemetery, shall be prosecuted as the law directs.

31. That no person shall be allowed to take any flower or plant out of the cemetery.

32. That the surveyor shall exercise a general supervision and control, under the trustees, over all matters pertaining to the cemetery.

33. That no person employed under the trustees shall be permitted to accept any gratuity whatever in the discharge of duty, nor shall be allowed to be pecuniarily interested in any work in the cemetery other than that for which he receives payment from the trustees.

34. That any person so employed accepting any such gratuity or being pecuniarily interested in any such work, shall be liable to be summarily dismissed.

35. That licenses to grave-dressers may be issued by the trustees in the form set out in Schedule B.

36. That a plan of the cemetery showing the distribution of the land, compartments, situations, and numbers of the graves, and a registry of all certificates of right of burial shall be kept at the office.
