WARDERS FOR LUNATIC ASYLUMS

THE following regulations, made by the Government to provide a temporary staff of Warders in the Lunatic Asylums, are published for general information:—

- Before entering on duty each candidate shall be required to pass a medical examination to test his physical qualifica-tions.
- 2. He is to give satisfactory evidence of being able to read and write.
- 3. The wages to be paid are to be for the first year, at the rate of 20s. per week; for the second, of 22s. per week; for the third year, of 24s.; together with rations and quarters.
- 4. Warders in the junior class are liable, at any time, to be discharged, after a week's notice, without compensation.
- 5. As they will compose a temporary or probationary staff only, they are not to hold their appointments under the provisions of the Lunacy Statute, nor to be deemed to possess any of the privileges conferred by it.
- 6. If any member of the junior staff, being an unmarried man, shall marry without the permission of the head of the department, he will forfeit his appointment.
- 7. If, after a service of three years, the members of the junior staff are reported competent and in every respect deserving of permanent employment, they shall be appointed officers of the department under the provisions of the Lunacy Statute, and be deemed fully entitled to the privileges conferred by it.
- 8. The right is reserved by the Government of reducing the maximum rate of pay to a limit to be named hereafter, and of making such other regulations in regard to the amount of the annual increments as shall be considered advisable without any claim for compensation or allowance of any kind.

WHEREAS by The Importation and Custody of Gunpowder Statute 1864 it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor in Council may proclaim any town, township, or borough, not being a seaport town, as a district into which no gunpowder shall be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine; and if any person shall bring more than one hundred pounds of gunpowder into any such district, and shall not forthwith deposit the same in a magazine as aforesaid, it shall be forfeited: And whereas by a Proclamation under the hand of the Governor and the Seal of the Colony, bearing date the twenty-sixth day of September 1870, the Borough of Smythesdale was declared to be a district into which no gunpowder should be brought unless for deposit in a public or licensed magazine: And whereas it is expedient to revoke the said Proclamation: Now therefore I, the Governor of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby revoke the Proclamation hereinbefore mentioned.

RULES FOR THE MANAGEMENT OF THE ALFRED GRAVING DOCK AND PATENT SLIP.

THE following Rules for the management of the Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip, which have been approved by the Governor in Council in lieu of those published on the 20th March last (which applied only to the Dock), are published for general information.

Rules for the Management of Alfred Graving Dock and Patent Slip. ,

- 1. The gates of the dock-yard will be opened at 6 a.m. and closed at 6 p.m. daily, Sundays excepted. Should any extension of hours be required in consequence of continuous repairs to a vessel in dock or on the slip, such may be obtained on application to the Superintendent, and on payment of 3s. 6d. per hour.
- per nour.

 2. All vessels belonging to H.M. Navy, the Victorian or any colonial Government, or commissioned ship of foreign nations, will be admitted into dock or on the slip without payment of the usual dock or slip dues, but only of such sum as is necessary for the reimbursement of actual expenditure of stores, wages, and materials. Any such vessel or steamer employed under contract with the Victorian Government to carry mails shall, with the special sanction of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, have precedence over vessels on the dock register.
- 3. All other vessels will be required to pay dues according to the Schedules hercunto annexed; the said dues including and coyering the cost of pumping, hauling up and launching, shoring, wedges, and blocks, as hereinafter provided; the cost of all labor on shore connected with the docking or undocking of a vessel, and the use of the warp required for warping a vessel in creater dock. in or out of dock.
- 4. Blocks, shores, and stages will be provided by the Govern-
 - Blocks.-One set for the length given at the time of registering.
 - Horizontal shores.—One for every fifteen feet of the length given at the time of registering.
 - Stage poles and planks.—A sufficient number to make one tier of stages round the vessel, to consist of two planks in breadth and a gangway-stage of two poles and five planks.

and five planks.

All necessary stage planks and cross bearers, with the use of the yard during the carrying on of repairs, will be allowed the persons effecting the repairs without any additional charge; but any damage occurring to the same, or to the dock, caisson, the keel-blocks, slip-cradle, or other material, shall be made good at the expense of the applicant for registration of the ship; and all such materials lent by the Government to the person using the dock or slip shall be returned in the same order as received, and stacked to the satisfaction of the Superintendent of the dock or his foreman previous to the vessel being undocked or launched, and no such materials will be allowed to be taken from the dock premises for effecting repairs after the vessel is undocked or launched.

- 5. The owner, master, or agent, of any vessel desiring the use of the dock or slip, should make his application to be registered on the form to be obtained from the office of the Chief Harbor-master, such application to be lodged between the hours of 9 a.m. and 4 p.m. on week days, which will be duly registered in order of receipt. Should any dispute arise as to priority for registration, such shall be submitted to and decided by the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, or other Minister acting in his behalf, whose decision shall be flual. With the application for registration, and before registration is made, the sum of Ten pounds (£10) shall be paid to the Secretary for Harbors as "entrance fee," which sum shall be allowed as part payment of dock or slip dues, provided that such dock or slip dues shall be settled within seven days after delivery of the account for the same, otherwise such fee will be forfeited, and dock or slip dues must be paid in full. No vessel will be taken into dock or on the slip until all claims due in respect to such vessel, or other vessels belonging to the same owners, or having the same master or agent, shall have been paid. The Chief Harbor-master will duly intimate to the applicant the date when the dock or slip will be available.

 6. Should any vessel not be in position and ready to be

 6. Should any vessel not be in position and ready to be warped into dock or over slip cradle at such time as may be specified in writing by the Chief Harbor-master, and addressed to the person making the application, the turn of such vessel will lapse, and fresh application for registration must be made, the entrance fee being also forfeited, and the applicant will be responsible for any expenses already incurred in connection with the docking or slipping, unless the inability to dock or slip shall have occurred through stress of weather, which the Chief Harbor-master shall determine, when such vessel may retain her position upon the register without forfeiture of the entrance fee.

 7. The Government will not hold itself responsible for any
- entrance ree.

 7. The Government will not hold itself responsible for any delay or accident occurring to any vessel during docking or undocking, hauling up or launching, nor while in dock or on the slip, the vessel being during the whole of such time entirely at the risk of the owners, except such may occur by the fault or negligence of any of its servants. No repairs are undertaken by the Government.

- 8. So soon as any warp shall have been made fast to any vessel by instruction of the Superintendent of the dock, such vessel having been placed in position by and at the expense of the master or owner in line with the fairway and within twenty feet of the entrance of the dock or slipway, and until relieved by the withdrawal of such warp, such vessel shall be held to be under the control of the Superintendent, whose directions must be implicitly and promptly attended to.
- 9. There shall be a sufficient number of officers and crew on board every vessel, while entering or going out of dock, for the purpose of warping the vessel in and out, or if using slip, of warping her between the platforms and steadying heron the cradle, and in either case assisting on board and attending to such orders as may be given by the Superintendent.
- 10. Changes of turns between vessels will be allowed with the written sanction of the Chief Harbor-master, but not otherwise.
- 11. No vessel will be admitted into dock or on the slip with any gunpowder or combustibles on board.
- 12. No vessel shall be broken up nor scuttled while in dock or on the slip, except with the written permission of the Chief Harbor-master; and should any master, owner, or agent commence to break up or to scuttle any vessel in dock or on the slip without such permission, the Chief Harbor-master may at once remove such vessel out of the dock or from the slip, and the master, owner, or agent shall be responsible, in addition to the dock or slip dues, for any expenses which may be incurred by such Chief Harbor-master in so doing.
- 13. Should wind and weather or tide not permit of a vessel being undocked or launched when the repairs are completed, she may be allowed to remain in dock or on the slip, without any additional charge, subject to the decision of the Chief Habor-master, but no demand for demurrage can be enter-
- 14. Sailing ships are to be charged dues on their registered tonnage, and steamships on their gross tonnage: tonnage in both cases to be British measurement.
- to the cases to be British measurement.

 15. The officers, crew, and workmen of any vessel while in dock or on the slip shall strictly comply with the printed rules and regulations of the establishment, copies of which will always be posted at the dock gates and in the dock office. Any workman committing any breach of the regulations will be liable to be prohibited from entering the dock premises; and before the water is let in to take any vessel out of dock, or any vessel be launched from the slip, the dock or slipway must be cleaned up to the satisfaction of the Superintendent, by or at the expense of the person who registered the vessel.
