WHEREAS by *The Boroughs Statute* it is amongst other things enacted, that at any time not less than thirty days before or after an annual election or general election or first appointment of councillors, whether under *The Municipal Corporations Act* 1863 hereby repealed or this Act, for any single borough, the Governor may, if he shall have received a petition to that effect signed by one-third of the number of burgesses on the burgess roll in such borough, and if he shall think fit so to do, divide the borough into three separate wards, by such names and with such boundaries respectively as shall by Order in Council be assigned to the same, and may from time to time subject to the like conditions alter, vary, or rescind such Order: And whereas the Governor has received a petition signed by not less than one-third of the number of burgesses on the burgess roll in the borough of Brighton praying that the said borough may be divided into three wards: Now therefore His Excellency the Governor, with the advice of the Executive Council, doth, in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, by this present Order divide the said borough of Brighton into three separate wards, by the names and with the boundaries hereby assigned to the same respectively, that is to say:—

**NORTH WARD.**—Commencing at the point where the north boundary of the borough abuts on the sea-coast; thence by the northern and eastern boundaries of the borough to the north side of North Road; thence by the said side of that road bearing west to the centre line of the Brighton Railway; thence by that line southerly to the centre of Bay street; thence by a line along the centre of that street bearing west to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast northerly to the commencing point.

**SOUTH WARD.**—Commencing at a point where the south boundary of the borough abuts on the sea-coast; thence by that boundary line east to the centre of Hampton street; thence by a line along the centre of that street and by a line along the centre of Durant street to the centre line of the aforesaid railway; thence by that line northerly to the centre of Bay street; thence by a line along the centre of that street bearing west to the sea-coast; and thence by the sea-coast southerly to the commencing point.

**EAST WARD.**—Commencing at the south-east angle of the South Ward; thence by the eastern boundaries of the South and North Wards to the northern boundary of the borough; and thence by the northern, eastern, and south boundaries thereof to the commencing point.

THE CALLAWADDA FARMERS COMMON, which is described in four several Proclamations bearing date respectively the fourth day of February, the twelfth day of March, and the eleventh day of November 1867, and the eleventh day of November 1873, is hereby diminished by deducting therefrom allotment 182 n in the parish of Riachella.—(73.M.26792.)

# QUARANTINE DISTRICTS UNDER "THE SCAB ACT 1870."

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Administrator of the Government in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts herein-after mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

*Pursuant to Order of 28 April 1873.*

**BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Brenanah and Coyocora Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

**GREENWALD QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the north-east corner of Greenwald run on the Crawford River; thence westerly by that river to its junction with the Glenelg River; thence southerly by that river and the Moleside Creek to the north-west corner of Kentbruck run; thence by the western boundary of that run bearing southerly to its south-westerly corner; thence by the southern boundary south-easterly; thence northerly and westerly by the top of Mount Kincaid to the south-west corner of Greenwich run; thence by the western boundaries of Greenwich and Lower Crawford runs to the Glenaulin Creek; thence by that creek south-easterly to the south-east corner of Greenwald run; thence by the eastern boundary of that run bearing northerly to the commencing point. The boundaries above described comprise the runs of Greenwald, Glenaulin, and Kentbruck.

**HAPPY VALLEY QUARANTINE DISTRICT**.—Commencing at the head of the Muddy Creek; thence westerly by the Main Dividing Range to the east boundary of the Glenvale run; thence northerly by the east boundary of that run to the Clonbinane run; thence northerly and north-easterly by the east and south-east boundaries thereof to the southern boundary of the Flowerdale run; thence by the said boundary easterly to the Glenburn run; thence south-easterly by that run to the Muddy Creek aforesaid; and thence to the commencing point.

**POWLETT'S PLAINS QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Powlett's Plains run).—Commencing at a point on the River Loddon, being the north-east angle of allotment 62, parish of Kinypanial; thence southerly along the said River Loddon to the northernmost angle of the Salisbury Plains run; thence westerly and southerly to the northernmost boundary of the Brenanah run; thence westerly along the said boundary to the eastern boundary of the Torpichen run; thence northerly along the said boundary to the southernmost boundary of the Edgar Plains run; and thence easterly to the point of commencement.

**PROTECTORATE QUARANTINE DISTRICT** (including Protectorate run).—Commencing at the north-east angle of Waranga run; on the west by that run; on the south by Postlethwaite run on the east by the Goulburn River for about seven miles; thence by a line running north-west to the commencing point.

**SANDHURST DISTRICT, FREEHOLD LANDS IN THE** Dunn's Farm, parish of Clunes, section C, allotments 20, 27, and 28.

The deaths in December exceeded those in November by 124. They also exceeded the average of the month in the previous ten years by 115. If allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of December by 25.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 101.2° on the 8th, and the lowest was 44.9° on the 14th. The mean temperature of the month (67.30°) was 4 degrees above the average. The greatest range of the thermometer (56.3°) in any one day took place on the 28th, viz., from a maximum of 98.5° to a minimum of 42.2°. The least range (11.1°) was on the 29th, viz., from a maximum of 70.1° to a minimum of 59°. The mean daily range was 27.8°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.819 inches) was about the average.

Males contributed 56 per cent., and females 44 per cent. to the total mortality; children under five years of age contributed 48 per cent. to that mortality. In December 1872 the proportion of children under five to the total was 55 per cent.; in December 1871 it was 53 per cent.; in December 1870 it was 52 per cent.; in December 1869 it was 53 per cent.; in December 1868, it was 55 per cent.; in December 1867, 54 per cent.; in December 1866, 69 per cent.; in December 1865, 65½ per cent.; in December 1864, 63 per cent.; and in December 1863, 47 per cent.

Thirteen deaths of persons of 75 years of age and upwards occurred during the month, viz., those of a watchmaker aged 76, of dysenteric diarrhoea; of a gardener aged 77, of heart disease and drowsy; of two females each aged 75, and of a female aged 81, of heart disease; of a widow aged 79, of gastritis; of a farmer aged 75; of a butcher aged 84; of three females aged 75, 76, and 80 respectively; and of a widow aged 86, of old age; of a female aged 79, of asthma and old age.

The number of violent deaths which took place during the month was 35; of these 29 were set down to accident or negligence, 5 to suicide, and 1 to homicide. The particulars were as follow:—A girl aged 5, was accidentally killed by a cartwheel passing over her; a lad aged 12, died of fracture of the base of the skull; a male aged 20, died of fracture of the skull, caused by a kick from a horse; a draper's assistant aged 24, died of the effects of a fall into a ship's hold; a sub-lieutenant of the Victorian navy aged 27, was killed by falling from the flying deck of the *Cerberus* while in the execution of his duty; a laborer aged 30, died from paralysis, caused by injury to the spine; a house painter aged 45, was killed by falling from a scaffold; a female aged 50, died of tetanus, resulting from an injury to the leg; three female children aged respectively 1, 3, and 3½, died of scalds; a male child aged 2, a female child aged 3, and a woman aged 72, died of burns; a female aged 31, and a draughtsman aged 65, died of sunstroke; three boys aged 6, 8, and 10, a school boy aged 10, a dealer aged 23, a cabinetmaker aged 27, a laborer aged 28, a male aged 42, a fisherman aged 54, and a female aged 58, were accidentally drowned; a miner aged 49 (a patient in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum), was drowned in the Yarra while endeavouring to escape; a female aged 2 months was accidentally suffocated at the breast; a female, aged 3 months, was suffocated by overlying; a laborer aged 18, was stabbed to the heart; a drayman aged 40, poisoned himself; a female aged 13, an enginedriver aged 30, a groom aged 35, and a female aged 35, drowned themselves.

Ninety-two deaths, or 18 per cent. of the total number, occurred in public institutions, viz.:—Melbourne Hospital, 49; Alfred Hospital, 10; Lying-in Hospital, 4; Benevolent Asylum, 11; Immigrants' Home, 4; Yarra Bend Asylum, 8; Metropolitan Asylum, 2; Industrial Schools, 3; Gaol, 1.

The deaths of children under 5 years of age numbered 243, of which 123, or 51 per cent., were of males, and 120, or 49 per cent., of females; 184 were under one year of age, 40 were between one and two, 6 were between two and three, 6 were between three and four, and 7 were between four and five years.

The deaths of persons above the age of five years numbered 259, of which 157, or 61 per cent., were males, and 102, or 39 per cent., were females; 17 were between five and ten, 6 were between ten and fifteen, 14 were between fifteen and twenty, 13 were between twenty and twenty-five, 19 were between twenty-five and thirty, 22 were between thirty and thirty-five, 25 were between thirty-five and forty, 32 were between forty and forty-five, 16 were between forty-five and fifty, 25 were between fifty and fifty-five, 16 were between fifty-five and sixty, 14 were between sixty and sixty-five, 15 were between sixty-five and seventy, 12 were between seventy and seventy-five, 9 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 4 were eighty years old and upwards.

The number of deaths in the quarter ending 31st December 1873 was 1,234, and the mean temperature in the shade was 61.4°. The deaths thus numbered 317 more than the average of the corresponding quarter during the previous ten years, and the mean temperature was over a degree in excess of an average extending over the same period.

During the year 1873 the number of deaths in Melbourne and suburbs amounted to 4,028, being in the proportion of 20.54 to every 1,000 of the living population.
