THE Committees for the Management of Mechanics' Institutes or Public Libraries in country districts claiming to participate in the grant of £3000 for the purchase of Books are hereby requested to send in their applications BEFORE THE 18TH OF FEBRUARY NEXT.

The conditions attached to the item in the Appropriation Act are as follow:—

1. That grants be made in proportion to sum, in the aggregate not less than £5, collected by private subscription or local rates during 1874.
2. That no grant exceeding £200 be paid to any one library.
3. That no grant be made to any institution in Melbourne, or more than one-sixth of the entire sum be divided amongst institutions within ten miles of it.

With reference to former announcements, dated August 1873 and October 1874, notice is hereby given, that the fixed light at present exhibited from the tower on the south side of the outer bar, at the entrance to Port Adelaide, will be discontinued on and after the 3rd day of February 1875; and, in lieu thereof, a white light of the first order, on the holophotal revolving dioptric system, showing a bright flash every thirty seconds, will be exhibited, and will be visible all round the horizon to a distance of about seventeen miles.

When much refraction exists this light will be seen at a greater distance than above stated.

Fifteen of the South Melbourne deaths and three of the Prahran took place in the Hospitals.

Of the total deaths, 96, or 62 per cent., were children not exceeding 3 years, and of these 53, or about 34 per cent., were under 1 year, and the remaining 43, or about 28 per cent., were of the ages of 1 to 3 years.

The general health of the districts is greatly improving. Measles is reported to be declining in those districts in which it still exists, and in many places it has disappeared. One case of typhoid fever occurred in the Melbourne Hospital.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, goldfield, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria; Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the respective Towns hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the names prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF NUMURKAH.—County of Moira, parish of Katunga; Commencing at the south-west angle of the parish; bounded thence by the parish boundary bearing north sixty chains;

thence by lines bearing respectively east one hundred and twenty-three chains fifty-two links and south sixty chains; and thence by the parish boundary bearing west one hundred and twenty-three chains forty-nine links to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(L.P.1223.) (74.O.17220.)

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Thursday the eighth day of April 1875, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, from the 1st July 1875 to 30th June 1876.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tenders for First Call."

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire services called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to *TEN PER CENT* of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a rateable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover and on the tender itself.

The tender of any person failing to comply with the foregoing conditions will not be entertained.

The attention of tenderers is drawn to the condition which requires that in cases where vehicles are used Members of Parliament shall be conveyed free of charge between the districts they represent and the districts in which they reside and Melbourne.

The contractor shall not be entitled to claim any extra payment on account of the removal of any post office during the term of his contract, unless such removal shall increase the distance to be travelled by such contractor on any one day to the extent of one mile.

The Government will not necessarily accept the lowest or any tender.
