The proportion of deaths as compared with the births has improved this week. Of the recorded deaths 70 or 57.3 per cent. were children not exceeding 3 years of age divided thus:—Under 1 year, 42 or 34.4; and 1 to 3 years, 28 or 22.9 per cent.; the most fatal cause being diarrhoea and dysentery, and next to that measles. Fourteen of the South Melbourne deaths took place in charitable institutions, one at Prahran in the Hospital, and one at Kew in the Lunatic Asylum.

**WHEREAS** in conformity with the laws relating to the sale and occupation of Crown lands in our Colony of Victoria the person hereinafter named ha, in consideration of the sum of £, which sum has been duly paid to us, become entitled to a grant in fee-simple of the land hereinafter described: Now know ye that, in consideration of the sum so paid, and in pursuance of *The Land Act 1869*, we do hereby grant unto h heirs and assigns, all that piece of land in the said colony containing

## COMMONS INCREASED.

### PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir WILLIAM FOSTER STAWELL, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and Administrator of the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

**WHEREAS** by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor at any time and from time to time under regulations to be made for such purpose to proclaim any Crown lands as a common, and at any time to alter, add to, diminish, revoke, or abolish

such common, or unite one or more commons; and it is also enacted that the Governor may from time to time increase, and after one month's notice in the *Government Gazette* diminish, alter, or abolish any common heretofore or hereafter to be proclaimed or re-proclaimed, and may from time to time re-proclaim the whole or any part of any such common for any of the purposes and subject to the provisions of the said Act; and it is also directed that notice of any proposed proclamation, alteration, addition, diminution, revocation, or union of commons shall be published and all objections thereto shall be heard in the manner set forth in the One hundredth section of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby add to and increase the Commons herein-after mentioned in accordance with the provisions of the above-recited Act, that is to say:—

**LILLICUR AND YALONG FARMERS' COMMON.**—The Lillicur and Yalong Farmers' Common, proclaimed by Order of the 4th May 1863, and increased by Orders dated respectively 26th March 1866 and 13th September 1869, is hereby further increased by adding thereto the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.:—Commencing at the north-west angle of the existing common; bounded thence by allotment 10 of section 1, parish of Lillicur, and by J. T. Vincent's 19th section block, No. 85111, bearing north to the north-east angle of the said block; thence again by that block bearing west to the east boundary of allotment 8 of aforesaid section 1; thence by that allotment and by allotments 6, 5, and 2 of said section, bearing northerly to the south side of the road from Avoca to Amherst; thence by that road north-easterly to the west boundary of the Amherst Gold-fields Common; thence by that common bearing south to the north-east angle of the aforesaid existing common; and thence by the north boundary thereof bearing west to the point of commencement. ## SHOAL PATCH IN THE ROADSTEAD AT NEW PLYMOUTH, NEW ZEALAND.

THE Chief Harbor-master of Taranaki reports the discovery of Shoal patch in the Roadstead at New Plymouth, with the following magnetic bearings:—

The flagstaff on with a farm-house in the centre of a clump of trees bearing ... S. 4 E.  
The two white beacons on the Sand Hills to the westward of the landing-place bearing ... S.W. by S.  
There is only 17 feet of water on it at low-water spring tides. The centre of the patch is about 30 feet square, and consists of large flat-topped stones with several detached stones lying from 20 to 30 feet off the centre, with 3½ to 4 fathoms over them at low-water. There is 4½ fathoms round the shoal. By keeping the western beacons open, this shoal will be avoided in anchoring either in or outside of it. These beacons in line lead direct over the shoal, which is half a mile N. 4 W. magnetic from the Flagstaff.

## CONVEYANCE OF MAILS 1875-76.

## FIRST CALL.

## ONE HUNDRED AND TWENTY SERVICES.

TENDERS are hereby invited, and will be received until Noon of Thursday the eighth day of April 1875, for the Conveyance of Post Office Mails as undermentioned, from the 1st July 1875 to 30th June 1876.

The covers of Tenders for these services must be endorsed "Tenders for First Call."

Tenders are required to be written on a form, printed copies of which may be had gratuitously on application at any post office in the colony, and may be forwarded (if by post, prepaid) addressed to the Honorable the Postmaster-General, with the words "Tender for the Conveyance of Mails" endorsed on the cover, or placed in the tender-box at the General Post Office.

Tenders are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the *bona fide* signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to TEN PER CENT. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them on application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them on application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.

In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a rateable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted.

Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but notwithstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum. The number of the service or services tendered for must be plainly endorsed on the outside of the cover and on the tender itself.
