The proportion of deaths as compared with the births has improved this week. Of the recorded deaths 70 or 67.3 per cent, were children not exceeding 3 years of age divided thus:—Under I year. 42 or 34.4; and I to 3 years, 28 or 22.9 per cent.; the most fath cause being diarrhozs and dysentery, and next to that measles. Fourteen of the South Bielbourne deaths took place in charitable institutions, one at Prahran in the Hospital, and one at Kew in the Lunatic Asylum.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the boná fide signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to become bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to Ten fer Cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them on application, on the bond and contract being completed.

In the event of a portion of railway affecting any particular service being opened for traffic during period of contract, and it being decided that the mails shall be conveyed by rail, the place of departure for the mail coaches shall be altered in such way as the Postmaster-General may from time to time direct; a rateable reduction shall be made in the amount paid for the service as then rendered by the contractors, such reduction to be computed on the basis of the average mileage rate of the lump tender or the average mileage rate of the single tender, in whichever form the tender may be accepted. Persons tendering are requested to state the description of the vehicle they intend to use, and the number of horses by which it is to be drawn.

A separate tender must be sent in for each service; but not-withstanding this condition, any offer will be entertained for the performance of any number of services for a lump sum.
