NEW HEBRIDES AND NEW CALEDONIA.

THE accompanying information, which I have received from Captain Chapman, of Her Majesty's ship *Dido*, relative to the New Hebrides and New Caledonia, is hereby promulgated for general information and guidance.

NEW HEBRIDES.

Three Hills Island.—A reef extends about 2' in an easterly direction from the N. end of this island.

Api Island.—The land from *Three Hills* is very clearly laid down in chart No. 1380. The passage between *Tonon* and *Api* appears very foul, numerous reefs and shoals having been seen from the mast-head and bridge. Approaching the S. end of *Api*, *Nanuka Island* is clearly made out as a cone covered with trees, it stands well out from the land, but is apparently a mile further E. than placed on the chart; between this island and the main land the coast line falls back into a deep bay. The *Dido* coasting along close in-shore, no dangers were seen from the mast-head or bridge, further than the fringe reef which trends along this shore about 1/4' from the beach. On approaching *La Menu Island* we steamed closer into the shore and observed a bay between the island and main land, finding, however, nothing less than 30 fms., and

that very close into the beach, we steamed out again and made for the island of Mallicollo.

Mallicollo Island.—A small wooded island was observed, which is not marked on chart No. 1380; it lies S. 15° W. about 5' from the S.W. point of S.W. Bay; off its W. point a reef runs out about 2 cables, and off S.W. point a reef extends a short distance. The whole of the south coast trends much further back than shown on the chart; it is also full of small bays and little islands. The islands appear to lie about one or two miles from the beach. The *Dido*, coasting along, observed a long, low, wooded island lying N. and S. from One-tree Point (so named from having a small rock off it with one tree standing on it). The channel between this island and the main land appeared very foul and is about 2' wide. Westerly, 3' from One-tree Point, is another bluff-looking point, and between these two points the land falls back, forming a small bay with which we communicated. From Bluff Point a reef runs out in a S.W. direction past and round some small islands lying off the beach. About 3' N.E. by N. lies another wooded low island from E. end of which a dangerous reef runs out to about 2 miles.

Ambrym Island.—This island we found to be at least 5' nearer to the Mallicollo coast than placed on the chart. Dip Point is easily recognized by its name; a small fringe reef runs round the coast, with this slight exception the coast appears quite free from danger.

NEW CALEDONIA.

Shoal inside the Woodin Pass.—A shoal extending S. 36° W. (magnetic) 3' from Ta Peak, and marked (?) on chart 2907, has been clearly made out and surveyed by the French officers. It is 2' in length, W. by S. and E. by N., and carries from 4½ to 11 fms. over it. From the centre of the shoal Ta Peak bears N. 36° E., Mount D'Or N. 46° W. On the present chart it is marked (shoal?).

IN pursuance of the 64th section of *The Scab Act 1870*, the Governor in Council has revoked all previous Orders relating to the Quarantine Districts hereinafter mentioned, and has ordered that the portions of Victoria whereof the boundaries are hereinafter described shall be Quarantine Districts within the meaning of the said Act, viz.:—

Pursuant to Orders of 23 December 1874.

BRENANAH QUARANTINE DISTRICT (including Brenanah and Coyoola Springs runs).—Commencing at the north-west angle of Catto's run; thence by that run south-easterly to the northern boundary of the Glenalbyn run; thence by that run westerly and southerly to the Kingower run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run to the Bealiba run; thence by the northern and western boundaries of that run, westerly and southerly to the eastern boundary of the Avoca Forest East run; thence by that run north-westerly to the southern boundary of the Spring Hill run; thence by that run north-easterly and northerly to the southern boundary of Torpichen run; thence by that run north-easterly to Powlett's Plains run; and thence by that run, and the Salisbury Plains run, south-easterly to the point of commencement.

LAANEOCORIE COMMON, being the unappropriated Crown land comprised within the boundaries of the Laanecoorie township reserve.—(74.N.2845.)

Of the 115 deaths, 50, or 43½ per cent., were children not exceeding the age of three years; 36, or a little over 31 per cent., being under the age of one year, and the remaining 14, or 12½ per cent., being of the ages of one to three years. Bronchitis prevails at North Melbourne, and low fever has made its appearance in one or two districts, but is yielding to treatment. With these exceptions the districts are reported on favorably. At Kew, one death occurred at the Asylum; at Prahran, two occurred in the Hospital; and in South Melbourne thirteen of the deaths occurred in public institutions, two of the deaths in the hospital being from typhoid fever.

A REGULATION, NUMBERED 123, OF THE TOWN OF FITZROY, MADE UNDER THE PROVISIONS OF SECTION 216 OF THE LOCAL GOVERNMENT ACT 1874, FOR APPOINTING PLACES FOR THE STANDING OF CARRIAGES WITHIN THE TOWN OF FITZROY.

IN pursuance of the power contained in and given by section 216 of the Local Government Act 1874, the mayor, councillors, and burgesses of the town of Fitzroy make the regulation following, that is to say:—

The places hereunder mentioned shall be stands within the town of Fitzroy for hackney carriages to ply for hire:—

1. Centre of Napier street, between Gertrude and Webb streets, horses' heads towards Gertrude street.
2. Centre of Gore street, between Gertrude and Webb streets, horses' heads towards Gertrude street.
3. Centre of Nicholson street, north of Johnston street, horses' heads towards Johnston street.
4. Centre of Brunswick street north, between Yorke and Newry streets, horses' heads towards Yorke street.

The owner or driver of any public vehicle shall not permit any part of such vehicle, or any horse drawing the same, to stand within ten feet of a line drawn from the corner of any street, whether for hire or otherwise.
