MINT REGULATIONS.

THE following Regulations respecting the Receipt and Coinage of Gold at the Melbourne Branch of the Royal Mint, to be substituted for those approved by Orders in Council of the 12th June 1872 and 29th December 1873, have been issued by His Excellency the Administrator of the Government in Council.

Unmanufactured Gold, in Dust or in Bullion, can be deposited at the Mint for Coinage, subject to the following charges, allowances, and conditions:—

CHARGES.

- 1. For a deposit of 1000 ounces standard or over, three half-pence per ounce.
- 2. For a deposit of less weight but exceeding 30 ounces standard, three pence per ounce.
- 3. For other deposits, Seven shillings and sixpence.

ALLOWANCES.

Any silver in a deposit in excess of Four per cent of the weight of the deposit, after melting, will be allowed for at the rate of Five shillings an ounce fine.

- 1. The Receiving Office at the Mint will be open daily from 11 a.m. to 3 p.m., except on Saturdays and Holidays, and on the last two working days of March, June, September, and December.
- 2. Each parcel for which a separate assay shall be demanded will be considered a separate deposit.

Gold and silver bullion, in ingots or bars, can be obtained at the Mint to a limited extent; gold at £3 17s. 10\forall d. the ounce standard, and silver at 5s. 6d. the ounce fine.

Gold coin which has become light, after issue from the Royal Mint or any of its branches, will be received at the Mint in parcels of not less than £50 nominal value, at £3 17s. 10\forall d. per ounce.

ADDITIONAL AND AMENDED PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency the Honorable Sir William Foster Stawell, Knight, the Chief Justice of the Colony of Victoria, and the Administrator of the Government of the said colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by the Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865 it is among other things enacted, that the Governor in Council, by proclamation published in the Government Gazette, may from time to time define the limits and boundaries of ports in Victoria, and frame rules and regulations for the governance and preservation of the said ports respectively, and for the regulation of shipping in the same; and also for the due protection and preservation and the good government and management of all public wharfs; and may appoint officers to carry out and enforce such rules and regulations; and any such limits, boundaries, rules, and regulations may from time to time be in like manner altered, amended, or repealed, and others substituted in their stead: Now therefore I, the Administrator of the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby frame the clauses hereinafter numbered 43A, 44A, 54A as additional Port and Harbor Regulations, and to bereby also frame the clauses hereinafter numbered 64, 66, and 67 as amended Port and Harbor Regulations, and to be observed accordingly, in lieu of clauses numbered 64, 66, 67, 69, and 70, published in the issue of the Government Gazette numbered 52, and bearing date the 21st day of May 1867, which are hereby repealed.

New Port and Harbor Regulations.

NEW PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

43A. Yards to be peaked or braced, and booms, \$\frac{6}{2}\text{c}, to be rigged in.—Every vessel in tow of a steamer proceeding up or down the River Yarra shall have the yards apeak or braced fore and aft, and the jibboom and flying jibboom rigged in to within three feet from the cap, and all running bowsprits run in close to the stems; the studding-sail booms and irons taken from the yards; the quarter and stern davits, the main and mizen booms and bumpkins, rigged in; and while lying in the river shall peak the yards as directed by the Harbor Master.

44a. Vessels about to be docked to be reported to Harbor Master.—
No vessel shall be taken up the River Yarra for the purpose of being admitted into dock, nor shall any vessel be docked, undocked, or removed to or from any wharf, quay, pier, or anchorage, to or from any dock or dock-wharf without due notice thereof being given to the Harbor Master.

54A. Space round cranes to be kept clear.—No goods will be allowed to remain after being landed upon any wharf or wharf road within the radius of any of the public cranes, nor shall any goods or other articles be deposited for shipment or otherwise upon any wharf or wharf road within the abovenamed radius and an approach of twenty-five (25) feet wide of the wharf roads in front of, and in line with, the public cranes, which must at all times be kept clear, and upon which no goods, carts, carriages, or other articles shall be placed or deposited so as to prevent the free use and working of the cranes.

AMENDED PORT AND HARBOR REGULATIONS.

64. Ballast.—No sand ballast or other material shall be raised from below high-water mark for ballasting vessels, except under conditions approved and at places appointed by Chief

- Harbor Master.

 66. Ballast vessels and persons in charge to be licensed.—The master or any other person in charge of any vessel within the meaning of the Passengers, Harbors, and Navigation Statute 1865 shall not receive ballast into any ship under his command unless the owner of the lighter supplying it shall be in possession of an uncancelled certificate from the Chief Harbor Master that such lighter has been duly measured and marked, and is in good order, and that the person in charge of such lighter is duly licensed; and such master or other person shall, while such lighter is employed supplying ballast to the ship under his command, keep possession of such certificate, and shall produce it on demand to the Chief Harbor Master, or any other officer deputed by him; and no ballast shall be supplied by a ballast lighter except she, as well as the master, is duly licensed by the Chief Harbor Master.

 67. Conditions upon which certificates will be granted.—Certificates.
- 67. Conditions upon which certificates will be granted.—Certificates shall be issued by the Chief Harbor Master subject to the following conditions:—
 - (1.) All ballast lighters and persons in charge thereof shall be examined by an officer acting under the orders of the Chief Harbor Master and passed by him.
 - (IL) All ballast lighters shall be surveyed once in every twelve months or within such shorter period as may be found necessary by the Chief Harbor Master.
 - (iii.) Every lighter shall have the number of her certificate painted on both bows in figures (white on black ground) of not less than twelve (12) inches deep and two (2) inches wide.
 - (iv.) An iron batten three (3) inches wide shall be secured to the sides of the stem and stern posts, or other convenient place to be decided by the Chief Harbor Master or other officer acting under his orders, and so marked as to show the draught of water for every five (5) tons weight of ballast carried or discharged, such marks to be in white figures where practicable of not less than one and a half (1½) inches deep, or of such dimensions as shall be approved by the Chief Harbor Master.
 - (v.) Two (2) grooves shall be cut into the planking from stem to stern post of not less than two (2) inches in width, and painted white, to denote the loaded and light draught lines; the lower edge of these grooves to be on a level with the water's edge to mark these measurements; such marks and corresponding draught of water shall be endorsed upon the certificates.
 - endorsed upon the certificates.

 (vi.) Such licenses may be cancelled or suspended when it shall be found to the satisfaction of the Chief Harbor Master that the owner or master has defrauded or attempted to defrand the master, owner, or charterer of any ship, by altering the marks or figures on any ballast lighter, or by delivering or attempting to deliver short weight of ballast to any vessel, or from any other cause whatever, or has been guilty of such misconduct as in the opinion of the Chief Harbor Master constitutes a sufficient cause for the cancellation or suspension of any such license or certificate. Solomon Islands, Etc.

Guadalcanar Island.—There is a good clear channel along the N. shore, keeping about I' distant from it. All the reefs show, so that they can be easily avoided.

Savo Island.—The natives here are very warlike, and continually at war with their neighbours. They seem, however, well disposed towards Europeans, but should not be trusted too implicitly. The island is steep to all round, and there are no outlying dangers. There is anchorage close to the beach on the N.W. side.

Guadalcanar, N.W. Point.—The reefs are said to extend 12 to the westward of this point, only breaking in heavy weather. Mr. Brodie, master of the schooner Lavinia, reports a shoal, with highest peak of C. Marsh Id. bearing N.4E., distant about 4', which only breaks in heavy weather.

The Puke of York Cluster consists of a group of seven or eight small islands, Duke of York and Mukkedah being the principal ones. There is good anchorage in six or seven fathoms between the two latter islands, and water may be obtained on Mukkedah. There is no water in Port Hunter, although it is reported so in the sailing directions.

Cape St. George may be distinguished from the S.E. by a white patch on it, looking, at a distance, very like a sail.

The positions given in Findlay's Directory about here are very doubtful.

Port Prastin is given by Duperrey as being in lat. 4° 49′ 45′ 8, long, 152° 54′ 40′ E. This position agrees with that of a harbor which I have called Lavinia Harbor, from the natives there having taken the Lavinia schooner. It is on the S.E. coast of New Ireland, about 3′ S. of C. Bougainville. The native name is Medik. It is well protected from westerly winds, though open to the S.E. Good anchorage in five to seven fathoms, with a level sandy bottom just inside the bluff at the entrance to the bay. There is a large river emptying itself into the bay, but the hostility of the natives should deter vessels from visiting it unless well armed.

Belcher's Port Prasin is 2′ N. of C. St. George, i

The current in St. George's Channel follows the monsoon. It generally turns before the N.W. monsoon sets in. The rains are very heavy and continue nearly all the year round. Winds light and variable with strong sea breezes on clear days.

St. George's Channel is very free from dangers. The New Ireland shore may be approached quite close, but there are recefs running out about a mile or thereabouts from the New Britain coast.

New Georgia Group:—Keso or Shark Island is situated on the N.W. end of a long coral reef, running out from the N.W. point of New Georgia. It is about 21' N.E. by E. ½E. from Eddystone Island. There is a very good anchorage at the E. end of the island inside the coral reefs. The entrance is about \(\frac{1}{2} \) across and is easily distinguishable from the masthead coming from the southward. There is a coral patch with two fathoms on it in the middle of the harbor, but this can easily be seen

and avoided. The best anchorage is in fourteen to fifteen fathoms off the village. The natives here are a colony from

langbangra, 12' distant.
To go to Koulangbangra there are two routes—one through To go to Koulangbangra there are two routes—one through an opening in the northern reef of about half a cable's width with ten fathoms in it, at about 14' to windward of Keso Island; the other route is to go out through the southern opening or entrance of Keso Ilarbor, and work to windward along the reefs till the peak of Koulangbangra bears N.E., when there is a clear passage of a mile in width through both reefs. The islands on the N. reef are generally sandy, while on the southern reef the trees grow down to the water's edge.

Koulangbangra is a very conspicuous island, apparently volcanic. It rises quite abruptly from the water's edge all round to a peak about 3000 feet in height. The natives assert that at the summit of this peak is a saltwater lake, full of fish. The island is steep to all round. Water is to be obtained from a river on the S.W. side, with Simbo or Eddystone Island just open to the eastward of the first large island east of Keso.

Bird Island.—Passed between Bird Island and Wreck Reef. There appears to be a sung anchorage for small vessels inside the lagoon to the leeward of Bird Island.

Zebra Shoal.—The Beagle passed over the position of Zebra Shoal, and the shoal marked E.D. N. of the Palm Islands, but the lead gave no intimation of shoal water, 1-10th was carried over the spot. We passed frequent large patches of spawn which have very much the appearance of discolored water, and may have given rise to the reports of these shoals.

Mourilyan Harbor.—Captain Chapman, of the schooner Johns Lane, reports that he had visited this harbor, and he considered it dangerous for any vessel to enter it, as his vessel grounded just inside and he could not find deep water to lie in there, while the natives are numerous and hostile.

Megara Rock.—We passed close to the position of this rock but saw nothing of it.

Port Darwin.—A good leading mark into Port Darwin is King's Table, open twice its width of Tale Head, until Point Emery bears E., when haul in for the anchorage off Fort Hill. The best anchorage is in eight fathoms with Fort Hill bearing N.W. by W. Off the settlement the holding ground is bad.

Great care should be taken in navigating these straits, especially if the channel to the northward of N. Vernon Island be taken. There is a shoal running off from Cape Gambier in a S.Wly, direction. It is of dark coral and not easily distinguished at any distance except on the W. side with a strong sea breeze, when it breaks in two fathoms. There are two islets off the S.W. point of Barrow Island, and very good fresh water may be obtained in a creek on Barrow Island, with sheltered anchorage between the northern of the two islets and the S.W. point, but the anchorage is difficult of access on account of the reefs which extend across the entrance and which can only be crossed at high water.

The alteration of 5' in the position of Barrow Island will probably extend also to the Monte Bello Islands and Richie's Reef, as the relative positions of these appear to be correct.

Great Sandy Island, which I have called Beagle Island, is composed of three islands connected by a reef. The N.E. island is rocky, from which the reef runs nearly due S. to a sandy cay, and then trends away S. W. to the principal island. There is a reef running off from the S.W. point about 4', and there is a good anchorage in four to five fathoms sandy bottom with the S.W. point bearing W.S.W., and shelter from the prevailing winds.

Mary Anne Group consists of eight small islands, the majority of which are little more than sandbanks. They are all more or less fringed with reefs and the passages between are very dangerous, on account of sandbanks and shoals. There is a very dangerous reef running to the northward from the northwestern island of the group, which breaks heavily at times, and the uneven bottom in its vicinity causes heavy overfalls with the sca-breeze and an ebb-tide, as the tides run three knots at springs between this reef and the Barrow Island Reef. Great caution must be used, and every attention paid to the lead in navigating amongst the islands of this group. A mashhead look-out is indispensable, but should not be too implicitly relied on.

It affords shelter for small vossels from all winds, except northerly, and the holding ground is good (sand and mud) two fathoms, is the deepest water at L.W. springs. It is H.W. F.&C. about noon.

Springs rise 0 to 12 feet. Brackish water may be obtained from a creek about 2' to the eastward of Port Weld.

Hemarks on the Winds and Weather.—During the summerseason on the N.W. coast. In the months of January and February the sea-breeze generally sets in about 10 a.m., and blows strong all day and sometimes half the night. It varies from S.W. to W.N.W., blowing stronger when it backs to the northward. About 4 or 5 p.m. the clouds generally gather up heavy over the land, with much lightning, and occasionally break over the coast-line with a sharp squall about 7 or 8 p.m. During this season hurricanes have been experienced, but they do not appear to extend over any great area. In 1871, about Christmas, a very severe one was felt at Roebourne, which blew all the houses down, whilst at the DeGrey River to the eastward and the Fortescue River to the westward it was hardly felt at all. In 1872 one was experienced on the DeGrey which was barely felt at Roebourne. They do not appear to be of any great duration. The heat is very great. Our thermometer constantly stood at 92° by day and 88° by night, but the air is so dry that the heat is not a trying one.

The climate is very healthy, its only drawbacks being the scarcity of water, and consequently the impossibility of obtaining any green food.

The death rate still continues rather high for this time of the year. Of the 111 deaths 59 or 35'l per cent, were children not exceeding the age of 3 years, of whom 25 or 22½ per cent, were under 1 year, and the remaining 14 or about 12½ per cent, were of the ages of 1 to 3 years, the causes of mortality among them being distributed pretty equally among the diseases peculiar to children. Dysentery and diarrhea are reported as prevalent at Flemington and North Melbourne. The other districts, with the exception of colds and a few remaining cases of measles, do not show any prevailing epidemic. The following are the deaths in charitable institutions:—Kew, 1 in the asylum; South Melbourne, 13 in hospital, and 1 in the gao; Prahran, 3 in the hospital.

Tenderers are requested to describe by their numbers, as below, the mail services for which they tender, and every tender will be taken to include the entire service as called for. The amount of the tender must be stated in words as well as figures.

Every tender must bear the bona fide signatures and addresses of the tenderer, and of two responsible persons willing to be-come bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of

come bound for the fulfilment of the same in such sum as the Government may direct, not exceeding the gross amount of the contract.

Every tender must be accompanied by a bank deposit-receipt for a sum equal to Ten per Cent. of the amount for which the tenderer is willing to undertake the service; the money to be lodged to the credit of the Deputy Postmaster-General, and to be absolutely forfeited to the Government in case the person whose tender may be accepted shall fail to complete, within ten days of the date of notice being given of the acceptance of his tender, the usual bond and contract to the satisfaction of the Government. The notice of acceptance, if delivered at the address named in the tender, shall be deemed sufficient.

The money deposited by successful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, on the bond and contract being completed.

The money deposited by unsuccessful tenderers will be returned to them upon application, and on their signing receipts for the respective amounts, but not otherwise.
