## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR REDMOND BARRY, Knight, the Senior Judge of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Wines, Beer, and Spirits Sale Statute 1864 Amendment Act* it is amongst other things enacted, that it shall be lawful for the Governor in Council, upon the application in writing of the council of any shire or road district, to proclaim any part of such shire or road district, to be defined by such council and not being in or within one mile of any city or town, a part within which the licensing magistrates for such district may grant certificates for publicans' licenses as aforesaid for which shall be charged the annual license fee of Ten pounds; and on the like application of the council of any borough, not being within fifty miles of the city of Melbourne, the Governor in Council may if he shall think fit proclaim any portion of such borough as a part within which the licensing magistrates for the district may grant certificates for such publicans' licenses, and for which license shall be charged a like fee of Ten pounds; and the said Governor in Council may from time to time revoke any such proclamation, such revocation to take effect from the time of the expiration of the last issued license under such proclamation: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby proclaim the districts hereinafter mentioned to be respectively districts within which Licensing Magistrates may grant Certificates for Publicans' Licenses for which shall be charged the annual License Fee of Ten pounds, that is to say:—

The Yallock Riding of the Shire of Cranbourne.  
The whole of the Shire of Glenlyon.

The Shire of Lexton, excepting those portions within a radius of two miles of the post offices of Lexton, Springs, Evansford, Glenlogie, and Trawalla.

The births of 586 children, viz., 290 boys and 296 girls were registered in Melbourne and suburbs during the month of November. In the month of October 601 births were registered, or 15 more than in the month under review.

The deaths in November numbered 390, viz., 214 of males and 176 of females, the births thus exceeded the deaths by 196. The deaths exceeded those in October by 84, and exceeded the average of November during the previous ten years by 94. If, however, allowance be made for the increase of population, they will be found to have exceeded the average of those ten years by 26 only.

The highest temperature in the shade recorded at the Melbourne Observatory during the month was 87.8° on the 4th and the lowest was 41.0° on the 15th. The mean temperature of the month (59.2°) was 1.2° below the average. The greatest range of the thermometer in any one day (35.9°) took place on the 11th, viz., from a maximum of 80.9° to a minimum of 45.0°. The least range (10.5°) was on the 10th, viz., from a maximum of 61.0° to a minimum of 50.5°. The mean daily range was 22.2°. The mean atmospheric pressure (29.834 inches) was a fraction below the average.

The number of persons of the age of 75 years or upwards who died during the month, was 9, viz.:—An inmate of the Benevolent Asylum, aged 75, of bronchitis; a laborer, aged 77, of jaundice and old age; a dairyman, aged 79, of chronic inflammation of the liver and jaundice; a female, aged 78, of apoplexy; a shoemaker, aged 85, of kidney disease; a stonemason, aged 80, a female, aged 80, a farmer, aged 87, and a female, aged 87, of old age.

Only seven violent deaths occurred during the month, a number much below the average. The following are the particulars:—A carter, aged 32, and a bullock driver, aged 65, died of injuries caused by being passed over by drays; a bricklayer, aged 36, and a mason, aged 53, died of injuries resulting from falls; a female child, aged 3, died of the effects of burns; a laborer, aged 23, died of fracture of the spine, verdict manslaughter; and a fur dresser, aged 54, poisoned himself with carbolic acid.

Seventy-eight deaths, or 20 per cent. of the whole, took place in public institutions, viz.:—40 in the Melbourne Hospital; 2 in the Immigrants' Home; 1 in the Children's Hospital; 6 in the Alfred Hospital; 5 in the Lying-in Hospital; 7 in the Benevolent Asylum; 1 in the Asylum for the Blind; 2 in the Melbourne Orphan Asylum; 2 in the Yarra Bend Lunatic Asylum; 8 in the Metropolitan Lunatic Asylum; 2 in the Melbourne Gaol; and 2 in the Pentridge Stockade.

The deaths of children under five years of age numbered 182, of which 102, or 56 per cent., were of males; and 80, or 44 per cent., were of females. Of those who died 111 were under one year of age, 31 were between one and two, 12 were between two and three, 14 were between three and four, and 14 were between four and five.

The persons who died at a more advanced age than five years numbered 208. Of these 112, or 54 per cent., were males and 96, or 46 per cent., were females; 19 were between five and ten, 7 were between ten and fifteen, 10 were between fifteen and twenty, 18 were between twenty and twenty-five, 11 were between twenty-five and thirty, 14 were between thirty and thirty-five, 18 were between thirty-five and forty, 24 were between forty and forty-five, 17 were between forty-five and fifty, 13 were between fifty and fifty-five, 14 were between fifty-five and sixty, 12 were between sixty and sixty-five, 11 were between sixty-five and seventy, 11 were between seventy and seventy-five, 4 were between seventy-five and eighty, and 5 was upwards of eighty.

Deaths from zymotic diseases increased from 64 in October to 112 in the month under review. The increase is chiefly due to the prevalence of measles, which caused only 2 deaths in October but 43 in November, and to that of dysentery and diarrhoea, which caused 12 deaths in the former and 30 in the latter month. Phthisis caused fewer deaths in November than in October, the numbers being respectively 36 and 41. Childbirth also caused fewer deaths than it has of late, the number being 4 in November and 9 in each of the three previous months.

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR REDMOND BARRY, Knight, the Senior Judge of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that the Governor may divide into counties the territory not already included in any county, and may also subdivide any county into parishes and towns, and may divide into parishes and towns any territory not included in any county, and by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* may define the boundaries of such counties, parishes, or towns, and may distinguish each by a name; and after such proclamation the territory comprised within the boundaries of any of the said divisions shall thenceforward be recognised as a county, parish, or town, by the name so given as aforesaid; the Governor may from time to time at the request of the council of any shire or borough alter by proclamation to be published in the *Government Gazette* the name of any such shire or borough, and may also from time to time by proclamation as aforesaid alter the name of any county, parish, town, township, land, area, gold-field, river, harbor, lake, bay, lagoon, swamp, mountain, glen, or other place or locality whatsoever within Victoria: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, do hereby define the boundaries of the Town hereinafter described, and do distinguish the same by the name prefixed thereto, that is to say:—

TOWN OF LALLAT.—County of Borung, parishes of Lallat and Rupanyup: Commencing at the north-eastern angle of J. Allingham's 19th section block, No. 10,052; bounded thence by a road bearing east ten chains; thence by lines bearing respectively south fifty chains and east two chains; thence by J. S. Campbell's 19th section block, No. 11,654, bearing south sixteen chains and west two chains; thence again by Campbell's block and by a line bearing south, ninety-five chains; thence by a road bearing west twenty-four chains; thence by the 19th section blocks of J. Gibson, No. 13,598, and W. Cruikshank, No. 11,440, and by a line bearing north eighty-one chains; thence by M. E. Shields' 19th section block, No. 20,467, bearing east fourteen chains; and thence again by Shields' block and by Allingham's block aforesaid, bearing north eighty chains to the point of commencement. The bearings are from the true meridian.—(L.P.1169, 1247.) (74.O.B.4554.)

## PROCLAMATION

By His Excellency SIR REDMOND BARRY, Knight, the Senior Judge of the Colony of Victoria, and Officer administering the Government of the said Colony, &c., &c., &c.

WHEREAS by *The Land Act 1869* it is amongst other things enacted, that notwithstanding anything thereinbefore contained the Governor may by proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber or particular description of timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick, or other earth, from such portions of Crown lands as are named in such proclamation, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers, or any of them, conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act: Now therefore I, the Officer administering the Government of Victoria, with the advice of the Executive Council, under and by virtue of the power conferred by the above-recited Act, do by this my Proclamation declare that no person, although he be duly licensed or otherwise authorized, shall cut, dig, or remove live or dead timber, or bark, stone, gravel, sand, loam, brick or other earth from such portions of Crown lands as are comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, or shall exercise on any such portions the powers or any of them conferred by any license granted under the authority of Part III. of the said Act, that is to say:—

County of Grant, parish of Puebla, being the unappropriated Crown lands comprised within the boundaries hereinafter described, viz.: Commencing at a point on the eastern bank of the Spring Creek where the south boundary of portion 67 abuts thereon; bounded thence by the said portion and by a line bearing east fourteen chains thirty-three links; thence by a road bearing north eight chains sixty-five links; thence by a road and by a line bearing east to the shore of Bass's Straits; thence by that shore south-easterly and south-westerly to the Spring Creek aforesaid; and thence by that creek north-westerly to the point of commencement.—(P.93.) (74.O.B.15578.)

# REGULATIONS FOR CLEANING AND DRESSING RICE IN BOND.

THE following regulations for dressing and cleaning rice in bond, which have been approved by His Excellency the Officer administering the Government in Council, are published for general information, viz.:—

1. The dressing and cleaning rice in bond will be allowed for home consumption or exportation upon the following conditions:—

2. Applications to be made in writing, specifying the building in which it is desired that dressing or cleaning rice in bond shall be carried on.

3. The buildings shall be subject to the approval of the Commissioner of Trade and Customs, and must be constructed of stone or brick, and shall be so arranged that there shall be a store for all the rice which it is intended to clean or dress, and also a separate store wherein the rice after cleaning or dressing shall be placed, together with the residue, from which latter place the deliveries for home consumption or exportation shall be made. The dressing and cleaning-house shall be capable of being secured under the locks of the Customs department, as well as all other places for the storage of rice above mentioned.

4. The proprietor or occupier shall provide at his own cost all such locks and weighing machines as the Collector of Customs may require, and a suitable "locker's office," and shall keep the same in good repair.

5. Rice may be entered direct from the ship, or transferred from any bonded warehouse to the receiving store, into which it must be weighed and a correct account thereof kept by the officer.

6. The dressed rice and "residue" must be placed in the store approved for the purpose; and none of the residue shall be removed except under such regulations as to proportion, chargeable with duty determined by the Commissioner, and upon the certificate of inspection by the landing surveyor.

7. The hours to be observed for the receiving and for delivering rice or residue for home consumption or exportation shall be the same as in bonding warehouses, but the cleaning or dressing of rice may be carried on between the hours of 6.30 a.m. and , except on Saturdays when the premises should be closed at 2 p.m. The fee for the attendance of the Customs officer shall be £250 per annum, payable quarterly in advance on 1st January, 1st April, 1st July, and 1st October respectively. Should any extended time be required for dressing or cleaning such may be allowed by the Collector of Customs upon payment of 3s. per hour overtime.
